
PREFACE

The Directory was first published in 1948. As a result of reports of its usefulness received from Medical Social Workers and Health Workers, it was decided to make it an annual publication.

The decision to include a particular Home in this directory lies at the discretion of the Committee. Nearly all the Independent homes were visited by one or more members of the Committee prior to their acceptance for the Directory, and subsequently annual visits have been made whenever possible. Homes within the National Health Service have also been visited, by courtesy of Regional Hospital Boards. A few private Homes that have contractual arrangements with Regional Hospital Boards have been included.

Homes which are situated outside the borders of the four Metropolitan Hospital Regions and of the Wessex Region have been placed in Part II, few of them having been visited by members of the Committee. Wherever they may be, all Homes in the Directory are for patients for whom convalescence or a recuperative holiday has been recommended by a doctor.

Information about 71 convalescent homes situated outside the four Metropolitan Hospital Board Regions can be found in the Directory of Convalescent Homes serving the Provinces published by the British Hospitals Contributory Schemes Association (1948), Royal London Buildings, 42 Baldwin Street, Bristol 1. EXPLANATORY NOTE

PART I of the Directory contains Homes within the four Metropolitan Hospital Regions and the Wessex Region arranged alphabetically according to the name of the town or village in which the Home is situated. Where there is more than one Home in a particular town, they are arranged in alphabetical order according to the names of the Homes.

PART II provides similar information about Homes situated outside those Regions.

The page containing details of each Home shows the Hospital Region in which the Home is situated at the top left hand corner and at the top right hand corner the words: "National Health Service," "Contractual Arrangements," "Special School" or "Independent." Patients at the first two will normally be a charge to the Regional Hospital Board, those at Special Schools are maintained by Local Educational Authorities and those at Independent Homes are frequently approved by Local Health Authorities under the recuperative holiday schemes.

When it is desired to select a Home in a particular district, reference should first be made to the GEOGRAPHICAL INDEX of Homes on pages ix to xiii. Private Homes having contractual arrangements with Hospital Boards are printed in italics in this list.

ALPHABETICAL INDEX on pages xiv to xvi is an alphabetical list of all Homes. The prefix letters to each Home show whether men, women or children are accepted and whether the following facilities are provided:—breakfast in bed, bed cases, ground floor rooms, long term stay.

CLASSIFIED INDEX on pages xvii to xxiv contains lists of Homes showing the treatments they provide and medical conditions accepted. It also lists Homes taking particular social or occupational groups.

CHILDREN'S INDEX on page xxv contains a list of all the children's Homes showing the age groups accepted.

NORMAL EXCLUSIONS—Although the types of cases not admissible vary to a certain degree as between Homes, it can normally be taken that Pulmonary Tuberculosis, Pregnancy (after the fifth month), Mental Cases, Epilepsy, Incurable, Infectious and Contagious Diseases and usually Skin Disease, Open Sores and Wounds are not accepted, unless otherwise stated. In trying to decide whether a patient is eligible or not for any given Home, a study of the information given under TREATMENT and STAFF will give a good idea as to the type of work undertaken.

LONDON AND ASCOT PRIORY CONVALESCENT HOME

ASCOT PRIORY, ASCOT, BERKS.

(Winkfield Row 2067)

Parent Society: Society of The Most Holy Trinity, Ascot, Berks. (Winkfield Row 2067)

PATIENTS: Women from 30 upwards. General Convalescence. Post-operative cases. Chronics. Hearts.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions. Bed cases. Those requiring night nursing.

RELIGION: Church of England. (All denominations accepted).

BEDS: 27, in one large ward on the ground floor. No isolation ward.

TREATMENT: No treatments or diets. Simple dressings. Intra-muscular injections can be given.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: The Reverend Mother Superior.

Nursing Staff: 3 S.R.N. 1 S.E.A.N. Medical Staff: Dr. G. Cook (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: No limit. Minimum 2 weeks.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Patients rise at 8.30 a.m. after having breakfast in bed, and retire at 6.30 p.m. No domestic work is expected from the patients. There is a library, and facilities for handicraft work are available.

Visiting Day: Every day except Monday. 2.30 p.m. to 5 p.m.

CHARGES: £8 0s. 0d. per week. Personal laundry extra. There is one bed at a reduced charge of £2 10s. 0d. per week, obtainable via the Reverend Mother Superior.

RECEIVING DAYS: Monday and Thursday.

DISCHARGE DAYS: Monday and Thursday (or by arrangement)

STATION: Ascot, from Waterloo.

GENERAL: The Home, which was built in 1865, is set well back from the road amongst pine-woods. It is attached to a Convent and stands in extensive grounds. Almoners are advised that it is suitable for elderly patients mostly of long stay.

Parent Society: The Invalid Children's Aid Association.

PATIENTS: Boys and Girls, from 5-11 years, suffering from communication difficulties on account of emotional disturbance.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 21.

TREATMENT: Psychiatric consultations. Routine medical supervision. Speech therapy.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Headmistress, Miss P. Denny.

Medical Staff: Dr. A. Skarbek (Visiting Consultant Psychiatrist). Dr. Frances Hill, School Medical Officer.

LENGTH OF STAY: As required for satisfactory treatment.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Children get up at 7.30 a.m., and go to bed between 6.0 p.m. and 8.0 p.m.

School: 5 hours daily in small groups according to ability; individual teaching for assessment of particular methods required for each child. Short holidays spent at home four times a year, and half-term and other week-ends if considered desirable.

Visiting Day: By arrangement with the Headmistress.

CHARGES: Payable by Local Education Authority.

RECEIVING DAY: By arrangement.

DISCHARGE DAY: Normally at the end of term.

STATION: Sutton, Surrey, from Victoria thence by bus No. 164 to Banstead War Memorial at the entrance to Park Road.

GENERAL: A modern school building with small and varied rooms for a wide range of activities.

PATIENTS: Men and women over 21. Medical and surgical cases. Bed cases.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 51, on ground floor, in wards of 6. Three single rooms.

TREATMENT: Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy given. Limited number of Gastric and Diabetic diets provided. All dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Sister-in-Charge (S.R.N., R.F.N.)

Nursing Staff: Trained Nurses; Student Nurses; Pre-Training Students.

Medical Staff: Dr. D. Aldridge (Medical Officer in Charge).

Dr. R. A. S. Redd.

LENGTH OF STAY: Normal (maximum 1 month.)

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: After early tea at 7 a.m. the patients rise at 11 a.m. having had breakfast at 8 a.m. in bed and retire at 8 p.m. or on special occasions 9 p.m.

There is a library as well as facilities for indoor games, and television in the

patients' recreation room.

Visiting Day: Daily by arrangement with the Sister-in-Charge.

RECEIVING DAYS: Monday and Thursday (men); Tuesday and Friday (women).

DISCHARGE DAYS: Monday and Thursday (men); Tuesday and Friday (women).

STATION: Banstead from Victoria or London Bridge. Patients are brought from the London Hospital by ambulance.

GENERAL: The Home stands on high ground with an open field in front of it. All beds can be pushed out on to a wide, sunny terrace.

WINIFRED HOUSE CONVALESCENT HOSPITAL FOR CHILDREN

BARNET GATE, ARKLEY, BARNET, HERTS.

(01-449-3343)

PATIENTS: Boys aged 2-10. Girls aged 2-12. Short or Long-term patients taken. Patients in plaster. Osteomyelitis. Non-Pulmonary T.B., T.B. Meningitis. Pneumonia. Asthma. Bed patients (limited number).

Ineligible: Normal exclusions.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 40, in wards of 8 to 12 beds. All on ground floor.

TREATMENT: Physiotherapy and Ultra-Violet Rays available. No diets. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron (S.R.N., R.S.C.N.).

Nursing Staff: 1 Full-time Sister; 1 Part Time Sister; 1 Part Time Senior Enrolled Nurse; 2 Enrolled Nurses; 4 Nursing Auxiliaries; 6 Pupil Nurses.

Medical Staff: Dr. K. R. Norton, (visiting consultant paediatrician).
Dr. L.R. Gardner (visiting), Dr. R.C.E. Norman (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: No limit.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Patients rise at 7.30 a.m. and retire at 7 p.m. There is a compulsory rest period.

There is a supply of toys and indoor games.

Visiting Day: Daily, 2 to 3.30 p.m., or by arrangement.

RECEIVING DAY: No special day.

DISCHARGE DAY: No special day.

STATION: New Barnet, from Kings Cross; or High Barnet (Northern Line). A bus runs from either station past the Home.

GENERAL: The Home was built in 1936 and stands on very high ground surrounded by fields. There is a large terrace for beds outside the Home.

APPLICATIONS: to the Matron.

PARNHAM

BEAMINSTER, DORSET.

(Beaminster 204)

PATIENTS: Elderly ladies suffering from a degree of mental deterioration, mainly loss of memory and confusion, but who are ambulant, able to walk up and down stairs unaided, and not incontinent on admission.

Ineligible: Bed-ridden and helpless cases, or those needing mental hospital treatment.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 52.

TREATMENT: Appropriate care, simple treatments and diets, regular chiropody, dental treatment etc.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officers:—Warden: Mrs. H. M. Moulding, S.R.N. Secretary: Mr. R. F. Moulding.

Nursing Staff:

Deputy Warden, (S.R.N.)
Day assistants and night nurses.

CHARGES: Shared accom. (2-8 beds) from £15 4 6d. Single rooms 17 gns.

STATION: Crewkerne from Waterloo. (The Warden will arrange for a car to meet trains, if necessary).

GENERAL: A beautiful Elizabethan Manor, modernised, with central heating, spacious grounds and well laid out gardens. Residents are encouraged to lead as normal a life as possible and social activities are arranged.

(Short-stay cases can be accepted, if suitable, but the home is really for permanent residents).

Such patients must have already received treatment for their condition and be in convalescent stage.

Ineligible: Bed cases. Colostomies. Urinary incontinence. Severe asthma. Inoperable malignant disease with a poor prognosis.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 80. (Dormitory Wards. No single rooms). Lift.

TREATMENT: Convalescent, gastric and other diets, (including full, light, low calorie, low salt, but not individual diets). Dressings. Physiotherapy and active exercises.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron.

Nursing Staff: 7 S.R.N., 2 S.E.N.

Medical Staff: Dr. R. A. Andrews (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: 2 to 3 weeks or at discretion of the Medical Officer of the Home.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The patients are called at 7.15 a.m. and go to bed at 9.0-9.30 p.m.

There are facilities for suitable indoor and outdoor games. Television, radio and library.

Visiting Days: Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday 2 to 4.30 p.m.

RECEIVING DAYS: Monday and Thursday.

DISCHARGE DAYS: Monday and Wednesday

STATION: Cooden Beach, from Victoria.

GENERAL: The Home stands in its own grounds in a pleasant position. It is ten minutes' walk from the sea.

PATIENTS: Women from 17 years. General convalescence. Gynaecological. Orthopaedic. Cardiac Diseases (including Post Cardiac surgery). Subject to the absolute discretion of the Medical Officer a few stabilised psychiatric patients can sometimes be accepted. Such patients must have already received treatment for their condition and be in convalescent stage.

Ineligible: Colostomies. Urinary incontinence. Pregnancy after the fourth month. Severe asthma. Inoperable malignant disease with a poor prognosis.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 90. 15 on ground floor. (Dormitory wards. No single rooms.) There is no lift at this home.

TREATMENT: Convalescent, gastric and other diets, (including full, light, low calorie, low salt, but not individual diets). Dressings. Physiotherapy and active exercises.

STAFF: Chief Officer: Matron.

Nursing Staff: 8 S.R.N.; 2 S.E.N. and 1 Nursing Auxiliary.

Medical Staff: Dr. R. A. Andrews (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: 2 to 3 weeks or at discretion of the Medical Officer of the Home.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The patients are called at 7.0 a.m. and go to bed at 9.30-10.0 p.m. They are expected to make their own beds if well enough. Television, radio and library.

Visiting: Daily.

RECEIVING DAYS: Wednesday and Friday.

DISCHARGE DAYS: Tuesdays and Fridays.

STATION: Bexhill Central, from Victoria.

GENERAL: The Home stands in an open position in its own grounds. It is ten minutes' walk from the sea.

This Home is for patients from Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Children, London and, when there are vacancies, for patients from other hospitals in the N.E. Metropolitan Region, and elsewhere.

PATIENTS: Boys over one and under eleven years. Girls over one and under fourteen

years. General convalescence.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 40.

TREATMENT: No treatments. Special diets provided. All dressings. Physiotherapy.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron-in-Charge (S.R.N., R.S.C.N., S.C.M.)

Nursing Staff: 2 R.S.C.N., 10 Nursing Assistants.

1 Part-time physiotherapist. M.C.S.P.

Medical Staff: Dr. R. K. Reid (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: No limit, but as recommended by the hospital. Normally not less than 3 weeks.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Normal times of rising and retiring. There is a compulsory rest during the afternoon. Tuition for children over seven years old. There is a supply of toys and books as well as facilities for indoor and outdoor games.

Visiting: Saturday and Sunday between 1.45 and 3.45 p.m., and other days by arrangement. (Not on first weekend of stay).

RECEIVING DAY: Normally Wednesday.

DISCHARGE DAY: Normally Wednesday.

STATION: Cooden Beach, from Victoria.

GENERAL: The Home is about a mile from the sea and stands in 5 acres of ground.

APPLICATIONS: to the Medical Social Worker, Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Children, Hackney Road, London, E.2. (01-759-8422, Extension 12).

THE MENTAL AFTER CARE ASSOCIATION

LAWN COURT, 26-27, PARK ROAD, BEXHILL-on-SEA, SUSSEX.

PATIENTS: Men and Women suffering from some degree of mental disability. Normally long-stay but recuperative holidays also given.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions other than mental illness. Bed cases or those requiring nursing care or night time attention are also ineligible.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 37. 1-5, according to size of rooms.

TREATMENT: Mental rehabilitation.

STAFF: At least three resident staff trained or experienced in Mental nursing. **Medical Staff**: Visiting Physician.

LENGTH OF STAY: Recuperative holidays or indefinite long-term care.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: All residents make their beds and help with domestic duties where possible and reasonable. Bedtime not later than 11 p.m. unless special concession granted. Television, radio and other indoor amusements provided. Outside activities encouraged.

Visiting: By arrangement with the Matron.

CHARGES: £6 6s. 0d.per week.

DISCHARGE DAY: Any week-day.

RECEIVING DAY: Any week-day.

STATION: Bexhill Central—frequent trains from Victoria.

GENERAL: Large house facing park and one minute from sea.

APPLICATIONS: To The Secretary, The Mental After Care Association, Eagle House, 110, Jermyn Street, London, S.W.1.

THE MENTAL AFTER CARE ASSOCIATION

THE TOWERS, 18 & 18a, EGERTON ROAD, BEXHILL-on-SEA, SUSSEX.

PATIENTS: Women suffering from some degree of mental disability.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions other than mental illness. Bed cases or those

requiring nursing care and night time attention are also ineligible.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 28. 1-4 according to size of rooms.

TREATMENT: Mental rehabilitation.

STAFF: Three resident staff trained or experienced in Mental nursing.

Medical Staff: Visiting Physician.

LENGTH OF STAY: Recuperative holidays or indefinite long-term care.






