PREFATORY NOTE

Before the inception of the National Health Service the annual Statistical Summaries prepared by the King's Fund provided the recognised means of assessing the work of London voluntary hospitals. These figures can no longer be published for the national hospitals, but a large number of convalescent homes, homes for incurables, hospitals and other institutions are still operating independently, and all those on the books of the Fund are requested to furnish accounts and statistics on a uniform basis—The Revised Uniform System for Hospitals.

The Fund has prepared the following Summary for its own information, but it is thought that the Hospitals and Homes concerned in this Summary may find the figures interesting and helpful.

They have been placed in six roughly comparable groups—(1) Convalescent Homes—Men and Women, (2) Convalescent Homes—Children and Infants, (3) Convalescent Homes with Special Schools, (4) Homes for Incurables and Other Institutions, (5) Homes for the Aged Sick and (6) Hospitals.

It should be borne in mind that there are many factors attaching to the running of homes and hospitals which may lead to apparently surprising differences in costs, etc., as between one and another, which could only be explained by a more detailed examination of all the circumstances.
