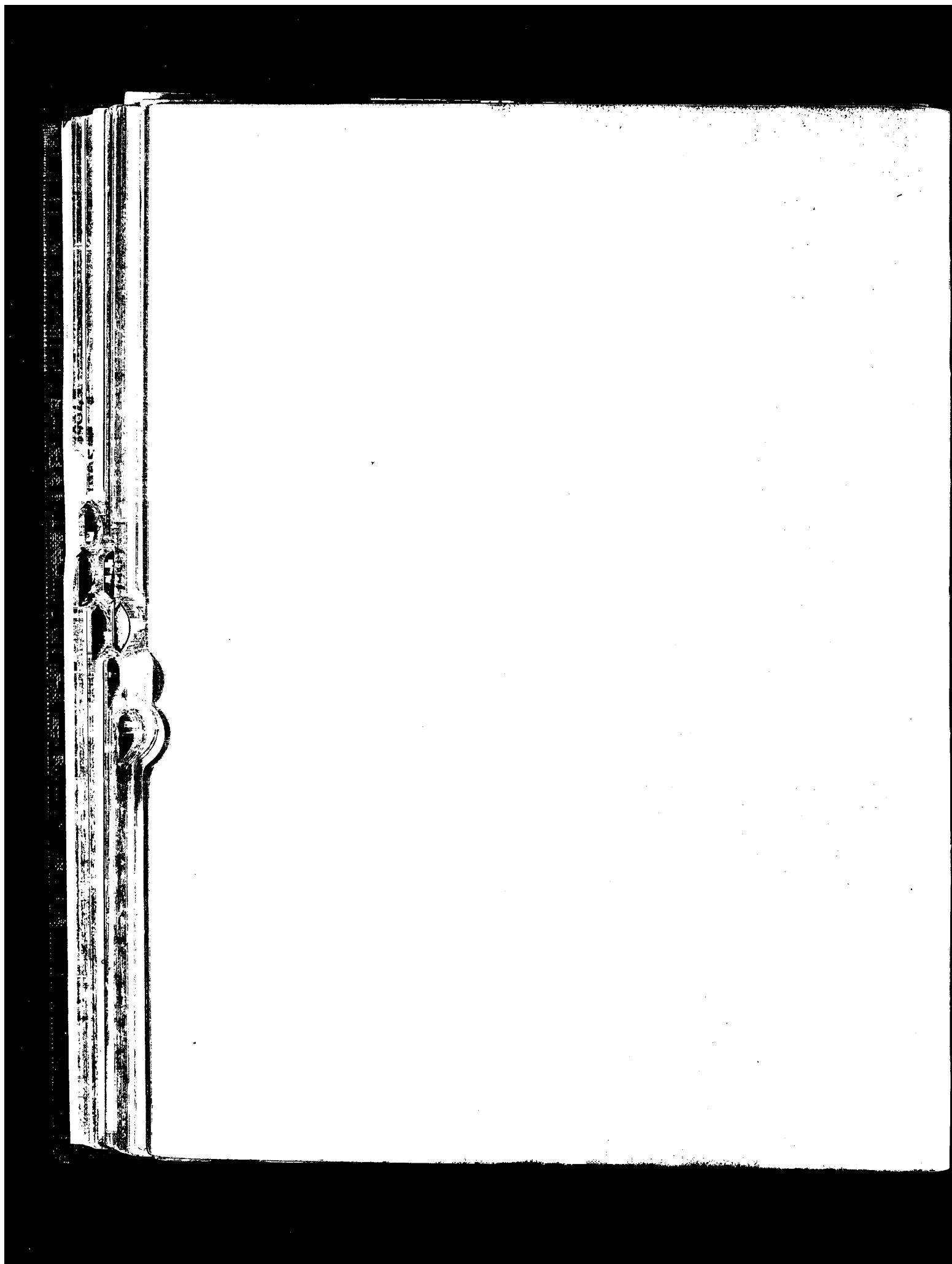

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1908.

THE total receipts for the year 1908 were £345,792 15s. This sum was made up as follows: Donations, £7,888 7s.; Contributions to Capital, £113,695 6s.; Annual Subscriptions, £24,782 1s. 4d.; Contribution of the League of Mercy, £19,000; from the Lewis Estate, £32,500; Legacies (including £65,768 3s. 4d. from the Lambert Estate), £67,770 18s. 2d.; Interest from Investments (including a bonus dividend of £17,931 1s. 5d.), £78,956 2s. 6d.; together with £1,000 from the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities and £200 from the Trustees of the Bawden Fund.

The amount distributed was £140,000, including the £1,000 entrusted to the Fund for distribution among Convalescent Homes by the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities. In addition to this an amalgamation grant of £500 became due during the year and was paid.

Since the inauguration of the Fund the amount spent on administration has been £1 4s. 8d. per cent. of the total amount received.

During the year a further sum of £32,500 was received from the Executors of the will of the late Mr. Samuel Lewis, making a total of £245,000, on account of the legacy of £250,000 left to the Fund. The estate of the late Mr. J. G. Lambert was finally wound up during the year, and the residue, amounting to £65,768 3s. 4d., was brought into the books of the Fund. A further sum of £1,400 was received on account of the residue of the estate of the late Mr. G. H. Heigham. The Fund has also to acknowledge further munificent donations of £100,000 from Lord Mount Stephen and £10,000 from Lord Iveagh, which, in accordance with the wishes of the donors, have been placed to capital.

The amounts received in donations and subscriptions, excluding gifts to capital, show, as compared with 1907, an increase of £2,552 1s. 1d.

The League of Mercy has contributed £19,000, being £1,000 more than in the previous year. During the ten years of its existence the League has furnished in all £116,000 to

the Fund. The Council desire to record their grateful appreciation of the labour of the voluntary workers who have contributed towards the collection of this large sum.

His Majesty the King, our Patron, has been pleased to continue the deep interest in the Fund which he has taken from its inception.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has continued to exercise personal supervision over the work of the Fund. In an Appendix to this Report will be found an account of the proceedings of the General Council meetings on December 14, 1908, and March 10, 1909, at which His Royal Highness presided.

The Council are happy to report that the Act of Incorporation passed in July, 1907, has worked satisfactorily. Such reorganisation as was found to be necessary in consequence of the Act has been effected, and the respective spheres of the various Committees have been re-defined. Four meetings of the General Council and thirty-four meetings of Committees were held during the year.

In March, 1908, it was decided to extend the area of the Fund by including in the work of the Distribution Committee the consideration of the claims of Hospitals situated outside the seven mile radius from Charing Cross but within the nine mile radius, and including in the work of the Convalescent Homes Committee the consideration of the claims of Consumption Sanatoria in the country taking London patients. A larger sum has this year been placed at the disposal of the Convalescent Homes Committee.

Every eligible Hospital and Consumption Sanatorium which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon by the Fund's Visitors, consisting as heretofore of one medical and one layman in each case.

The Revised Uniform System of Accounts, which was drawn up in 1906 by the Fund in association with the Metropolitan Hospital Sunday Fund and the Hospital Saturday Fund, and which came into force on January 1, 1907, has proved to be of great value in facilitating comparisons of the financial position and relative cost of the different hospitals. A circular dealing with various questions which had arisen out of the first year's experience has been drawn up on the advice of Mr. John G. Griffiths, F.C.A., and issued by the three Funds.

The improvements introduced by the Revised System have enabled the Statistical Report annually prepared by the Fund to be re-arranged upon the basis of the separation of the expenditure on in-patients from that on out-patients. At the same time the number of hospitals dealt with in the Report has been largely increased.

In February the Distribution Committee issued a circular reminding the Hospitals of the request of the General Council, first made public in 1903, that proposals for the foundation of new hospitals or the extension or reconstruction of existing hospitals should be submitted to the Fund. The circular described in detail the points upon which the Fund desired to receive information.

During the year the negotiations for the amalgamation of the Hampstead and North-West London Hospitals were brought to a successful conclusion, and the Council are glad to say that the work of the two Hospitals is now being carried on under one management, in-patients for both districts being treated at Hampstead and out-patients at Kentish Town.

The Fund has continued the policy of setting aside grants to the Throat, Nose and Ear Hospitals pending their amalgamation. The Council regret to observe that the negotiations, the responsibility for which at present rests with the Hospitals themselves, have failed during the year to make definite progress.

At the Annual Meeting in March, 1908, His Royal Highness the President announced his intention of appointing a Committee to inquire into the system prevailing in the London voluntary hospitals with regard to the admission of out-patients, but stated that the actual appointment would be deferred until the Royal Commission on the Poor Laws, whose terms of reference included certain aspects of medical relief, had issued its report. This report had not appeared at the time the 1908 Council laid down its duties.

At the Distribution Meeting in December His Royal Highness the President drew attention to the necessity of an increase in the number of annual subscribers, and it is evident that a continuance of public support and the replacement by new subscribers of those whose contributions are lost through death or other causes must be secured if the progress hitherto made in the total amount distributed is to be maintained. Steps to this end are being taken.

The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co. to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year.

The Council are obliged to the Press for the services they have rendered in the past, and continue to rely upon their kindly co-operation in obtaining for the Fund wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

A MEETING of the President and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria for the present year, was held on December 14, 1908, at Marlborough House, H.R.H. the PRINCE OF WALES being in the chair.

Those present were:—The Bishop of London, the Rev. T. Bowman Stephenson, D.D., the Earl of Bessborough, Viscount Iveagh, Lord Rothschild, the Speaker of the House of Commons, the Master of Elibank, M.P., the Postmaster-General, the President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (the Lord Mayor), the Chairman of the County Council (Mr. R. A. Robinson), the Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. W. Middleton Campbell), the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir R. Douglas Powell), the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Mr. Henry Morris), the Rt. Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt. (Hon. Secretary), the Rt. Hon. Sir Joseph Dimsdale, Bt., the Rt. Hon. C. Stuart-Wortley, K.C., M.P., Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt., Sir W. S. Church, Bt., Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Arthur Bigge, Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Everard Hambro, Sir Horace Marshall, Sir W. J. Collins, M.P., Sir John Craggs, Mr. J. Danvers Power, Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary), Mr. John G. Griffiths, Mr. William Latham, K.C., Mr. Albert G. Sandeman, and Mr. Hugh C. Smith.

The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: The Lord-Lieutenant of the County of London (the Duke of Fife), the Duke of Norfolk, the Chancellor of London University (the Earl of Rosebery), the Bishop of Southwark, Archbishop Bourne, the Rev. J. Guinness Rogers, D.D., the Chief Rabbi (the Rev. Dr. Adler), Lord Revelstoke, Lord Strathcona, Lord Farquhar, the Rt. Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel, the Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P., Sir John Aird, Bt., Sir Julius Wernher, Bt., Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt., Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, jun., and Professor W. Osler.

LORD ROTHSCHILD reported that the amount received for general purposes by the Fund to December 10, after payment of expenses, was £156,748 1s. 5d.

SIR HENRY BURDETT stated that the total amount collected by the League of Mercy seemed likely to be larger than in any previous year, and that the grant to the King's Fund would be at least £18,000. The League had also made grants amounting to £1,516 to sixty-eight hospitals in the Home Counties.

THE PRINCE OF WALES, in moving the adoption of the Reports and Awards, said: My Lords and Gentlemen,—The recommendations contained in the Reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees, the adoption of which I have much pleasure in moving, will, I hope, be regarded with satisfaction, not only by the Council and by our subscribers, but by the public generally. The donations for 1908 include the munificent gifts of £100,000 from Lord Mount Stephen, which, in accordance with the direction of the donor, has been placed to capital, and £10,000 from Lord Iveagh, which has been similarly disposed of. Considerable sums have also been received from legacies, but it has been thought

advisable to follow the established custom of distributing under this head an amount equal to the average receipts of past years. The sum thus available in the present year is £31,000. I am very glad to announce that the Fund has been in a position to allocate £140,000 for distribution among hospitals, convalescent homes, and country consumption sanatoria. This is an increase of £19,000 over the sum distributed last year, and it is most encouraging to think that, in the past ten years, almost without any exception, there has been a steady increase in the annual amount available for distribution. Amongst the largest grants is that of £5,000 more to the removal fund of King's College Hospital, making a total of £27,000 granted by the Fund to this excellent object; and you will be glad to hear that the building on the new site at Denmark Hill has actually been commenced, so that adequate hospital accommodation will be provided in the near future in a district where it has long been needed. The grant of £12,000 to the London Hospital, including £2,000 towards the reduction of its debt, will be recognised as further evidence of the Fund's appreciation of the noble and efficient work carried out by that institution. The Fund continues to encourage the amalgamation of the smaller hospitals which are working on more or less parallel lines. It is hoped that the Throat, Nose, and Ear Hospitals may before long be willing to take action in this direction. The maintenance grants which would probably have been made to them in their separate existence have justly been reserved until the negotiations have assumed some more definite shape. It will be noticed from the Distribution Committee's report that the Fund adheres to the policy of aiding the extension of hospitals situated in or near to the poorer districts, and remote from the larger general hospitals, thus meeting the urgent needs of the dwellers in those localities. The principle is one which involves a wide and detailed survey of the requirements of the Metropolis as a whole, and of the abundance or scarcity of hospital accommodation in its various parts. I observe with satisfaction that the Committee have given the most careful consideration to this difficult question, and their report affords us much enlightenment and guidance in forming a judgment on the question of unoccupied beds. We are again indebted to the London Parochial Charities for their annual grant of £1,000 for the convalescent homes, which we have been able to supplement this year. Those acquainted with the homes and the life of the London poor will agree that the use of convalescent homes to complete the cure begun in the London hospitals is, in many cases, most essential. I trust that the help of the London Parochial Charities may be continued, and that we may be able, year by year, to renew our efforts on behalf of these institutions. At our Distribution meeting, a year ago, it was decided to extend the operations of the Fund to consumption sanatoria in the country, taking patients from London. Powers in this matter were delegated to the Convalescent Homes Committee, and you have just heard their report on this subject. It may be that this new departure of the Fund is not yet widely known, or that there are, as yet, only a small number of homes capable of dealing with what is an undoubted want. But, whatever the cause, the number of applications for grants from the Fund is unexpectedly small. It is common knowledge that the demands upon such well-known institutions as the Ventnor and Bournemouth sanatoria are very great. Admission to these is limited to patients who have obtained letters, and doubtless the rights thus assured to subscribers combine with the high reputation of the institutions to maintain their finances in their present creditable position. But even so, patients have almost invariably to wait for a considerable time for admission, and it is evident that these institutions meet only a portion of the existing demand. If the applications received by the Convalescent Homes Committee this year are to be taken as a measure of the supply of beds in the country for the consumptive poor of London, I cannot help feeling that the supply is inadequate. One step towards meeting this need has already been taken by the formation of the National Association for the Establishment and Maintenance of Sanatoria for Workers Suffering from Tuberculosis. The Benenden Sanatorium is the first outcome of this movement, and I think you will agree that such an effort on the part of the workers themselves to deal with this great question deserves the encouragement and support of the Fund. I regret that the annual subscriptions do not increase as much as was contemplated by the originators of the Fund, especially as regards small amounts, and I hope that this will not be lost sight of by our committees; at the same time, we must not forget the liberal and steadily increasing contributions to the League of Mercy. Following upon the introduction of the revised uniform system of accounts, the statistical report which the Fund prepares every year upon the expenditure of the various hospitals has been considerably enlarged and extended. Eighteen more hospitals have been included, bringing the total number up to sixty-six, and the expenditure on in-patients has now, for the first time, been separated from that on out-patients. This has removed one possible source of error in the

comparisons of cost per bed, and there is every reason to hope that the new series of reports, which has now been begun by Mr. Maynard, our secretary, will still further assist the control over expenditure which followed the initiation of the first series. Last year, in nominating members of committees, I stated that I proposed to proceed on the principle of not nominating any individual to more than one committee. This principle has worked satisfactorily during the past year, and for the ensuing year I do not propose to make any change in this respect. The fact that we have over 100 members of the Fund serving either as Visitors or on this Council, or on the various committees, is, I think, a guarantee to our subscribers, and to the general public, that the management of the Fund is widely distributed. The experience of last year suggested the necessity of certain amendments to the delegation resolutions agreed to in January last. Under my instructions amended resolutions have been drafted, and they lie on the table, together with a memorandum summarising these changes. If you should approve of the new form to-day, the meeting of the Council, which it is necessary to hold early in the new year, need only be formal. I wish to take this opportunity of recording my sincere gratitude, and that of the Council, to the honorary officials and members of the League of Mercy, numbering among them many of the keenest and most consistent supporters of the Fund from its inception, for the gratifying results of the past year, and for the continued increase of the yearly amount secured. To the honorary officials of the Fund I offer my warmest thanks for their devoted, untiring, and most valued services. Owing to the extension of the area of our operations, the work of the Visitors has considerably increased, and I am deeply sensible of the careful and efficient manner in which it is done. I cannot conclude without referring to the lamented death of Mr. Vaughan Hawkins. His wise counsels and vast experience proved of the greatest benefit, both in the drafting of the King Edward's Hospital Fund for London Bill and in its guidance through the two Houses of Parliament. I have now much pleasure in moving the adoption of the reports.

The Lord Mayor (Sir G. WYATT TRUSCOTT) seconded the motion, which was supported by Mr. DANVERS POWER.

After discussion, the adoption of the reports was put and carried unanimously.

On the motion of Lord IVEAGH, seconded by the Chairman of the London County Council (Mr. R. A. ROBINSON), it was resolved—That the cheques for the grants should be posted on December 17.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1909.

The PRESIDENT then said: My Lords and Gentlemen,—With regard to the Council for 1909, I have already alluded to our loss by the death of Mr. Vaughan Hawkins, and it is my intention to appoint the remaining members of the General Council of 1908 to serve again if they will kindly do so. I also desire to appoint the members of the Finance Committee who served last year. With regard to the Distribution Committee, I wish to appoint Sir William Church (Chairman), Sir Trevor Lawrence, the Rev. Canon Barnett, Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Cooper Perry, Sir John Tweedy, Mr. Frederick M. Fry, and Mr. Oswald Partington. With regard to the Convalescent Homes Committee, I intend to appoint the same gentlemen as before, with the addition of Sir Horace Marshall and Sir Havelock Charles. With regard to the Executive Committee, I propose to appoint the same gentlemen as before, with the addition of Mr. Harry Lawson and Mr. William Whittall.

On the motion of the Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. W. MIDDLETON CAMPBELL), seconded by the BISHOP OF LONDON, resolutions were approved delegating power to the Finance, Distribution, and Convalescent Homes Committees.

On the motion of Sir EVERARD HAMBRO, seconded by Sir HORACE MARSHALL, a resolution was approved delegating powers to the Executive Committee.

On the motion of Mr. STUART-WORTLEY, seconded by the MASTER OF ELIBANK, the Council directed that it should be an instruction to the Executive to report on the question of rules and regulations.

HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS then moved :—"That the keys of the lock under which the corporate seal is kept be held as follows : One of the three keys comprising one triplicate set shall be held respectively by the Earl of Bessborough, the Lord Rothschild, and Mr. Frederick M. Fry, and one of the three keys comprising the other triplicate set shall be held respectively by Sir Savile Crossley, Mr. J. Danvers Power, and Mr. Hugh Colin Smith."

The Speaker of the House of Commons (the Right Hon. JAMES W. LOWTHER, M.P.) said that the business before them being now concluded, he had the great honour of asking them to pass a vote of thanks to his Royal Highness for his kindness in taking the chair that day. He was sure it did not need any words from him, the youngest member of that Council, to commend this to their attention, because it would receive the unanimous support of them all. The Council was very much indebted to his Royal Highness for the great care and attention and time and study which he gave to the Fund. The poor of London and the cause of charity throughout the metropolis owed a great debt to his Royal Highness for having thrust himself so readily into this rather heavy work. As a representative of one of the Houses of Parliament, he would like to congratulate not only his Royal Highness, but himself, upon the fact that the intervention of Parliament did not seem to have inflicted any injury upon the cause, and that, as they had heard that day, the increased authority, the increased efficiency, and the growing usefulness of the Fund had not, at all events, been injured, and he thought they might flatter themselves that they had been advanced by the incorporation of the Fund under an Act of Parliament.

The Postmaster-General (the Right Hon. SYDNEY BUXTON, M.P.), in seconding the vote, expressed the opinion that it was not so much the large sum of money distributed among the hospitals which had shown the value of the Fund as the conditions coupled with the grants. These had certainly brought about a very great improvement in hospital administration.

The vote was carried by acclamation.

THE PRINCE OF WALES said :—Gentlemen, in thanking you for the vote of thanks which has been so kindly proposed by the Speaker, and seconded by the Postmaster-General, I am sure you would like to know that the King was much pleased to hear of the large increase in the sum which we have been able to distribute this year, and he has asked me to congratulate you on the excellent management of his Fund.

The proceedings then terminated.

The Annual Meeting of the President and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, to receive and adopt the Accounts and the Report for the year 1908, was held at Marlborough House on March 10, 1909, H.R.H. the PRINCE OF WALES, President of the Fund, being in the chair.

Douglas Powell, Bt.), the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Mr. Henry Morris), the Right Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt. (Hon. Secretary), the Right Hon. Sir Joseph Dimsdale, Bt., the Right Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P., the Right Hon. C. Stuart-Wortley, K.C., M.P., Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt., Sir W. S. Church, Bt., Sir Edgar

Speyer, Bt., Lieut.-Colonel Sir Arthur Bigge, Sir Horace Marshall, Sir W. J. Collins, M.P., Sir John Craggs, Mr. J. Danvers Power, Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary), Mr. Albert G. Sandeman, and Mr. Hugh C. Smith.

The Minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: The Lord-Lieutenant of the County of London (the Duke of Fife), the Duke of Norfolk, the Bishop of London, Archbishop Bourne, the Earl of Bessborough, Viscount Iveagh, Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, the Speaker of the House of Commons (the Right Hon. J. W. Lowther, M.P.), the Postmaster-General (the Right Hon. Sydney Buxton, M.P.), the President of the Local Government Board (the Right Hon. John Burns, M.P.), the Chairman of the County Council (Sir R. Melvill Beachcroft), the Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. W. Middleton Campbell), the Right Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel, Sir Julius Wernher, Bt., Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Everard Hambro, Mr. John G. Griffiths, Mr. William Latham, K.C., Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, jun., and Professor W. Osler.

Sir WILLIAM CHURCH (Chairman of the Distribution Committee) moved, and the LORD MAYOR seconded, a resolution with reference to the payment of an amalgamation grant.

Lord ROTHSCHILD (the Hon. Treasurer) in presenting the Account of Receipts and Expenditure and the Balance Sheet for the year ending December 31, 1908, called attention to the fact that the income from investments included a bonus dividend of £17,000 on securities given by Lord Mount Stephen and Lord Strathcona. The Balance Sheet now presented was of a rather more complicated nature than usual, because by the Act of Parliament they had to invest in trust funds those moneys left without any particulars being specified, and only in non-trust funds those which the donors desired should be so invested. When the separation of these funds took place—on July 21—the non-trust funds were worth £100,000 more than they cost, and on December 31 there was a further increase of £100,000. At the latter date the trust funds showed an increase of only £1,000. He looked forward, with the advice of the gentlemen with him on the Finance Committee, to successfully administering the funds entrusted to them, and he hoped they would have many opportunities of acknowledging gifts of money both for trust and non-trust funds.

The PRINCE OF WALES moved the adoption of the Accounts, which was seconded by Sir EDGAR SPEYER, and carried unanimously.

Sir SAVILE CROSSLEY (Hon. Secretary) presented the Draft Report of the Council for the year 1908.

THE PRINCE OF WALES, in moving the adoption of the Report, said:—My Lords and Gentlemen,—You will, I hope, agree with me in thinking that we may congratulate ourselves upon the condition of the affairs of the Fund as described in the report which lies on the table. I do not propose to go at length into the various questions to which it refers, as the business of the Fund was fully dealt with at our meeting in December. The Act of Incorporation has worked most satisfactorily and smoothly during the past year. It has been necessary to hold a considerable number of committee meetings, but the members have, as usual, responded readily to the calls made upon their time. The completion of the negotiations for the amalgamation of the Hampstead and North-West London Hospitals will, I feel sure, be approved of by the charitable public, both as conducing to the better organisation of hospital accommodation in that neighbourhood, and as one more step in the direction of economy of management. It will be remembered that the orthopædic hospitals were the first to combine, and it is satisfactory to know that the new buildings in Great Portland Street will be ready for occupation by the three amalgamated institutions in the course of this year. Last March we looked forward to the appointment of a committee to inquire into the system prevailing in the London voluntary hospitals with regard to the admission of out-patients. The report of the Poor Law Commission which we were waiting for, has, as you know, quite recently appeared, and will

require most careful consideration. As it is probable that the whole of the evidence upon which the report is based will not be issued for some considerable time, I have decided, upon the advice of the Executive Committee, to defer the appointment of our committee of inquiry until next year. I have now much pleasure in moving the adoption of the report.

THE BISHOP OF SOUTHWARK, in seconding the motion, said it was with real satisfaction that they had listened to what the Chairman of the Finance Committee had been able to report as to the condition of the Fund. If they looked at either end of their support, at the big end or the little end, the results were equally satisfactory. On the one hand, it was not at all certain that benefactions so great as those of the late Mr. Lewis and of Lord Mount Stephen, Lord Strathcona, and Lord Iveagh would have come to the hospitals of London had there not been a Fund like this acting as a focus, accredited by the patronage of his Majesty and of his Royal Highness, and known to be managed as this Fund was. At the other end, it was satisfactory to note that the League of Mercy continued its beautiful work of gathering in the small donations of those who gave with as much feeling and perhaps with as much sacrifice as the wealthier donors.

The resolution was then put and carried unanimously.

In the absence of Lord Bessborough (Chairman of the Executive Committee), Mr. STUART-WORTLEY presented an interim report of the Executive Committee upon the question of rules and regulations, which was adopted.

Mr. HUGH C. SMITH moved, and the MASTER of ELIBANK seconded, a vote of thanks to H.R.H. the Prince of Wales for presiding, the vote being carried by acclamation.

HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS said:—My Lords and Gentlemen, I much appreciate the very kind manner in which the vote of thanks has been proposed and received. The large attendance of members at these meetings, and the hearty support which you invariably give me, are most gratifying, and greatly encourage me in my work as President of the Fund, in which I am so deeply interested.

The proceedings then terminated.

Report of the Distribution Committee.

(1) The Council having this year placed the sum of £135,000 in the hands of the Committee for distribution amongst the London Hospitals, as against £120,000 in 1907, the Committee beg to report as follows:—

(2) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is 105, as against 99 last year, three having fallen out and nine new applications having been received. Of the new applications, four are from institutions which have become eligible for the first time as the result of the extension of the area from the seven to the nine mile radius from Charing Cross.

(3) Among the hospitals which have fallen out is the North-West London Hospital, which has ceased to exist as a separate institution as the result of the decision to amalgamate with the Hampstead General Hospital. An increased maintenance grant of £1,500 becomes payable to the Hampstead General Hospital for five years on the completion of this amalgamation.

(4) In regard to the Throat, Nose, and Ear Hospitals, the Executive Committee in January last passed the following resolution:—

“The Executive Committee, while adhering to its policy in regard to the amalgamation of small hospitals, considers that the responsibility for the business of these amalgamations at present rests on the hospitals themselves, the King's Fund having by the sums provisionally set aside against the event of amalgamation shown its readiness to forward the desired object.”

This resolution was communicated to the hospitals concerned, but, so far as the Committee are aware, no step has been taken by them in the direction of amalgamation. The Committee have set aside a further sum of £3,000 instead of making separate grants to each hospital. They cannot, however, recommend that this sum, together with the £3,000 already set on one side for the same purpose in the last two years, should be held over indefinitely, nor do they wish it to be understood that these amounts will be paid to the Throat and Ear Hospitals if the amalgamation is not carried out.

(5) In 1906 the Council approved of a recommendation of this Committee that grants made towards specified objects, such as building or other improvements, should in future be retained by the Fund until required, but that some limit should be placed on the length of time during which such grants should be allowed to remain unexpended, and that they should be reconsidered every two years while they remained unapplied. Of the grants made in

December 1906, and retained in accordance with this decision, the following amounts are still unpaid, viz. :—

Dreadnought Hospital, £124. 15s. 3d., being the balance of a grant of £2,000 to improvements.

Hospital for Women, £2,000 granted to rebuilding.

London Lock Hospital, £1,000 to nursing accommodation.

St. Mary's, Plaistow, £1,000 to building.

The Committee recommend that the unpaid grants to the Dreadnought and to St. Mary's, Plaistow, be renewed, and that the grant to the Hospital for Women be renewed and transferred to the scheme of reconstruction which has now received the approval of the Committee. In the case of the London Lock Hospital, the grant of £1,000 to nursing accommodation, which now lapses, was in addition to grants of £1,600—viz. £1,000 paid over in 1905 and £600 granted in 1907 and still retained by the Fund till required. The Committee recommend that a sum of £4,000 should be added to the lapsed grant, and that the whole sum of £5,000 should be given to the rebuilding of the out-patient department at Dean Street (to which a substantial grant was promised in 1906 and 1907), on the understanding that the sum now needed to complete the fund for building the nurses' home at Harrow Road is subscribed by the public.

(6) The sum of £5,000 voted towards the removal of King's College Hospital to South London increases the total amount contributed by the Fund to this object to £27,000. The Committee are glad to know that building operations on the new site are now in progress.

(7) In February last the Committee issued a circular setting forth the full purport and intention of the resolution of the General Council that in future any new hospital, or those reconstructing or extending to a considerable extent within the area dealt with by the Fund, be requested, before taking definite action, to submit their proposals to the Fund. In the course of the year various schemes of greater or less magnitude have been submitted under this resolution. To some of these the Committee have raised no objection, in some they have suggested modifications, while two or three are still under consideration. In some cases the result of the Committee's deliberations upon these proposals is reflected in the grants recommended and in the accompanying public or private remarks.

(8) The Committee have continued the policy of making substantial grants in aid of the extension of various hospitals situated in or near to the poorer districts remote from the larger general hospitals. In doing so they have not lost sight of the fact that in other parts of London there are beds or bed spaces unoccupied. They have carefully considered every case in which the existence of such vacant accommodation in institutions applying to the Fund has been reported. The Committee exclude from this category beds which are temporarily unoccupied merely as the result of the periodic changes of occupant, the provision of a surplus for accidental emergencies, and the occasional closing of wards for necessary cleaning. Apart from this inevitable margin, they find that most of the beds reported as vacant fall into the following classes :—

- (a) Beds which are at present used for the accommodation of nurses or for other necessary hospital purposes which could not be provided for elsewhere without expenditure on building ;

- (b) Beds, the accommodation for which was erected without due consideration of the local demand or of the prospect of maintenance, and which have never been opened for use ;
- (c) Beds which have recently become available as the result of extensions and which there is at present no reason to suppose the hospitals will not be able to open as public support (including the normal grants from this Fund) increases in response to the increased demand ; and
- (d) Beds in Hospitals which have for one reason or another failed to secure or to retain public confidence.

The remaining beds which may properly be described as vacant for want of funds are less than twenty-five, and in the case of some of these there are special circumstances which render their availability doubtful.

The Committee consider that in view of the existing distribution of the demand for hospital accommodation, the resources of the King's Fund can at present be better employed in assisting the extensions of the outlying hospitals above referred to than in opening the beds reported as vacant.

(9) The Reports of the Visitors have, as heretofore, received the careful consideration of the Committee and have been of the utmost value.

(10) The Committee have found that the Revised System of Accounts, which provides for the publication of uniform balance sheets and the separation of the expenditure upon the In-patient and the Out-patient departments, has greatly facilitated the task of ascertaining the exact financial position of the various hospitals and of comparing their cost of working.

(11) In addition to their published remarks, the Committee have followed and extended their usual practice in recommending that various suggestions, including many arising from the Visitors' Reports, should be made privately to the hospitals. They have not omitted to call attention to the cases where, from the Statistical Report, it appears that greater attention to economical working is most urgently needed.

The details of the awards to the various hospitals are appended.

(1) Hitherto the Convalescent Homes Committee have dealt only with the sum of £1,000, which has for ten years been entrusted to the Fund annually by the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities for distribution amongst Convalescent Homes. This year, however, the power of recommending as to the distribution of grants not only to Convalescent Homes, but also to Consumption Sanatoria outside the Metropolitan area, has been delegated to the Committee as reconstituted under the Act of Incorporation. Applications from Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria were accordingly invited in the annual advertisements and press notices; and the President and General Council have placed in the hands of the Committee the sum of £4,000 for both objects, in addition to the grant of £1,000 generously continued by the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities for Convalescent Homes only. The Committee beg to report as follows:—

(2) The number of applications eligible for consideration amounted to thirty-three from Convalescent Homes and five from Consumption Sanatoria, as against twenty-eight from Convalescent Homes last year.

(3) The Committee observe with regret the small number of Consumption Sanatoria which have applied for grants, and they have been impressed by the apparent absence of facilities for the transfer of consumption patients from London hospitals to country institutions at the time at which, in the opinion of the hospital doctors, they most need it. Two of the London Consumption Hospitals have their own country branches to which a certain number of patients can be so transferred. These branches are dealt with by the Distribution Committee in conjunction with the parent institutions. In the case of consumptive patients in other London hospitals there appears to be no means of securing the admission to sanatoria of those who specially need country treatment except by means of a subscriber's letter, which even after it is obtained involves a delay, often of many weeks, while the patient waits his turn for admission. The Committee have made inquiries with a view to ascertaining whether this difficulty could be overcome, but have failed to arrive at any arrangement by which certain and prompt admission, in however small a number of cases, might be secured to London patients.

The Committee note that it is not the practice of the Fund to accept subscribers' letters in return for grants, and they do not consider that this rule should be departed from in the case of country sanatoria. It is true that such letters would ensure that grants from the Fund would benefit London patients, but an addition to the number of letters issued by the sanatoria would only increase the delay experienced by the nominees of other subscribers without securing for a single patient in a London hospital the benefit of country treatment at the moment it is most needed.

(4) As the small number of applications from suitable institutions may be partly due to the fact that the extension of the operations of the Fund to Consumption Sanatoria is a new departure which may not yet be generally known, the Committee recommend that the sum of £1,000 out of the additional sum of £4,000 at their disposal this year should be carried for the present to a Suspense Account, and that in the event of any further communications being received the Committee be authorised to make a supplementary recommendation for its distribution either to the Annual Meeting of the President and General Council in the spring, or to the next Ordinary Distribution Meeting in December, as the case may be.

(5) In the circumstances set forth in the preceding paragraphs the Committee have devoted a larger share of their total funds to Convalescent Homes than they would otherwise have done, and they would not desire it to be assumed that the grants to Convalescent Homes will necessarily be on the same scale in future years.

(6) In some cases the Committee have made grants in aid of building and other special purposes which they were unable to assist when they had only £1,000 of strictly income moneys to distribute. They recommend that such grants should be retained by the Fund until required, upon the same conditions as in the case of special grants to hospitals.

(7) It has been the practice of the Fund in the case of hospitals in the London area not to assist in the foundation of new hospitals, nor to entertain applications for grants from hospitals which have not been in existence in a properly constituted form for a period of at least three years. But in view of the apparent lack of country accommodation for London consumptives the Committee recommend that exceptions to this rule should at present be permitted in the case of Consumption Sanatoria in the country.

(8) The Committee are much indebted to the Visitors who undertook the task of inspecting the Consumption Sanatoria in the country, and whose reports have been of the greatest value.

(9) In addition to their published remarks, the Committee have made suggestions privately to certain institutions. This practice has enabled them, amongst other things, to draw attention in some cases to the need for economy and to the fact that the Revised Uniform System of Accounts applies to Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria as fully as to hospitals within the Metropolitan area.

(10) The grants to the various institutions are appended. The Committee consider that the names of Convalescent Homes to which grants are not made should not be published. This has been their practice hitherto. In the case of Consumption Sanatoria, however, it seems to the Committee desirable that the list should contain the names of all that have been admitted to consideration and inspected by the Fund's Visitors.

Cheques and Postal Orders should be made payable to "KING EDWARD'S HOSPITAL FUND FOR LONDON," and crossed "Bank of England."
