

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1916.

The total receipts for the year 1916 were £326,474 3s. 9d., of which £9,447 15s. 5d. were contributions to Capital, and £317,026 8s. 4d. receipts on General Account.

The amount distributed was £170,000, which was £30,000 more than the amount applied to this purpose in 1915, and £12,500 more than the previous maximum appropriation before the war. In making these comparisons the supplementary distributions made in 1911 and 1915, resulting from the special donations from Sir Ernest Cassel, are omitted as being made after the original distributions were settled.

Of the amount distributed, £162,500 was allocated to London Hospitals and £7,500 to Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients, as against £133,500 and £6,500 respectively in 1915.

Of the £162,500 granted by the Fund to the London Hospitals, £128,425 was given in aid of general maintenance, £15,000 to the reduction of debts on maintenance account, and £19,075 towards improvement schemes or in reduction of liabilities on such schemes undertaken

before the war. The Fund has continued to encourage the Hospitals in the policy of postponing all schemes of capital expenditure not exceptionally urgent or not already in hand at the outbreak of war, and the total grants in aid of new schemes were only £6,525. The increase in grants for maintenance over those made in 1915 amounted to £25,900.

This large addition to the grants was, however, by no means in excess of the needs of the Hospitals. The Fund made no serious increases in the distribution for maintenance in the first two years of the war, pending trustworthy evidence from the published accounts of the Hospitals as to the extent of their greater burdens and the manner in which the different Hospitals were being affected. This evidence began to appear in the accounts for 1915; and the policy of the Fund was justified by the fact that the Council was able, when the need was established, to come to the assistance of the Hospitals concerned by substantial increases in the maintenance grants. The steady rise in prices of provisions and drugs, and in the cost of all departments, gives reason to fear that the needs of the Hospitals have since continued and will continue to increase; and these matters will demand the consideration of the Fund in future distributions.

The £7,500 distributed by the Convalescent Homes Committee was appropriated, as to £5,535, to Consumption Sanatoria, and, as to £1,965, to Convalescent Homes. The grants to Sanatoria enabled 53 beds to be reserved for the use of patients in London Hospitals as compared with 52 last year.

The total sum distributed amongst Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria during the last ten years (after deducting conditional grants to the extent of £6,500 that have been allowed to lapse), is £1,544,750. Since the foundation of the Fund a total amount of £2,268,416 has been distributed. The average annual distribution for the whole period of 20 years has been £113,420 16s. 5d.

During the year the amount spent on administration was £3,161 2s. 3d., or 19s. $4\frac{1}{2}d$. per £100 of the total amount received, as compared with £3,205 16s. 1d., or £1 8s. 3d. per £100, last year. The corresponding percentage for the whole period since the inauguration of the Fund has been £1 4s. 3d., or less than 3d. in every £1 received, the average yearly outlay in this respect being £2,836 2s. 8d.

His Majesty the King, Patron of the Fund, has been graciously pleased to continue his annual subscription of £1,000. Her Majesty the Queen, Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, and His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales have also been pleased to subscribe to the Fund, as also have many other Members of the Royal Family.

The subscribers will be glad to note that the list of contributions again includes annual subscriptions of £5,000 from Mr. Walter Morrison, £4,000 from the Drapers' Company, £1,000 from Lord Astor, and £1,000 from the Merchant Taylors' Company; besides an anonymous donation of £1,000. The Fund has also received annual subscriptions of £500 from

Lord Iveagh, from Sir John R. Ellerman, Bt., from Mr. Robert Fleming, from Messrs. Morgan, Grenfell & Co., and from Messrs. N. M. Rothschild & Sons; and donations of the same amount from the Clothworkers' Company, and from "S.D.R.S.D."

The League of Mercy this year has contributed £15,000, a larger sum than was received from the League in any of the last three years. The Council is greatly indebted to the Members of the League for the efforts which have led to so successful a result. The total amount contributed to the Fund by the League of Mercy since its foundation in 1899 now amounts to £245,000, apart from the sums awarded by the League to institutions outside the area of the Fund's distributions. The Council again express their appreciation of this very substantial benefit derived from the labours of a numerous band of voluntary workers.

Legacies received during the year include (in addition to the bequest of the late Isabella Countess of Wilton, and a further amount of £3,000 from the Lewis bequest) £20,193 193. 5d. from the late Lady Brownlow, on the death of her husband, Field-Marshal Sir Charles Brownlow; £10,000 given by the executors of the late Mr. Thomas Stephen Whitaker in the exercise of their discretionary powers; and £5,000 to capital from the late Rt. Hon. Sir Andrew Richard Scoble.

The amount announced in the last Annual Report as received from the estate of the late Sir Julius Wernher has been increased by further receipts of £4,084 16s. 11d. during the year to £324,100 10s. 1d. This very generous legacy of one-twelfth of the residue of his estate, of which further amounts remain yet to be received, was left to be applied in augmentation of the capital account of the Fund; and the income the Fund is now receiving from this benefaction has contributed substantially to the distribution of the past year.

The Fund also received during the year the sum of £137,634 18s. 11d. on account of the residue of the estate of the late Lady Wilton. This legacy was estimated to realise £150,000, but since the end of the year further sums have been received raising the final total to £163,202 9s. 4d. The Fund desires to record its obligations to Sir Walter Trower in connection with the administration and realisation of the estate. The receipt of this important legacy, to the application of which no conditions were attached, largely influenced the Fund in the decision to make a material increase in the distribution.

To maintain the annual distribution at £170,000 about £80,000 has to be raised each year from subscriptions, donations and legacies. The subscriptions and donations received in 1916 were £31,440 4s. 11d., an increase of £154 11s. 9d. over 1915. With the addition of the £15,000 from the League of Mercy, this source of revenue amounted to a little over £46,000 out of the £80,000 required. The uncertainty attaching to income from ordinary legacies is illustrated by the fact that, though in 1916 they amounted to £33,418 7s. 8d., in 1915 they had only produced £4,412 10s. 7d. The legacy from Lady Wilton thus provides a reserve against fluctuation in legacies during the coming years of possible stress.

The Statistical Report on the expenditure of the London Hospitals was again reduced in size this year in order to economise the consumption of paper and the employment of labour in printing. A fresh table of statistics showing the results of the war on Hospitals and expenditure down to the end of 1915 was added to the prefatory note. This showed that the average number of beds in daily occupation by naval and military patients in 1915 was 2,378, of which about one-half were beds specially added for the purpose. The total additional ordinary expenditure in 1915, after deducting War Office payments, as compared with ordinary expenditure in 1913, was over £48,000, or nearly twice the amount by which the Fund's distribution to maintenance was increased. The causes of this increase in expenditure have operated with still greater force, since the year 1915.

Each eligible Hospital and Consumption Sanatorium which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon, as hitherto, by two of the Fund's visitors, of whom one was a medical man and the other a layman.

The Council regret to record the death during the year of Mr. Algernon E. Sydney, a Member of the Council since 1913 and of the Executive Committee since 1902. The Fund has also lost through death the services of Surgeon-General Sir Benjamin Franklin, K.C.I.E., and Mr. David Simson, who had given valuable help as Visitors on behalf of the Fund.

The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has again appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co., Chartered Accountants, to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year. They have been the Honorary Auditors since January 1898, during which period they have rendered the Fund very valuable services.

The Council are under great obligations to the Press for the great assistance they have rendered in the past, and continue to rely upon their kindly co-operation in obtaining for the Fund wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

A Meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes, and Consumption Sanatoria for the year, was held on Friday, December 15, 1916, at St. James's Palace, the Viscount Iveagh, K.P., being in the chair.

Those present were: The Duke of Norfolk, the Earl of Bessborough, the Viscount Mersey, the Lord Revelstoke, the Lord Farquhar, the Lord Burnham, the Lord Stamfordham, the Lord Somerleyton (Hon. Secretary), the Governor of the Bank of England (the Lord Cunliffe), the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Dr. Frederick Taylor), the Rt. Hon. Sir T. Vezey Strong, Sir William Church, Bt.; Sir Walter Lawrence, Bt.; Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Owen Philipps, Sir William H. Bennett, Sir William J. Collins, Sir Horace Marshall, Sir Cooper Perry, Sir John Tweedy, Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Sec.), Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Sec.), Dr. Edwin Freshfield, and Mr. Walter Morrison.

The Minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following:—

H.H. the Duke of Teck, the Speaker of the House of Commons (the Rt. Hon. James W. Lowther, M.P.), the Lord Lieutenant of the County of London (the Marquess of Crewe), the Bishop of London, the Bishop of Southwark, Cardinal Bourne, the Rev. W. L. Watkinson, D.D., the Chief Rabbi (the Rev. J. H. Hertz, D.D.), the Viscount Knutsford, the Lord Sandhurst, the Lord Murray of Elibank, the Hon. N. Charles Rothschild, the Hon. Algernon H. Mills, the President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (the Rt. Hon. The Lord Mayor), the Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P., Sir Francis H. Champneys, Bt., Sir John Craggs, and Mr. Robert Fleming.

Lord Revelstoke (the Honorary Treasurer) said that the net receipts for the year to December 11, apart from receipts on capital account, had amounted to £269,526 18s. 6d. This included £100,000 cash received from Sir Walter Trower in respect of the residue of the estate of the late Isabella Countess of Wilton, and the Fund had already had transferred to it securities amounting to over £22,000. As he indicated at the meeting in May last, the Finance Committee were retaining the cash uninvested, so as not to hamper in any way the discretion of the Council in deciding as to the use of the money in the event of any emergency.

Sir William Collins, in making the annual statement on behalf of the League of Mercy, said that so far as he was able to make an estimate, he thought there was no reason to doubt that the League would be in a position to make for the fourth year in succession a grant of £14,000 to King Edward's Hospital Fund, and also to make a distribution of something like £3,000 in the extra-metropolitan district, the total granted to the Fund in seventeen years being £244,000. He felt that in view of the splendid manner in which the Hospitals had assisted the State by taking in thousands of wounded soldiers, the action taken by the League at the beginning of the war had been fully justified.

Sir WILLIAM CHURCH (the Chairman of the Distribution Committee) presented the report of that committee.

Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

Dr. Edwin Freshfield (the Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee) presented the report of that committee.

Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

Lord IVEAGH, in moving the adoption of the Reports and Awards, said:—My Lords and Gentlemen,—I have been asked by the Duke of Teck to say that his absence is due to work connected with the war, and by the Speaker to say that his special duties make it impossible for him to be here to-day. First of all, I have the honour to read the following letter which has been addressed to the Governors by His Majesty the King, through Lord Stamfordham:—

"Buckingham Palace,

"December 12th, 1916.

"I am commanded by the King, Patron of the Fund, to ask you to convey to the Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund at their Meeting on the 15th instant his congratulations on the distribution of £170,000 this year. This, as His Majesty reminds you, is £30,000 more than last year's total, and £12,500 over the previous record achieved in the years just before the War.

"The King is much gratified at this evidence of the power of the Fund to give substantial assistance to the Hospitals in a time of exceptional difficulty. He trusts that the public will help to maintain this record, and he hopes especially that there may be an increase in the ranks of

Annual Subscribers, whose numbers are naturally depleted from various causes each year.

"His Majesty learned with much regret of the death of Mr. Algernon Sydney, who had done such good service to the Fund for many years; and he takes this opportunity of conveying to the Governors, Council, Officers and all Committees of the Fund, as well as to the Visitors, his cordial appreciation of their work for the Hospital Service, now more important than ever to the welfare of his people.

The Council will wish me to tender to His Majesty their humble thanks for his gracious message. We have all noticed with pride that His Majesty, the Patron of the Fund, has taken every opportunity of visiting the hospitals both abroad and in England, and has shown the deepest interest in their suffering patients and in the recent important progress of medical science. It is with great satisfaction that we find ourselves able to make the record distribution of £170,000. This is £30,000 more than last year, and £12,500 more than the previous maximum in the years immediately before the war. I am referring here to the ordinary distribution apart from supplementary grants rendered possible by the generosity of Sir Ernest Cassel. As has been explained in previous years, the reduction in the total distribution in 1914 and 1915 was due, first, to the decrease in the demand for building grants, and, second, to the danger of increasing largely the maintenance grants before it was known which hospitals would be most affected by the financial difficulties arising out of the war. I say "danger," because there was also a third consideration—the question whether a larger total could have been maintained, or whether we might only have had to reduce our grants later on just when they were most needed. From that we have been saved, partly by the prudence, if I may venture to make that claim, of the Council, and partly by good fortune. We are able now to increase the distribution by £30,000, primarily through the receipt of legacies. Those of an ordinary character have this year amounted to £32,000, as against only £4,000 last year. But this, by itself, would not have been enough; and we certainly could not safely have distributed so large a proportion of these legacies of 1916 had it not been for the very munificent bequest by the late Isabella Countess of Wilton of the residue of her estate, received by the Fund during the year through Sir Walter Trower. The Council has, wisely I think, passed no resolution tying its hands as to the application of this legacy. No one can foresee what the difficulties of the hospitals may yet be as the result of the war, or what extra demands may be made on the Fund; and surely no one can accuse us either of reckless expenditure or of

undue hoarding if in these uncertain times the Finance Committee retains in cash such part of this legacy as was received in cash, and if the Council takes it into account in deciding how far the distribution can be increased without undue risk of violent fluctuations in the near future. For it is one of the functions of this Fund to serve as a steadying influence on the finances of the hospitals. I need hardly say that even £170,000 would not go far towards supporting the hospitals of London, if the contributions which they receive from their direct subscribers, as the result of their own efforts, were to show any very serious or permanent decline. The amount which the hospitals will get from the Fund in grants to maintenance, even in this record year, is only a little more than one-ninth of their total ordinary expenditure; while the very large increase we have been able to make in the maintenance grants will not cover the increase in their ordinary expenditure since the war began, reckoning only the year 1915. Therefore, I say, this Fund cannot maintain the hospitals: what it can do is to help to steady their financial position by providing an annual distribution, which may rise or fall with their needs, but is as far as possible free from involuntary fluctuations. There is no doubt, moreover, that the needs of the hospitals will continue to grow in the near future. The proportions I have given you relate to the expenditure of 1915, on which this year's distribution is necessarily based. The burden of 1916 will inevitably be greater; and if this Fund is to continue to do its part an increased distribution may become desirable. I commend this to the consideration of those, if any such there be, who, just because the operations of the Fund are so large, forget that the demands on it are proportionately great, and, what is more, are, in the present circumstances, continually growing. It is with much gratification that we learn of the success of the League of Mercy in collecting for the Fund the very large sum which Sir William Collins has mentioned. We have also to express our indebtedness for the legacies of £20,000 received, under the will of the late Lady Brownlow, on the death of Sir Charles Brownlow; and £10,000 very kindly allocated to the Fund by the Executors of the late Thomas Stephen Whitaker in the exercise of their discretionary power. I should like also to make a special reference to a series of contributions, amounting in all to a total of over £270, which we have received at intervals throughout the year from the War Fund of the Citizens of East London, South Africa. This is a welcome recognition, coming from one of the distant parts of His Majesty's dominions, of the great work which the hospitals of London are doing in aid of the sick and wounded sailors and soldiers. The Governors are glad to see the reference in the Report of the Distribution Committee to the part which the hospitals are taking in the great fight against venereal diseases. This Fund has, I believe, never singled out any particular section of the current expenditure of hospitals for special recognition in its grants to maintenance; which are made to the upkeep of each hospital taken as a whole. But the Committee recommend that the Fund, which by means of large capital grants was instrumental in bringing the Male Lock Hospital up to date, should now offer substantial assistance to the improvement of the Female Lock Hospital in Harrow Road. The Council will remember the special report made by the Convalescent Homes Committee in May last on the exceptional difficulties with which the Benenden Sanatorium was faced owing to the war. Fortunately the sanatorium was able to surmount those difficulties by its own efforts; but we are glad to be able to give it some special assistance in the reduction of its mortgage debt. This sanatorium, as you will remember, represents an effort on the part of the workers themselves to deal with the scourge of consumption, and as such it deserves our sympathy and support. The enquiry into the question of Pensions for Hospital Officers, which was begun by the Executive Committee before the war, was deferred for a time by the other pre-occupations that press upon all of us. But it is progressing steadily under the expert chairmanship of Mr. W. J. H. Whittall. The Fund has to regret the loss by death of Mr. Algernon Sydney, who had done good service for several years as a Member of the Council and the Executive Committee, and in many other ways. I have now only the pleasant task of thanking the members of the Council, members of Committees, Visitors, and Honorary Officers, for all their work

on behalf of the Fund. I think you would wish me specially to mention Lord Somerleyton, who has been Honorary Secretary of the Fund from its inception, and to congratulate him on the honour recently conferred upon him by His Majesty. I now beg to move the adoption of the Reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees.

The Duke of Norfolk having seconded the motion, the adoption of the Reports was then put and carried unanimously.

On the motion of Lord Farquhar, seconded by Sir Walter Lawrence, it was resolved that the cheques for the grants should be posted on Wednesday, December 20th, except in the case of grants for the reservation of beds in Consumption Sanatoria during 1917, the cheques for which should be posted on January 1st.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1917.

Lord IVEAGH then said :-

My Lords and Gentlemen,—I have now to announce the appointments which the Governors propose to make to the Council and Committees for 1917, and you will then be asked to consider the delegation resolutions, which, if approved by you here to-day, will only require to be passed by the formal meeting in January. They are exactly the same as the resolutions already in operation for 1916.

Lord Somerleyton (Hon. Secretary) then read the list of the Council and Committees, including the following new appointments: To the General Council, Mr. W. J. H. Whittall; to the Executive Committee, Sir Edward Hope, K.C.B.

On the motion of Lord Burnham, seconded by Sir Vezev Strong, a resolution was approved delegating powers to the Finance Committee, Distribution Committee, and Convalescent Homes Committee.

On the motion of Sir Henry Burdett, seconded by Sir William Bennett, a resolution was approved delegating further powers to the Finance Committee.

On the motion of Lord Mersey, seconded by Sir Owen Philipps, a Resolution was approved delegating to the Distribution Committee the power to draw upon the grants set aside for the amalgamation of the Throat Hospitals.

On the motion of Lord Bessborough, seconded by Sir John Tweedy, a Resolution was approved delegating Powers to the Executive Committee.

The Governor of the Bank of England (Lord Cunliffe), in proposing a vote of thanks to Lord Iveach for presiding, said that in view of his many duties as Governor of the Bank, and the extra work that had fallen upon his shoulders during the last two years, he hoped to be excused for not having attended the meetings of the Fund more often.

The resolution was seconded by The President of the Royal College of Physicians (Dr. Frederick Taylor), and carried unanimously.

Lord Iveagh, in acknowledging the vote of thanks, said:-

My Lords and Gentlemen,—I am very grateful for the vote of thanks passed by you. When we met in this room a year ago I have no doubt that in the hearts of many of us there was a hope that our next meeting might be held under more normal conditions, but we meet again while a terrible and ruthless war still rages across Europe, and our year's work has been carried out under the inseparable difficulties brought about by such conditions. Nevertheless we should, I think, be satisfied with the measure of success which has been achieved for the year, success only brought about by the unselfish and self-sacrificing

work of those upon whom the bulk of the good work falls. Ours is essentially a work of peace, but I fear many anxious months must pass before peace and its blessings again visit our land. Peace will lessen some of the difficulties under which we are working, but I foresee as one of the results of the hardships and privations of our men in the field, hardships and privations borne so nobly and uncomplainingly, that a heavier load even than before will be thrown upon the resources of the hospitals when these gallant men return to civil life. For in many of them, fighting at the various seats of war, will be sown the seeds of future ills, and it behoves us to continue untiring in our efforts to increase, if possible, the resources of the Fund instituted through the far-seeing sagacity of His late Majesty King Edward, and in which His Majesty the King continues to take such a deep and encouraging interest.

The proceedings then terminated.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors and General Council to receive the Accounts and the Report of the General Council for the year 1916, was held at St. James's Palace on Friday, 27th April, 1917, His Highness the Duke of Teck being in the chair.

Those present were: The Viscount Iveagh, the Speaker of the House of Commons (the Rt. Hon. James W. Lowther, M.P.), the Rev. W. L. Watkinson, D.D., the Chief Rabbi (the Rev. J. H. Arthur Stanley, M.P., the Rt. Hon. Sir T. Vezey Strong, Sir William Church, Bt., Sir Walter Lawrence, Bt., Sir Francis H. Champneys, Bt., Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Owen Philipps, M.P., Sir William H. Bennett, Sir Everard Hambro, Sir William J. Collins, M.P., Sir Horace Marshall, Sir John Craggs, Sir John Tweedy, Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary), Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary), Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. W. J. H. Whittall.

The Minutes of the last Meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: The Lord Lieutenant of the County of London and Chairman of the County Council (The Marquess of Crewe); The Bishop of London; The Bishop of Southwark; Cardinal Bourne; Lord Stamfordham; Lord Somerleyton (Hon. Secretary); Lord Murray of Elibank; The Hon. N. Charles Rothschild; The Hon. Algernon H. Mills; The President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (The Rt. Hon. The Lord Mayor); The President of the Royal College of Physicians (Dr. Frederick Taylor); The Governor of the Bank of England (The Lord Cunliffe); The President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir W. Watson Cheyne, Bt.); The Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P.; Sir Cooper Perry; Mr. Robert Fleming; Mr. Walter Morrison.

Lord Revelstoke (the Hon. Treasurer), in presenting the Account of Receipts and Expenditure and the Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December, 1916, said:—Your Highness, my Lords and Gentlemen,—I have the honour to submit the Account of Receipts and Expenditure and the Balance Sheet for the year 1916. The form of Accounts has been slightly altered this year, in order that items relating to the Capital Account may be more readily distinguished from those pertaining to the General Fund, and the total disbursements from the balance carried to reserve. It is a matter for congratulation that notwith-standing the exceptionally heavy calls entailed by the present state of affairs, the Fund has received such continued support as to enable it to put a substantial addition to reserve. This addition, which amounts to no less than £143,000, is due mainly to the receipt of £137,000 on account of the residue of the estate of the late Lady Wilton. Since the end of the year, a further sum has been received raising the total of the bequest to £163,000, thus more than justifying Sir Walter Trower's original estimate that the amount to

be received by us in this connection would prove to be somewhat in excess of £150,000. Had it not been for this legacy, and for other large legacies and gifts received in the past, the Fund would not have had the power it possesses to-day of affording such invaluable assistance to the Hospitals. It will not be forgotten that the confidence in the objects and methods of the Fund, which inspired the donors and the testators of these large bequests and gifts, was primarily due to the personal interest and to the supervision of His late Majesty King Edward and His present Majesty. The net loss on the realisation of investments shown in the Balance Sheet is due to a sale of the Fund's holding of American securities, which the Finance Committee considered it their duty to make in response to the invitation from H.M. Treasury, and the reinvestment of the proceeds in British Government securities. A large proportion of these American securities, which were of the very highest character, were originally presented to the Fund by generous donors. The result will be a small diminution in the income from investments, an income which, apart from this consideration, is still practically unaffected by the war.

The Speaker of the House of Commons moved the adoption of the Accounts, and the resolution, having been seconded by The Viscount Sandhurst, was put and carried unanimously.

Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary) presented the draft Report of the Council for the year 1916. The Viscount Iveach formally moved the adoption of the Report.

The Viscount Knutsford, in seconding the Resolution, said they must all feel that it was very satisfactory that the Fund had been able to distribute such a very large sum, £170,000, amongst the Hospitals. The Report pointed out that "The total additional ordinary expenditure of Hospitals in 1915, after deducting War Office payments, as compared with ordinary expenditure in 1913, was over £48,000." That was only for 1915; but the Fund would have to face the much larger expenditure in 1916 and the increasing cost in the present year.

The adoption of the Report was then put and carried unanimously.

The Viscount Mersey, in moving a vote of thanks to the Duke of Teck for presiding, said they all knew that His Highness had taken the greatest interest in this Fund for very many years past.

The Resolution was seconded by the Hon. ARTHUR STANLEY, M.P., and carried unanimously.

The Duke of Teck having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings terminated.

Report of the Distribution Committee.

- (1) The Governors and General Council have this year fixed the sum available for distribution amongst the London Hospitals at £162,500, as against £133,500 in 1915.
- (2) This is the largest sum that has ever been distributed by the Fund amongst the Hospitals, being an increase of £29,000 over the last two years and £11,500 over the previous maximum of £151,000 which was reached in the years immediately preceding the war.
- (3) While the increase in total distribution over the previous highest amount is thus £11,500, the increase in grants in aid of maintenance is much greater, being £28,075. This is due to the postponement of building schemes and the consequent reduction of grants towards capital expenditure. Of the capital grants of £19,075 recommended this year only £6,525 is on account of schemes which have been begun since the outbreak of war on the ground of exceptional urgency: the balance has been devoted to relieving Hospitals of capital liabilities incurred before the war.
- (4) In distributing the increased grants to maintenance, the Committee have again been faced with the difficulty that it is impossible to make reliable comparisons between the financial positions of different Hospitals except on the evidence of the audited accounts, which are necessarily those of 1915, when the effects of the war had not been felt as fully as they have during 1916. They recognise, therefore, that the awards cannot actually represent the relative claims of the Hospitals as they are at the present moment. They have, however, done whatever they could to distribute the increased grants in proportion to the probable urgency of need in 1916. Amongst other things, they have given rather greater weight than usual to the more permanent elements which affect a Hospital's power to stand increased financial strain, such as the relative amount of fixed income and the relative amount of available reserve funds. But the actual results of 1916 cannot be taken into account until the next distribution.
- (5) While thus giving special assistance to Hospitals which, through no fault of their own, are financially weak, the Committee have maintained the position that the help of the Fund is not to be looked upon as a substitute for the efforts of the Hospitals themselves, whether in raising funds or in prudent and economical management. Exceptional grants in reduction of debt, in particular, are not given without a careful consideration of the steps already taken by the Hospitals concerned, and especially of the possibility of increased local support. In some neighbourhoods it is obvious that for the bulk of the necessary funds the Hospital must

depend upon external help. But even in these cases it is impossible for the Fund to do more than supplement the contributions raised by the Hospitals themselves; while in other parts of London exceptional assistance must always be conditional upon sustained local as well as general efforts.

- (6) The Committee have again taken into consideration the returns made by the Hospitals of the work done in the treatment of naval and military patients during the previous year, and also during the first nine months of the current year.
 - (7) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is 107, being three in excess of last year.
- (8) The position with regard to the amalgamation of the Throat, Nose, and Ear Hospitals, so far as the Fund is concerned, is the same as last year, except that an extra grant is recommended to the amalgamated Hospital for Diseases of the Throat to assist in meeting additional expenditure incurred in consequence of the postponement of the building scheme owing to the war.
- (9) The Committee receive year by year evidence of the increasing work done by the Voluntary Hospitals (quite apart from the treatment of naval and military patients) in the cure or prevention of disease in co-operation with State or Municipal authorities. This is one of the numerous ways in which the Hospitals take their part in the development of fresh methods of promoting public health. The attitude of the Fund towards these activities, as they affect its distribution, depends, generally speaking, upon their results as shown in the statistics of work done and in the relation between income and expenditure.

The latest development in this direction is the preparation by various Hospitals of schemes for the treatment of venereal diseases in co-operation with the Local Government Board and the London County Council in accordance with the recommendations of the recent Royal Commission. These schemes naturally do not affect the accounts and statistics for 1915 or even, as a rule, 1916. But in one case, that of the London Lock Hospital, an application for a capital grant in aid of sanitary and other improvements at the Female Hospital has been received, and in view of the importance of increasing the efficiency of this Hospital in these respects the Committee are recommending a substantial grant towards the sanitary improvements. The Committee further recommend that the Council, which has already by large grants enabled the Male Lock Hospital to be brought thoroughly up-to-date, should also offer substantial assistance towards an approved scheme for the reconstruction of the Female Lock Hospital.

(10) Both last year and the year before the Committee drew attention in their report to the fact that Hospitals generally had, with the approval of the Fund, adopted the policy of deferring till after the war all schemes involving capital outlay unless of exceptional urgency. Several of the schemes thus postponed had already been submitted to the Fund in accordance with the well-known request of the Council to that effect. Other schemes have been prepared and submitted to the Fund as a preparatory step, although no action is contemplated until after the war.

Appeals have, however, been issued by some Hospitals in aid of schemes for work to be carried out after the war which had not been submitted to the Fund; and, with the object of avoiding any misunderstanding and in fairness to Hospitals that had, with the approval of the Fund, held over their appeals, the Committee issued a circular drawing attention to the various statements that had already been made by the Fund on the subject.

(11) The following grants made in 1913 in aid of schemes of building expenditure which have been deferred during the war again require to be recommended for renewal:—

Queen Charlotte's Lying-in Hospital, £1,000 to new out-patient department.

- St. Mary's Hospital for Women and Children, Plaistow, £1,500 to new nurses' home and out-patient department.
- (12) While recognising that the cost of working at Hospitals generally has been raised by the war, the Committee have specially considered all cases where the increase has been markedly greater than at similar Hospitals. Where no adequate explanation is apparent they have appended a remark to their award.
- (13) The Committee have continued the practice of recommending that extracts from the Visitors' Reports should, where desirable, be communicated privately to the Hospitals with the grants. By this means the Reports, in addition to their great value to the Committee in making the awards, are rendered of direct service to the Hospitals concerned. The Committee desire to tender their best thanks to the Visitors for their services in this connection.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.

Report of the Convalescent Homes Committee.

- (1) The Governors and General Council have this year fixed the sum available for distribution amongst Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria at £7,500, as against £6,500 in 1915. This is the largest sum that has ever been placed at the disposal of the Convalescent Homes Committee.
- (2) The number of applications eligible for consideration amounted to 42 from Convalescent Homes and 9 from Consumption Sanatoria, as against 41 and 9 respectively last year.
- (3) In dealing with all applications, whether from Sanatoria or from Convalescent Homes, the Committee have, as usual, taken into consideration the question of comparative urgency of need, as shown by the audited accounts and balance sheets of the various institutions to December 31st last. In the case of Consumption Sanatoria they have also taken note of the proportion of the total work of each institution which is covered by the receipts under the National Insurance Act. As these and other circumstances affecting the relative claims of the different institutions vary from year to year, it must not be assumed that a reduction in the grant to any particular institution, whether for maintenance or for capital purposes, or even the absence of a grant, implies dissatisfaction.
- (4) The proportion allotted to Convalescent Homes is again smaller than usual owing to the absence of grants to several Homes which since the beginning of the war have ceased to be occupied by convalescent patients from London, and are therefore temporarily ineligible for consideration by this Committee.
- (5) The Committee have been able to make a slight increase this year in the number of beds reserved at Consumption Sanatoria for the use of patients in London hospitals, owing to the fact that certain women's beds that are no longer available have been replaced by children's beds. The accommodation thus secured this year amounts to 53 beds at six Sanatoria, situated as follows:—
 - 9 beds for children at the Children's Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.
 - 4 beds at the Daneswood Sanatorium (Jewish), Woburn Sands, Beds.
 - 10 beds at the Devon and Cornwall Sanatorium, South Brent, Devon.
 - 6 beds at the Kelling Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.
 - 12 beds at the Sanatorium of the National Association for the Establishment and Maintenance of Sanatoria for Workers, Benenden, Kent.
 - 12 beds at the Northampton Sanatorium, Creaton, Northants.

- (6) The Committee recommend that the beds thus reserved be allocated amongst London hospitals as follows:—
 - 12 beds to the City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
 - 2 beds to the Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
 - 11 beds to the London Hospital.
 - 10 beds to Guy's Hospital.
 - 5 beds to the Middlesex Hospital.
 - 5 beds to St. George's Hospital.
 - 4 beds to St. Mary's Hospital.
 - 4 beds to University College Hospital.
- (7) The Visitors' Reports, often made at the expense of long journeys and considerable inconvenience, have again proved most useful to the Committee, and in suitable cases extracts from the observations of the Visitors have been privately attached to the grants.
 - (8) The grants recommended to the various institutions are appended.

TITLE AND CONSTITUTION.

The Fund was founded in 1897, under the title of "The Prince of Wales's Hospital Fund for London," by his late Majesty King Edward VII., then Prince of Wales, with the object of securing more efficient aid and support for the Hospitals of London, and of thus commemorating the Sixtieth Anniversary of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, by establishing the voluntary hospital system of London on a sound financial basis.

It was re-named "King Edward's Hospital Fund for London" in January 1902, after the accession of His Majesty King Edward VII.

By desire of King Edward, it was incorporated under that title, and its constitution settled, by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London Act, 1907 (7 Edw. 7, Ch. lxx.).

The Governing Body under the Act consists of the President and General Council.

His late Majesty King Edward VII. was President of the Fund, while Prince of Wales, from 1897 to 1901, and was subsequently its Patron during his reign from 1901 to 1910.

His present Majesty King George V. was President, as Prince of Wales, from 1901 to 1910, and is now Patron.

The powers of the President have been exercised since 1910 by three Governors appointed by His Majesty pursuant to the provisions of the Act. The names of the Governors are given on page 1 of this Report.

The work of the Fund is carried on under the General Council by the four standing Committees and the Officers as set out on pages I and 2. No individual serves on more than one Committee.

RULES AS TO APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS.

Under its present rules the Fund receives applications for grants from:

- (a) Hospitals situated in the County of London or within 9 miles from Charing Cross.
- (b) Convalescent Homes which are situated within these boundaries or which, being situated outside, take a large proportion of patients from London.
- (c) Consumption Sanatoria which take patients from London, or which are prepared to place beds at the disposal of the Fund for the use of patients from London Hospitals.

The Fund does not, however, assist at present in the foundation of new institutions, or entertain applications from institutions which have not been in existence in a properly constituted form for a period of at least three years, or from dispensaries, nursing institutes, or other institutions not possessing beds for in-patients, or from institutions for the treatment of incurables or of mental cases, or from holiday homes as distinct from convalescent homes.

All institutions applying for grants are required to publish their accounts in accordance with the Revised Uniform System of Hospital Accounts.

Every eligible Hospital and Sanatorium applying for a grant is annually inspected on behalf of the Fund by two Visitors, a medical man and a layman in each case, specially appointed for the purpose.

In accordance with the rule laid down by the Founder of the Fund, in order that the hospitals should derive the greatest possible amount of assistance, the Fund does not receive "letters" of admission or recommendation in return for its grants.

Applications are invited in March, and the awards are made, on the recommendations of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees, by the General Council in December.

Applications for grants, and all other communications, should be addressed to the Honorary Secretaries, at 7 Walbrook, E.C. 4.

METHODS AND RESULTS.

Under the active personal supervision of its Royal Presidents, the Fund has grown steadily in the scope of its work and has secured in an increasing degree the confidence and support of the public.

During the twenty years of its existence the Fund has distributed over £2,250,000 to London Hospitals and to Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients, the amount distributed in 1916 being £170,000, being an increase of £30,000 over the two previous years, and £12,500 over the previous maximum in the years preceding the war. The total to the end of 1916 was £2,268,416.

The amount spent annually on administration since the foundation of the Fund has averaged £1 4s. 3d. per cent. of the receipts, which is equal to less than 3d in every £1 received.

The League of Mercy, founded under Royal Charter, in 1899, has enlisted the co-operation of thousands of small subscribers, and has contributed £ $\frac{1899}{290}$,000 to the Fund during the last eighteen years; the contribution in 1916 being £15,000, the largest which the League has been able to make for some years.

The Fund has through its Committees, and through the annual inspections by its Visitors, special facilities for ascertaining the relative needs, efficiency and economy of working of the various institutions and any special circumstances affecting their claims; and it allocates its grants accordingly. Extracts from the Visitors' Reports, together with other remarks bearing on efficiency or economy, are communicated privately to the hospitals with the grants.

All important schemes of building, extension or improvement of hospitals are submitted to the Fund and carefully scrutinised; and, in suitable cases, special grants are made.

In co-operation with the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds, a Uniform System of Hospital Accounts has been introduced which facilitates comparisons between the financial positions of the various Hospitals; and due economy is encouraged by the publication of an Annual Statistical Report showing the cost of working at different hospitals. The issue of these Reports has enabled the Hospitals to effect considerable savings.

From the foregoing it will be seen that the Fund not only collects money for the voluntary hospitals but also helps to secure that all contributions given to them are efficiently and economically employed.

SPECIAL NEEDS-1917.

Many hospitals are doing a great work for the country in taking in sick and wounded soldiers in addition to their ordinary work for the civilian population, and in view of the necessarily heavy increase in prices the help of the Fund is more than ever needed. It is therefore very important that the Fund should be enabled at least to maintain the record distribution of £170,000 achieved in 1916.

PUBLICATIONS OF THE FUND.

The Fund also from time to time collects, and places at the disposal of the hospitals and the public, information on points of interest, and appoints special Committees to enquire into and report upon questions of difficulty affecting hospitals.
