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
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PREFACE

The Directory was first published in the autumn of 1948. As a result of reports of its usefulness received from Almoners and Health Workers, the Convalescent Homes Committee of King Edward's Hospital Fund decided to make it an annual publication.

The decision whether to include a particular Home or not lies at the discretion of the Committee. Of the Homes operating outside the National Health Service, nearly all are visited by one or more members of the Committee prior to their acceptance for the Directory, and subsequently, if possible, every year. Homes within the National Health Service have also been visited, by courtesy of Regional Hospital Boards. Only Homes which are prepared to admit patients residing in the London area are recorded. Until recently only Voluntary or National Health Service Homes have been included, but now it has been decided to include a few private Homes that have contractual arrangements with Regional Hospital Boards.

Homes which are situated outside the borders of the four Metropolitan Hospital Regions have been placed in Part II, few of them having been visited by members of the Committee. Wherever they may be, all Homes in the Directory are for patients for whom convalescence or a recuperative holiday has been recommended by a doctor.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

PART I of the Directory contains Homes within the four Metropolitan Hospital Regions, arranged alphabetically according to the name of the town or village in which the Home is situated. Where there is more than one Home in a particular town—such as Broadstairs—they are arranged in alphabetical order according to the names of the Homes.

When it is desired to select a Home in a particular district, reference should first be made to the GEOGRAPHICAL INDEX of Homes on pages xiii to xviii Private Homes having contractual arrangements with Hospital Boards are printed in italics in this list.

PART II provides similar information about Homes situated outside the four Metropolitan Hospital Regions. The page containing details of each Home shows the Hospital Region in which the Home is situated at the top left hand corner and at the top right hand corner the words: "National Health Service," "Contractual Arrangements," "Special School" or "Independent." Patients at the first two will normally be a charge to the Regional Hospital Board, those at Special Schools are maintained by Local Educational Authorities and those at Independent Homes are frequently approved by Local Health Authorities under the recuperative holiday schemes.

ALPHABETICAL INDEX on pages xix to xxii is an alphabetical list of all Homes. The prefix letters to each Home show whether men, women or children are accepted and whether the following facilities are provided:— breakfast in bed, bed cases, ground floor rooms, long term stay.

CLASSIFIED INDEX on pages xxiii to xxxi contains lists of Homes showing the treatments they provide and medical conditions accepted. It also lists Homes taking particular social or occupational groups.

CHILDREN'S INDEX on pages xxxii to xxxiii contains a list of all the children's Homes showing the age groups accepted.

NORMAL EXCLUSIONS — Although the types of cases not admissible vary to a certain degree as between Homes, it can normally be taken that Pulmonary Tuberculosis, Pregnancy (after the fifth month), Mental Cases, Epilepsy, Incurable, Infectious and Contagious Diseases and usually Skin Disease, Open Sores and Wounds are not accepted, unless otherwise stated. In trying to decide whether a patient is eligible or not for any given Home, a study of the information given under TREATMENT and STAFF will give a good idea as to the type of work undertaken.

LONDON AND ASCOT PRIORY CONVALESCENT HOME

ASCOT PRIORY, ASCOT, BERKS.

(Winkfield Row 67)

Parent Society: Society of The Most Holy Trinity, Ascot, Berks. (Winkfield Row 67)

PATIENTS: Women from 30 to 65. General Convalescence. Post-operative cases. Chronics. Hearts.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions. Bed cases. Those requiring night nursing.

RELIGION: Church of England. (All denominations accepted).

BEDS: 28, in one large ward on the ground floor. No isolation ward.

TREATMENT: No treatments or diets. Simple dressings. Intra-muscular injections can be given.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: The Reverend Mother Superior.

Nursing Staff: 2 S.R.N. 2 S.E.A.N. Medical Staff: Dr. R. Allen (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: No limit. Minimum 2 weeks.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Patients rise at 8.30 a.m. after having breakfast in bed, and retire at 6.30 p.m. No domestic work is expected from the patients. There is a library, and facilities for handicraft work are available.

Visiting Day: Every day except Tuesday.

CHARGES: £4 4s. 0d. per week. Personal laundry extra. There is one bed at a reduced charge of £2 10s. 0d. per week, obtainable via the Reverend Mother Superior.

RECEIVING DAYS: Monday and Thursday.

STATION: Ascot, from Waterloo. Patients make their own way to the Hospital, by taxi procured at the station or by Thames Valley bus—route number 2.

GENERAL: The Home, which was built in 1865, is set well back from the road amongst pine-woods. It is attached to a Convent and stands in extensive grounds. Almoners are advised that it is especially suitable for elderly patients.

APPLICATIONS: to the Reverend Mother Superior at the Home. N.H.S. patients to the N.W. Metropolitan Regional Hospital Board, 11a, Portland Place, W.1.

RESIDENTIAL OPEN AIR SCHOOL OF RECOVERY (SURGICAL HOME FOR BOYS)

PARK ROAD, BANSTEAD, SURREY

(Burgh Heath 4174)

- **PATIENTS:** Boys aged 5-11 years. General convalescence. Asthma. Bed cases are taken. **Ineligible:** Normal exclusions.
- **RELIGION:** Undenominational, but services are held in the Chapel by C. of E. Chaplain.
- **BEDS:** 30 in one ward on the ground floor. A part of this ward can be shut off by folding doors to form an isolation room.
- TREATMENT: Physiotherapy. No diets. Post-operative dressings.
- STAFF: Nursing Staff: Matron; 1 Staff Nurse; 3 Probationers; 1 Visiting Masseuse.

 Medical Staff: Dr. D. B. Smallshaw (visiting Surgeon).
- LENGTH OF STAY: No limit.
- **ROUTINE AND RECREATION:** The boys rise at 7.30 a.m. and retire at 6.30 p.m. Half an hour's rest in the afternoon.
 - Visiting Day: Second and fourth Sunday in each month, 2 to 4 p.m.
- CHARGES: £4 4s. 0d. per week. Payable by Local Education Authority for children of school age. Physiotherapy and medical prescriptions extra.
- **RECEIVING DAY:** Any Day.
- **STATION:** Sutton, from Victoria or London Bridge. Patients are not met at the station, but No. 164 bus stops at the Banstead War Memorial near the Home.
- **GENERAL:** Late Victorian buildings with a large garden, stand in open country not far from Epsom Downs.
- APPLICATIONS: to the Matron (for vacancies only). All other correspondence to be addressed to the Secretary.

(Burgh Heath 822)

Patients taken from the London Hospital only. (BIShopsgate 3255).

PATIENTS: Men and women from 12 upwards. Medical and surgical cases. Bed cases.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 51, on ground floor, in wards of 6. Three single rooms. 36 beds are reserved for orthopædic patients.

TREATMENT: Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy given. Gastric and Diabetic diets provided. All dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Sister-in-Charge (S.R.N.).

Nursing Staff: Trained Nurses; Student Nurses; Pre-Training Students.

Medical Staff: Mr. W. Alexander Law (Visiting Surgeon).

Dr. John Ellis (visiting Physician).

Dr. H. S. Atkinson (Medical Officer in Charge).

LENGTH OF STAY: Normal maximum 1 month.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: After early tea at 6 a.m. the patients rise for breakfast at 8 a.m. and retire at 8.30 p.m. Breakfast in bed is provided when desirable. No school.

There is a library as well as facilities for indoor games, and television in the patients' sitting room.

Visiting Day: Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 3 to 4 p.m.; Saturday and Sunday, 2 to 4 p.m.

RECEIVING DAYS: Monday and Thursday (men); Tuesday (women).

STATION: Banstead, from Victoria or London Bridge. Patients are brought from the London Hospital by ambulance.

GENERAL: The Home stands on high ground with an open field in front of it. All beds can be pushed out on to a wide, sunny terrace.

THE PAWLING HOME-HOSPITAL

HADLEY HIGHSTONE, BARNET, HERTS.

(Barnet 0324)

PATIENTS: Girls 3—13, Boys 3—7. General convalescence. Ministry of Education recommend for congenital hearts. Bed cases admitted.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions. Bronchitis.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 20 beds, all of which are on the ground floor. 1 cubicle bed.

TREATMENT: No treatments or diets. Simple dressings, including mastoids.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron (S.R.N.).

Nursing Staff: Sister (S.R.N.); 3 Untrained.

Medical Staff: Dr. J. A. Nunn (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: Minimum 1 month. No limit.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The children rise at 7 a.m. and retire at 7p.m. They are not expected to do any domestic work.

There are facilities for indoor games.

Visiting Day: Saturday or Sunday when children well enough can be taken out by the parents for the whole or the half day.

CHARGES: Payable by Local Education Authority, or by Regional Hospital Board.

RECEIVING DAY: Any day except Sunday.

STATION: High Barnet (Northern Tube) and No. 134 bus to Hadley Highstone. Green Line Nos. 716 and 717 stop close by.

GENERAL: The Hospital was built in 1912, and stands high in open country.

APPLICATIONS: to the Matron.

N.H.S. patients: to the N.W. Metropolitan Regional Hospital Board, 11a, Portland Place, London, W.1.

WINIFRED HOUSE CONVALESCENT HOSPITAL FOR CHILDREN

BARNET GATE, ARKLEY, BARNET, HERTS.

(Barnet 3343)

PATIENTS: Boys aged 2-10. Girls aged 2-12. Long-term patients only. Patients in plaster. Osteomyelitis. Non-Pulmonary T.B. T.B. Meningitis. Pneumonia Asthma. Bed patients (limited number). (Vaccination essential).

Ineligible: Normal exclusions. Hearts.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 40, in wards of 8 to 12 beds. All on ground floor.

TREATMENT: Physiotherapy and Ultra-Violet Rays available. No diets. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron (S.R.N.).

Nursing Staff: 1 Part-time Sister (S.R.N.); 2 Assistant Nurses; 6 Student Nurses.

Medical Staff: Dr. S. C. Pritchard, Dr. L. R. Gardner (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: Minimum 3 months. No limit.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Patients rise at 7 a.m. and retire at 7 p.m. There is a compulsory afternoon rest.

There is a supply of toys and indoor games.

Visiting Day: First and third Sunday every month, 2 to 4 p.m.

RECEIVING DAY: No special day.

STATION: New Barnet, from Kings Cross; or High Barnet (Northern Line). A bus runs from either station to near the Home.

GENERAL: The Home was built in 1936 and stands on very high ground surrounded by fields. There is a large terrace for beds outside the Home.

APPLICATIONS: to the Matron.

CHILDREN'S CONVALESCENT HOME

WHITE BARN, STATION ROAD, BEACONSFIELD, BUCKS.

(Beaconsfield 37)

PATIENTS: Boys and girls 0-5 years. General convalescence. Ambulant plasters.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions. Bed cases. Asthma.

RELIGION: Interdenominational.

BEDS: 30 in open wards, 2 of which are on the ground floor.

TREATMENT: No treatments or diets. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron (S.R.N.).

Nursing Staff: 1 Sister (S.R.N.); 12 Nursery Nurses (including 2 Night Nurses).

Medical Staff: Dr. A. J. Milner (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: 4-12 weeks only.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The children rise at 6.30 a.m. and retire at 5.30 p.m. with an hour's rest in the afternoon.

There is an outdoor sandpit, paddling pool, hardpitch and a playing-field in the grounds. The Home has a good supply of toys.

Visiting Day: Second Sunday in each month, 2 to 4 p.m., after 1 month's stay.

CHARGES: £4 5s. 0d. per week.

RECEIVING DAY: Every other Wednesday.

STATION: Beaconsfield, from Marylebone. Escorts provided.

GENERAL: Well-adapted buildings with modern additions. Extensive grounds.

APPLICATIONS: to the Shaftesbury Society, 32, John Street, London, W.C.1. (CHAncery 6937).

HALDANE HOUSE FOR SICK CHILDREN

21, COODEN DRIVE, BEXHILL-ON-SEA, SUSSEX.

(Bexhill-on-Sea 2662)

PATIENTS: Boys and girls 0-13 years. Medical and surgical (post-hospital condition).

Boys and girls 0-6 years. Tuberculosis (non-infectious).

Ineligible: Epileptics and Blind children. Mental Patients.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 47 (medical and surgical). Wards vary from 3 to 8 beds and/or cots.

TREATMENT: All treatments and diets as necessary, and as prescribed by sending

hospitals. Sanatorium regime for tuberculosis patients. Physiotherapy.

STAFF: Matron: Miss I. M. Stenton, S.R.N., S.C.M., H.K.Cert.

Asst. Matron: Miss N. Heseltine, S.R.N., S.C.M., R.S.C.N.

Nursing Staff: Day Duty—1 Sister (S.R.N.), 2 Staff Nurses (R.S.C.N.), 14

Student Nurses.

Night Duty-1 Sister (R.S.C.N.), 3 Student Nurses.

Medical Staff: Dr. R. K. Reid (visiting).

Dr. R. Dingley (Regional Hospital Board Chest Physician

—visiting).

Dr. L. G. Scott, M.R.C.P., D.C.H. (Consultant Pædiatrician). Miss G. Davies, M.C.S.P. (visiting Physiotherapist).

LENGTH OF STAY: As recommended by hospitals, but extended as may be required by fitness of patient.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Routine is governed by age and condition of patient. A school for children of school age, run by East Sussex Education Committee, is held in a building in the grounds (Lessons are given to bed patients in the wards as befits their state of health). Nursery School for the under-fives. Patients are taken out as often as possible—many types of perambulators and chairs are available. Film shows for the older children. Various types of indoor and outdoor swings, toys, games, etc. Small library. Controlled radio.

Visiting Day: Any day 2-4 p.m. Notice of intended visit is appreciated so that child's routine for day of visit can be adjusted accordingly.

CHARGES: Contract with South-East Metropolitan Regional Hospital Board.

RECEIVING DAY: By arrangement.

STATION: Bexhill Central (Victoria)—No. 8 trolley bus to Richmond Road (1 mile), Bexhill West (Charing Cross)—3 to 4 minutes' walk. Collington Halt (Eastbourne, Lewes and Brighton line)—1 minute's walk. Arrangements can be made for Hospital Car Service to meet patients should their condition make this necessary.

GENERAL: The House is situated at the western end of Bexhill; it has a full southern aspect; and is two minutes from the sea. It has a large garden with ample space for outdoor recreation. All rooms are spacious and light, and all equipment is of an up-to-date type.

APPLICATIONS: N.H.S. tuberculosis patients to the Regional Hospital Board of the area in which the patient resides. All other N.H.S. patients to the Secretary at the Home.

LITTLE FOLKS HOME

LITTLE COMMON, BEXHILL-ON-SEA,

SUSSEX.

(Cooden 284)

This Home is only for patients from Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Children, London (N.E. Metropolitan Region) (SHOreditch 8866)

PATIENTS: Children up to the age of 14. General convalescence. Bed cases. Some long-term cases.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 40. Some on ground floor.

TREATMENT: No treatments. Gastric and coeliac diets provided. All dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron-in-Charge (S.R.N., S.R.C.N.).

Nursing Staff: 2 S.R.N., 7 Student Nurses.

Medical Staff: Dr. R. K. Reid (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: No limit, but as recommended by the hospital.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Normal times of rising and retiring. There is a compulsory rest during the afternoon. No school.

There is a supply of toys and books as well as facilities for indoor and outdoor games.

Visiting: Saturday and Sunday between 1.45 and 3.45 p.m.

RECEIVING DAY: Thursday.

STATION: Cooden Beach, from Victoria. Patients are met either at Cooden Beach or Victoria. A bus service runs from the station to near the Home.

GENERAL: The Home is about a mile from the sea and stands in 8 acres of ground.

METROPOLITAN CONVALESCENT HOME FOR MEN

LITTLE COMMON, NEAR BEXHILL SUSSEX.

(Cooden 5) (Patients—Cooden 782)

PATIENTS: Men 17-65 years. General convalescence. Mild Hearts (including post-cardiac surgery).

Ineligible: Bed cases. Colostomies. Urinary incontinence. Skin diseases. Severe neurasthenia. Severe asthma. Inoperable malignant disease with a poor prognosis.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 82.

TREATMENT: Convalescent gastric diet. Simple dressings. Physiotherapy and active exercises. Lift.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron.

Nursing Staff: 3 S.R.N.

Medical Staff: Dr. R. A. Andrews (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: At discretion of the Medical Officer of the Home.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The patients get up at 7.30 a.m. and go to bed at 8.0-9.30 p.m.

There are facilities for suitable indoor and outdoor games.

Visiting Day: Sunday 2 to 4.30 p.m.

RECEIVING DAY: Thursday.

STATION: Cooden Beach, from Victoria.

GENERAL: The Home stands in an excellent position with view over the sea and nine acres of garden. It is ten minutes' walk from the sea.

APPLICATIONS: to the Secretary, Hospital Management Committee, 11, Holmesdale Gardens, Hastings, Sussex. (Envelopes endorsed "Metropolitan Convalescent Home.")

METROPOLITAN CONVALESCENT HOME FOR WOMEN

OLD TOWN, BEXHILL-ON-SEA,

SUSSEX.

(Bexhill 1131)

(Patients—Bexhill 3076)

PATIENTS: Women 17-65 years. General convalescence. Gynaecological.

Ineligible: Colostomies. Urinary incontinence. Pregnancy after the fourth month. Severe neurasthenia. Severe asthma. Inoperable malignant disease with a poor prognosis. Skin diseases.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 90. Some on ground floor.

TREATMENT: Convalescent gastric diet. Simple dressings. Physiotherapy and active exercises. A small number of beds are available for very early convalescents requiring a few days further rest in bed.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron.

Nursing Staff: 3 S.R.N.

Medical Staff: Dr. R. A. Andrews (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: At discretion of the Medical Officer of the Home.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The patients get up at 7.15 a.m. and go to bed at 8-9 p.m. They are expected to make their own beds if well enough.

There is no lift at this Home.

Visiting Day: Sunday 2 to 4 p.m.

RECEIVING DAYS: Wednesday and Friday. Bed patients admitted on Friday only.

STATION: Bexhill, from Victoria.

GENERAL: The Home stands in an open position in its own grounds. It is ten minutes' walk from the sea.

APPLICATIONS: to the Secretary, Hospital Management Committee, 11, Holmesdale Gardens, Hastings, Sussex. (Envelopes endorsed "Metropolitan Convalescent Home.").

THE DIABETIC CONVALESCENT HOME

FOR WOMEN

"ST. MARY'S,"

BEACH AVENUE,

BIRCHINGTON-ON-SEA.

KENT.

(Thanet 41667)

PATIENTS: Diabetic women (including those with complications).

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 50 for women — 8 on ground floor.

TREATMENT: Special training in diabetic diet and injection. Diabetic diets of all types are provided, including variations, e.g. diabetic gastrics. All dressings—subject to acceptance by Matron. Massage, sunlight and remedial exercises.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron.

Nursing Staff: 5 S.R.N.; 3 S.E.A.N.; 7 Nursing Auxiliaries.

Medical Staff: Dr. T. S. Stone (visiting).

A diabetic specialist is available.

LENGTH OF STAY: Normally 3 weeks—subject to medical necessity.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The patients get up at 7.30 a.m. and go to bed at 9 p.m. Those who are able are asked to make their own beds, and after the first week to help with the washing up once a week. So far as treatments permit, patients are allowed out daily until 6.45 p.m. during the summer months and until 4 p.m. during the winter months.

There is an indoor games room as well as ample sitting room accommodation.

Visiting Day: By arrangement.

RECEIVING DAY: Patients are admitted on Tuesday and discharged on Monday.

STATION: Birchington, from Victoria or Cannon Street. Patients are met by arrangement at the station, which is only 2 minutes from the Home.

GENERAL: The Home was originally built as a Convalescent Home in 1888, and has been kept modernised.

APPLICATIONS: to the Matron at the Home.

EDITH PRIDAY HOME (BRITISH RED CROSS SOCIETY)

23, ST. JOHN'S PARK, S.E.3.

(Greenwich 0039)

PATIENTS: Men and women over 60, mainly those living in the County of London.

Ineligible: Incontinent cases. Those requiring night nursing.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 24, in wards of 6-4. 1 ground floor ward of 6 beds (women).

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
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
