

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
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PREFACE

The first edition of the Directory was published in the Autumn of 1948. Reports of its usefulness received from Almoners and Health Workers encouraged the Convalescent Homes Committee of King Edward's Hospital Fund to make it an annual publication. The general arrangement followed in last year's edition has been left largely undisturbed but some additional homes have been added and all information has been brought up to date.

The decision whether to include a particular Home or not lies entirely at the discretion of the Committee. It is, accordingly, of interest that of the Homes operating outside the National Health Service nearly all are visited by one or more members of the Committee prior to their acceptance for the Directory, and subsequently every year. Only Homes which are prepared to admit patients residing in the London area are recorded. For convenience of reference, Homes which lie outside the borders of the four Metropolitan Hospital Regions have been placed together in Part II; these have only in rare cases been visited by members of the Committee. Wherever they may be situated, all the Homes in the Directory are for patients for whom convalescence or a recuperative holiday has been recommended by a doctor. None are commercially managed for profit.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Directory concerns itself only with Homes which are prepared to take patients from London. Part I contains those within the four Metropolitan Regions, arranged within their Regions in alphabetical order. Part II provides the same details about Homes outside the Metropolitan Regions. No claim is made that the Directory is comprehensive—indeed, as explained in the Preface, it is to some degree selective.

The Hospital Region in which each Home is situated is indicated at the top left-hand corner of each page. At the top right-hand corner appear the words: NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE, CONTRACTUAL ARRANGEMENTS, SPECIAL SCHOOL, or INDEPENDENT. Patients at the first two will normally be a charge to the Regional Board: those at Special Schools are maintained by the Ministry of Education: Independent Homes are frequently approved by the Local Health Authorities for use under the Recuperative Holidays Scheme.

It should be emphasised that Contractual Homes and Special Schools are, with a few exceptions, independent in all respects, save that maintenance charges are paid by the appropriate Authority.

INDEX I is an alphabetical list of all Homes.

INDEX II is a classified index designed to facilitate the finding of a suitable Home for any of the normal categories of patient. For example, a Home may be required for a man needing a gastric diet. Under "gastric" will be found the page numbers of all Homes providing gastric diets. Those which cater for men will appear in the appropriate column. If necessary, the process can be carried a step further. Should it be desirable that this man should go to a Home in Sussex, the enquirer should look up "Sussex" and see if any of the Homes listed in the "men" column are the same as those catering for men requiring gastric diets.

NORMAL EXCLUSIONS.—Although the types of cases not admissible vary to a certain degree as between Homes, it can normally be taken that Pulmonary Tuberculosis, Pregnancy (after the fifth month), Mental Cases, Epilepsy, Incurable, Infectious and Contagious Diseases and usually Skin Disease, Open Sores and Wounds are not accepted. In trying to decide whether a patient is eligible or not for any given Home, a study of the information given under TREATMENT and STAFF will give a good idea as to the type of work undertaken.

THE DOMINICAN CONVALESCENT HOME

CHURCH STREET, KELVEDON, NEAR COLCHESTER.

ESSEX.

(Kelvedon 59)

Sisters of the Order of St. Dominic.

PATIENTS: Women over 16. General convalescence and rest.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions. Aged and infirm. Bed cases.

RELIGION: Roman Catholic. (Patients of other denominations taken.)

BEDS: 14, of which 3 are in private rooms; the remaining 11 being in cubicles. Some ground floor rooms.

TREATMENT: No treatments. Gastric and diabetic diets provided. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Mother Prioress.

Nursing Staff: 1 S.R.N. 2 Assistant Nurses.

Medical Staff: Dr. Mackenzie, Dr. Clark (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: One month, extended in special cases.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Breakfast at 8.45 a.m. and lights are put out at 10 p.m. They are expected to make their own beds and keep their rooms tidy.

Visiting Day: Any day.

CHARGES: Cubicles, £3 3s. 0d. per week. Private rooms, £3 12s. 6d. and £4 4s. 0d. per week.

RECEIVING DAY: Any day.

STATION: Kelvedon from Liverpool Street. Patients are met at the station by arrangement.

GENERAL: The building, which is somewhat old-fashioned, stands in pleasant country surroundings and has a good garden. The sea is within easy distance.

APPLICATIONS: to the Mother Prioress at the Home.

N.H.S. patients: to the N.E. Metropolitan Regional Hospital Board, 11A, Portland Place, London, W.1 (MUSeum 3380).

EDEN COTTAGE HOSPITAL

HATFIELD BROAD OAK, NEAR BISHOP'S STORTFORD,

HERTS.

(Hatfield Broad Oak 252)

PATIENTS: Women and girls over 15. General convalescence. Post-operative and medical cases.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions, diabetics and tuberculosis cases. Bed cases and those requiring extensive nursing supervision.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 7, 2-3 beds in general wards.

TREATMENT: No treatments or diets. Surgical dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Sister-in-Charge (S.R.N.).

Nursing Staff: None.

Medical Staff: Dr. J. S. H. Wilson (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: 2-3 weeks.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Patients get up between 8.15 and 8.30 a.m. Lights out 9 p.m. Breakfast in bed is provided if necessary. No domestic work is expected of the patients. No school.

There is a wireless in every room, television and plenty of books.

Visiting Day: Any day by arrangement.

RECEIVING DAY: Any day by arrangement.

STATION: Bishop's Stortford, from Liverpool Street. Patients are met by Hospital car service by arrangement. Patients can travel by bus from Judd Street Coach Station to Hatfield Broad Oak Post Office, where they are met.

GENERAL: An old-fashioned house in good condition, in rural surroundings. Good garden and verandah.

APPLICATIONS: to the Sister in Charge, Eden Cottage Hospital, Hatfield Broad Oak, nr. Bishop's Stortford, Herts.

ESSEX CONVALESCENT HOME

MAGDALEN GREEN, CLACTON-ON-SEA,

ESSEX.

(Clacton 1171)

PATIENTS: Men and women aged 15-65. General convalescence, including gastrics.

Īneligible: Normal exclusions. Bed cases. Hearts. Asthma. Neurasthenia and nervous disorders.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 47, divided equally between men and women. One private room. No beds on ground floor.

TREATMENT: No special treatments. Simple diets and dressings only.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron.

Nursing Staff: 1 S.R.N. 1 Assistant Nurse.

Medical Staff: Dr. Fenn Davy (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: According to medical necessity. Normal 3 weeks.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The patients get up at 8 a.m. Breakfast at 8.30 a.m. Lights out at 10 p.m. No domestic work is expected from the patients.

There are facilities for indoor and outdoor games, e.g. billiards, etc.

Visiting Day: Any day 2 to 4 p.m.

CHARGES: £2 5s. 0d. per week. Private room, £3 3s. 0d. per week. With a subscriber's letter the charge is £1 10s. 0d. per week for 3 weeks.

RECEIVING DAY: Monday and Saturday.

STATION: Clacton, from Liverpool Street. The Home is 5 minutes from the station by taxi. All coaches stop at the Home gates.

GENERAL: Built in 1883 half a mile from the shore, the Home was re-opened in 1946 after re-decoration. There is a large garden, and the comfort of the patients has been carefully considered.

APPLICATIONS: to the Matron.

MAITLAND HOUSE

OLD ROAD, FRINTON-ON-SEA.

ESSEX.

(Frinton 657)

PATIENTS: Convalescent Guest House for Nurses and other workers (female) who have a T.B. background and are requiring a rest-break for rehabilitation.

Ineligible: Positive Sputum cases. Those requiring nursing.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 12, mostly in shared rooms.

TREATMENT: No treatments or diets. A.P. refills can be arranged with the Regional Hospital Board's Chest Physician, Colchester. No dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Warden. Assistant Warden.

Nursing Staff: None.

Medical Staff: Dr. F. G. Sladen (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: Up to one month in the first instance.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The aim of the Trustees is to provide a restbreak and post-convalescent service coupled with the atmosphere of home. There are, therefore, few restrictions or routine arrangements. Guests are asked to make their beds and help clear up after meals.

Visiting Day: No restrictions.

CHARGES: £4 4s. 0d. per week.

RECEIVING DAY: Any day.

STATION: Frinton-on-Sea, from Liverpool Street. The Home is 15 minutes' walk from the station. Taxis by arrangement.

GENERAL: The house is a modern building adjacent to sea front, shops and places of worship. Small, pleasant garden.

APPLICATIONS: to Dr. Esther Carling, 25, Russell Road, Moor Park, Northwood, Middlesex.

N.H.S. patients: to the N.E. Metropolitan Regional Hospital Board, 11A, Portland Place, London, W.1 (MUSeum 3380).

MIDDLESEX BRANCH HOSPITAL AND HULKE ENDOWED CONVALESCENT HOME

CLACTON-ON-SEA,

ESSEX.

(Clacton-on-Sea 877)

The Home is primarily intended for patients from the Middlesex Hospital. Others are admitted when vacancies permit.

PATIENTS: Men and women to age 65. Boys 0-10. Girls 0-12. General convalescence.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions; Chest cases in winter or early spring.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 60 (19 for men, 29 for women, 4 for mothers and babies, 8 for children). 12 beds on the ground floor.

TREATMENT: Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy. Diets and simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron (S.R.N., S.C.M.).

Nursing Staff: 1 Sister (S.R.N., S.C.M.); 4 Staff Nurses; 10 pre-nursing Students.

Medical Staff: Dr. H. P. Clark visits twice weekly when required.

LENGTH OF STAY: Usually 3 or 4 weeks. No fixed limit.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Breakfast at 8.30 a.m. is served in bed if necessary. Patients are expected to rest after lunch. No domestic work is required of the patients. No school.

There is a library and wireless and a supply of indoor games.

Visiting Day: Any day 2 to 4 p.m., by arrangement with Matron.

RECEIVING DAY: Thursday. (See arrangements under STATION.)

STATION: Clacton-on-Sea, from Liverpool Street. Patients normally travel by bus from the Middlesex Hospital, meeting there at 9 a.m. On return, the bus reaches the Hospital about 5.15 p.m.

GENERAL: The Home is situated about 5 minutes from the beach and has a large garden.

APPLICATIONS: to the Resident Medical Officer, Middlesex Hospital, London, W.1 (MUSeum 8333).

OGILVIE SCHOOL OF RECOVERY

HOLLAND ROAD, CLACTON-ON-SEA,

ESSEX.

(Clacton 57)

PATIENTS: Girls aged 6-10. Boys aged 6-9. School of recovery for delicate children. (Immunisation usually required.)

Ineligible: Bed cases; normal exclusions.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 90, divided equally between boys and girls, in wards containing 9-12 beds. There are no ground floor bedrooms.

TREATMENT: No treatments or diets. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Lady Superintendent (R.S.C.N.).

Nursing Staff: 2 S.R.N.; 6 Assistant Nurses.

Medical Staff: Dr. A. Fenn Davy (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: Normally 3-6 months.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Children are called at 7 a.m. and go to bed at 7 p.m. There is a compulsory rest during the day.

There are large grounds, with a playground and games fields.

Visiting Day: FIRST Saturday in the month, from 2 p.m.

CHARGES: Payable by Local Education Authority.

RECEIVING DAY: By arrangement.

STATION: Clacton, from Liverpool Street. Children are met at the station and travel by car to the Home.

GENERAL: The School is a fine modern building in good condition, near the sea, with verandahs opening out of dormitories.

APPLICATIONS: to the Manager, Ogilvie Trust, 48, Broadway, London, S.W.1.

N.E. METROPOLITAN REGION COLCHESTER MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

RECKITT CONVALESCENT HOME

CLACTON-ON-SEA,

ESSEX.

(Clacton 1345)

PATIENTS: Men, women and children aged 5-70. General convalescence. Short-term medical and surgical cases. Priority for patients from the Royal Northern Hospital.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions. Bed cases.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 34.

TREATMENT: No treatments. Gastric diets. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron (S.R.N.).

Nursing Staff: 1 S.R.N.; 2 Children's Helps.

Medical Staff: Dr. D. G. Bown (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: 3 weeks, sometimes extended.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The patients are called about 7.30 a.m. for breakfast at 8.30 and go to bed about 9.30 p.m. They make their own beds, if fit to do so. No school.

There is a supply of books and facilities for indoor and outdoor games. Parties and outdoor excursions are sometimes arranged.

Visiting Day: Any day.

RECEIVING DAY: Thursday.

STATION: Clacton, from Liverpool Street. Taxis are available at the station.

GENERAL: The Home is a modern building standing in 4 acres of its own ground with direct access to the seashore.

APPLICATIONS: to the Matron.

ST. JOHN'S OPEN AIR SCHOOL

CHIGWELL CONVENT, WOODFORD BRIDGE,

ESSEX.

(BUCkhurst 1624)

Parent Society: The Sisters of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

PATIENTS: Boys aged 5-12½. General convalescence. Hearts, chests, malnutrition. Bed cases. Long term. Asthma.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions; congenital hearts; post-operative cases.

RELIGION: Roman Catholic. (All denominations accepted.)

BEDS: 124 in wards containing from 6 to 20 beds. Some on ground floor. Self-contained isolation ward, 9 beds.

TREATMENT: No treatments or diets. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Sister-in-Charge (S.R.N.).

Nursing Staff: 2 S.R.N.

Medical Staff: Dr. K. Perry (Consultant); Dr. A. Norman (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: No limit.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: The boys get up at 7.30 a.m. and go to bed between 6.30 and 7.30 p.m. according to age and health. There is a compulsory rest in the afternoon and outdoor gardening forms part of the school's curriculum. Parents of non-Roman Catholic children are asked for permission if their children wish to attend Roman Catholic Services.

The Home has a library and there are plenty of facilities for indoor and outdoor games.

Visiting Day: SECOND Sunday in the month, 2 to 4 p.m. (Special consideration for parents as needed, especially for those who live far away.)

CHARGES: Payable by Local Education Authority.

RECEIVING DAY: No special day.

STATION: South Woodford (Central Line). Then No. 10 bus, Abridge or Woodford Bridge. Patients are met at South Woodford Station by request.

GENERAL: An old Manor House, with the boys' block added in 1916, standing in its own grounds near Epping Forest.

APPLICATIONS: to the Sister-in-Charge of the Home.

ST. MICHAEL'S CONVALESCENT HOME

MARINE PARADE EAST, CLACTON-ON-SEA,

ESSEX.

(Clacton 88)

Owners: Westminster Sisters of Mercy, 11, Harewood Avenue, N.W.1.

PATIENTS: Girls aged 4-11. (In children's wards.) Women of any age. General convalescence.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions. Bed cases. Nerve cases.

RELIGION: Roman Catholic. (Other denominations taken.)

BEDS: 40 children in wards; 50 adults in single or double rooms; 15 in wards (cubicled).

TREATMENT: Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy. Gastric, diabetic and vegetarian diets. All dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Matron (S.R.N.), cookery diploma.

Nursing Staff: Assistant Matron (M.C.S.P.); Religious Sisters; Assistant Nurses.

Medical Staff: Dr. Arnold Moore (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: As necessary.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Breakfast in bed is provided when necessary. There is compulsory afternoon rest for all children. Adults are not allowed to mix with the children. If able, patients are asked to help dust and tidy their rooms. No other domestic work is expected of them. No school. There is a library for the adults and a playground and playroom for the

children. The beach is only a few yards away. There is a chapel in the Convent grounds, but attendance is not compulsory. Wireless in sitting-rooms and play-rooms. Smoking lounge.

Visiting Day: By arrangement with Matron.

CHARGES: Children, £1 15s. 0d. per week. Adults, from £4 4s. 0d. to £10 10s. 0d. per week, in rooms. Three guineas in wards.

RECEIVING DAY: Children on Tuesday. Adults p.m. by arrangement.

STATION: Clacton-on-Sea, from Liverpool Street. Children are met at Clacton station.

GENERAL: The Home stands on the front and faces south. There is a large vegetable garden.

APPLICATIONS: to the Matron.

SAMUEL LEWIS SEASIDE CONVALESCENT HOME

NAZE PARK ROAD, WALTON-ON-NAZE,

ESSEX.

(Walton-on-Naze 127)

PATIENTS: Jewish men and women aged 16-70. General convalescence.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions; bed cases.

RELIGION: Jewish.

BEDS: 80, in wards of 1-12 beds. Some ground floor rooms. Isolation ward provided.

TREATMENT: No treatments. Simple gastric diets. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officers: Matron and Warden.

Nursing Staff: Sister; Nurses.

Medical Staff: Dr. F. J. Sladen (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: 2-4 weeks.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Indoor games are provided.

Visiting Day: By arrangement with the Matron.

CHARGES: Through Divisional Medical Officers. £3 10s. 0d. per week.

RECEIVING DAY: Women on Tuesday. Men on Thursday.

STATION: Walton-on-Naze, from Liverpool Street. Patients are conveyed from London by coach.

GENERAL: The Home was built about 40 years ago (modernised 1949-50), and faces the sea.

APPLICATIONS: to the Jewish Board of Guardians, Health/Convalescence Department, 127, Middlesex Street, London, E.1 (BIShopsgate 1602).

ALL SAINTS CONVALESCENT HOSPITAL

EASTBOURNE,

SUSSEX.

(Eastbourne 6)

Parent Society: Community of All Saints Sisters, London Colney, near St. Albans, Herts.

PATIENTS: Men and women from 14-70. General convalescence, including non-pulmonary T.B. Ambulant plasters. Suitable Colostomy cases.

Ineligible: Normal exclusions; helpless patients; bed cases; those seeking readmission within 12 months.

RELIGION: Church of England. (All denominations accepted.)

BEDS: 191, of which 72 are for men, 95 for women and 24 for visitors and private patients. There are beds on the ground floor. Electric lift to all floors.

TREATMENT: No treatments. Mild diabetic and gastric diets. Surgical dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Sister Superior.

Nursing Staff: 4 S.R.N.; 4 Assistant Nurses; 1 Male Orderly.

Medical Staff: Dr. E. Wilson Hall (visiting).

LENGTH OF STAY: Usually 3 weeks. Maximum 6 months, except in special cases.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Patients get up at 7.45 a.m., the women retire at 8 p.m., and the men at 9.30 p.m. Patients make their beds when able to do so. Women are expected to help with washing up.

There is a Red Cross Library. Whist drives and various social entertainments are arranged.

Visiting Day: Any day.

CHARGES: Wards, £3 18s. 0d. per week. Private rooms on ground floor, £4 14s. 6d. per week. Subscribers' letters are worth 12s. per week.

RECEIVING DAY: Women, Mondays and Thursdays. Men, Tuesdays and Fridays.

STATION: Eastbourne, from Victoria. Patients are met at Eastbourne station, when arriving at the stipulated time.

GENERAL: The Hospital is a large, well-kept building erected in 1869. It stands in ample grounds on the seafront, at the foot of Beachy Head.

APPLICATIONS: to the Sister Superior at the Hospital.

S.E. METROPOLITAN REGION SEAMEN'S HOSPITAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

ANGAS CONVALESCENT HOME FOR SEAMEN

(SEAMEN'S HOSPITALS GROUP)

CUDHAM,

KENT.

(Biggin Hill 3)

PATIENTS: Members of Merchant Navy. Preference given to patients from the Seamen's Hospitals Group.

Ineligible: Cases requiring active nursing.

RELIGION: Undenominational.

BEDS: 36. Special accommodation for Officers.

TREATMENT: Treatments and diets as ordered. Diversional Therapy is provided. Simple dressings.

STAFF: Chief Resident Officer: Sister-in-Charge (S.R.N.).

Nursing Staff: 3 S.R.N.; 2 Enrolled Assistant Nurses; 2 Student Nurses.

Medical Staff: Visiting Doctor from "Dreadnought" Hospital.

LENGTH OF STAY: As required. Normally 3 weeks.

ROUTINE AND RECREATION: Patients rise at 7 a.m. and retire at 9 p.m. A certain amount of diversional therapy, e.g. soft toys, rug-making, etc., can be voluntarily undertaken by patients and any help in the house or garden will be welcomed, but is not obligatory.

All forms of indoor and outdoor recreation.

Visiting Day: Daily.

RECEIVING DAY: Wednesday.

STATION: Orpington, from Charing Cross or Victoria. Bus half-hourly from station.

GENERAL: Own garden produce.
