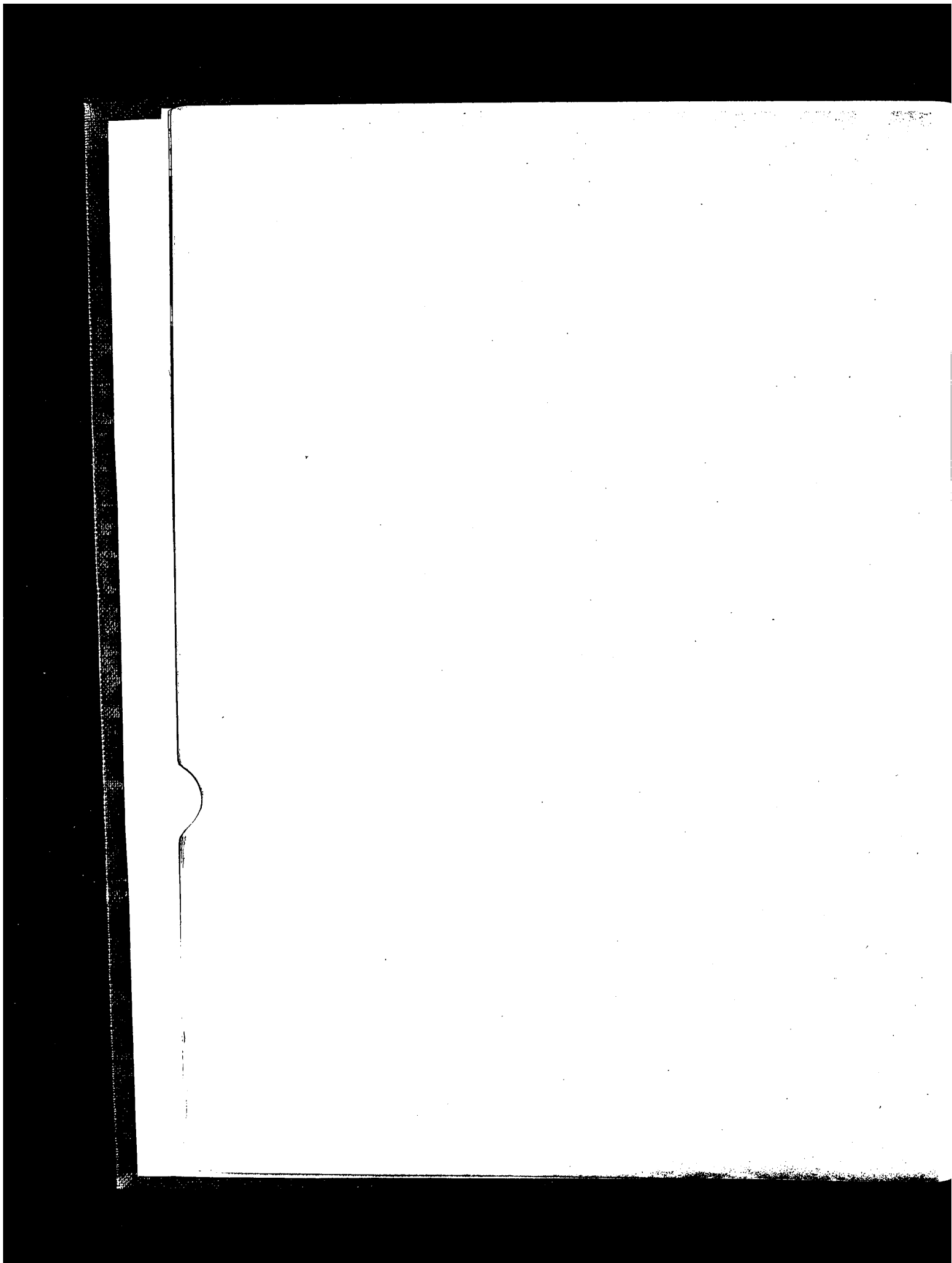

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1911.

The total receipts for the year 1911 were £235,620 9s. 9d. This sum was made up as follows: Donations £48,106 18s. 4d.; Contributions to Capital, £6,071 10s. 1d., including £1,239 17s. 7d. on account of a legacy, together with £1,444 12s. 3d. net profit on realisation of Securities; Annual Subscriptions, £25,766 2s. 9d.; Contribution of the League of Mercy, £17,000; from the Lewis Estate, £13,491 5s. 11d.; Legacies (other than Legacies to Capital), £48,576 16s. 6d.; Interest from Investments, £76,407 16s. 2d.; together with £200 from the Trustees of the Bawden Fund.

The donations include a munificent contribution of £31,500 made to the Fund by Sir Ernest Cassel, being part of a gift of £50,000 to Hospitals in London and the Provinces, in memory of his daughter, the late Mrs. Maude Ashley. The Governors and the General Council are deeply grateful to Sir Ernest Cassel for entrusting the Fund with the distribution of this large sum and thus enabling the awards which had already been voted to Hospitals and other institutions to be increased in each instance by one-fifth.

The amount originally placed at the disposal of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees for distribution was £157,500, being an increase of £2,500 over the sum distributed in 1910. The supplementary grants made in respect of the special donation above referred to increased the total distribution to £189,000. Of this the Hospitals received £181,200, while the remaining £7,800 was distributed amongst Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients.

The total sum distributed amongst Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria during the last ten years (after deducting grants to the extent of £7,409 16s. 7d. that have been allowed to lapse) is £1,243,840 3s. 5d.; since the foundation of the Fund a total amount of £1,475,916 8s. 5d. has been distributed.

During the year the amount spent on administration (including the expenses of the Out-patient Enquiry Committee) was £1 9s. 11d. per cent. of the total amount received. The corresponding percentage for the whole period since the inauguration of the Fund has been £1 5s. 3d.

Amongst the Legacies received during the year were payments of £28,301 12s. 1d. on account of the residue of the estate of the late Mr. Edward Matyear, £14,643 5s. 11d. on account of the residue of the estate of the late Mr. G. H. Swonnell, and £2,936 4s. 7d. from the late Mr. B. C. Hirsch. The Council have also to acknowledge an anonymous donation of £10,000, and an annual subscription of £5,000 from Mr. Walter Morrison.

His Majesty The King was graciously pleased to allocate to the Fund a sum of £2,000 out of the Coronation Gift of His Highness the Maharaja of Gwalior.

The amounts received in donations and subscriptions, excluding gifts to capital, show, as compared with 1910, an increase of £28,376 12s. 2d.

The League of Mercy has this year contributed £17,000. During the twelve years of its existence the League has furnished in all £170,000 to the Fund. The Council express their best thanks to the voluntary workers who have so materially assisted the Fund by the collection of this large sum.

Every eligible Hospital and Consumption Sanatorium which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon by the Fund's Visitors, consisting as heretofore of one medical and one layman in each case.

The scheme of the Convalescent Homes Committee for securing beds at Consumption Sanatoria and placing them at the disposal of London Hospitals for the accommodation of patients urgently needing country treatment, has proved successful from the point of view both of the Sanatoria and of the Hospitals. The scheme has this year been extended, the number of beds secured for the coming year amounting to 35 at four Sanatoria as against 18 at three Sanatoria last year.

In July, 1911, the Executive Committee had under consideration the probable effect of the National Insurance Bill upon the future of the Hospitals of London, and a Sub-Committee was appointed to collect information on the subject. A report of this Sub-Committee, summarising the opinions of thirty-two of the principal Hospitals upon various aspects of the question, was published in the newspapers of July 19, 1911.

The Annual Statistical Report on the expenditure of London Hospitals has again been enlarged. It now deals with 106 Hospitals, and forms as nearly as possible a complete analysis of the expenditure of all the Hospitals which have adopted the Revised Uniform System of Accounts. The reductions in cost recorded in the successive issues of these reports since the comparative figures were first prepared in 1903 now amounts to a total of no less than £47,000 a year.

The Special Committee, consisting of Lord Mersey (Chairman), the late Lord Northcote and the Bishop of Stepney, appointed to inquire into the methods prevailing in the London

Voluntary Hospitals with regard to the admission of Out-patients, began to sit early in the year. Their proceedings were delayed by the lamented illness and death of Lord Northcote, and the Committee subsequently postponed consideration of their report until the conclusion of the discussion of the National Insurance Bill. The work of the Committee had, therefore, not been completed when the Council for 1911 laid down its duties.

The Distribution Committee have carefully considered all schemes for the extension or reconstruction of hospitals which have been submitted in accordance with the request of the Council. The Fund has thus used its best endeavours to assist the Hospital Authorities in ensuring that when capital expenditure of this kind is undertaken, adequate consideration is given to economy, efficiency, and the prospect of funds for future maintenance, and has particularly considered the relation of each scheme to the general question of hospital accommodation in London.

In view of the absence from England of His Highness the Duke of Teck and Viscount Iveagh, in connection with the Coronation Durbar in India, the Earl of Donoughmore and the Rt. Hon. Sir T. Vezey Strong were appointed, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Incorporation of the Fund, to act with the Speaker as a Committee to exercise the powers of the Governors till their return.

The Council regret to record the loss by death, during the year 1911, of two of their earliest Members, the Rev. J. Guinness Rogers, D.D., and the late Chief Rabbi, the Rev. Dr. Hermann Adler.

The Council desire to express their appreciation of the great services rendered to the Fund by Mr. Frederick M. Fry as Honorary Secretary for the four years ending December, 1911. This term included the period immediately following the reorganisation after the Incorporation of the Fund by Act of Parliament, and in this as well as in other matters his experience in administrative work and his devotion to the duties of his office have been of special value. The Council are glad to know that the Fund will still retain Mr. Fry's services as a Member of the Council and Distribution Committee, as well as in the work connected with the Out-patient Enquiry. The vacancy created by his retirement has been filled by the appointment of Mr. John G. Griffiths, who has been actively associated with the Fund for many years.

The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co. to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year.

The Council are obliged to the Press for the services they have rendered in the past, and continue to rely upon their kindly co-operation in obtaining for the Fund wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

A Meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria, was held on Monday, December 11th, 1911, at St. James's Palace, the Speaker of the House of Commons being in the chair.

Sir Savile Crossley, Bt. (Hon. Secretary), Sir W. S. Church, Bt., Sir Henry Burdett, Sir Horace Marshall, Sir Cooper Perry, Sir John Craggs, Mr. Frederick M. Fry (Hon. Secretary), Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. John G. Griffiths, Mr. Albert G. Sandeman.

The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: His Highness The Duke of Teck, Viscount Iveagh, The Earl of Donoughmore, The Lord-Lieutenant of the County of London (The Duke of Fife), The Bishop of London, the Bishop of Southwark, Cardinal Bourne, The Rev. T. Bowman Stephenson, D.D., The Earl of Bessborough, Lord Rothschild, Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, Lord Farquhar, Lord Stamfordham, The Postmaster-General (the Rt. Hon. Herbert Samuel, M.P.), The President of the Local Government Board (the Rt. Hon. John Burns, M.P.), The Chairman of the County Council (Mr. Edward White), The President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir Thomas Barlow, Bt.), The Rt. Hon. C. Stuart-Wortley, K.C., M.P., The Rt. Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel, The Rt. Hon. Sydney Buxton, M.P., The Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P., The Rt. Hon. Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt., Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt., Sir Julius Wernher, Bt., Professor Sir William Osler, Bt., Sir W. J. Collins, Mr. J. Danvers Power, Rev. Canon Barnett, Mr. William Latham, K.C., and Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, junior.

In the absence of LORD ROTHSCHILD (Honorary Treasurer), LORD REVELSTOKE reported that the amount received by the Fund for general purposes to the 8th December, after payment of expenses, was £176,745 *os.* 3*d.*

Sir HENRY BURDETT stated that the League of Mercy hoped this year that their contribution to the Fund and their distribution amongst the Hospitals in the Home Counties would amount together to a sum of £20,000. He could not for the moment say exactly what sum.

The Chairman of the Distribution Committee (Sir WILLIAM CHURCH) read the Report of that Committee, and Sir SAVILE CROSSLEY (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

In the absence of Mr. WILLIAM LATHAM, K.C. (Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee) Dr. FRESHFIELD read the Report of that Committee, and Mr. FREDERICK M. FRY (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS, in moving the adoption of the Reports and Awards, said:—My Lords and Gentlemen, it falls to my lot this year to preside at the distribution meeting, and to propose the motion which stood in the name of the Duke of Teck last year, and which for so many years was moved by his present Majesty when Prince of Wales and President of the Fund—namely, the adoption of the Reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees. The absence of my colleagues, the Duke of Teck and Lord Iveagh, who are both attending the ceremonies connected with His Majesty's visit to India, has rendered it necessary to put into operation the clause of the Act of Incorporation which authorises the Governors to delegate their powers to a committee. They have, therefore, with the approval of His Majesty, the Patron of the Fund, appointed Lord Donoughmore and the Rt. Hon. Sir Thomas Vezev Strong to exercise with myself the powers of the Governors for the time being. Before proceeding to the business of the motion before us, I have to communicate to the Council the following message, which we have had the honour of receiving from His Majesty:—

“Emperor's Camp, India, 9th December, 1911, 2.45 P.M.

“On the occasion of the Annual Meeting on Monday I wish to congratulate the Governors and Council of the Fund upon the satisfactory results achieved last year. I am glad to think that they can increase the annual distribution by £2,500, indicating the continued support of the public and confidence in its efficient administration. I highly appreciate the generous and untiring work given to the Fund by the Honorary Secretaries and Members of the various Committees; and I take as ever the deepest interest in its welfare.

“GEORGE, R.I.”

I feel sure that I shall be voicing the sentiments of all present here to-day if I express our deep appreciation of His Majesty's kind message and our thanks to him for his remembrance of our meeting and work in the midst of the absorbing and moving scenes with which His Majesty's attention is now so fully occupied. The first point that arises from a consideration of the reports which are before us is the steady progress (referred to in His Majesty's gracious message) in the amount distributed. The total this year is £157,500, representing an increase of £2,500—£1,000 in the amount distributed to Hospitals and £1,500 in the amount distributed to Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria. Among the receipts which have made possible this progress I would mention first the increased annual subscription of one hundred guineas with which Her Majesty The Queen has honoured the Fund. This, following as it does upon the increase last year of His Majesty's subscription from £500 to £1,000 and the subscription of £100 from H.R.H. The Prince of Wales, is yet another mark of the interest taken by the Royal Family in the Fund, and their recognition of the needs of the Hospitals of London. His Majesty has also allocated to the Fund a share amounting to £2,000, in the munificent Coronation Gift of His Highness the Maharaja of Gwalior. The receipts again include an anonymous donation of £10,000; the City Corporation have for the third time in succession voted an annual subscription of £500 for five years; while several of the City Companies have continued their welcome donations to the Fund. The contribution of the League of Mercy continues to be one of the largest items in the list of receipts. The Council will have observed the withdrawal of St. George's Hospital from the list of applicants. It is a matter of deep regret to all of us that any difficulty should arise between the Fund and any of the Hospitals. But the Fund is bound by the findings of Sir Edward Fry's Commission on the Financial Relations between Hospitals and Medical Schools, and it has no option but to observe them both in the letter and in the spirit. In the same way the Fund is bound by the rules of the Revised Uniform System of Hospital Accounts. This system, it will be remembered, was adopted by the three Metropolitan Funds,

after full discussion with a Committee of Hospital Secretaries, not as being the only form in which the accounts of hospitals could legitimately be kept, but as being a sound and practicable method of securing the commonly admitted benefits of a general uniformity. As such it has become the recognised standard of Hospital account-keeping; intending subscribers rely upon the system as a means of comparing one Hospital with another; and in fairness therefore both to the public, and to the Hospitals generally, it is necessary to see that its rules are observed by all institutions applying for grants. In this connection a word of thanks is due to the Accountants and Auditors who have carried out the system, and whose professional services are so often given to charitable institutions either free or for merely nominal remuneration. The Council will notice that grants to special purposes again form an important feature in the distribution. It must not be supposed, however, that the thorough consideration by the Distribution Committee of schemes submitted to the Fund has only taken place where special grants appear in the list. It often happens that the Committee pass a scheme, and yet do not consider that the circumstances demand the ear-marking of any portion of the Fund's grant. In recommending all awards, whether allocated to a special purpose or not, the Committee take into consideration all the facts which come to the knowledge of the Fund, including those submitted by the Hospitals themselves, or contained in the Visitors' Reports, as well as those revealed by the published accounts and balance sheets, and statistics of cost of working. The Council will have been pleased to hear of the success of the scheme of the Convalescent Homes Committee for placing beds in consumption Sanatoria at the disposal of London Hospitals, and of the increase in the number of beds secured in this way for next year. In July last the Executive Committee issued a circular to the principal Hospitals most likely to be concerned, inviting expressions of opinion as to the probable effect of the National Insurance Bill upon their finances and the numbers of their patients. A short statement summarising the general effect of the replies was prepared by the Committee and was published in the press. It is with deep regret that the Governors have to record the death of Lord Northcote, who at the time of his illness was giving the Fund the benefit of his invaluable assistance as a Member of the Special Committee which, under the Chairmanship of Lord Mersey, has been enquiring into the Out-patient System. In spite of the delays resulting from the loss of the services of their colleague, the Committee had before the end of the summer nearly completed the receipt of evidence. They did not, however, feel that it was desirable to settle their Report while the National Insurance Bill was before Parliament, and still liable to changes which might affect its relation to the subject of their enquiry. Besides the death of Lord Northcote, the Council has also to lament the loss of two of its original Members, the Rev. Dr. Adler (the Chief Rabbi), and the Rev. J. Guinness Rogers, while the Fund has lost a useful Visitor by the death of Dr. Rainy. To all the Members of the Council and Committees and to the Visitors and the Honorary Officers the Governors desire to tender their best thanks. It is with great regret that we have learned that Mr. Fry is unable through pressure of other work to continue his invaluable services in the responsible position of one of our Honorary Secretaries. It would be difficult to say in a few words how much the Fund has owed, during the last four years, to his great experience in administrative and charitable work, and to his untiring devotion to the performance of any duty which he has taken up. It is some consolation to know that we shall still retain his services on the Council and on the Distribution Committee. The Governors, with the approval of His Majesty The King, Patron of the Fund, have invited Mr. John G. Griffiths to take his place as one of the Honorary Secretaries, and as a colleague to Sir Savile Crossley. Mr. Griffiths has been associated with the Fund for many years, and he is well known in the Hospital world through his work in connection with the Revised Uniform System of Hospital Accounts. I have now, my Lords and Gentlemen, to move the adoption of the Reports.

The DUKE OF NORFOLK having seconded the motion, the adoption of the Reports was then put and carried unanimously.

On the motion of Sir JOSEPH DIMSDALE, seconded by Dr. FRESHFIELD, it was resolved that the cheques for the grants should be posted on December 19th, except in the case of grants for the reservation of beds in Consumption Sanatoria during 1912, which should be posted on January 2nd.

Sir SAVILE CROSSLEY stated that since the Distribution Committee had settled its report he had been asked whether in the event of a donor proposing to give £50,000 to Hospitals and other institutions, of which about £7,000 would be for selected country Hospitals, the Fund would accept from such donor an offer to supplement the distribution by one-fifth of the amount distributed to each institution, making a supplementary distribution of £31,500 and a total distribution of £189,000. The donor wished to have the privilege of naming beds or cots in respect of his whole donation, and he proposed to distribute the balance of the £50,000 amongst certain London Hospitals receiving grants from the Fund.

On the motion of Sir T. VEZEY STRONG, seconded by the LORD MAYOR (Sir THOMAS CROSBY), it was resolved unanimously that in the event of the munificent offer indicated by Sir Savile Crossley being made, the Fund would gratefully accept it, and in such case that it should be referred to the Distribution Committee and Convalescent Homes Committee respectively to make such arrangements as might be necessary for distributing the sum thus specially placed at their disposal, and that they should be requested in doing so to conform as nearly as might be to the scheme of distribution already adopted by the Council in respect of the year 1911.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1912.

THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS then said: My Lords and Gentlemen,—In accordance with the custom of the Fund, I have now to announce the intentions of the Governors with regard to the appointment of the General Council and Committees for the year 1912. Briefly our present intention is to re-appoint the whole of the existing Members both of the Council and of the Committees, including, of course, the Out-patient Enquiry Committee, whose work is not yet finished. It only remains to consider the delegation resolutions which have been circulated with the agenda, and then, if they are approved, the meeting which will be held in the new year to pass them need only be formal.

On the motion of Sir HORACE MARSHALL, seconded by Mr. ALBERT G. SANDEMAN, a Resolution was approved delegating powers to the Finance, Distribution, Convalescent Homes, and Out-patient Enquiry Committees.

On the motion of Sir COOPER PERRY, seconded by Sir JOHN CRAGGS, a Resolution was approved delegating powers to the Executive Committee.

THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS then moved the following Resolution, which was seconded by the PRESIDENT OF THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF SURGEONS (Mr. R. J. GODLEE), and carried:—"That the keys of the lock under which the Corporate Seal is kept be held as follows: One of the three keys comprising one triplicate set shall be held respectively by the Earl of Bessborough, the Lord Rothschild, and Mr. John G. Griffiths, and one of the three keys comprising the other triplicate set shall be held respectively by the Lord Revelstoke, the Rt. Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt., and Mr. Frederick M. Fry.

On the motion of Sir HENRY BURDETT, seconded by Sir SAVILE CROSSLEY, it was unanimously resolved that the cordial and grateful thanks of the Council be given to Mr. F. M. Fry for his invaluable

services as Honorary Secretary to the King's Fund from 1908 to 1911, during which period he had practically devoted his whole time to his duties and had shown a knowledge and grasp of the Fund's business which had won for him the respect and admiration of all who had had the pleasure to be associated with him in the work of the Fund.

Mr. FRY having briefly replied,

THE LORD MAYOR (Sir THOMAS CROSBY) proposed a vote of thanks to the Speaker of the House of Commons for presiding. The resolution was seconded by the GOVERNOR OF THE BANK OF ENGLAND (Mr. A. C. COLE), and carried unanimously.

The SPEAKER having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings terminated.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, to receive the Accounts and the Report of the General Council for the year 1911, was held at St. James's Palace on Thursday, the 18th of April, the Speaker of the House of Commons being in the Chair.

Those present were: The Viscount Iveagh, the Earl of Bessborough, Lord Rothschild, the President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (the Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor), the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir Thomas Barlow, Bt.), the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Mr. Rickman J. Godlee), the Rt. Hon. Sir Joseph Dimsdale, Bt., the Rt. Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt. (Hon. Secretary), the Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P., the Rt. Hon. Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt., Sir W. S. Church, Bt., Sir Horace Marshall, Sir William J. Collins, Sir John Craggs, Mr. Frederick M. Fry, Dr. Edwin Freshfield, Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary).

The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: H.H. the Duke of Teck, the Duke of Norfolk, the Bishop of London, the Bishop of Southwark, Cardinal Bourne, the Rev. T. Bowman Stephenson, D.D., Lord Revelstoke, Lord Farquhar, Lord Stamfordham, the Rt. Hon. the Master of Elibank, M.P., the Postmaster General (the Rt. Hon. Herbert Samuel, M.P.), the President of the Local Government Board (the Rt. Hon. John Burns, M.P.), the Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. A. C. Cole), the Rt. Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel, Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt., Sir Julius Wernher, Bt., Professor Sir William Osler, Bt., Sir Henry Burdett, Mr. J. Danvers Power, Rev. Canon Barnett, Mr. William Latham, K.C., Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, jun., Mr. Albert G. Sandeman.

LORD ROTHSCHILD (the Honorary Treasurer) in presenting the Account of Receipts and Expenditure, and the Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December, 1911, said he was glad to announce that there was a small increase in the Capital Account; but it was much to the regret of the Council that more financial support and sympathy were not forthcoming for the Fund, as, owing to increased legislation, there might be increased calls upon the various hospitals. When the status of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London was definitely arranged by Parliament, the Treasurer and Finance Committee were ordered to separate their investments into trust securities and non-trust securities. Any money given to the Fund without an expression of preference by the donor would naturally be invested in trust securities. It was always left to the donor to express a wish that his contribution should be invested in non-trust securities. The result of that legislation had been as follows: The total original value of the Fund's present investments was £1,670,864, of which £608,438 represented trust securities and £1,062,426 non-trust securities. The present value of the trust securities was £574,375, or a diminution of 5.6 per cent., and of the non-trust securities £1,119,629, being an increase of 5.4 per cent.; making a total of £1,694,004, shewing a net

increase of 1·4 per cent. He trusted that when he had the honour to move the adoption of the accounts in another year he would be able to announce an increase of contributions.

The SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS formally moved the adoption of the Accounts.

The resolution, having been seconded by LORD IVEAGH, was then put and carried unanimously.

Sir SAVILE CROSSLEY (Honorary Secretary) presented the draft Report of the Council for the year 1911.

The SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS, in moving the adoption of the Report, said :—My Lords and Gentlemen,—In accordance with the custom at this Annual Meeting I intend only to refer briefly to one or two of the matters arising out of the Report and Accounts which are before us. At the Distribution Meeting in December it was announced that a donor, who was about to distribute an “in memoriam” gift of £50,000 amongst hospitals, had offered the Fund, out of this sum, a donation of £31,500, being the amount required to increase the awards for the year by one-fifth. The donor did not then wish his name to be made known. It was impossible therefore to acknowledge his generosity as we should have wished to do; but I desire now, and I am sure that I shall do it in your name, as well as that of the Governors, to tender to Sir Ernest Cassel the best thanks of all connected with the Fund for this most munificent donation, and for this mark of his confidence in the principles upon which the distribution of the Fund’s grants is made. The Committee which, under the Chairmanship of Lord Mersey, was appointed to enquire into the Out-patient System of London, has now made considerable progress with the study of the voluminous evidence it has collected, and we look forward to the issue of its report on this difficult subject at no very distant date. Since the end of the year the Fund has had to mourn the loss of the Duke of Fife, who was one of the oldest Members of the Council, and presided over its meetings on several occasions. A resolution was passed by the Executive Committee at the time, expressing in the name of the Governors and the General Council their condolence with Their Majesties and the Princess Royal in the loss they had sustained. I would also desire to refer here to the death of Lord Lister, the most distinguished surgeon of his day, who was for several years a Member of the Council of the Fund, a Member of the Visiting Committee, and Chairman also of the Distribution Committee. We have therefore personal reasons for associating ourselves with the universal tributes to the memory of the noble work of this great man. There have been a few changes in the personnel of the Fund since the meeting in December. The Governors have appointed the Rev. R. F. Horton to the Council in the place of the late Rev. J. Guinness Rogers. Mr. Danvers Power is, we regret to say, unable to continue his services on the Distribution Committee, and we have accordingly appointed Mr. Griffiths to that Committee and Mr. H. L. Hopkinson to the Executive Committee. I now beg to move the adoption of the Report, and in doing so I would desire to express the thanks of the Governors and all of us to Lord Rothschild and the Members of the Finance Committee for the skill and care with which they watch over our investments.

Sir EDGAR SPEYER seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

On the motion of the Lord Mayor (Sir THOMAS BOOR CROSBY), seconded by Mr. THOMAS BURT, a vote of thanks to the Speaker for presiding was carried unanimously.

The SPEAKER having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings terminated.

Report of the Distribution Committee.

The Governors and General Council having this year placed the sum of £151,000 (*a*) in the hands of the Committee with a view to distribution amongst the London Hospitals, as against £150,000 in 1910, the Committee beg to report as follows:—

(1) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is 105, as against 106 last year.

(2) Among the Institutions which do not appear in this year's list is St. George's Hospital, the Governors of the Hospital having withdrawn their application as a result of the decision of the Fund on the question of the amounts which could properly be paid to the Medical School in respect of work done for the Hospital. The grant of £2,000 which was reserved last year lapses, the conditions attached to it by the Council of the Fund not having been fulfilled.

(3) With regard to the applications received this year from four out of the five Throat, Nose and Ear Hospitals, it will be remembered that the Fund has long considered that in the public interest the continuance of five special hospitals for these diseases is not desirable. Various communications upon the subject of amalgamation have passed during the year between one Hospital and another, and between different Hospitals, jointly as well as individually, and the Fund. No detailed scheme has, however, yet reached the stage at which a grant from the Fund can be recommended. Under the circumstances the Committee consider it desirable that the total sums set aside or promised towards a general scheme of amalgamation should be increased to £20,000 (*b*), and should remain at that figure pending an agreement upon a satisfactory scheme or schemes. The capital grant, promised under certain conditions by the Fund towards a general scheme, amounts to at least £10,000, and the sums now held in reserve in lieu of separate maintenance grants amount to £7,500. The Committee therefore recommend that these reserved grants of £7,500 should be added to the capital sum of £10,000, and that a further sum of £2,500 (*b*) should be added in respect of this year's distribution. The whole amount of £20,000 (*b*) thus accumulated should be considered as a grant to capital (including building capital), and the Committee recommend that they should be empowered to draw upon this sum, in such proportions as they may consider appropriate, in the event of a general or partial amalgamation, as the case may be, being brought to a satisfactory conclusion before the next distribution.

(*a*) Subsequently increased by one-fifth by means of the special donation of Sir Ernest Cassel.

(*b*) Subsequently increased by £500 (see note (*a*)).

(4) None of the grants made to special purposes in 1909 remain unapplied, and no question of the renewal of grants under the two years rule therefore arises.

(5) It will be seen from the list of awards that, as in the past, grants have in many cases been made in aid of schemes of improvement or extension which have been submitted to the Fund in accordance with the resolution of the General Council to that effect.

(6) The Committee are glad to report that the poor district of Kentish Town will shortly be provided with improved Hospital accommodation by the rebuilding of the Out-patient Department of the amalgamated Hampstead and North-West London Hospitals.

(7) The sum of £5,000 (c) voted towards the removal of King's College Hospital to South London increases the total amount contributed by the Fund to this object to £42,000 (c). The Committee are glad to report that they have received an assurance that every endeavour will be made to push forward the completion of the new Hospital and to open it at the earliest possible date.

(8) The Reports of the Visitors have as usual proved to be of the greatest value, and many of their observations have been brought to the notice of the Hospital authorities—a practice which has produced useful results in the past.

(9) The enlargement of the Annual Statistical Report to cover practically all the Hospitals applying for grants has enabled the Committee to extend the practice of drawing the attention of the Hospitals concerned to cases where the excess of cost above the average seems to call either for specific justification or for greater attention to economy. They desire to record their appreciation of this Report prepared by Mr. Maynard, which has now at length reached the complete form aimed at from its inception.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.

Report of the Convalescent Homes Committee.

(1) The Governors and General Council have this year placed the sum of £6,500^(a) in the hands of the Committee with a view to distribution amongst Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria. The amount distributed in 1910 was £5,000.

(2) The number of applications eligible for consideration amounted to 43 from Convalescent Homes and 7 from Consumption Sanatoria, as against 45 and 8 respectively last year.

(3) In dealing with applications from Convalescent Homes the Committee have adhered to their original policy of giving special consideration to the Convalescent Homes closely connected with London Hospitals.

(4) The Committee are glad to report that the scheme for placing beds in Country Consumption Sanatoria at the disposal of patients in London Hospitals has proved satisfactory. The Hospitals to whom the beds are allotted have all testified to the value of the arrangement and expressed the hope that it will be continued, while the amount of accommodation offered has increased from 18 beds at three Sanatoria to 37 beds at four Sanatoria. The accommodation is situated as follows:—

7 beds at the Sanatorium of the National Association for the Establishment and Maintenance of Sanatoria for Workers, Benenden, Kent.

8 beds at the Kelling Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.

10 beds at the Devon and Cornwall Sanatorium, South Brent, Devon.

12 beds at the Northampton Sanatorium, Creaton, Northants.

(5) With regard to the allocation of these beds to Hospitals in London the Committee have followed the same principle as that adopted last year, viz. : that preference should be given (in order of relative size) to the two Consumption Hospitals which have no country branches and that the rest of the beds should be divided between the two largest of the general hospitals which apply to the Fund.

(a) Subsequently increased by one-fifth by means of the special donation of Sir Ernest Cassel.

They accordingly recommend the following allocation :

- 17 beds to the City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
- 8 beds to the Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
- 6 beds to the London Hospital.
- 6 beds to Guy's Hospital.

(6) The Committee are greatly indebted to the Visitors who undertook the task of inspecting the Sanatoria applying for grants, and who thus furnished the Committee with invaluable evidence as to the suitability of the accommodation provided for London patients by means of the grants made last year.

(7) The grants recommended to the various Institutions are appended.
