

INTRODUCTION

As was foreshadowed in the 1984 edition, each institution included in this book has been visited by representatives of the Fund within two years previous to publication.

The Fund has recently defined more sharply the facilities that in these days it would hope to find in homes providing convalescence, rehabilitation and other short term care for those physically incapacitated. Homes without wheelchair access, that exclude all but the relatively untroublesome conditions and provide few if any rehabilitation facilities and skills, will no doubt continue to meet some needs. But the more multi-purpose that residential care can become, the more valuable it is likely to prove, especially if it includes patients for whom there is at present inadequate provision. At its best this will imply some specialist rehabilitation services – physiotherapy and occupational therapy certainly, speech therapy as required, with access to hydrotherapy a distinct bonus. It will mean good day and night nursing care as well as readily available medical attention. It will require staff who are aware of the psychological as well as medical need for continuity, in both type and intensity of treatment, on admission and on discharge. These are the resources and facilities we hope to find available for rehabilitation and which will therefore, increasingly, be reflected in the entries admitted to the Directory.

It may be that later issues of the Directory will record a similar sharpening of focus in other fields, but at present not all institutions fall within the area that has so far been examined in this greater detail. That does not mean that they have been excluded from consideration. Provided it has been visited within the qualifying period and has made a good impression, the institution will have been included.

THE BELL MEMORIAL HOME

Southern Convalescent Homes Inc South Street, Lancing, Sussex (Lancing (0903) 752 020)

PATIENTS

Adult patients. Married couples in double rooms. General convalescence. Mild asthmas. Subject to the absolute discretion of the Superintendent and Senior Matron a few emotionally disturbed patients can sometimes be accepted. Such patients must have already received treatment for their condition and be in the convalescent stage. Subject to the same discretion a limited number of patients with controlled ostomies or those with mild and controlled epilepsy can be accepted. Patients must be able to wash and dress themselves. The Home is unable to cater for bed cases.

RELIGION

Undenominational

REDS

25 single rooms and 11 double rooms.

TREATMENTS AND FACILITIES

If required, rehabilitative treatments can occasionally be arranged at a local hospital if booked well in advance by the sending hospital. Wheelchair cases can occasionally be taken if able to manage for themselves. Dry dressings carried out. No special diets. Lift.

Nursing Staff: Matron and Assistants (untrained)

Medical Staff: Dr M Berkley (visiting)

LENGTH OF STAY

Usually 2 or 3 weeks, but longer if required.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION

The patients rise at 8.15 am and retire at 10 pm. Patients are expected to make their own beds. Impromptu concerts are organised from time to time.

Visiting: any day.

CHARGES

Large double front rooms £65 per person per week Small double back rooms £58 per person per week Single rooms £60 per person per week.
