

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1915.

The total receipts for the year 1915 were £226,779 19s. 5d., of which £12,949 17s. 9d. were contributions to Capital, and £213,830 1s. 8d. receipts on General Account.

The very generous donation of £28,000 from Sir Ernest Cassel, like his similar gift of £31,500 in 1911, formed part of a total of £50,000 given by him for distribution amongst Hospitals in London and the provinces, this time in the form of $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. War Stock, 1925-45. The proportion entrusted to this Fund was distributed, as before, amongst the institutions receiving grants from the Fund, in the form of supplementary grants equal in each case to one-fifth of the original grant. The effect of Sir Ernest Cassel's generosity was thus not only to increase the grants, but to ensure that a holding of War Stock should appear on the Balance Sheet of each institution.

The amount originally appropriated for distribution was £140,000, being the same amount as in 1914. Of this, £133,500 was allocated to London Hospitals and £6,500 to Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients. These totals were increased by the supplementary grants in respect of Sir Ernest Cassel's gift to £168,000; £160,200 and £7,800 to the two classes of institution respectively.

Of the £133,500 allocated by the Fund from its ordinary resources to the London Hospitals, £111,775 was granted in aid of general maintenance, £5,750 to the reduction of debts on maintenance account, and £15,975 towards schemes of buildings or improvements:

the supplementary grants following the same apportionment. Although the Fund has continued to encourage the Hospitals in the policy of postponing all schemes of capital expenditure that were not already in hand at the outbreak of war or exceptionally urgent, the claims on the Fund in this respect were slightly greater than in 1914. Nevertheless, the amount granted in maintenance, even before the addition of the supplementary grants from Sir Ernest Cassel's special donation, was larger than in 1913.

The £6,500 distributed by the Convalescent Homes Committee (apart from the supplementary grants of £1,300 War Stock) was allocated as follows: £4,560 to Convalescent Homes and £1,940 to Consumption Sanatoria. The increased grants to Sanatoria enabled 52 beds to be reserved for the use of patients in London Hospitals as against 44 last year. This increase was rendered possible by the fact that several Convalescent Homes formerly eligible as taking London patients had either been closed owing to the war or had become, for the time being, country hospitals for wounded.

The question whether the sphere of operations of the Fund could be extended to include such hospitals, or certain other institutions now outside its limits, was very carefully considered, and it was decided that in view of the existing and prospective needs of the Hospitals now within the area, no extension was advisable at the present time.

The total sum distributed amongst Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria during the last ten years (after deducting conditional grants to the extent of £7,500 that have been allowed to lapse), is £1,484,750. Since the foundation of the Fund a total amount of £2,098,416 8s. 5d. has been distributed. The first million was passed in 1909, the thirteenth year of the Fund. It has taken six years for the grants to reach the second million. The average annual distribution for the whole period of 19 years has been £110,442 19s. 4d.

During the year the amount spent on administration was £3,205 16s. 1d., or £1 8s. 3d. per cent. of the total amount received, as compared with £3,178 6s. 5d., or 12s. per cent., last year. The corresponding percentage for the whole period since the inauguration of the Fund has been £1 4s. $7\frac{1}{2}d$., and the average yearly outlay in this respect has been £2,819 0s. 7d.

His Majesty the King, Patron of the Fund, has been graciously pleased to continue his annual subscription of £1,000. Her Majesty Queen Mary, Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, and many other members of the Royal Family, have also again honoured the Fund with subscriptions.

The list of contributors includes annual subscriptions of £5,000 from Mr. Walter Morrison, £4,000 from the Drapers' Company, £1,000 from Lord Astor, and £1,000 from the Merchant Taylors' Company; besides an anonymous donation of £1,000. The Fund has also received annual subscriptions of £500 from the City Corporation, from Lord Iveagh, from Sir John R. Ellerman, Bt., from Mr. Robert Fleming, from Messrs. Morgan, Grenfell & Co., and from Messrs. N. M. Rothschild & Sons; and donations of the same amount from the Clothworkers' Company, and from "S.D.R.S.D."

The League of Mercy this year has again contributed £14,000, and the Council is greatly indebted to the members of the League for so successful an effort during a time of special difficulty. The total amount received from the League of Mercy since its foundation in

1899 now amounts to £230,000, apart from the sums awarded by the League to institutions outside the area of the Fund's distribution. The Council desire to express their appreciation of this very substantial benefit derived from the efforts of a numerous band of voluntary workers.

Legacies received during the year include (in addition to a further amount of £34,121 8s. 1d. from the Lewis bequest) £6,174 12s. 9d., on account of the residue of the estate of the late Mr. Alfred John Heath, and an additional sum of £1,182 9s. 5d. given by the executors of the late Miss Emma Brandreth in the exercise of their discretionary powers. The Fund has also received the sum of £475, "a payment by the residuary legatee, Miss Letitia Overend, to carry out what she believed to be the wish and intention of her late uncle, Mr. T. B. G. Overend."

The amount announced in the last Annual Report as received from the estate of the late Sir Julius Wernher was increased by further receipts of £6,300 during the year to £320,015 13s. 2d. The very generous legacy of one-twelfth of the residue of his estate, of which this represents the first instalments, was left in augmentation of the capital account of the Fund; and the interest has been of the greatest value in helping to maintain the distribution.

Since the end of the year the Fund has received notification of the munificent bequest of the residue of the estate of the late Isabella Dowager Countess of Wilton. This legacy, which is estimated at £150,000, will very greatly assist the Fund to provide for the exceptional demands which it is feared may be made upon it in the near future.

In order to maintain the distribution on the same scale as that of the last two years, an annual sum of nearly £50,000 has to be raised from subscriptions, donations, and legacies, and as there is every reason to believe that the full effect of the war, both upon income and upon expenditure, has still to be felt by the Hospitals, the claims on the Fund are likely to increase rather than to diminish.

The total amount received from annual subscriptions and donations during 1915 (apart from the gift of Sir Ernest Cassel) showed, as compared with 1914, a decrease of £162 8s. 4d., while the receipts from legacies (other than the Lewis and Harman bequests) were £24,083 18s. 8d. less than in the previous year, and were £27,482 6s. 10d. less than the average of the five years 1910–1914.

The Executive Committee of the Fund have kept themselves informed on various matters arising out of the war which affected the London Hospitals upon which the action of a central Fund such as this could be of assistance. Amongst other matters the Committee have considered and corresponded with the authorities on the formulation of a scale of grants-in-aid in respect of hospital treatment of naval or military patients, which is now in general operation; and on the deficiency of resident medical officers resulting from the requirements of the Army and Navy Medical Services.

The inquiry into the subject of Pensions for Hospital Officers was delayed at the beginning of the war. But the preparation of the Report of the Sub-committee was resumed later on, and was still in progress at the end of the year.

The Statistical Report on the expenditure of the London Hospitals has been continued during the war in a modified form. All calculations that do not seem to be of sufficient value under the exceptional circumstances have been omitted, at some saving of cost and labour, while particulars relating to naval and military patients have been added.

Each eligible Hospital and Consumption Sanatorium which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon, as hitherto, by two of the Fund's visitors, one medical man and one layman in each case.

At the Annual Meeting of the Governors and General Council, held at St. James's Palace on April 19, 1915, the following resolution was unanimously passed:

That the Governors and General Council desire to place on record their profound regret at the death of Lord Rothschild, Hon. Treasurer of the Fund since its foundation. They recall with gratitude the great services rendered by him as Treasurer and as an active member of the Council during the whole period of its existence, as Trustee and member of the Executive Committee down to the incorporation of the Fund by Act of Parliament in 1907, and subsequently as Chairman of the Finance Committee. They are deeply indebted to Lord Rothschild for the skill and care which he devoted to the ever-growing responsibilities of his office, and they deplore the loss of a colleague whose name, whose ability, and whose interest in the work of charity, were a constant source of strength to the Council and to the Fund.

The Council also regret to record the death of Mr. William Latham, K.C., who was a member of the Council and had been Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee from 1898 to 1914. The Fund has also lost through death the services of Mr. Stanley Boyd, F.R.C.S., Dr. G. A. Heron, F.R.C.P., and Mr. Edmund Owen, F.R.C.S., who had given valuable help as visitors on behalf of the Fund for many years.

The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co., Chartered Accountants, to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year. They have been the Honorary Auditors of the Fund since January, 1898.

The Council are under great obligations to the Press for the valuable services they have rendered in the past, and continue to rely upon their kindly co-operation in obtaining for the Fund wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

A Meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes, and Consumption Sanatoria, for the year, was held at St. James's Palace on Thursday, December 16, 1915, at 11.30 A.M., the Speaker of the House of Commons (The Rt. Hon. James W. Lowther, M.P.) in the chair.

Secretary); The Rt. Hon. Sir Vezey Strong; Sir William S. Church, Bt.; Sir Henry Burdett; Sir William H. Bennett; Sir William J. Collins; Sir Horace Marshall; Sir John Tweedy; Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary); Dr. Edwin Freshfield; Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary); and Mr. Walter Morrison.

The Minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, and signed by the Speaker of the House of Commons, letters of regret were reported from the following: H.H. The Duke of Teck; The Lord Lieutenant of the County of London (The Marquess of Crewe); The Bishop of London; Cardinal Bourne; The Rev. W. L. Watkinson, D.D.; The Chief Rabbi (The Rev. Dr. J. H. Hertz); The Earl of Bessborough; Lord Farquhar; Lord Murray of Elibank; The Hon. Arthur Stanley; The Hon. H. L. W. Lawson, M.P.; The Postmaster General (The Rt. Hon. Herbert Samuel, M.P.); The President of the Local Government Board (The Rt. Hon. Walter Long, M.P.); The Governor of the Bank of England (Lord Cunliffe); The President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir W. Watson Cheyne, Bt.); The Rt. Hon. C. Stuart-Wortley, K.C., M.P.; The Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P.; Sir Owen Philipps; Sir Cooper Perry; Sir John Craggs; Mr. Robert Fleming; Mr. Algernon E. Sydney.

Lord REVELSTOKE (the Honorary Treasurer), in reporting that the amount received for General Purposes by the Fund to December 11th, after payment of expenses, was £124,575, said that it was satisfactory to notice, especially during the difficult times which the financial world had been passing through in the last eighteen months, that the income from investments for 1915 exceeded that for 1914 by about £,14,000.

Sir WILLIAM COLLINS, in making the annual statement on behalf of the League of Mercy, said the League was happily in a position, at the close of the current year, again to contribute £14,000 to the Fund, as in 1913 and 1914, thus making a total of £230,000 contributed by the League to the Fund since the foundation of the former in 1899. It had been a difficult year for the League. The stringency of money, the rival claims of other Funds, the fact that many of their workers were engaged in war service, made the year a very difficult one; and, had they not been able to urge that the voluntary Hospitals were themselves doing admirable war service, it would probably have been impossible to present such a satisfactory report.

Sir WILLIAM CHURCH (the Chairman of the Distribution Committee) presented the Report of that Committee.

Mr. FREDERICK M. FRV (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

Dr. Edwin Freshfield (the Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee) presented the Report of that Committee.

Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

The Speaker of the House of Commons, in moving the adoption of the Report and Awards, said:—My Lords and Gentlemen,—In the continued absence of the Duke of Teck on military duty, I rise on behalf of the Governors to move the adoption of the Report. First of all, I have the honour to read the following letter, which His Majesty has been graciously pleased to address to the Presiding Governor, through Lord Stamfordham:-

"Buckingham Palace,

"Yours very faithfully,

" 15th December, 1915.

"STAMFORDHAM.

"Dear Sir,-I am commanded by the King to ask you to convey to the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund his congratulations on the maintenance of the distribution at the same amount as last year.

"His Majesty is interested to see that the total amount distributed by the Fund since its foundation, 19 years ago, now exceeds £2,000,000—a convincing proof of the success of the

scheme inaugurated by His late Majesty King Edward.

"His Majesty trusts that the Fund will continue to receive the generous support of the public and will thus be enabled effectively to assist the Hospitals of London in carrying on their beneficent work during these times of difficulty.

"To the Presiding Governor, "King Edward's Hospital Fund for London."

The present distribution is in a sense a landmark in the history of the Fund, owing to the fact that it will make the total amount distributed since the foundation of the Fund a little over £2,000,000, the exact total, in nineteen years, being £2,070,416 8s. 5d. The first million was reached in 1909, when the Fund had been in existence thirteen years. With these figures before us, we may fairly claim that the Fund has succeeded in rendering (to quote the words of the Act of Incorporation) efficient aid and support to the Hospitals of London. This is the second distribution of the Fund that has taken place under war conditions, and I need hardly say that very important questions have had to be considered in fixing the amount to be distributed and in settling the details of the various awards. In both connections we have to look before and after, taking into account not only the present but the future, and to some extent also the past. With regard to the income of the Fund we know what our present position is. Subscriptions and donations have been on the whole very fairly maintained, thanks partly to the loyal support of those who were already contributors, and partly to the welcome help of new subscribers who realise the need of maintaining the Fund's distribution through the period of stress. It is particularly gratifying that the League of Mercy should have been able to make the same contribution as last year, exactly one-tenth part of the total distributed. Legacies show a considerable reduction, but this, fortunately, is to some extent balanced by the additional income received from the investments representing the late Sir Julius Wernher's munificent bequest to the capital of the Fund. The result is that we are enabled to make the same distribution as last year. Though this is a smaller total than in the years before the war, the demands in aid of capital expenditure are still so much less than in 1913 that the grants to maintenance are actually larger. We are, therefore, still able to achieve the object aimed at by our financial policy in the good years of the past-namely, that the Hospitals should, as far as possible, continue to receive from the Fund, in relation to their individual needs, the assistance for which they have become accustomed to look. To what extent that assistance can be continued in full measure in the future, only the future can show. All we can say is that the needs of the future are constantly present to the minds of the Committees which have charge of the resources of the Fund—the Executive Committee, which sees to the collection of the funds and recommends the amount to be distributed; and the Finance Committee, which has the care of the investments. Whatever can be done by those Committees to safeguard the future we feel sure has been, and is

being, done. But this Fund exists not for its own sake but for the sake of the Hospitals, and their needs, future as well as present, are also the subject of the most careful consideration of the Committees charged with the recommendations as to the total, and the details, of the distribution. The future needs of the Hospitals are, of course, a matter of speculation. It is obvious that there is a danger of bad times ahead. Prices have risen and are rising. There is a scarcity in all ranks of Hospital service, medical and lay, from the most skilled to the least skilled. All this adds to their expenditure. There are ever increasing demands, for other purposes, upon the purses of their regular supporters. On the other hand, there is the spirit of mutual assistance and of sacrifice which has, so far, produced a volume of voluntary giving far above the normal. Whether the share of this volume, which has been given to the Hospitals, has kept pace with their growing needs, and, if so, how long it will continue to do so, it is, perhaps, too early to say. As regards the present needs of the Hospitals, to meet which the present distribution of the Fund is designed, this again is, much more than in normal times, a matter of estimate—almost of conjecture. Of necessity, therefore, the Fund is compelled to go by the evidence of the past. The audited accounts, the accounts to December 31st, 1914—these are firm ground, and the only firm ground, for deciding the financial considerations involved in the present distribution. These show the effect on the finances of the Hospitals of all the factors that were the uncertain subjects of estimate a year ago-the increase of expenditure, the effect of the war upon income, the additional work of placing at the disposal of the Government the magnificent resources of the Voluntary Hospitals for the treatment of the wounded. At the present moment the results of these same influences during 1915 are again matters of estimate, but at the next distribution they will in their turn be reflected in the accounts, and if in any instances the Fund's grant, made on accounts nearly a year old, proves to be larger or smaller than present circumstances would justify, this will itself be shown in the year's accounts and will be an important factor in determining next year's grant. Thus justice is done, and in no other way could it be done. Apart from these questions of finance and the general policy to be adopted under war conditions, there is but little in the events of the year to require mention. The Executive Committee have kept themselves informed as far as possible on the various points on which the national requirements in connection with the war affect the Hospitals, and have always been ready to make representations or obtain information whenever it appeared that such action would be agreeable to the Hospitals and could be more readily undertaken by the Fund than by the Hospitals separately. To the loss which the Fund sustained in the spring through the death of Lord Rothschild, Honorary Treasurer and Chairman of Finance Committee, reference was made at the Annual Meeting last April. It was with great regret that we learned of the death, in July last, of Mr. William Latham, whose resignation of the Chairmanship of the Convalescent Homes Committee, which he had held for eighteen years, was announced a year ago. To all the Members of the Council, Members of Committees, Honorary Officers, and Visitors of the Fund the Governors desire to tender their very best thanks. With so many Members, medical and lay, absent on war service, the work of the Fund makes larger demands on those who are available, themselves often busy men, rendered still more busy by other activities arising out of the war. I now beg to move the adoption of the reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees.

Mr. WALTER MORRISON having seconded the motion, the adoption of the Reports was put and carried

unanimously.

On the motion of Lord Iveagh, seconded by The Lord Mayor (Sir Charles Wakefield), it was resolved: "That the cheques for the grants should be posted on Tuesday, December 21st, except in the case of grants for the reservation of beds in Consumption Sanatoria during 1916, which should be posted on January 1st."

Sir Savile Crossley (Hon. Secretary) said it was his pleasant duty to announce that the Rt. Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel proposed to give again, as in 1911, £50,000 to Hospitals, this time in the form of $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ War Loan Stock. Of this, £28,000 would, if accepted by the Governors and General Council, be given to the Fund to be distributed amongst the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes, and Consumption

Sanatoria receiving grants from the Fund this year, in amounts equal to one-fifth of the grants made by the Fund. The remaining £22,000 had been allocated to certain Hospitals and kindred institutions in London and the country. The distribution would be effected as soon as practically possible, and the list with details would be published.

On the motion of The Speaker it was resolved that the Fund gladly accepts the very munificent offer of Sir Ernest Cassel, and asks Sir Savile Crossley to convey to Sir Ernest Cassel the thanks of the Governors and General Council for his renewed benevolence to the Fund and for the great assistance he had thus rendered to the Hospitals of London.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1916.

The Speaker of the House of Commons then said :-

My Lords and Gentlemen,—I have to announce that there are three vacancies on the Council, and the Governors have decided to add the following names:—The Hon. Nathaniel Charles Rothschild; Sir Walter Lawrence, Bt.; Sir Francis Champneys, Bt. I will now ask the Honorary Secretaries to read the list of Members of the Council, Members of Committees, and Honorary Officers for the year 1916. [The list having been read by Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary), The Speaker continued.] No alterations are necessary in the usual resolutions delegating powers to the various committees. It is customary to have these resolutions approved at this meeting so that the meeting of the new Council called in January to pass them need only be formal.

On the motion of Lord Knutsford, seconded by Sir William Bennett, a resolution was approved delegating powers to the Finance Committee, Distribution Committee, and Convalescent Homes Committee.

On the motion of The President of the Royal College of Physicians (Dr. Frederick Taylor), seconded by Sir John Tweedy, a Resolution was approved delegating to the Distribution Committee the power to draw upon the grants set aside for the amalgamation of Throat Hospitals.

On the motion of Mr. Algernon H. Mills, seconded by Sir Henry Burdett, a Resolution was approved delegating powers to the Executive Committee.

Lord Mersey, in moving a vote of thanks to the Speaker of the House of Commons for presiding, said they were all very grateful for the great interest he had taken for many years past in this Fund, and were very much obliged to him for the clear and comprehensive statement he had made with reference to the present condition of the Fund and its future prospects.

The Resolution was seconded by Sir Horace Marshall, and carried unanimously.

The Speaker, in acknowledging, said: I am very much obliged for this vote of thanks. It is always a great pleasure to me to be able to be present on these occasions. I feel that I can do little on behalf of place my services at your disposal at any time.

The proceedings then terminated.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, to receive the Accounts and the Report of the General Council for the year 1915, was held at Rt. Hon. James W. Lowther, M.P., being in the chair.

The Minutes of the last Meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: H.H. The Lord Mayor); The Chairman of the County Council (Mr. Alfred F. Buxton); The Governor of the Bank of England (Lord Cunliffe); The Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P.; Sir Walter Lawrence, Bt.; Sir Francis H. Champneys, Bt.; Professor Sir William Osler, Bt.; Sir Everard Hambro; Mr. Robert Fleming; Dr. Edwin Freshfield; Mr. Algernon E. Sydney.

Lord Revelstoke (The Honorary Treasurer) in presenting the Account of Receipts and Expenditure and the Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December, 1915, said: Mr. Speaker, My Lords and Gentlemen,-The account of income and expenditure is sufficiently analysed in the draft report which is before the Council to-day. I will only add a few remarks on matters with which the Finance Committee is specially concerned. The income from investments is larger than ever before. This is primarily due to the receipt of a full year's income from the first instalments of the Wernher legacy. I might perhaps mention that out of the whole of the revenue from the investments under the care of the Finance Committee, a revenue amounting to £97,000, the total loss to the income of the year through failure to pay interest or dividends since the war began amounts to less than £800, and this diminution of income is due to the non-receipt of interest or dividends on certain securities which were acquired by the Fund as gifts or legacies from various donors, and for the purchase of which the Finance Committee were therefore not responsible. The Council will notice that, after this income from investments is taken into account, a sum of about £50,000 has still to be raised in order to maintain the distribution at last year's figure without allowing for any increase in the needs of the Hospitals. The Council may like to hear that the Fund held on December 31st a large amount of War Stock. Of this, the greater part represents investment, while the balance was derived from the conversion of Consols received from various executors in the past. I am glad to be able to state that the realised depreciation of £6,046 on Trustee stocks, due to this conversion of Consols, was very nearly balanced by a realised appreciation on non-trust investments, leaving a net realised depreciation of only £262. At the present moment the Fund also holds large amounts of Treasury Bills and Exchequer Bonds. Since the beginning of this year we have been notified by Sir Walter Trower of the very munificent bequest of the residue of the estate of the late Dowager Lady Wilton. The total residue is estimated to be about £150,000, and we have already received £100,000 on account. In deciding how to apply this large sum the Council will have to consider not only the general policy of the Fund in relation to legacies, but also the special conditions arising or likely to arise out of the war. The question will not come up until the autumn, and in the meantime the Finance Committee propose to deal temporarily with the cash to the best of their ability, without prejudice to any future decision which may be taken by the Council.

The Speaker of the House of Commons formally moved the adoption of the Accounts, and the resolution, having been seconded by Sir T. Vezey Strong, was put and carried unanimously.

Sir Savile Crossley (Hon. Secretary) presented the draft Report of the Council for the year 1915. The Speaker of the House of Commons formally moved its adoption, and the Earl of Bess-BOROUGH seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Sir William Church (Chairman of the Distribution Committee) presented a report of that Committee on the expenses of the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology at the Middlesex Hospital. The report recommended that the scheme of apportionment between Hospital and Medical School now submitted by the Hospital should be accepted as regards the year 1915 as satisfying the condition attached to the grants made by the Fund in December last—namely, that the expenditure should be allocated in the accounts for 1915 in accordance with a scheme of apportionment to be approved by the Fund.

Sir WILLIAM CHURCH, in moving the adoption of the Report, said that, with regard to the lengthy and intricate matter which the Distribution Committee had had to consider, he would like publicly to state how harmoniously they had worked with the Middlesex Hospital. They had several meetings with the representatives of the Hospital, and themselves paid a visit to the Hospital, and were always treated by them with the greatest courtesy; and, during the whole of the business which they had to examine into, the negotiations were of the most friendly character.

The Report was seconded by Sir John Tweedy and carried unanimously.

In the absence of Dr. Freshfield (Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee), Sir William H. Bennett moved the adoption of a report of that Committee on the subject of a special application from the National Association's Sanatorium at Benenden.

The Report, which was seconded by the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir W. WATSON CHEYNE), and adopted, recommended that the Committee be empowered under certain circumstances to promise and if required to pay over an emergency grant of a limited amount.

The Chief Rabbi (the Rev. Dr. Hertz) proposed a vote of thanks to the Speaker of the House of Commons for presiding.

Viscount Mersey, in seconding the resolution, said that it must have struck them all that the management of the funds which Lord Revelstoke and the Finance Committee of the Fund had in their care had been most admirable. The times we had been passing through were times of great stress and strain, particularly in connection with money matters. He thought it very much to the credit of the gentlemen to whom the monetary interests of this great Fund were entrusted that they were able to show such an admirable result at the end of their year of work.

The SPEAKER, in acknowledging the vote of thanks, said that he agreed with Lord Mersey as to the satisfactory character of the Balance Sheet and Statement of Accounts. He thought they must prepare their minds for the fact that, as the war continued, the margin of eleemosynary funds available for the general charities of the country must shrink to a considerable extent. This margin had been largely drawn upon, and, as time went on, it would be still more largely drawn upon, and no doubt this Fund would be amongst the sufferers. Fortunately, up to the present they had got through their difficulties extraordinarily well; but they must not be disappointed if at the meeting next autumn or this time next year they found a considerable shortage. We all had to suffer in this respect, and it was impossible to expect that this Fund would be immune from the ills which charitable flesh is heir to.

The proceedings then terminated.

Report of the Distribution Committee.

- (1) The Governors and General Council have this year fixed the sum available for distribution amongst the London Hospitals at £133,500, being the same amount as in 1914 (a).
- (2) The Distribution Committee have continued to encourage the Hospitals in the policy of deferring all schemes of capital expenditure that are not of exceptional urgency. In a few cases grants are recommended in support of schemes of this character sanctioned during the year, while further assistance from the Fund has in some instances been required in aid of schemes which were already in hand before the outbreak of war. The result is that the total amount of the grants towards buildings and improvements is rather larger than in 1914, amounting to £15,975 (b), as against £12,350 last year. The total amount allotted to maintenance is correspondingly reduced from £121,150 to £117,525 (b), but it still exceeds the total given for maintenance in 1913.
- (3) Although the awards are made in respect of the work of the current year and are based upon a consideration of all the known circumstances of each Institution, the evidence as to financial position is, as usual, derived primarily from the last audited and published Income and Expenditure Accounts and Balance Sheets, namely, those to December 31, 1914. As the circumstances of the different Hospitals often vary from year to year, it must not be assumed that a reduction in the grant to any particular Institution, whether for maintenance or for capital purposes, or even the absence of a grant, implies dissatisfaction.
- (4) As was explained in last year's Report, the effects of the first few months of the war on the statistics and finances of the Hospitals, as well as the consequences of placing beds during that period at the disposal of the Naval and Military Authorities, were reflected in the accounts of the various Institutions for the year 1914. These points have received the fullest consideration in making the awards of the present distribution. The effects of similar causes during 1915, in the course of which a much larger number of beds have been provided for sick or wounded soldiers and sailors for much longer periods, will be reflected in this year's accounts. These will also show the effect of the increases in the cost of working and the very

large demands which have been made upon the purses of the public in other directions during the same period. The results of these factors during 1915 could only be very roughly estimated at the present time, and will not come fully before the Distribution Committee until they have to consider their next distribution.

- (5) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is 104, being the same number as last year.
- (6) In support of the amalgamation of the Hospital for Diseases of the Throat, Golden Square, and the London Throat Hospital, Great Portland Street, reported last year, a second instalment is payable this year of the maintenance grant of £900 a year, subject to the usual annual inspection, which was promised for five years, together with a capital grant of £10,000. Out of the moneys set aside or promised towards a general scheme of amalgamation of the Throat, Nose, and Ear Hospitals, there still remain unallocated a capital sum of £10,500, and maintenance grants not exceeding £1,100 a year. The General Council at its meeting on December 16th, 1914, gave the Distribution Committee power to draw upon the balance of the capital and maintenance grants so promised or set aside, in such proportions as they may consider appropriate, in the event of any further amalgamation scheme being brought to a satisfactory conclusion at a time when a meeting of the Governors and General Council is not pending. No action has been called for during the current year.
- (7) As a consequence of the postponement, during the war, of the less urgent schemes of capital expenditure, the following grants, made in 1913 and retained by the Fund until required, will lapse at the end of the present year unless renewed by the Council, viz.:—

Queen Charlotte's Lying-in Hospital, £1,000 to new out-patients' department.

St. Mary's Hospital for Women and Children, Plaistow, £1,500 to new nurses' homeand out-patient department.

The grant of £2,000 towards the new nurses' home now in course of erection at the West. London Hospital has also not yet been applied for.

The Committee recommend that all these grants be renewed.

- (8) The Distribution Committee have continued to take into consideration economy of management as well as efficiency. They recognise that under the conditions produced by the war there are many factors tending inevitably to raise the cost of working. They have, therefore, directed their attention specially to those instances where the relative cost at a particular hospital, as compared with the average cost at similar institutions, appears to call for remark. By this method any increases due to circumstances common to all hospitals are automatically eliminated, and comment is reserved for cases where the cost has reached an exceptionally high level and therefore seems to require an individual explanation.
- (9) The Committee desire again to express their indebtedness to the Fund's Visitors for their very valuable reports on the hospitals applying for grants. Many of the inspections-

have been made at considerable personal sacrifice by Visitors, both medical and lay, whose duties have been largely extended by special work connected with the war, and who have, in consequence, had more than usual difficulty in sparing the necessary time to carry out their investigations.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.

The grant is made on condition that the accounts of the Hospital for 1915 will show no payments to have been made to or on account of the Medical School out of general funds subscribed for the relief of the sick poor, and that the expenses of the Bland-Sutton Institute of Pathology will be allocated in the accounts for 1915 in accordance with a scheme of apportionment to be approved by the Fund.

Report of the Convalescent Homes Committee.

- (1) The Governors and General Council have this year fixed the sum available for distribution amongst Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria at £6,500 (a).
- (2) The number of applications eligible for consideration amounted to 41 from Convalescent Homes and 9 from Consumption Sanatoria, as against 48 and 10 respectively last year.
- (3) In dealing with all applications, whether from Sanatoria or from Convalescent Homes, the Committee have taken into consideration the question of comparative urgency of need, as shown by the audited accounts and balance sheets of the various institutions to December 31st, 1914. In the case of Consumption Sanatoria they have also taken note of the proportion of the total work of each institution which is covered by the receipts under the National Insurance Act. As these and other circumstances affecting the relative claims of the different institutions vary from year to year, it must not be assumed that a reduction in the grant to any particular institution, whether for maintenance or for capital purposes, or even the absence of a grant,
- (4) Some of the Convalescent Homes which, though situated outside London, usually receive grants in consideration of the fact that they treat convalescent patients from London, have, since the beginning of the war, ceased to take such patients and have been devoted entirely to the treatment of sick or wounded sailors or soldiers. These Homes thus no longer possess the specific feature which gave them, as distinct from other institutions in the country, a claim to be considered by the Fund, and are not, therefore, included this year amongst the institutions recommended for grants.
- (5) The total of the grants to Convalescent Homes being thus temporarily reduced, the Committee have been able to reserve this year a larger number of beds at Consumption Sanatoria
 - (a) Subsequently increased by one-fifth by means of the special donation from Sir Ernest Cassel.

for the use of patients in London Hospitals, and to extend the list of Hospitals amongst which such beds are allocated. The accommodation thus secured this year amounts to 52 beds at six Sanatoria, situated as follows:—

- 4 beds for children at the Children's Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.
- 4 beds at the Daneswood Sanatorium (Jewish), Woburn Sands, Beds.
- 10 beds at the Devon and Cornwall Sanatorium, South Brent, Devon.
- 10 beds at the Kelling Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.
- 12 beds at the Sanatorium of the National Association for the Establishment and Maintenance of Sanatoria for Workers, Benenden, Kent.
- 12 beds at the Northampton Sanatorium, Creaton, Northants.
- (6) The Committee recommend that the beds thus reserved be allocated amongst London hospitals as follows:—
 - 12 beds to the City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
 - 3 beds to the Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
 - 10 beds to the London Hospital.
 - 9 beds to Guy's Hospital.
 - 5 beds to the Middlesex Hospital.
 - 5 beds to St. George's Hospital.
 - 4 beds to St. Mary's Hospital.
 - 4 beds to University College Hospital.
- (7) All the Sanatoria applying for grants have been inspected on behalf of the Fund, and the Committee desire to express their indebtedness to the Visitors who undertook this work, often at considerable inconvenience.
- (8) The Committee desire to place on record their regret at the death of Mr. William Latham, K.C., and their appreciation of his services as Chairman of the Committee from its establishment in 1898 down to the end of 1914.
 - (9) The grants recommended to the various institutions are appended.

TITLE AND CONSTITUTION.

The Fund was founded in 1897, under the title of "The Prince of Wales's Hospital Fund for London," by his late Majesty King Edward VII., then Prince of Wales, with the object of securing more efficient aid and support for the Hospitals of London, and of thus commemorating the Sixtieth Anniversary of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, by establishing the voluntary hospital system of London on a sound financial basis.

It was re-named "King Edward's Hospital Fund for London" in January 1902, after the accession of His Majesty King Edward VII.

By desire of King Edward, it was incorporated under that title, and its constitution settled, by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London Act, 1907 (7 Edw. 7, Ch. lxx.).

The Governing Body under the Act consists of the President and General Council.

His late Majesty King Edward VII. was President of the Fund, while Prince of Wales, from 1897 to 1901, and was subsequently its Patron during his reign from 1901 to 1910.

His present Majesty King George V. was President, as Prince of Wales, from 1901 to 1910, and is now Patron.

The powers of the President have been exercised since 1910 by three Governors appointed by His Majesty pursuant to the provisions of the Act. The names of the Governors are given on page 1 of this Report.

The work of the Fund is carried on under the General Council by the four Standing Committees and the Officers as set out on page 2. No individual serves on more than one Committee.

RULES AS TO APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS.

Under its present rules the Fund receives applications for grants from:

- (a) Hospitals situated in the County of London or within 9 miles from Charing Cross.
- (b) Convalescent Homes which are situated within these boundaries or which, being situated outside, take a large proportion of patients from London.
- (c) Consumption Sanatoria which take patients from London, or which are prepared to place beds at the disposal of the Fund for the use of patients from London Hospitals.

The Fund does not, however, assist at present in the foundation of new institutions, or entertain applications from institutions which have not been in existence in a properly constituted form for a period of at least three years, or from dispensaries, nursing institutes, or other institutions not possessing beds for in-patients, or from institutions for the treatment of incurables or of mental cases.

All institutions applying for grants are required to publish their accounts in accordance with the Revised Uniform System of Hospital Accounts.

Every eligible Hospital and Sanatorium applying for a grant is annually inspected on behalf of the Fund by two Visitors, a medical man and a layman in each case, specially appointed for the purpose.

In accordance with the rule laid down by the Founder of the Fund, in order that the hospitals should derive the greatest possible amount of assistance, the Fund does not receive "letters" of admission or recommendation in return for its grants.

Applications are invited in March, and the awards are made, on the recommendations of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees, by the General Council in December.

Applications for grants, and all other communications, should be addressed to the Honorary Secretaries, at 7 Walbrook, E.C.

METHODS AND RESULTS.

Under the active personal supervision of its Royal Presidents, the Fund has grown steadily in the scope of its work and has secured in an increasing degree the confidence and support of the public.

During the nineteen years of its existence the Fund has distributed over £2,000,000 to London Hospitals and to Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients, the amount distributed in 1915 being £140,000, besides a special gift of £28,000 $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. War Loan Stock from Sir Ernest Cassel.

The League of Mercy, founded under Royal Charter in 1899, has enlisted the co-operation of thousands of small subscribers, and has contributed £230,000 to the Fund during the last sixteen years; the contribution in 1915 being £14,000.

The Fund has through its Committees, and through the annual inspections by its Visitors, special facilities for ascertaining the relative needs, efficiency and economy of working of the various institutions and any special circumstances affecting their claims; and it allocates its grants accordingly. Extracts from the Visitors' Reports, together with other remarks bearing on efficiency or economy, are communicated privately to the hospitals with the grants.

All important schemes of building, extension or improvement of hospitals are submitted to the Fund and carefully scrutinised; and, in suitable cases, special grants are made.

In co-operation with the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds, a Uniform System of Hospital Accounts has been introduced which facilitates comparisons between the financial positions of the various Hospitals; and economy is encouraged by the publication of an Annual Statistical Report comparing the cost of working at different hospitals. The issue of these Reports was followed by savings estimated at £47,000 a year.

From the foregoing it will be seen that the Fund not only collects money for the voluntary hospitals but also helps to secure that all contributions given to them are efficiently and economically employed.

SPECIAL NEEDS-1916.

It is very important that, during the continuance of the war, the Fund should be enabled to make as large a distribution as possible to the hospitals to meet the increased and increasing expenditure. Many hospitals are doing a great work for the country in taking in sick and wounded soldiers in addition to their ordinary work for the civilian population, and this at a time when it is feared that subscriptions and donations will be considerably diminished and expenses increased.

The Fund also from time to time collects, and places at the disposal of the hospitals

and the public, information on points of interest, and appoints special Committees to enquire into and report upon questions of difficulty affecting hospitals.
