



REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1917.

I. The total receipts for the year 1917 were £238,572 11s. 9d., of which £1,517 18s. 2d. were contributions to Capital, and £237,054 13s. 7d. receipts on General Account.

- 3. The grants made for the year amounted to £190,000, being £20,000 more than in 1916, and £32,500 in excess of the grants made in 1912 and 1913, the years of the highest distribution before the War. The above comparisons do not take into consideration the supplementary distributions made in 1911 and 1915. These were made from special donations by Sir Ernest Cassel, granted after the original distributions were settled.
- 4. Of the amount distributed, £181,000 was given to London Hospitals and £9,000 to Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients, as against £162,500 and £7,500 respectively in 1916.
- 5. The £181,000 granted by the Fund to the London Hospitals was applied as to £140,025 in aid of general maintenance, £12,150 to the reduction of debts on maintenance account, and £28,825 towards improvement schemes or in reduction of liabilities on such schemes undertaken

before the War. The Fund has continued to encourage the Hospitals in the policy of postponing all schemes of capital expenditure not exceptionally urgent or not already in hand at the outbreak of war, and the total grants in aid of new schemes were only £8,675. Grants for maintenance amounted to £8,750 more than in 1916, or £34,650 more than in 1915.

- 6. This increase in maintenance grants, largely the result of the munificence of Viscount Astor, was fully justified by the evidence as to the needs of the Hospitals, which continue to suffer from the rise in prices and other financial difficulties due to the War.
- 7. Of the £9,000 distributed by the Convalescent Homes Committee, £7,050 was allocated to Consumption Sanatoria, and £1,950 to Convalescent Homes. The grants to Sanatoria enabled 62 beds to be reserved for the use of patients in London Hospitals as compared with 53 last year.
- 8. The total sum distributed amongst Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria during the last ten years (after deducting conditional grants to the extent of £3,500 that have been allowed to lapse) is £1,614,000. Since the foundation of the Fund a total amount of £2,458,416 8s. 5d. has been distributed. The average annual distribution for the whole period of 21 years has been £117,067 9s. od.
- 9. During the year the amount spent on administration was £3,460 10s. od., or £1 9s. $0\frac{1}{2}d$. per £100 of the total amount received, as compared with £3,161 2s. 3d., or £0 19s. $4\frac{1}{4}d$. per £100 in the previous year. The corresponding percentage for the whole period since the inauguration of the Fund has been £1 4s. 6d., or less than 3d. in every £1 received, the average yearly outlay in this respect being £2,865 17s. 3d. The increased expenditure has been occasioned mainly by additions to the remuneration of the Staff, and also by the greater cost of stationery, printing, etc., caused by the War.
- 10. His Majesty the King, Patron of the Fund, has been graciously pleased to continue his annual subscription of £1,000. Her Majesty the Queen, Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, and His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales have also been pleased to subscribe to the Fund as also have many other Members of the Royal Family.
- II. The list of contributions again includes annual subscriptions of £5,000 from Mr. Walter Morrison, £4,000 from the Drapers' Company, £1,000 from Lord Astor (in addition to his most generous donation of £35,000), and £1,000 from the Merchant Taylors' Company; besides an anonymous donation of £1,000, and an anonymous gift of War Stock of the same amount. The Fund has also received annual subscriptions of £500 from Lord Iveagh, from Sir John R. Ellerman, Bt., from Mr. Robert Fleming, from Messrs. Morgan, Grenfell & Co., and from Messrs. N. M. Rothschild & Sons; and donations of the same amount from the Clothworkers' Company, and from "S.D.R.S.D."

- 12. The League of Mercy this year has contributed £15,000, a sum equal to that which was received from the League last year. The Council is again indebted to the Members of the League for the efforts which have led to so successful a result. The total amount contributed to the Fund by the League of Mercy since its foundation in 1899 now amounts to £260,000, apart from the sums awarded by the League to institutions outside the area of the Fund's distributions. The Council again express their appreciation of this very substantial benefit derived from the labours of a numerous band of voluntary workers.
- 13. Legacies received during the year include £3,712 10s. from the late Field-Marshal Sir Charles Brownlow; £3,893 7s. 1d. on account of the residue of the estate of the late Miss Catherine Hughes; £3,102 11s. 11d., being the balance of the residue of the estate of the late Mr. George Henry Swonnell; £2,000 from the late Mr. Francis Reckitt; a further amount of £1,000 from the executors of the late Mr. Samuel Lewis; and £500 given by the executors of the late Mr. Marcus Van Raalte in the exercise of their discretionary powers.
- 14. The Fund also received during the year the sum of £25,567 10s. 5d., the balance of the residue of the estate of the late Lady Wilton. This legacy, which has amounted in all to £163,202 9s. 4d., has greatly strengthened the financial position of the Fund at a time when the demands on it are continually increasing.
- 15. To maintain the annual distribution at £190,000 about £80,000 has to be raised each year from subscriptions, donations, and legacies. Apart from Viscount Astor's donation, the subscriptions and donations received in 1917 were £30,281 17s. 3d., a decrease of £1,158 7s. 8d. as compared with 1916. Legacies decreased from £33,418 7s. 8d. to £14,674 3s. 8d.
- 16. The Statistical Report on the expenditure of the London Hospitals was again issued in its reduced form this year in order to economise the consumption of paper and the employment of labour in printing. From the special table in the prefatory note, it appears that the average number of beds at the London Hospitals in daily occupation by naval and military patients in 1916 was 2,855. The total ordinary expenditure, which in 1913 was £1,142,938, had risen in 1916 to £1,513,834, an increase of £370,896. In so far as this increase was due to the treatment of naval or military patients, it was partially covered by contributions from the authorities amounting to £218,087. The balance, amounting to £152,809, represents the additional ordinary expenditure which fell on the funds of the voluntary Hospitals of London during 1916: an increase of 13.36 per cent. on the expenditure in 1913. The result has been in several instances a material reduction in the available funds of these most essential institutions.
- 17. Every eligible Hospital which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon, as hitherto, by two of the Fund's visitors, of whom one was a medical man and the other a layman. Owing to the restrictions on travelling by motor and by rail the inspection of

Consumption Sanatoria had to be suspended. All the Sanatoria receiving grants had, however, already been visited for several successive years.

- 18. The Council regret to record the death during the year of the Duke of Norfolk, one of the original Members of the Council and a generous subscriber to its funds. The Fund has also lost through death the services of Sir George Alexander and Mr. Arthur James, who had given valuable help as Visitors on behalf of the Fund.
- 19. Out of the six members of the Office Staff of the Fund, three have been on active service. The Council have learned with regret that one of these, Mr. Frank G. Simmons, has died of wounds in Palestine, and that another, Mr. Victor H. Rushton, has been wounded and is a prisoner in Germany.
- 20. The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has again appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co., Chartered Accountants, to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year. They have been the Honorary Auditors since January 1898, during which period they have rendered the Fund very valuable service.
- 21. The Council are under great obligations to the Press for the great assistance they have rendered in the past, and continue to rely upon their kindly co-operation in obtaining for the Fund wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of General Council.

A Meeting of the Governors and General Council for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria for the present year, was held on Thursday morning, December 13, 1917, at St. James's Palace, the Rt. Hon. James W. Lowther, M.P., Speaker of the House of Commons, being in the Chair.

Those present were: The Bishop of London, the Earl of Bessborough, the Viscount Knutsford, the Viscount Mersey, the Viscount Farquhar, Lord Revelstoke, Lord Stamfordham, Lord Somerleyton (Honorary Secretary), the Hon. Sir Arthur Stanley, M.P., the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir Frederick Taylor, Bt.), the Right. Hon. Sir Vezey Strong, Sir William S. Church, Bt., Sir Francis H. Champneys, Bt., Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Owen Philipps, M.P., Sir William H. Bennett, Sir William J. Collins, M.P., Sir Horace Marshall, Sir Cooper Perry, Sir John Tweedy, Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Honorary Secretary), Mr. John G. Griffiths (Honorary Secretary), Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. Walter Morrison, Mr. W. J. H. Whittall.

The Minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from

the following:-

The Marquess of Cambridge, the Viscount Iveagh, the Lord Lieutenant of the County of London and Chairman of the County Council (the Marquess of Crewe), Cardinal Bourne, the Rev. R. F. Horton, D.D., the Rev. W. L. Watkinson, D.D., the Chief Rabbi, Lord Burnham, Lord Murray of Elibank, the Hon. N. Charles Rothschild, the Hon. Algernon H. Mills, the Postmaster-General, the President of the Local Government Board, the President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (the Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor), the Governor of the Bank of England, the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir George H. Makins), the Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P., Sir Walter Lawrence, Bt., Sir John Craggs, Mr. Robert Fleming.

Lord Somerleyton (Hon. Secretary) said that he had the pleasure to announce that the donor of £35,000, who had desired to remain anonymous until that day, was Viscount Astor.

On the motion of the Speaker of the House of Commons it was unanimously resolved that the best thanks of the Council be conveyed to Lord Astor for his very handsome and generous contribution to the Fund.

Lord Revelstoke (the Hon. Treasurer) said that the total general receipts to December 8, less expenses, amounted to £205,781 45. 9d. This included the donation of £35,000 from Lord Astor to which Lord Somerleyton had just referred. It also included the final instalments of £25,567 10s. 5d. received from Sir Walter Trower on account of the bequest of the late Isabella Countess of Wilton of the residue of her estate. The total residue amounted to no less than £163,000. It was only because of such large contributions as these that the Fund was able to face with equanimity so large a distribution as £190,000. The Finance Committee was making it part of its business to see that the undistributed balance of these gifts was kept in such condition as to be readily available, so that the Council might have at its disposal a reserve force on which to draw in case of necessity.

Sir William Collins, in making the annual statement on behalf of the League of Mercy, said that though the funds collected during the year were not actually paid in to the League until December 15, he thought he could arrive at an approximate figure. Since 1899 the contributions from the League to the Fund had varied from £1,000 to £19,000; during the years 1913, 1914 and 1915 the contribution was £14,000; while last year it was raised to £15,000; and the Hon. Treasurer, in view of the amounts at present known, was of opinion that the League would be able to contribute not less than the £15,000 which was handed over last year. Should this prove to be the case, he believed that the total amount which would have been contributed by the League to the Fund would be £260,000. He might add that besides this sum the League gave grants to Hospitals outside the County of London, and £25,000 had been distributed in that way, making altogether a total of £285,000 which the League of Mercy had collected and distributed since its inception.

Sir William Church (the Chairman of the Distribution Committee) presented the Report of that Committee, and Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary) presented the list of awards.

Dr. Edwin Freshfield (the Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee) presented the Report of that Committee, and Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary) presented the list of awards.

The Speaker of the House of Commons, in moving the adoption of the Reports and Awards, said:—

My Lords and Gentlemen,—Before moving the adoption of the Reports, I have the honour to read the following letter which His Majesty the King, our Patron, has been pleased to address to the Governors through Lord Stamfordham:—

"Buckingham Palace,
"10th December, 1917.

"DEAR SIR,

"I am commanded by the King to convey to you and through you to the Council of the Fund his congratulations on the distribution of the large sum of £190,000, and his appreciation of the work accomplished during the year by the Governors, the Council, the Committees, Visitors and others Officers of the Fund.

"His Majesty is gratified to learn that so great an increase in the total is largely the result of a most generous gift of £35,000 from a friend whose anonymity has at his own desire been hitherto preserved.

"This considerable addition to the amount for distribution will be of the utmost benefit. The King's many visits to London Hospitals during the current year have enabled him to estimate the importance of the services rendered by these Institutions to the Navy, the Army, and to men disabled during the war; while the ever growing demands upon them for adequate ministration to the sufferings of the civil population have equally been brought home to him.

"His Majesty realises also the advance in medical and surgical science as evidenced by the work performed at the Hospitals of London. In many cases limbs have been saved, and indeed valuable lives preserved which in the no distant past must have been sacrificed.

"The King is glad to see that the Distribution Committee have paid special attention this year to the accommodation provided for nurses, to whose services every Hospital patient would gladly

testify. The Reports of the Visitors have shown that the importance of due solicitude for the health and comfort of these workers is realised by the responsible authorities of the Hospitals.

"His Majesty is confident that the public will continue to recognise how much has been accomplished by the Fund, and will by their support enable the distribution to be maintained during the difficult times to come.

It is very gratifying that the Fund should again have been enabled, by the munificence of a very generous donor, to increase its distribution to meet the growing needs of the Hospitals in these troublous times. In 1916 it was the bequest of the late Dowager Countess of Wilton that rendered it possible to rise, in one year, from £140,000 to £170,000, without undue risk of a relapse before the need for exceptional efforts was past. This year we are able, through the noble gift of £35,000 from the friend whom we now know to be Lord Astor, to add another £20,000, thus raising the total to £190,000. Of course, we do not distribute the whole of such a large gift in one year. That would indeed be rash finance, in a time of long-continued difficulty, the end of which no one can foresee. We consider that the best value for the Hospitals is obtained from such gifts if they are used, partly for an immediate increase of the distribution, and partly for its maintenance at or near the increased level over the remaining years of crisis. We could not, of course, hope to do this if we had to rely solely on exceptional contributions of this sort. We have our subscription list, headed by His Majesty the King, our Patron, and including the annual £4,000 from the Drapers' Company, and £5,000 from Mr. Walter Morrison, himself an active and vigilant member of the Council. We have the annual contribution of the League of Mercy, the result not of spasmodic efforts, but of the continued perseverance and enthusiasm of a well-organised body of workers. And we have a very reliable, though unfortunately not very numerous, list of donors. These together make up a large part, and an essential part, of our regular receipts. Then we have our income from investments, maintained by the ceaseless care of Lord Revelstoke and the Finance Committee. And lastly, we have legacies. These are, of course, very uncertain, and apart from the exceptional bequest of Lady Wilton, and some receipts from the Lewis Estate, they have dropped from £33,000 last year to £14,000 this year. Thus the gift of £35,000 has saved us from a very real difficulty, which would otherwise have prevented any increase in the distribution. Now for the application of this unprecedented sum of £190,000. The bulk of it goes in grants to ordinary maintenance, where it is greatly needed to assist the Hospitals to bear the strain of high prices and other difficulties. From the figures printed in the Fund's Statistical Report it appears that the ordinary expenditure in 1916 falling on the normal sources of Hospital income (that is, not covered by War Office payments for the treatment of wounded soldiers) was £104,000 more than in 1915, and £153,000 more than in 1913. That is the measure of the increased need which this Fund has to do its share in meeting, and no doubt the figures for 1917 will be still larger. Towards this extra £104,000 we contributed in 1916 an extra £28,000; so you will see that there is ample reason why we should again increase our total as far as we safely can. Last year, part of the increased amount given to maintenance was distributed in the form of grants to reduce debt: these grants being given after special enquiry, on the understanding that greater efforts should be made to collect funds from the public. This advice has borne good fruit, and this year you will notice some extra grants, "in recognition and aid of special efforts that have been made to extricate the Hospital concerned from serious financial difficulties." On the other hand, there are one or two cases where the Hospital is to be informed privately that a special grant to reduce debt would have been made had it not been that the cost of working, being already exceptionally high, had increased out of all proportion to the general rise in cost due to causes common to all Hospitals. I hope these three public announcements, of what has often been our private practice, will enlighten the eyes of any Hospital managers or others who may be in danger of being misled by the cry occasionally raised, that the way to get extra help from the King's Fund is to run into debt through indolence or extravagance. Another illustration of the practice of the Fund occurs in the case of Charing Cross Hospital, where the Fund is making an exceptionally large grant this year, to complete the extinction of the mortgage debt. The disappearance of this debt, which only a few years ago was £85,000, is a very notable achievement, and reflects great credit on the present energetic management. The Council will notice that the Fund's Visitors were asked, this year, to make a special inspection of the nurses' quarters at all Hospitals. This plan of "starring" a particular set of questions in the Visitors' Report for special enquiry in a given year seems to me a very good one. The choice of the nurses' quarters this year was a happy thought, when nurses are harder pressed than ever, and have, even more than usually, the right to expect that their health and comfort shall receive adequate attention from Hospital Committees. We are glad to see that the reports show that this is the case. Sometimes the buildings in which they are housed are out of date, and yet cannot be replaced during the war. But even here temporary improvements are often possible. The Convalescent Homes Committee have been able to increase from 53 to 62 the number of beds in Consumption Sanatoria placed at the disposal of patients in London Hospitals, and also to increase the number of Hospitals whose patients can thus be assisted. This provision has been found very useful in the past. Its extension is the result of the increased distribution, and, therefore, counts amongst the benefits which the Hospitals owe to the special donation of Lord Astor, our hitherto anonymous donor. Much progress has been made during the year with the Report on the question of Pensions for Hospital Officers, which a Sub-committee of the Executive Committee is preparing under the Chairmanship of Mr. Whittall. I feel sure that this Report, which contains a great deal of information about Pension Funds in general, will prove a valuable work of reference, not only to Hospitals, but to all who have occasion to consider the formation or administration of Pension Schemes of any kind. Looking outside the Fund for one moment, I should like to be allowed, in the name of the Governors and General Council, to give a word of welcome to the newly established charity which bears, like this Fund, the name of a Royal Founder. I mean King George's Fund for Sailors, which will do for marine charities something of the same sort of work as King Edward's Hospital Fund does for Hospitals. • King George's Fund for Sailors has, of course, no connection whatever with King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, but if in any way our experience, extending now over 20 years, can help the new Fund in its work, we shall all be delighted. It is with great regret that the Governors record the loss of one of the leading members of the Fund by the death of the Duke of Norfolk, who had served on the Council since its formation. The Fund also deplores the loss of the valuable services of three of the visitors: Surgeon-General Sir Benjamin Franklin, Mr. Arthur James, and Mr. David Simson. I should also add that Professor Sir William Osler, who had been a member of the Council since 1908, found himself unable to accept reappointment this year. Out of the six members of the Office Staff, three have at one time or another been on active service; and we regret to say that one, Mr. F. G. Simmons, has recently died of wounds received in the East. In conclusion, the Governors offer their most sincere thanks to all the Members of the Council, Members of Committees, Visitors, Honorary Secretaries and other Officers, for their services during another year. I have now to move the adoption of the Reports.

Sir Arthur Stanley having seconded the motion, the adoption of the Reports was put and carried unanimously.

On the motion of Mr. Walter Morrison, seconded by Mr. W. J. H. Whittall, it was resolved "that the cheques for the grants should be posted on Wednesday, December 19, except in the case of grants for the reservation of beds in Consumption Sanatoria during 1918, the cheques for which should be posted on January 1."

ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1918.

The Speaker of the House of Commons then said:-

My Lords and Gentlemen,—We have now to consider the resolutions delegating powers to the various Committees for 1918, which, if approved here, will be passed at the formal meeting on January 7. The only alteration is in the maximum limit placed upon the amount which may be spent by the Executive Committee. As you know, our expenses are very small, averaging only £1 4s. 3d. in every £100 received. But, like other institutions, we find our costs affected by the war; and the Executive have been compelled to ask that the maximum for ordinary expenses may be put at £4,000 instead of £3,500.

On the motion of Sir Francis H. Champneys, seconded by Sir Horace Marshall, a Resolution was approved delegating powers to the Finance Committee, Distribution Committee, and Convalescent Homes Committee.

On the motion of Sir T. Vezev Strong, seconded by Sir Cooper Perry, a Resolution was approved delegating further powers to the Finance Committee.

On the motion of Lord Knutsford, seconded by Sir John Tweedy, a Resolution was approved delegating to the Distribution Committee the power to draw upon the grants set aside for the amalgamation of Throat Hospitals.

On the motion of Lord FARQUHAR, seconded by the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir Frederick Taylor), a Resolution was approved delegating powers to the Executive Committee.

Lord Mersey, in proposing a vote of thanks to the Speaker of the House of Commons for presiding, said the loyalty of the Speaker to the King's Fund and its interests was well known.

The Resolution was seconded by the BISHOP OF LONDON and carried unanimously.

The Speaker having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings then terminated.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, to receive the Accounts and the Report of the General Council for the year 1917, was held at St. James's Palace on Tuesday, 14th May, 1918, the Rt. Hon. James W. Lowther, M.P., Speaker of the House of Commons, being in the chair.

Those present were: The Viscount Iveagh, the Bishop of London, the Viscount Sandhurst, the Viscount Farquhar, the Lord Revelstoke, the Lord Burnham, the Lord Stamfordham, the Lord Somerleyton (Hon. Secretary), the Lord Stuart of Wortley, the Hon. Sir Arthur Stanley, M.P., the President of the Local Government Board (the Right Hon. W. H. Fisher, M.P.), the President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (the Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor), the Chairman of the London County Council (Mr. R. C. Norman), the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir George Makins), the Rt. Hon. Sir Vezey Strong, Sir William S. Church, Bt., Sir Francis H. Champneys Bt., Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Horace Marshall, Sir John Craggs, Sir John Tweedy, Mr. Frederick M. Fry Hon. Secretary), Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary), Mr. Yvon R. Eccles, Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. Geo. Lawson Johnston.

The Minutes of the last Meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: The Marquess of Cambridge; the Lord Lieutenant of the County of London (the

Marquess of Crewe); Cardinal Bourne; the Rev. A. E. Garvie, D.D.; the Rev. W. L. Watkinson, D.D.; the Chief Rabbi (the Rev. J. H. Hertz, D.D.); the Earl of Bessborough; the Viscount Knutsford; the Viscount Mersey; Lord Murray of Elibank; Hon. N. Charles Rothschild; Hon. Algernon H. Mills; the Governor of the Bank of England (Sir Brien Cokayne); the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Dr. Norman Moore); Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P.; Sir Owen Philipps, M.P.; Sir William H. Bennett; Sir William J. Collins, M.P.; Sir Cooper Perry, Mr. Robert Fleming, Mr. W. J. H. Whittall.

Lord Revelstoke (the Hon. Treasurer) said that he had the honour to submit the accounts of Receipts and Expenditure and also the Balance Sheet for the year 1917. There was no particular feature to which he thought the attention of the Council should be called. There was certainly no feature of any unsatisfactory nature. On the contrary, it was satisfactory to be able to report that the Fund had been again able to make a substantial increase in the distribution, and also to add to its reserves. If its ordinary income showed no decrease, the Fund should be able to maintain the distribution at or near the total arrived at in 1917.

The Speaker of the House of Commons formally moved the adoption of the Accounts.

The resolution, having been seconded by the Viscount IVEAGH, was put and carried unanimously.

Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary) presented the draft Report of the Council for the year 1917. The Speaker of the House of Commons, in moving the adoption of the Report, said:—I need not detain you above a moment in calling attention to one or two matters connected with the Report. The grants amounted to £20,000 more in 1917 than in 1916, a very satisfactory statement. We may also congratulate ourselves on the low cost of management. The amount spent on administration was only £1 95. $0\frac{1}{2}d$. per £100 of the total amount received, in spite of the increased cost of printing and paper, and the fact that in some cases we are paying the salaries of those of our staff who are on active service. We have again to thank the League of Mercy for a very substantial addition to our funds. I take this opportunity of informing the Council that this year, for the first time, the Governors have secured the services of some ladies, who have been added to the Visitors. This step was not taken without having previously obtained His Majesty's consent, which was readily given. We feel sure that the Fund will be benefited by the assistance of these ladies, who are prepared to undertake work for which they are admirably qualified. I now beg to move the adoption of the Report of the General Council.

The Lord Mayor (Sir Chas. A. Hanson) having seconded the resolution, the adoption of the Report was then put and carried unanimously.

On the motion of the Chairman of the Distribution Committee (Sir William Church), seconded by the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir George Makins), a Report of the Distribution Committee on the grant made in 1917 to the Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest was adopted

Sir Henry Burdett drew attention to the importance of keeping up and increasing the amount received from subscriptions and annual donations, and Lord Somerleyton, on behalf of the Hon. Secretaries, undertook to bring the matter before the Executive Committee.

The President of the Local Government Board (The Rt. Hon. W. Hayes Fisher, M.P.) in moving a vote of thanks to the Speaker of the House of Commons, said that later in the day the Speaker would be presiding over another Assembly, where a great Budget, dealing with millions of money, would be discussed. The Chancellor of the Exchequer would envy the Council of this Fund its Budget dealing with money provided so liberally and expended so well.

The resolution was seconded by the Chairman of the London County Council (Mr. R. C. NORMAN), and carried unanimously.

The Speaker having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings terminated.

Report of the Distribution Committee.

- (1) The Governors and General Council have this year fixed the sum available for distribution amongst the London Hospitals at £181,000, as against £162,500 in 1916, and £133,500 in 1915.
 - (2) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is again 107.
- (3) Of the total amount distributed, £152,175 has been applied in the form of grants to maintenance. This is an increase of £8,750 over the corresponding total in 1916, and of £34,650 over 1915.
- (4) Now that the war has lasted over three distribution periods its effect on the finances of the Hospitals is less difficult to estimate. Although the allocation of the increased maintenance grants is necessarily based each time on audited accounts which are nearly a year old, it has been found that over the whole period the grants have been adjusted fairly closely to the requirements of the various Hospitals.

In making these awards, the Distribution Committee have not lost sight of the principle of helping the Hospitals which have maintained or improved their position by their own efforts. Last year several exceptional grants were made in reduction of debt, after a careful consideration of the steps already being taken to secure local and general support. This year several additional grants are made to supplement the amounts collected by special efforts, sometimes made at the direct instance of the Fund, and resulting in substantial improvement in the financial position at the close of the year.

(5) The capital grants this year amount to £28,825, an increase of £9,750 as compared with 1916, or of £12,850 as compared with 1915. Of this year's total, only £4,025 is in respect of schemes sanctioned during the war on the ground of exceptional urgency, while £20,150 is in reduction of capital liabilities incurred before the war. The remaining £4,650 has been earmarked for schemes of improvement which cannot be carried out until after the war, but which are so urgent that, in the opinion of the Committee, it is desirable that plans should be ready, and a certain amount of funds available, so that the work may be put in hand without delay as soon as circumstances permit.

- (6) At the same time, the Committee have continued to discourage the issue during the war of appeals to the public in aid of building schemes not of this degree of urgency. The request of the General Council that all Hospitals contemplating any considerable reconstruction or extension should, before taking definite action, submit their proposals to the Fund, still holds good; and the issue of a public appeal is considered by the Committee to be definite action.
- (7) The Committee recommend with special satisfaction the grant of £5,000 to extinguish the mortgage debt on Charing Cross Hospital. Ten years ago this debt stood at £85,000, with a provision of only £7,800 towards its redemption; and the position of the Hospital, as the result of premature extension, had been rendered so precarious that the Fund only felt justified in continuing its support "in view of the new management." At the beginning of the year 1914 the debt was still close on £50,000. The Chairman and Committee are to be congratulated on having reduced this debt to £5,000 during the war, while at the same time largely increasing the current income. The grant of £5,000 by the Fund (making £10,700 in all contributed to this object) will thus enable the Hospital to begin the new year free of debt.
- (8) The position with regard to the amalgamation of the Throat, Nose, and Ear Hospitals, so far as the Fund is concerned, is the same as last year. The Committee have again decided to recommend an extra grant to the amalgamated Hospitals for Diseases of the Throat to assist in meeting additional expenditure resulting from the postponement of the building scheme in consequence of the war.
- (9) The Committee have as usual taken into consideration the returns made by the Hospitals relating to the treatment of naval and military patients during the previous year, and also during the first nine months of the current year.
- (10) The following grants in aid of schemes of building expenditure which have been deferred during the war are recommended for renewal:—

Hospital and Home for Sick Children, Sydenham (1915), £75 to central heating. Queen Charlotte's Lying-in Hospital (1913), £1,000 to new out-patient department. St. Mary's Hospital for Women and Children, Plaistow (1913), £1,500 to new nurses' home and out-patient department.

- (11) The Committee have borne in mind the importance of economy of management in the working of a Hospital in all its departments; and though they recognise that wages, salaries, and the cost of provisions, drugs, coal, etc., have inevitably risen during the war, they have continued to draw attention to cases where the total cost per bed is exceptionally high, or where the rise is considerably greater than at other comparable Hospitals.
- (12) The Visitors' Reports have again proved to be of the greatest service. The Committee frequently direct the special attention of all the Visitors in a given year to some particular point. This year the questions selected for more detailed enquiry than usual related to nurses' accommodation. The Committee were glad to see that in the great majority of instances the

Reports were satisfactory; and wherever improvements seemed *prima jacie* desirable and practicable a private remark has been appended to the grant, asking for the observations of the Committee of Management. In more than one case special grants are recommended in aid of urgent reconstruction.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.

Report of the Convalescent Homes Committee.

- (1) The Governors and General Council have this year fixed the sum available for distribution amongst Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria at £9,000, as against £7,500 in 1916. This is an increase of £1,500 on the largest sum ever before placed at the disposal of the Convalescent Homes Committee.
- (2) The number of applications eligible for consideration amounted to 41 from Convalescent Homes and 9 from Consumption Sanatoria, as against 42 and 9 respectively last year.
- (3) In dealing with all applications, whether from Sanatoria or from Convalescent Homes, the Committee have, as usual, taken into consideration the question of comparative urgency of need, as shown by the audited accounts and balance sheets of the various institutions to December 31st last. In the case of Consumption Sanatoria they have also taken note of the proportion of the total work of each institution which is covered by the receipts under the National Insurance Act. As these and other circumstances affecting the relative claims of the different institutions vary from year to year, it must not be assumed that a reduction in the grant to any particular institution, whether for maintenance or for capital purposes, or even the absence of a grant, implies dissatisfaction.
- (4) The proportion allotted to Convalescent Homes is again smaller than usual owing to the absence of grants to several Homes which since the beginning of the war have ceased to be occupied by convalescent patients from London, and which are therefore temporarily ineligible for consideration by this Committee.
- (5) The increased amount available for distribution has enabled the Committee to make a considerable further increase this year in the number of beds reserved at Consumption Sanatoria for the use of patients in London hospitals, and also to contribute, by means of additional maintenance grants, towards the increased cost of working caused by the war. The accommodation thus secured this year amounts to 62 beds at six Sanatoria, situated as follows:—
 - 10 beds for children at the Children's Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.
 - 4 beds at the Daneswood Sanatorium (Jewish), Woburn Sands, Beds.
 - 10 beds at the Devon and Cornwall Sanatorium, South Brent, Devon.
 - 6 beds at the Kelling Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.
 - 20 beds at the Sanatorium of the National Association for the Establishment and Maintenance of Sanatoria for Workers, Benenden, Kent.
 - 12 beds at the Northamptonshire Sanatorium, Creaton, Northants.

- (6) The Committee recommend that the beds thus reserved be allocated amongst London hospitals as follows:—
 - 12 beds to the City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
 - 2 beds to the Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
 - 11 beds to the London Hospital.
 - 10 beds to Guy's Hospital.
 - 5 beds to the Middlesex Hospital.
 - 4 beds to St. George's Hospital.
 - 4 beds to St. Thomas's Hospital.
 - 4 beds to University College Hospital.
 - 2 beds to Charing Cross Hospital.
 - 2 beds to King's College Hospital.
 - 2 beds to the Royal Free Hospital.
 - 2 beds to St. Mary's Hospital.
 - 2 beds to Westminster Hospital.
- (7) Owing to the Government restrictions on travelling facilities, both by rail and by motor, it was found impracticable this year to arrange for the usual inspection of Consumption Sanatoria in the country. All the Sanatoria to which grants are recommended have been inspected by the Fund's Visitors for several successive years.
 - (8) The grants recommended to the various institutions are appended.

TITLE AND CONSTITUTION.

The Fund was founded in 1897, under the title of "The Prince of Wales's Hospital Fund for London," by his late Majesty King Edward VII., then Prince of Wales, with the object of securing more efficient aid and support for the Hospitals of London, and of thus commemorating the Sixtieth Anniversary of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, by establishing the voluntary hospital system of London on a sound financial basis.

It was re-named "King Edward's Hospital Fund for London" in January 1902, after the accession of His Majesty King Edward VII.

By desire of King Edward, it was incorporated under that title, and its constitution settled, by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London Act, 1907 (7 Edw. 7, Ch. lxx.).

The Governing Body under the Act consists of the President and General Council.

His late Majesty King Edward VII. was President of the Fund, while Prince of Wales, from 1897 to 1901, and was subsequently its Patron during his reign from 1901 to 1910.

His present Majesty King George V. was President, as Prince of Wales, from 1901 to 1910, and is now Patron.

The powers of the President have been exercised since 1910 by three Governors appointed by His Majesty pursuant to the provisions of the Act. The names of the Governors are given on page 1 of this Report.

The work of the Fund is carried on under the General Council by the four standing Committees and the Officers as set out on pages 1 and 2. No individual serves on more than one Committee.

RULES AS TO APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS.

Under its present rules the Fund receives applications for grants from:

- (a) Hospitals situated in the County of London or within 9 miles from Charing Cross.
- (b) Convalescent Homes which are situated within these boundaries, or which, being situated outside, take a large proportion of patients from London.
- (c) Consumption Sanatoria which take patients from London, or which are prepared to place beds at the disposal of the Fund for the use of patients from London Hospitals.

The Fund does not, however, assist at present in the foundation of new institutions, or entertain applications from institutions which have not been in existence in a properly constituted form for a period of at least three years, or from dispensaries, nursing institutes, or other institutions not possessing beds for in-patients, or from institutions for the treatment of incurables or of mental cases, or from holiday homes as distinct from convalescent homes.

All institutions applying for grants are required to publish their accounts in accordance with the Revised Uniform System of Hospital Accounts.

Every eligible Hospital and Sanatorium applying for a grant is annually inspected on behalf of the Fund by two Visitors, a medical man and a layman in each case, specially appointed for the purpose.

In accordance with the rule laid down by the Founder of the Fund, in order that the hospitals should derive the greatest possible amount of assistance, the Fund does not receive "letters" of admission or recommendation in return for its grants.

Applications are invited in March, and the awards are made, on the recommendations of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees, by the General Council in December.

Applications for grants, and all other communications, should be addressed to the Honorary Secretaries, at 7 Walbrook, E.C. 4.

METHODS AND RESULTS.

Under the active personal supervision of its Royal Presidents, the Fund has grown steadily in the scope of its work and has secured in an increasing degree the confidence and support of the public.

During the twenty-one years of its existence the Fund has distributed over £2,458,416 to London Hospitals and to Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients, the amount distributed in 1917 being £190,000, an increase of £20,000 over the previous year, and £32,500 over the previous maximum in the years preceding the war.

The amount spent annually on administration since the foundation of the Fund has averaged £1 4s. 6d. per cent. of the receipts, which is equal to less than 3d. in every £1 received.

The League of Mercy, founded under Royal Charter in 1899, has enlisted the co-operation of thousands of small subscribers, and has contributed £260,000 to the Fund during the last nineteen years; the contribution in 1917 being £15,000, the same amount as in 1916, which was the largest contribution the League had been able to make for some years.

The Fund has through its Committees, and through the annual inspections by its Visitors, special facilities for ascertaining the relative needs, efficiency and economy of working of the various institutions and any special circumstances affecting their claims; and it allocates its grants accordingly. Extracts from the Visitors' Reports, together with other remarks bearing on efficiency or economy, are communicated privately to the hospitals with the grants.

All important schemes of building, extension or improvement of hospitals are submitted to the Fund and carefully scrutinised; and, in suitable cases, special grants are made.

In co-operation with the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds, a Uniform System of Hospital Accounts has been introduced which facilitates comparisons between the financial positions of the various Hospitals; and due economy is encouraged by the publication of an Annual Statistical Report showing the cost of working at different hospitals. The issue of these Reports has enabled the Hospitals to effect considerable savings.

From the foregoing it will be seen that the Fund not only collects money for the voluntary hospitals but also helps to secure that all contributions given to them are efficiently and economically employed.

PUBLICATIONS OF THE FUND.

The Fund also from time to time collects, and places at the disposal of the hospitals and the public, information on points of interest, and appoints special Committees to enquire into and report upon questions of difficulty affecting hospitals.
