REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1904.

THE sums received during 1904, in addition to interest from investments (£26,955. 17s. 3d.), were as follows: Donations, £8,486. 19s. 6d.; Annual Subcriptions, £33,316. 10s. 1d.; from the League of Mercy, £14,000. The total income of the Fund from general sources amounted to £85,202. 14s. 5d. There was also received £12. 19s. 5d. on Capital Account; and £13,873. 3s. 6d. for the 'Additional £14,000 Permanent Income Fund.'

When towards the latter part of the year it became necessary to decide upon the sum that should be placed at the disposal of the Distribution Committee £80,000 was fixed upon, this being an amount which, at that time, seemed likely to exceed the general receipts for the year. Very gratifying additional support was subsequently received, and the Council were able to carry forward a surplus of about £3,000, instead of having to report a deficiency. It must be remembered, however, that in 1903 £100,000 was distributed, an amount which exceeded the income of that year by £18,751. 9s.

The amounts received in donations and subscriptions during the year show an increase of £886. 14s. 7d., as compared with 1903; and in addition the League of Mercy has contributed £14,000, being £4,000 more than in the previous year. During the six years of its existence the League has furnished in all £46,000 to the Fund. To all voluntary workers who have contributed towards this increasing success the Council desire to express their grateful acknowledgments.

The Council regret that they were unable to raise the sum (equal to at least £300,000) which was necessary in order to enable His Royal Highness the President to take advantage of the munificent offer of an anonymous donor announced in March last. In a year during which so many other pressing appeals were before the public the task was beyond their powers; and, recognising this, they thought it better not to enter upon the extensive operations which are, in any case, inseparable from the collection of a sum of such magnitude from the general public. They, however, lost no opportunity of submitting the matter to persons with

whom the ordinary business of the Fund brings them into contact, and in addition three appeals were made by means of letters to the various newspapers.

His Majesty the King, our Patron, has been pleased to continue the deep interest in the Fund which he has taken from its inception; and His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, our President, has exercised continuous personal supervision over the work of the Fund. In Appendix I. to this Report will be found the speeches made by His Royal Highness at the meetings of the General Council on December 19, 1904, and March 29, 1905.

By the invitation of His Royal Highness the President, Mr. Edgar Speyer has been added to the General Council and Mr. J. Danvers Power appointed one of the Honorary Secretaries.

Every eligible Hospital which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon.

The Council have steadily discouraged any efforts to increase the number of small special Hospitals in London, and they consider that attempts to reduce by means of amalgamation the number of such Hospitals already in existence should be continued. It is far from their desire to discourage charitable effort; but in the interests of economy and efficiency they appeal to the authorities of the smaller Hospitals to consider most carefully the advantages which would be derived from amalgamation.

The subject of general economy has occupied the attention of the Council during the past year. A Statistical Report dealing with the expenditure of the sixteen largest General Hospitals was prepared. The object of this Report was to supply from a central source information as to expenditure and prices. The Council desire to acknowledge the assistance and support which their efforts in this direction have received from the Hospitals, and they are glad to know that the information provided has, in a number of cases, resulted in various savings.

The increasing sums which of late years some Hospitals have paid to, or on behalf of, their medical schools, rendered it necessary for the Fund to respond to the general desire that it should institute inquiries into the matter. A Committee, consisting of Sir Edward Fry (Chairman); Lord Welby, and the Bishop of Stepney, was appointed to report on the whole subject, and commenced its duties early in November. Their Report had not been received up to December 31.

In conclusion the Council again relies upon the kindly co-operation of the Press in obtaining for the work of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London yet wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

AT a meeting of the General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, held at Marlborough House on December 19, 1904, for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals and Convalescent Homes for the year 1904, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, in moving the adoption of the Report, said :—

It is my pleasing duty as President of the Fund to move the adoption of the Report of the Distribution Committee, with that of the Executive Committee, which we have just heard read. In so doing I note with pleasure that, as we are receiving a larger sum from the League of Mercy than we anticipated, it is not now necessary to draw on our reserve, as we at first feared, in order to distribute $\pounds 80,000$, and, in fact, I am glad to say we have a small surplus, which will be used towards replacing, though only to a slight extent, the $\pounds 18,000$ odd taken from the reserve last year. Let me take this opportunity of expressing the deep gratification we all feel that the League of Mercy is growing in strength and popularity, and I should like to congratulate those whose labours have produced this result. It is satisfactory to feel that the League is becoming firmly established, and its work more understood and appreciated.

In reviewing the results of this year's work I must refer to what was said last year, when we distributed $\pounds_{100,000}$ by drawing on our available balance for that purpose to the extent of $\pounds_{18,751}$. 9s. I then pointed out that we drew that large sum from our reserves for one year only, and I expressed a hope that we might receive increased contributions to enable us to distribute an equal sum this year, without any encroachment on our reserves. These hopes were subsequently further raised by the munificent offer of an anonymous donor, who promised us a gift which would increase our permanent income by $\pounds_{4,668}$ a year, provided twice this amount were raised before the end of this year. That condition unfortunately has not been fulfilled. As I anticipated last year, the public are now confronted with appeals for over $\pounds_{1,000,000}$ in connection with hospitals in London. There is, of course, a limit to what the charitable public can do, and we have had to cut our coat according to our cloth. We are only able this year to distribute $\pounds_{80,000}$, including the $\pounds_{1,000}$ which the London Parochial Charities generously continue to entrust to us for allotment to convalescent homes. This sum is, I am only too well aware, insufficient to enable us to fulfil our original object. We could easily distribute $\pounds_{150,000}$ a year to hospitals which require the money, and would put it to good use. In the meantime I venture to think that a means may be found of increasing the amount at the disposal of the hospitals for carrying on their ever-growing work.

It must be remembered that, if the expenditure of the hospitals can be decreased, without impairing the extent or efficiency of the work they do, the result would be even more satisfactory than an increase in the money subscribed to support the hospitals. (Hear, hear.) Waste of all kinds is a bad thing, and, as I have before pointed out, some of the hospitals certainly fail in the point of economy. This is a matter of the utmost importance, and one with which this Fund most properly concerns itself. Our object, however, is to help, not to hinder, to encourage, not to chill, the work of charity; and to do this by offering friendly assistance to those hospitals which, as we think, might save money by a few slight alterations in their arrangements. I feel sure those who are generously giving their time to the administrative work of our hospitals would accept the advice we offer in the spirit in which it is meant, even though on examination, it might not be found to apply to their particular case. This year a beginning has been made in the direction I have indicated. A statistical report has been prepared on the expenditure of the sixteen largest general hospitals, which alone received more than half our grants last And in doing so we have supplied ourselves with information which no one hospital could be vear. expected to provide on its own account. That report shows some remarkable results. It gives the average expenditure of these sixteen hospitals on those branches of expenditure over which control exists. And the aggregate value of the sums paid in excess of these averages works out to no less than £39,400 for the year 1903. We do not say that that sum can all be saved at once. But no doubt every hospital will realise that a large saving could be effected by making sure that no other institution is, in similar circumstances, doing the same work as its own, equally well, and at a lower cost. (Hear, hear.) We have done all in our power to provide the necessary information by giving the comparative prices of the principal goods used in the different hospitals. Some of the discrepancies are certainly worth serious consideration. By way of example I would mention that there is a difference of no less than $3\frac{1}{4}d$. per pound between the highest and the lowest prices paid for the same description of beef, of $3\frac{1}{2}d$. per pound for legs of mutton, of 1s. 1d. in the price of fowls, of 23d. per gallon in the price of milk, and of 7d. per pound in the price of tea. In drugs and household articles there are similar discrepancies. There may be reasons to account for some of these differences, and all we ask for is careful inquiry on the part of each hospital. I am glad to hear that in the case of one of the largest and best managed hospitals our efforts have been gratefully acknowledged, and that, as a result of the comparisons we have provided, various economies have been effected which have resulted in a considerable saving. (Hear, hear.) With regard to the question of prices paid, it is obvious that a large contract has a considerable advantage over a small one. For this reason I merely venture to throw out as a suggestion the possibility of some of the smaller hospitals combining to make a large contract, and thus gaining the advantage enjoyed by the larger institutions. If this is feasible, and the assistance of some outside body is required to organise the preliminary arrangements, I am quite certain that our Committee would gladly give every assistance in their power by encouraging hospital managers to meet and discuss the question.

There is another matter to which I must briefly allude. The anonymous donor, in his letter to me, referred to the question of money subscribed to the relief of the sick poor being used for the purposes of medical education, and he expressed a hope that, as President, I would endeavour to prevent any of the fund being thus diverted. The doubts which evidently exist in the mind of the anonymous donor were also shared by some other members of the fund. The question is one which cannot be settled off-hand. For there are proper considerations which may be urged both for and against a contribution from the general funds of a hospital to the funds of its medical school. We have, therefore, thought it best to appoint a committee, consisting of Lord Welby, Sir Edward Fry, and the Bishop of Stepney. I am glad to say that Committee has commenced its labours, that it is receiving every assistance from those who are able to set all sides of the question before it, and I feel confident that a report by three such eminent men will be of the greatest value in assisting us to come to a right conclusion. We have, therefore, shown our subscribers that we are endeavouring, as far as possible, to assist the hospitals to lay out our grants economically, and to husband their resources ; that we are willing to help them, if they so desire, to settle any vexed question that may arise with regard to difficulties of administration, whether internal or external, or on matters concerning reconstruction, removal, or amalgamation.

The question remains: Can we increase our income and, therefore, their income? I must own myself greatly disappointed at the results of our appeal for the sum necessary to enable us to accept the generous offer of my anonymous friend. Whether he may be willing to extend, beyond the end of this year, the period in which we may collect for this object, I cannot say. I trust he may do so; for I confess that there is, to my mind, no better form of charity; and I would, while we are still in 1904, appeal once more to those who desire to see their gifts economically and wisely distributed, to help us to accept the offer. In these times of depression in trade, there are, I know well, great difficulties. But I am convinced that sooner or later the working of this fund will be appreciated at the proper value. I trust sooner.

As your President I wish to thank all the members of the Visiting Committee for their most valuable reports. Also the members of the Distribution Committees. I know their labours have been complex and often But I trust none of them will grudge the days given up from their business to the service of the onerous. Fund. The work of compiling the statistical report, has been very severe. I must take this opportunity of conveying to the Honorary Secretaries, and especially to Mr. Danvers Power, what I am sure all privileged to see the report will desire to express, our warmest thanks and appreciation of the statistics so accurately compiled. (Hear, hear.)

The King wishes me to assure you of his unabated interest in the work of the fund which he founded. His Majesty is gratified at the considerable advance made by the League of Mercy, and has noted with satisfaction that in the year's contribution one of the largest increases has been in a district the lady president of which is a near member of his family. I beg now to move the adoption of the report. (Hear, hear.)

At the Annual Meeting of the General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, held at Marlborough House on March 29, 1905, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, in moving the adoption of the Report of the Council for the year 1904, said :---

In moving the adoption of the Report for the year 1904 it will be advisable first to refer to our financial position. The available income for the year amounted to $\pounds 85,200$, but of this, $\pounds 4,000$ is accounted for by the unexpected increase in the sum which we received from the League of Mercy, which was $\pounds_{14,000}$, against $\pounds_{10,000}$ in the year 1903. This increase of $\pounds_{4,000}$ a year is a wonderful testimony to the expansion of the League, and of the growing appreciation of its work by the public. The Council fully realise what a valuable auxiliary it has become to the King's Fund, and I take this opportunity of again expressing my gratitude to all the workers of the League through whose efforts such remarkable results have been achieved. When our grants were considered by the Distribution Committee it was anticipated that our income would only be a little over £80,000, and therefore we fixed that sum for distribution last year. I not only wish to congratulate the League of Mercy on their splendid contribution, but also the Council on our having been able this year to replace part of the sum taken from reserve in the year 1903, when \pounds 100,000 was distributed, although the total receipts for that year were under £84,000. Our subscriptions and donations for 1904 show an increase of something under £900, and I sincerely trust that this year the general public will respond even more liberally to our efforts. The amounts due from small sums, though so valuable in the aggregate, have not shown the same increase as the contributions of large sums which we continue to receive. We must attach great importance to adding to the number of our subscribers. I am, however, especially grateful for the munificence of my ever-generous friend; Lord Mount Stephen, whose gift of securities to the value of £200,000 was announced after the accounts for 1904 were closed. (Hear, hear.) I also wish to acknowledge with sincere thanks the conditional offer received from Mr. Marshall, which will be equivalent to a gift of £12,000 if his condition is complied with. This condition has reference to our immediate aim, which is to assure for the Fund a permanent income from investments-apart altogether from subscriptions and donations—of £50,000 per annum. With this sum we could practically make sure of being able to distribute $\pounds_{100,000}$ a year among the London Hospitals. Lord Mount Stephen's gift brought us to within a capital sum of £30,000 of this goal. Mr. Marshall's offer provides £12,000 of this amount. Sir Charles Tennant has given us £3,000 to capital, so that only £15,000 is required by July 31, to enable us to accomplish our object. But even then we shall not rest on our oars. The King, in his letter written at the inauguration of the Fund, stated that a sum of £100,000 to £150,000 was required annually to place the Hospitals on a sound financial basis. Since then the population of London has

grown, its building area has been enlarged, hospital requirements have increased. To meet these growing demands I am convinced that our aim must be to provide from the King's Fund an income from all sources which will permit of an annual distribution among the London Hospitals of at least $\pounds_{150,000}$ a year. This was the original intention of the King when he initiated the Fund, and my earnest efforts will be directed towards the fulfilment of that object, which is as near as ever to the heart of the founder. I confidently trust that others will come forward to help us. That their money will be well bestowed they may rest assured, and it is most satisfactory to know that the expenses of the Fund are only a little over 2 per cent. on the total amount collected in spite of the increased work we are now undertaking in different directions. (Hear, hear.)

I turn from the question of finance to other matters referred to in the Report, the first of which is the subject of the amalgamation of small special hospitals. It must not be forgotten that the present number and position of the various hospitals in London are, to a great extent, the chance result of efforts extending over many years, and based on no general scheme under the guidance of one authority. Doubtless, this was unavoidable because no means existed of dealing with the establishment and distribution of London Hospitals as a whole, and probably the question had not become pressing when most of the smaller hospitals were founded. The growth of London and the increasing claims of charity have now compelled all who are specially interested in hospital work to consider every suggestion which tends towards either economy or increased usefulness. There is one such suggestion which seems worthy of consideration, namely, whether hospitals which devote themselves to the work of curing one special disease should not be carried on under as few roofs as possible, and whether, as time goes on, a judicious reduction of the total number of small hospitals might not be advantageously effected. The difficulties of promoting amalgamation, however, are very great. Everyone must sympathise with those who, having for many years given their time and money to maintain a hospital in which they are interested, feel reluctant to consent to its absorption by a larger establishment, where its identity would be lost. I need scarcely say that the King's Fund only concerns itself with amalgamations in connection with requests for grants. Our object is not merely to initiate reforms, but rather to act as faithful trustees of the money subscribed by the public through the Fund.

It is not necessary now to add much to the remarks I made on the subject of hospital economies at the Distribution Meeting last December. All we do is to offer for the consideration of the hospitals any information we are able to provide. It is satisfactory to find that in the great majority of cases our efforts have been received entirely in the spirit in which they were made. I was particularly pleased to observe that the London Hospital sent representatives to inquire into the expenditure and the arrangements of some of the Hospitals in Scotland and the North of England, for the purpose of comparison. We shall issue the Statistical Report again this year, when it will have the benefit of additions and improvements for which we shall be indebted to the co-operation of the hospital managers themselves. This Report is as yet only known to the members of the Council and Committees, and to the hospitals directly concerned. I hope that it may be possible some day to make it public; for I believe, by what I hear from those who have studied it, that its usefulness will be generally recognised, and that the credit of its initiation must benefit the King's Fund and attract the sympathies of all who desire that the money they give in charity shall be made to go as far as possible. For the present, however, publication would not be fair to some of the hospitals concerned. A reasonable period must be allowed to enable them to take whatever advantage they can find in the particulars now supplied to them for the first time. But I hope that sooner or later all objections to publication will be removed, and that its usefulness will be extended to hospitals generally.

Although the Report of the Medical Schools Committee, consisting of the Bishop of Stepney and Lord Welby, under the chairmanship of Sir Edward Fry, had not come to hand at the end of last year, I cannot address you to-day without expressing our best thanks to them for having so willingly undertaken the

arduous duties which thus devolved upon them. We may indeed congratulate ourselves on our good fortune in securing their valuable services. I also desire to thank with them Mr. Danvers Power, who, at the special request of the Committee, acted as their Honorary Secretary. Considering what weight the Report carries, we shall, of course, endeavour to fulfil its recommendations. The Report states that, of the twelve hospitals which have medical schools, at least eight contribute from their funds to the support of medical education, and proceeds to declare that the Committee "do not find that any special considerations have been advanced in justification of the expenditure by the hospitals on the schools." I am glad, however, to see that the Committee recommend us not to open up past transactions, but to deal only with the future. (Hear, hear.) Inasmuch as the Report was not published until after the commencement of the present year, the hospitals cannot act upon it in such a way as to clear the accounts of the present year of these charges. It is hoped, therefore, that we shall be considered to have acted reasonably if we begin with the first complete year after the publication of the Report : that is, the year 1906. If this is approved, the hospitals will have nine months in which to consider their position. All that we will ask is that the whole of the grants from the King's Fund may go to the relief of the sick poor. If a general account is kept for that exclusive purpose, out of which only hospital payments are made, and into which all ordinary receipts for the general funds of the hospital are paid, then we are satisfied to make our grants to that account. Individual subscribers, and even the whole body of subscribers to a particular hospital, are in a different position from that of subscribers to the King's Fund. It must be remembered that our Fund collects many small sums from people who wish to do something for the sick poor, but who have no special interest in any one hospital, or in anything but the ordinarily accepted objects of the hospitals. While this subject of medical schools remained in doubt, while we were assured that for various reasons it was in the interests of the sick poor that the hospitals should assist in maintaining the schools, we were entitled to accept that view, and we did so. But now that we have in our hands the Report of Sir Edward Fry's Committee we are bound to act upon its recommendations, and to reconsider the policy which we have hitherto followed.

I trust and believe that in the near future the result of our action will be of benefit not only to the hospitals themselves, but to medical education as well. (Hear, hear.) The Committee point out that while the final studies of a medical student can only be pursued within the walls of a hospital, the teaching of the preliminary and intermediate subjects are more properly carried out in an institution of a university character, and express great satisfaction to find that the Statutes of the University of London direct the Senate to "use its best endeavours whenever practicable to secure such common courses of instruction for internal medical students in the preliminary and intermediate portion of their studies under appointed or recognised teachers at one or more centres." I am glad to know that the Senate has already put forward a scheme for the establishment of an Institute of Medical Sciences in connection with the University of London. It is to be hoped that the public will generously support the appeal which has been made for the funds necessary to build and equip such an institute, and thus assist the University in its efforts to provide in London a medical education unrivalled throughout the Empire. I have observed with satisfaction that since the issue of the Report of the Committee, Mr. Alfred Beit has made a very generous addition to the large donation which he had previously promised to the Institute Appeal Fund.

Before concluding this review of the year's work, I desire to record my feelings of deep gratitude to all those who have assisted in its accomplishment. Remembering that the members of our General Council, the Visiting, Distribution, and Executive Committees, our Honorary Secretaries, and other Honorary Officials are busily occupied either in duties of the State or in their own respective professions, we recognise that their valuable work to the Fund is one of its very important assets. The minute books show that there has been a large and regular attendance at the Committee meetings. I know that this entails no small sacrifice of time on the part of the members, and in expressing my appreciation of their services, I trust that they will all be willing to continue during the coming year in their various offices. (Hear, hear.)

Report of the Hospitals Distribution Committee.

THE Committee have the pleasure to report that the Executive Committee, with the approval of His Royal Highness the President, placed in their hands this year the sum of \pounds 79,000 for distribution among the London Hospitals.

In connection with the grants which the Committee are able to recommend for the year 1904 it may be well to mention that the amount available for distribution in 1903 was £20,000 more than that which is now at disposal, viz., £99,000, of which a sum of £18,751. 9s. was transferred from the General Funds.

It will be remembered that in 1903 the Committee set aside £10,500 to be drawn on as required for the expenses incidental to the amalgamation of certain Hospitals. They noted with satisfaction in their last Report that the National Orthopædic and the Royal Orthopædic Hospitals had amalgamated, and expressed their regret that the City Orthopædic Hospital had not consented to join in the amalgamation. They now learn that the City Orthopædic Hospital continues to stand out of this most desirable amalgamation, and but for the fact that the annual grant of £250 made to this Hospital was for the maintenance of beds re-opened by the Fund they would have seriously considered the question of making any grant. They have, however, felt bound this year, while withdrawing the annual grant, to make a donation of £250, and must reserve their entire freedom of action next year in considering the claims of the City Orthopædic Hospital on the Fund.

The Committee draw attention to the undesirability of opening new special hospitals with small accommodation, and they will feel it their duty to discourage further attempts in this direction.

Several of the subjects which, being preliminary to modern medical education, are taught at the various medical schools, occasion a demand on the accommodation of the hospitals and a drain on the resources of the schools, which would be avoided were instruction on these subjects provided elsewhere. The question is one which deserves the attention of all who are concerned with the increasing requirements of hospitals.

The number of beds re-opened as free beds by the Fund since its inauguration, is 443.

The Committee have again done their utmost to show appreciation of the scheme for the removal of King's College Hospital.

An application was received from St. Bartholomew's Hospital for a grant towards the Rebuilding Fund, accompanied by an intimation to the effect that when the necessary money

to reconstruct the Hospital had been collected no further appeal would be made for public assistance. The Committee having no precedent to guide them, and being in doubt as to their powers to make a grant in these circumstances, referred the matter to the Executive Committee. That Committee resolved as follows :—

"That in the opinion of the Executive Committee, the King's Fund cannot properly be devoted to capital expenditure on behalf of hospitals possessed of endowments substantially adequate to their maintenance, as such a departure would preclude the regular practice of the Fund in associating annual inspection with contribution."

The Distribution Committee, therefore, regret that in accordance with this instruction, they have no power to consider the application for a grant made by this ancient foundation, the work of which has for so long a period been of the greatest value to the sick poor of London. They desire to add that the Hospital was inspected by the Fund and that the Report received from the Visitors was favourable.

Among the 106 Reports of the Visitors which have, as usual, been of much service to the Committee, they have observed in several cases that recommendations have been made in connection with the existing arrangements for protection against fire. This subject appears to them to be one which might usefully occupy the attention of the Executive Committee, or of a special committee.

In addition to their published remarks the Committee have followed their usual practice in recommending that various suggestions should be made privately to many of the Hospitals, especially in connection with expenditure which in some cases still appears to be excessive.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.
