

### REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1909.

THE total receipts for the year 1909 were £258,926. 3s. 2d. This sum was made up as follows: Donations, £12,145. 6s. 11d.; Contributions to Capital, £279. 3s. 10d., together with £13,782. 5s. 8d. net profit on realisation of Securities; Annual Subscriptions, £23,615. 2s. 7d.; Contribution of the League of Mercy, £19,000; from the Lewis Estate (exclusive of interest), £75,000; Legacies (including interest on Lewis Legacy), £46,401. 18s. 5d.; Interest from Investments, £68,502 5s. 9d.; together with £200 from the Trustees of the Bawden Fund.

The amount distributed was £150,000, being an increase of £10,000 over the sum distributed in 1908. For the first time therefore the sum mentioned by his present Majesty at the inauguration of the Fund has been attained. The Council desire to express their gratitude to all those whose contributions, large or small, have made it possible to achieve this result, and they trust they may receive the public support necessary to maintain this rate of distribution.

The total sum distributed amongst Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria since the foundation of the Fund now exceeds £1,000,000, the exact figure (after deducting grants to the extent of £4,659. 16s. 7d. that have been allowed to lapse) being £1,134,916. 8s. 5d.

The Council desire to express their thanks to the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities, who for eleven years terminating in 1908 placed at their disposal the sum of £1,000 for distribution amongst Convalescent Homes, and thus enabled the Fund to undertake this branch of its work.

Since the inauguration of the Fund the amount spent on administration has been £1.4s.7d. per cent. of the total amount received.

During the year the final instalment of £5,000 was received from the executors of the will of the late Mr. Samuel Lewis on account of the legacy of £250,000 left to the Fund, together

with interest amounting to £8,058. 16s. and a first payment of £70,000 on account of the share of the residue of the estate. Amongst other legacies received were the following: £9,000 from the late Sir George Livesey; £6,837. 16s. 6d., being the balance of the residue of the estate of the late Lieut.-General G. E. Baynes; £5,000 from the late Miss E. S. Wolfe; £3,000 from the late Rev. W. H. Cooper; and £2,000 from the late Mr. Ellis Franklin. The Fund has also to acknowledge an award of £7,348. 17s. 2d. made by the High Court, being the residue of the estate of the late Mr. J. T. Bell, and a donation of £4,775, being one-half of the present available surplus of the Franco-British Exhibition, handed over to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs and placed by him at the disposal of the Fund.

The amounts received in donations and subscriptions, excluding gifts to capital, show, as compared with 1908, an increase of £ 3,090.

The League of Mercy has again contributed £19,000. During the eleven years of its existence the League has furnished in all £135,000 to the Fund. The Council desire to record their grateful appreciation of the labour of the voluntary workers who have contributed towards the collection of this large sum.

His Majesty the King, our Patron, has been pleased to maintain the deep interest in the Fund which he has taken from its inception.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has continued to exercise personal supervision over the work of the Fund. In an Appendix to this Report will be found an account of the proceedings of the General Council meetings on December 13, 1909, and March 3, 1910, at which his Royal Highness presided.

In May, 1909, the Executive Committee, with the approval of his Royal Highness the President, appointed a Sub-Committee, consisting of Lord Richard Cavendish, Chairman, Mr. Griffiths and Mr. Sydney, with Mr. Fry, to consider the question of the Expenses of Charity Entertainments. The Sub-Committee reported that while there was no evidence of widespread extravagance or abuse in this connection, certain precautions were desirable. This report was circulated amongst the hospitals both with a view to assisting them to frame regulations for their own protection and as an indication of the readiness of the Fund to deal with the subject if desired.

Every eligible Hospital and Consumption Sanatorium which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon by the Fund's Visitors, consisting as heretofore of one medical and one layman in each case.

The annual Statistical Report prepared by the Fund, which had previously been printed for private circulation only, has this year been published and placed on sale. The Report now deals with the expenditure on in-patients and out-patients respectively at 66 hospitals, and the Council hope that the wider distribution of the Report may increase public interest in the efforts which are being made in the direction of economy.

The Distribution Committee have continued to make a careful examination of all schemes for the extension or reconstruction of hospitals, submitted in accordance with the request of the Council. The Fund thus uses its best endeavours to ensure that when capital expenditure of this kind is undertaken, due attention is paid to economy, efficiency, the prospect of funds for future maintenance, and the relation of each scheme to the general question of hospital accommodation in London.

The Council observe that the negotiations for the amalgamation of the Throat, Nose and Ear Hospitals have made no progress during the year. While the Fund has again set aside for this purpose a sum considerably in excess of the probable maintenance grants to the separate institutions, the amounts set aside in 1906 and 1907 have now lapsed in accordance with the conditions attaching to grants which remain unapplied for two years.

The Council have approved of a proposal by the Convalescent Homes Committee to enter into negotiations with Consumption Sanatoria in the country with a view to securing beds which could be placed at the disposal of hospitals in London for the accommodation of suitable cases urgently requiring country treatment. It is hoped that during 1910 more than one scheme of this kind will be definitely arranged.

In the last report it was stated that his Royal Highness the President had announced his intention of appointing a Committee to inquire into the system prevailing in the London voluntary hospitals with regard to the admission of out-patients, but that the actual appointment would be deferred until after the Royal Commission on the Poor Laws had issued its report. The whole of the evidence taken by that Commission on the subject of medical relief was not available at the end of the year 1909, but it is hoped that the proposed Committee of Enquiry will be appointed in the course of the year 1910.

The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co. to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year.

The Council are obliged to the Press for the services they have rendered in the past, and continue to rely upon their kindly co-operation in obtaining for the Fund wider publicity and support.

# Appendix to Report of the General Council.

A MEETING of the President and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, for awarding grants to the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria for the present year, was held on December 13, 1909, at Marlborough House, H.R.H. the Prince of Wales being in the chair.

Sir Joseph Dimsdale, Bt., the Rt. Hon. Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt., Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt., Sir W. S. Church, Bt., Sir Julius Wernher, Bt., Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Arthur Bigge, Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Horace Marshall, Sir W. J. Collins, M.P., Sir John Craggs, Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. John G. Griffiths, Professor W. Osler, Mr. Albert G. Sandeman, Mr. Hugh C. Smith.

The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: The Lord-Lieutenant of the County of London (the Duke of Fife), the Duke of Norfolk, the Bishop of Southwark, Archbishop Bourne, Viscount Iveagh, Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, the Speaker of the House of Commons (the Rt. Hon. J. W. Lowther, M.P.), the Master of Elibank, M.P., the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir R. Douglas Powell, Bt.), the Rt. Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt., the Rt. Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel, the Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P., Mr. J. Danvers Power, Mr. Frederick M. Fry, Mr. William Latham, K.C., Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, jun.

LORD ROTHSCHILD reported that the amount received by the Fund to December 9, after payment of expenses, was £133,977 5s. 4d.

SIR HENRY BURDETT stated that although it had not been a good year for small contributions, and there had been various other difficulties, the League of Mercy would be able to renew its contribution of £19,000 to the Fund. The amount distributed by the League to hospitals in the home counties had been increased to £1,980, thus making a total of practically £21,000. He thought this was a remarkably good result, and reflected great credit on all the workers of the League, and also on its new Secretary.

The Prince of Wales said: My Lords and Gentlemen,—You will all be delighted to hear what Sir Henry Burdett has said with regard to the League of Mercy. I know the extreme difficulty that there is in collecting these small sums, and I am sure you will agree that the results are most satisfactory.

The PRINCE OF WALES, in moving the adoption of the Reports and Awards, said :-- My Lords and Gentlemen,—The interesting reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees, to which we have listened, will, I hope, be considered satisfactory, and I have much pleasure in moving their adoption. The largest donation received during the year was one of £4,775, representing one-half of the present available surplus of the Franco-British Exhibition. Our best thanks are due to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, in whose hands the disposal of this sum was left, for having given it to the Fund. The legacies this year have not equalled the exceptional amounts received in 1907 and 1908. by following the practice adopted in those years of distributing a proportion based approximately on a five years' average of the amount received from this source, it has been possible, with due regard to the future, to distribute the sum of £150,000 this year. This amount has more than once been publicly referred to as our aim. It was mentioned in the King's letter inaugurating the Fund, and was alluded to by Lord Mount Stephen when he made his last munificent donation of £ 100,000 to capital. Its attainment, therefore, represents, like the distribution of £50,000 in 1900, and £100,000 in 1902, a landmark in the history of the Fund. It is my pleasing duty to convey to you from the King the expression of his gratification at this achievement, upon which his Majesty offers us his hearty congratulations. it does not follow that a distribution of £150,000 can be maintained without effort. The income from investments is not yet £70,000, and for the balance we have to rely upon annual subscriptions, donations, including the contributions of the League of Mercy, and legacies. I am sorry to find that there has been a diminution in the annual subscriptions. It is to be hoped that this may only be a temporary loss, and that with a revival of trade there may be a corresponding increase in our income obtained from this source.

The reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees give evidence, as usual, of the care with which these Committees do their work. It must not be forgotten that while the awards are made in respect of work done in the current year, the financial statistics upon which they are based must necessarily be derived from the audited accounts of the previous year. The study of these accounts shows that while the year 1908 did not prove to be so bad as was anticipated, the demands on the Fund were considerably greater than in 1907. In three or four cases you will notice that the Distribution Committee recommend that the Fund should make specially large grants to hospitals which were in pecuniary difficulties and were hampered by debt. These grants are not recommended without most careful inquiry. I think that the power of assisting institutions in exceptional difficulties, after such inquiries, is of the greatest benefit to the hospitals generally. The report of the Distribution Committee calls attention to two successful amalgamations—that of the Orthopædic Hospitals and that of the Hampstead and North-West London Hospitals; and I am sure that the Council will be right in making substantial grants to these amalgamated institutions. I regret that the hope expressed last year of similar action on the part of the Throat, Nose, and Ear hospitals has not yet been fulfilled. The Distribution Committee's recommendation for this year, if confirmed, will slightly diminish the total amount set aside for this amalgamation. That amount, I think, still exceeds the individual grants which would probably have been made to the separate hospitals.

It will be noticed that the consideration of proposals for the extension or improvement of hospital accommodation has again occupied the attention of the Distribution Committee. These schemes arise from the necessity for hospitals to keep pace with the improvements in medical science; and from the growth or shifting of population both in the centre and in the suburbs. The examination of them has added greatly to the labours of the Committee. After reading the minutes of each meeting, I can bear witness to the time and trouble expended on this work, no scheme of any magnitude being passed without

a visit and report by members of the Committee specially deputed. The work of the Convalescent Homes Committee, which for many years was limited to the distribution of the generous donation of £1,000 from the London Parochial Charities, is now extended to dealing with the amount voted by the Council for convalescent homes and consumption sanatoria. Considering the enormous demand for accommodation in the country for consumption patients from the London hospitals, it is much to be regretted that the possible openings in this direction are at present so few. I trust that the managers of existing or of future sanatoria within reach of London will appreciate the readiness of the Committee to enter into negotiations to secure beds for the accommodation of patients from metropolitan hospitals.

The Executive Committee have this year had under consideration the question of the expenses of charity entertainments. On their recommendation I appointed a special sub-committee which, under the chairmanship of Lord Richard Cavendish, collected evidence on the subject and presented a report published last August. The conclusion arrived at was that, while there was no evidence of widespread extravagance or abuse, there were certain dangers to be avoided, and these the report dealt with in detail. It is by no means easy to suggest rules to enable hospitals to protect their interests without hampering the legitimate and valuable efforts of their friends. The Executive Committee, I think wisely, decided not to lay down definite regulations, but to circulate the report, thus hoping to assist the hospitals in framing their own regulations, and to elicit their views as to further action by the Fund in the matter.

You will remember that last year the appointment of the proposed committee of inquiry into the out-patient question was postponed pending the issue of the report of the Poor Law Commission. Much of the evidence taken by that Commission on the question of medical relief is now available, and I trust that it may be possible to appoint the committee in the coming year. It is to be hoped that before that time Mr. Fry, whose absence to-day we all regret, will be fully restored to health. His illness, originally resulting from an accident incurred while travelling to London on the business of the Fund, has, I fear, been aggravated by the work connected with the meetings of the Distribution Committee.

And now, in the name of the Council, I ask the honorary officials and members of the League of Mercy to accept our hearty thanks for their strenuous and most successful efforts, by which the Fund has benefited to the amount of £19,000 this year. To the honorary officials of the Fund itself we owe a special debt of gratitude. The yearly increase of their work only seems to call forth from them redoubled zeal and readiness to cope with it. To Mr. Maynard, our efficient and hard working secretary, I offer our best thanks. We have sustained great loss in the deaths of Mr. Clutton and Mr. Marcus Gunn, both eminent in their profession, who had for many years rendered invaluable service to the Fund as members of our Board of Visitors. I now have the pleasure of moving the adoption of the reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees.

The Bishop of London, in seconding the adoption of the reports, said that he was certain that he would be expressing the opinion of all the Council if he first offered his Royal Highness their heartiest congratulations on the magnificent result that had been achieved by the Fund in distributing the sum of £150,000. He thought that result was largely owing to the personal interest that his Royal Highness had always taken in the Fund. He would only mention two points. His work took him about from one hospital to another, and it was quite impossible to over-estimate the encouragement which these grants gave to the struggling institutions, and the way in which they drew forth subscriptions. But apart from stimulating other subscriptions, the Council was filling a very long desired place as a central board for

improving hospital management, and he had himself found over and over again improvements that he wished to see put into force, accomplished by means of the Fund. He felt quite certain that the Council under his Royal Highness's presidency was increasing the confidence of the charitable public in these institutions altogether, and he had very great pleasure in seconding the adoption of the reports.

The adoption of the reports was then put and carried unanimously.

On the motion of the Chairman of the London County Council (Sir R. Melvill Beachcroft), seconded by Lord Revelstoke, it was resolved that the cheques for the grants should be posted on December 16.

On the motion of the Earl of Bessedrough, seconded by the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Mr. Henry T. Butlin) a recommendation of the Executive Committee on the subject of rules and regulations was adopted.

#### ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1910.

H.R.H. the President then said: My Lords and Gentlemen,—I intend to appoint the same members of the General Council who have served this year to serve again, with the addition of the following:—Lord Sandhurst, Canon Barnett, and Sir Cooper Perry. With regard to the Committees, I intend, later on, to reappoint the present members of these with very few changes. I regret that we shall lose the services of three gentlemen who are unable to continue to serve—Sir Trevor Lawrence, who has given us the best of his time for many years past on the Distribution Committee, and Lord Richard Cavendish and Canon Barnett, who, though only recently appointed, have been useful members on the Executive and Distribution Committees respectively. We now have to consider the resolution delegating powers to the Finance, Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees. The delegation resolutions as amended last year have worked well, and if the Council is willing to reaffirm them now the proceedings at the meeting in the new year need only be formal. With reference to the Executive Committee it is necessary to add a clause empowering the Committee to provide for the expenses of the out-patient inquiry.

On the motion of Lord Farquhar, seconded by Sir Edgar Speyer, a resolution was approved delegating powers to the Finance, Distribution, and Convalescent Homes Committees.

On the motion of Sir Joseph Dimsdale, seconded by the Governor of the Bank of England, a resolution was approved delegating powers to the Executive Committee.

HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS then moved:—"That the keys of the lock under which the corporate seal is kept be held as follows:—One of the three keys comprising one triplicate set shall be held respectively by the Earl of Bessborough, the Lord Rothschild, and Mr. Frederick M. Fry, and one of the three keys comprising the other triplicate set shall be held respectively by Sir Savile Crossley, Mr. John G. Griffiths, and Mr. Hugh Colin Smith."

The motion was seconded by the CHIEF RABBI and carried.

The Lord Mayor (Sir JOHN KNILL) said he had the great pleasure and the great honour of proposing a vote of thanks to his Royal Highness for presiding. He knew the keen interest his Royal Highness took in the Fund, and would ask the Council to join with him in giving thanks.

Sir William Collins said that he had great pleasure in seconding the resolution and in thanking his Royal Highness for the gracious and encouraging words which had fallen from him that day. Also, as an honorary officer of the League of Mercy, he would like to thank his Royal Highness for the handsome encomium he had passed on the work of the League. That work was carried out now in a larger number of districts than before, and during the 10 or 11 years in which it had been at work the League had handed over to the King's Hospital Fund the sum of £135,000. Only those who worked as honorary officers of the Fund and of the League of Mercy knew how incalculable the personal interest taken by his Royal Highness, and by other members of the Royal Family, in this work was in maintaining and consolidating it, and on behalf of the Council and of the League he had the greatest pleasure in seconding the vote of thanks to his Royal Highness.

The vote was carried by acclamation.

The PRINCE OF WALES said:—My Lords and Gentlemen,—I beg to thank the Lord Mayor and Sir William Collins for the kind words they have used in proposing and seconding the vote of thanks to me. It is always a great pleasure to me to have this meeting held in my house, and especially so when we can all congratulate ourselves upon the very prosperous state of the Fund.

The proceedings then terminated.

The Annual Meeting of the President and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, to receive the accounts and the report of the General Council for the year 1909, was held at Marlborough House on March 3, 1910, his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, President of the Fund, being in the chair.

Lowther, M.P.), the Master of Elibank, M.P., the President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (the Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor), the Chairman of the County Council (Sir R. Melvill Beachcroft), the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir R. Douglas Powell, Bt.), the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Mr. Henry T. Butlin), the Rt. Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt. (hon. secretary), the Rt. Hon. Sir Joseph Dimsdale, Bt., the Rt. Hon. Mr. Thomas Burt, M.P., Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt., Sir W. S. Church, Bt., Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Arthur Bigge, Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Horace Marshall, Sir Cooper Perry, Sir John Craggs, Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. Frederick M. Fry (hon. secretary), Mr. John G. Griffiths, Mr. William Latham, K.C., and Mr. Albert G. Sandeman.

The Minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following:—The Lord Lieutenant of the County of London (the Duke of Fife), the Bishop of London, the Bishop of Southwark, the Earl of Bessborough, the Postmaster-General (the Rt. Hon. Herbert Samuel, M.P.), the Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. Reginald E. Johnston), the Rt. Hon. Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt., Sir Julius Wernher, Bt., Mr. J. Danvers Power, Canon Barnett, Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, jun., Professor W. Osler, and Mr. Hugh C. Smith.

#### THE BALANCE-SHEET.

Lord Rothschild (the Hon. Treasurer) in presenting the account of receipts and expenditure and the Balance-sheet for the year ending December 31, 1909, said he would, with his Royal Highness's permission, venture to make just two remarks. The amount of receipts in 1909, including additions to capital, was £258,926 35. 2d., a considerable amount although less than the amount received in some years, and the expenditure was £153,000. Since the end of the year they had so far received £31,000, as against £30,000 last year, and he had also learnt from the newspapers, that sums amounting to about £30,000 had been left to the Fund. Owing to the constitution of the Fund now, all moneys given or left without any specific direction could only be invested in trust securities; but if the donor or testator wished them to be invested in non-trust securities that could be done. In that way they held at the present moment a considerable amount of non-trust securities, and the effect of that was that the King's Hospital Fund benefited to the extent of £16,000 a year more from their investments in non-trust securities than would have been the case if the moneys had been invested in trust securities.

The Prince of Wales formally moved the adoption of the Accounts.

Lord Strathcona said he had the honour of seconding the adoption of the accounts. The result of the working of the Fund was an even better one than last year, and he was sure that his Royal Highness and all concerned might heartily congratulate themselves upon it.

The resolution, having been supported by Sir Henry Burdett, was then put and carried unanimously.

#### REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL.

Sir Savile Crossley (hon. secretary) read the draft report of the Council for the year 1909.

The Prince of Wales, in moving the adoption of the Report, said:—My Lords and Gentlemen,—It is always a great pleasure to me to preside at our annual meeting, and all the more so when I move the adoption of so satisfactory a Report as that presented to us to-day. As the Distribution Meeting of the Council in December is the recognised occasion for reference to the events of the year, I will only now mention two points which seem to me of special interest in the report. I think we are justified in congratulating ourselves upon the fact that the total sum distributed among Hospitals, Convalescent Homes, and Sanatoria since the foundation of the Fund, thirteen years ago, now exceeds one million sterling, the exact figures being £1,134,916 8s. 5d. I would like to refer to the satisfactory list of legacies received during the past year, amounting to £46,400, not including £75,000 from the estate of the late Mr. Samuel Lewis, from which latter source the Fund has benefited to the extent of £328,000. As I said in December, with reference to the Committee of Inquiry into the system prevailing in the London voluntary hospitals with regard to the admission of out-patients, I hope that it may be appointed during this year and commence work at the beginning of 1911. I have now much pleasure in moving the adoption of the report.

Miller General Hospital for South-East London, £289, being the balance of a grant of £1,250 to extension.

Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest, £1,000 granted to open a fund for a Country Sanatorium.

The Committee recommend that the unpaid balances of the grants to the East London Hospital for Children and the Miller General Hospital should be renewed. With reference to the Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest they are informed that the governing body of the Hospital have not been able to see their way to undertake a scheme for the provision of a Country Sanatorium. Under the circumstances they recommend that the grant should lapse, but they are glad to hear that the Convalescent Homes Committee of the Fund are making enquiries with a view to a scheme by which in certain existing Sanatoria beds might be made available for patients from metropolitan hospitals.

(7) In connection with the resolution of the General Council requesting hospitals which are contemplating extension or reconstruction to submit their proposals to the Fund, the Committee have again had before them several schemes of greater or less magnitude. To some of these the Committee have raised no objection, in some they have suggested modifications, while two or three are still under consideration. In two cases, however, the schemes appeared to be open to such serious objections on general grounds that the Committee felt compelled to recommend that the approval of the Fund should be withheld.

In one case, that of the National Hospital for Diseases of the Heart, it was proposed to rebuild and enlarge the Hospital at a cost of £25,000. It is admitted that the present building is unsuitable for the purposes of a hospital, but considering the demands now made upon the charitable public for the maintenance and improvement of hospital accommodation in London, the Committee could not recommend a scheme for the expenditure of a large sum of money in making special provision for cases which can be equally well treated elsewhere.

The other case raised the question of the proper method of supplying the need for a general hospital in Woolwich. In their last report the Committee emphasised the policy adopted by the Fund of assisting in the provision of hospital accommodation in the outlying districts, and they consider that the special circumstances of Woolwich give that neighbourhood a strong claim upon the assistance of the Fund. The Committee, however, saw grave objections to the particular scheme laid before them, which contemplated the gradual evolution of a hospital out of general wards connected with and subordinate to a small institution primarily designed for the training of midwives. The Committee consider that the first step towards meeting the needs of Woolwich should be the formulation of a scheme for the provision of an independent general hospital of fair size, to which any other kindred objects should be subordinate, and they have announced their readiness, in the event of a representative movement in this direction, to afford substantial assistance.

(8) In further connection with the provision of hospital accommodation in the outlying

districts of London, the Committee are of opinion that the needs of Wimbledon would be better served by one adequate hospital than by two independent institutions for which separate building schemes are proposed.

- (9) The sum of £5,000 voted towards the removal of King's College Hospital to South London increases the total amount contributed by the Fund to this object to £32,000.
- (10) The Reports of the Visitors, which every year prove of increasing value, have as heretofore received most careful consideration by the Committee, and many of their observations have been brought to the notice of the managers of the hospitals concerned; nor have the Committee failed to call attention to instances in which the Statistical Report affords evidence that considerably greater economy might be exercised without impairment of efficiency.

The details of the awards to the various hospitals are appended.

The Duke of Norfolk, in seconding the motion, said he was sure they all echoed the expression of his Royal Highness's satisfaction that the Fund had now reached the point that his Majesty had in his mind and in his heart when he first promoted it. That was a matter of the keenest satisfaction to all of them.

The Rev. T. Bowman Stephenson said he very heartily supported the resolution. It seemed to him that the Fund had conquered, so to speak, its proper position among charities and that it was becoming the very good habit of many in considering the disposal of their fortunes to set aside some fair portion for this great and wonderful Fund. It also seemed to him that the Fund was exercising a most healthy influence upon hospital administration. Whilst they did not attempt to interfere with the internal management of hospitals, yet, in a quiet way and a way least likely to give offence, hospital administration was being continually improved.

The resolution was then put and carried unanimously.

The Speaker of the House of Commons (the Rt. Hon. James W. Lowther, M.P.), in moving a vote of thanks to the Prince of Wales for presiding, said that they might all congratulate themselves upon the marvellous success which had been achieved by the Fund as shown by the Report, which had been so well received and which had created so much satisfaction amongst them all. He was sure that he was not only expressing the opinion of all in that room, but he believed also of all the inhabitants of the metropolis, when he said how much they were indebted to his Royal Highness for the great personal interest which he had shown in the Fund, and that if it had not been for that element so great a success would not have been achieved by this time, if ever. He concluded by expressing, on his own behalf, and he was sure on behalf of all, their sincere thanks to his Royal Highness, both for the great interest he had always taken in the Fund, and for presiding over the meeting of the Council that day.

The vote was seconded by the MASTER OF ELIBANK, and carried by acclamation.

HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS said:—My Lords and Gentlemen,—I wish to express my warmest thanks for the kind vote of thanks which you have just passed.

The proceedings then terminated.

## Report of the Distribution Committee.

- (1) The Council having this year placed the sum of £147,000 in the hands of the Committee for distribution amongst the London Hospitals, as against £135,000 in 1908, the Committee beg to report as follows:—
  - (2) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is 104, as against 105 last year.
- (3) In the new building of the Royal National Orthopædic Hospital opened by his Majesty the King in July last, 130 out of the 200 beds for which the Hospital is designed are already available for use. This represents a further stage in the amalgamation of the Orthopædic Hospitals. In addition to the grant for maintenance, the Committee have recommended a substantial sum towards the reduction of the debt on the new building.
- (4) The amalgamation of the Hampstead and North-West London Hospitals is now complete. The Out-patient Department, with a few beds for emergencies, will be maintained in the poor district of Kentish Town formerly served by the North-West London Hospital, while the In-patient Department of the combined institutions is situated upon the higher ground of Hampstead. The Committee, in addition to making a maintenance grant, have now set aside the sum of £3,000 on account of the grants promised in connection with the reconstruction of the Out-patient Department.
- (5) With regard to the Throat, Nose, and Ear Hospitals, no steps so far as the Committee are aware have been taken during the year in the direction of amalgamation. The Committee in their last report recommended that the sums set aside for this purpose in past years should not be held over indefinitely, and they consider that the time has now come to apply to these awards the rule that grants for special purposes should be reconsidered every two years if they remain unapplied. The Committee, therefore, while setting aside the sum of £2,500 as the grant this year towards the amalgamation, recommend that the grants of £1,000 made in 1906 and £2,000 made in 1907 should now lapse.
- (6) The following grants made in 1907 for special purposes and retained in accordance with the rule also remain unapplied:—

East London Hospital for Children, £618. 16s. 6d., being the balance of a grant of £1,000 to improvements.

# Report of the Convalescent Homes Committee.

- (1) The Council have this year placed the sum of £3,000 in the hands of the Committee for distribution amongst Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria. This makes, with the sum of £1,000 set aside last year for Consumption Sanatoria but not allocated, a total distribution of £4,000, as against £5,000 provided for in 1908, of which only £4,000 was actually distributed.
- (2) The number of applications eligible for consideration amounted to 37 from Convalescent Homes and 4 from Consumption Sanatoria, as against 33 and 5 respectively last year.
- (3) The Committee have received new applications from several Convalescent Homes, to most of which grants are recommended in consideration of the number of London patients admitted during the past year. At the same time the Committee have adhered to some extent to their original policy of giving special consideration to the Convalescent Homes closely connected with London Hospitals.
- (4) The Committee regret again to have to report the smallness of the number of applications from Consumption Sanatoria, and the very limited opportunities which have hitherto presented themselves for assisting by means of grants in the provision of additional beds for the immediate accommodation of those patients in London Hospitals who urgently need country treatment.
- (5) The Committee, however, have under consideration proposals for securing for patients in London Hospitals the right of admission to a certain number of beds at a Sanatorium now in course of erection. Should this Sanatorium upon inspection by the Fund's Visitors be found to be eligible for a grant on this basis, the Committee hope to be in a position to make a recommendation next year. They trust that this scheme, if successful, may lead to the conclusion of similar arrangements elsewhere, and that this possibility may be borne in mind by the promoters of Sanatoria within reach of London. In cases, for instance, where a larger number of beds could be opened at a Sanatorium without proportionate additional expenditure upon the administrative sections or increase in the fixed charges, such an arrangement might well result in greater economy in the management of the Sanatorium, besides saving the extra cost of erecting and maintaining separate establishments for London patients.
- (6) The Committee would again express their indebtedness to the Visitors who undertook the inspection of Consumption Sanatoria in the country, and whose reports have been of the greatest value.

The grants recommended to the various institutions are appended.




