

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1912.

The total receipts for the year 1912 were £179,378 17s. 7d. This sum was made up as follows: Donations, £7,450 16s. 8d.; Contributions to Capital, £424 10s. 10d.; Annual Subscriptions, £25,700 19s. 7d.; Contribution of the League of Mercy, £18,000; from the Lewis Estate, £36,886 10s. 3d.; Legacies (other than Legacies to Capital), £11,437 11s. 6d.; Interest from Investments, £79,278 8s. 9d.; together with £200 from the Trustees of the Bawden Fund.

The amount distributed was £157,500, being the same as in 1911, apart from the supplementary distribution of £31,500 made possible in that year by Sir Ernest Cassel's gift. Of this sum the Hospitals received £151,000, while the remaining £6,500 was distributed amongst Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients.

The total sum distributed amongst Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria during the last ten years (after deducting grants to the extent of £7,409 16s. 7d. that have been allowed to lapse) is £1,300,340 3s. 5d.; since the foundation of the Fund a total amount of £1,633,416 8s. 5d. has been distributed.

During the year the amount spent on administration (including the balance of the expenses of the Out-patient Inquiry Committee) was £1 17s. 1d. per cent, of the total amount received. The corresponding percentage for the whole period since the inauguration of the Fund has been £1 6s. 2d.

His Majesty the King, Patron of the Fund, has been graciously pleased to continue his Annual Subscription of £1,000. Her Majesty Queen Mary, Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and many other Members of the Royal Family are liberal supporters of the Fund.

The list of contributions includes Annual Subscriptions of £5,000 from Mr. Walter Morrison, £3,000 from the Drapers' Company, £1,000 from Mr. William Waldorf Astor, and £1,000 from the Merchant Taylors' Company; besides a donation of £1,000 from the Goldsmiths' Company and an anonymous donation of £1,000.

The legacies received during the year included £3,000 allocated to the Fund by the Executors of the late Miss Emma Brandreth, £2,199 15s. on account of the residue of the estate of the late Mr. George Henry Swonnell, £2,000 allocated by the Executors of the late Mr. Hugh Alexander Laird, and £1,799 12s. 6d. on account of the residue of the estate of the late Mr. George Low.

The total amount received in donations and subscriptions as compared with 1911 showed, excluding contributions to capital and the special donation of £31,500 from Sir Ernest Cassel, a decrease of £8,221. It should be remembered, however, that the receipts for 1911 included an anonymous donation of £10,000. Legacies showed a decrease of £37,139 5s. as compared with 1911, or of £38,838 15s. 6d. as compared with the average of the five years 1907 to 1911.

In view of the falling off of legacies to a point so far below the average, the maintenance of a distribution of £157,500 was only rendered possible by drawing upon reserves resulting from the receipt in recent years of exceptionally large legacies. The Council would emphasise the fact that the income from investments represents only about one-half the amount of the annual awards, and that for the maintenance of the present rate of distribution the Fund is dependent upon contributions received during the year.

The League of Mercy has this year contributed £18,000, being an increase of £1,000 over the sum contributed in 1911. During the thirteen years of its existence the League has furnished in all £188,000 to the Fund, making, with the sums distributed by the League direct to institutions outside the area of the Fund's distribution a total contributed to Hospitals of £200,000. The Council desire to express their appreciation of the efforts of the voluntary workers who have so materially assisted the Fund and the Hospitals by the collection of this large sum.

Every eligible Hospital and Consumption Sanatorium which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon by the Fund's Visitors, consisting as heretofore of one medical man and one layman in each case.

The scheme of the Convalescent Homes Committee for securing beds at Consumption Sanatoria and placing them at the disposal of London Hospitals for the accommodation of patients urgently needing country treatment, has again been extended, the number of beds secured for the coming year amounting to 39 at five Sanatoria as against 37 at four Sanatoria last year.

The annual Statistical Report on the expenditure of London Hospitals now deals with 107 institutions, and forms as nearly as possible a complete analysis of the expenditure of all the Metropolitan Hospitals which have adopted the Revised Uniform System of Accounts. The reductions in cost recorded in the successive issues of these reports since the comparative figures were first prepared in 1904 now amount, in spite of the rise in prices and the continual introduction of new methods of treatment, to a total of no less than £37,400 a year.

Lord Mersey and the Bishop of Stepney, who with the late Lord Northcote formed the special Committee appointed to inquire into the methods prevailing in the London Voluntary Hospitals with regard to the admission of Out-patients, issued their report in July last. On the principal questions involved the substance of their findings was that the out-patient departments were not abused to any considerable extent, but were in some degree misused by overlapping with other forms of medical assistance, in particular by the treatment for minor ailments of patients able to

pay small fees to general practitioners, of patients able to make provision by means of Provident Agencies, and of patients unable to benefit through lack of non-medical forms of assistance which only the Poor Law could supply. They also found that the medical assistance provided was to some extent prejudiced by the want of co-ordination with other forms of charitable help, or lack of touch with the home conditions or previous history of the patients. For the remedy of these and other defects the principal recommendation of the Committee was the extension of the system of specially trained inquiry officers known as "Almoners," which is already in operation at many hospitals.

The Council commended this report to the careful consideration of the Hospitals, and asked for information as to the probable cost of carrying out the recommendations. In view of the prevailing uncertainty as to the effect of the National Insurance Act upon the working of the out-patient departments and upon the finance of the Hospitals the Council had not by the end of the year considered it expedient to take any further step at the moment.

The Council desire to record their regret at the loss sustained by the lamented illness and death of Lord Northcote, which deprived the Special Committee of his valuable services during the later part of this inquiry. They desire to express to Lord Mersey and the Bishop of Stepney the thanks of the Fund for the great service they have rendered in undertaking the arduous work of the inquiry and in presenting so exhaustive and valuable a report.

The Distribution Committee have carefully considered all schemes for the extension or reconstruction of hospitals which have been submitted in accordance with the request of the Council. The Fund has thus used its best endeavours to assist the Hospital Authorities in ensuring that when capital expenditure of this kind is undertaken, adequate consideration is given to economy, efficiency, and the prospect of funds for future maintenance; and has particularly considered the relation of each scheme to the general question of hospital accommodation in London.

The General Council regret to record the loss by death, during the year, of His Grace the Duke of Fife, who was for 12 years a Member of the Council and presided over its meetings on several occasions. The Fund has also been deprived by death of the valuable services of the Rev. T. Bowman Stephenson, the Rt. Hon. Sir Joseph Dimsdale, and Sir Julius Wernher. Dr. Bowman Stephenson and Sir Julius Wernher had been Members since the foundation of the Fund in 1897.

The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co. to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year.

The Council are under great obligations to the Press for the valuable services they have rendered in the past, and continue to rely upon their kindly co-operation in obtaining for the Fund wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

The meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria, was held on Wednesday, December 18th, 1912, at York House, St. James's Palace, the Speaker of the House of Commons being in the Chair.

Those present were:—The Viscount Iveagh; The Duke of Norfolk; Lord Rothschild; Lord Revelstoke; Lord Farquhar; Lord Stamfordham; The President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (The Rt. Hon. The Lord Mayor); the Chairman of the County Council (Lord Cheylesmore); The President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir Thomas Barlow, Bt.); The Right Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt. (Hon. Secretary); The Right Hon. Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt.; Sir W. S. Church, Bt.; Sir Henry Burdett; Sir Horace Marshall; Sir William J. Collins; Sir Cooper Perry; Sir John Craggs; Mr. J. Danvers Power; Mr. Frederick M. Fry; Dr. Edwin Freshfield; Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon Secretary); Mr William Latham, K.C.; and Mr. Albert G. Sandeman.

The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following:—His Highness The Duke of Teck; The Lord Lieutenant of the County of London (The Marquess of Crewe); The Bishop of London; The Bishop of Southwark; Cardinal Bourne; The Earl of Bessborough; Lord Sandhurs; Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal; Lord Murray of Elibank; The Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. A. C. Cole); The President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir Rickman J. Godlee, Bt.); The Right Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel; The Right Hon. Sydney Buxton, M.P.; The Right Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P.; Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt.; Professor Sir William Osler, Bt.; Sir Everard Hambro; and the Rev. Canon Barnett.

Lord Rothschild (The Hon Treasurer), in reporting that the amount received for general purposes by the Fund to December 16th, after payment of expenses, was £117,338 10s. 3d., said that, for the first time for several years, the total of the accounts was not of the satisfactory character which could be desired. There was a deficit on the year; that deficit would be met out of accumulated surpluses not distributed in previous years. He did not think it would be proper to analyse the reasons why the present year had not been of quite the satisfactory nature that past years had been. This year the legacies had unfortunately been smaller. It was only to be hoped that in years to come the prosperity of this great Fund would not be impaired by future legislation making calls upon the public. It was only right to mention that Messrs. Barings, who held the funds on deposit, had allowed the Fund a most generous rate of interest.

Sir Henry Burdett, in making his annual statement on behalf of the League of Mercy, said that this had been a year of great anxiety, but it had called forth increased effort on the part of the League, and it was a matter of great satisfaction to be able to report that a larger sum had been raised this year than last, and he hoped that the grant to be made to the King's Fund by the League of Mercy would be at least equal to that of 1911. As to the future, the announcement by the Insurance Commissioners that morning would, he thought, help forward the League of Mercy; it meant that the poor, who were their immediate

care, would need their help more than ever before. The members hoped next year to raise a still larger sum and to do an infinitely greater amount of good by being, not the Levite, but the Good Samaritan in reference to the Hospitals.

The actual sum raised by the League this year was £20,000. They had given altogether £182,000 through the King's Fund and contributions to Hospitals in the Home Counties in the past twelve years. If a few friends would send to him as Treasurer of the League before the end of the year a thousand pounds, the League would be in the proud position of having contributed £200,000 in twelve years for the sick poor of this country. If that additional £1,000 were forthcoming within the next few days, it would so inspirit their members that next year their collection would be larger than it had ever been in the history of the League.

Sir WILLIAM CHURCH, Chairman of the Distribution Committee, read the Report of that Committee, and Sir Savile Crossley (Hon. Secretary) presented the Lists of Awards.

Mr. WILLIAM LATHAM, K.C., Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee, read the Report of that Committee, and Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

The Speaker of the House of Commons, in moving the adoption of the Reports and Awards, said:—My Lords and Gentlemen,—His Highness the Duke of Teck has written to express his regret that he is unable to be present this morning, and on behalf of the Governors I rise, therefore, to move the adoption of the Reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees. Before doing so, however, I have the honour to read to you the following letter which has been addressed to the Governors by Lord Stamfordham, by direction of His Majesty the King, the Patron of the Fund:—

"Buckingham Palace,
"17th December, 1912.

"Dear Sir,—I am commanded by the King to convey to you, and through you to the Council at their meeting on Wednesday, an assurance of His Majesty's continued deep interest in the Fund.

"His Majesty is sorry to see the falling off in the income of the Fund from subscriptions and donations this year, but he is glad that, notwithstanding, it has been found possible to distribute, apart from Sir Ernest Cassel's munificent gift of last year, the same amount as in 1911. For the King would look upon any reduction in the total grants as a calamity, and is sure that this feeling would be shared by all those concerned, directly or indirectly, with the Hospital work of London.

"His Majesty highly appreciates the work of the Members of the Council and the Standing Committees, especially the Honorary Secretaries and Mr. Fry, and also the valuable services rendered by Lord Mersey, the Bishop of Stepney, and the late Lord Northcote in connection with the Report on the Out-patient question.

"His Majesty is gratified to hear of the excellent work of Mr. Maynard and the Permanent Staff.

The most important feature of the reports which are before us is the fact, referred to in His Majesty's gracious letter, that the amount of this year's distribution is the same as that of last year's—omitting, of

course, from the comparison the supplementary grants by which the generosity of Sir Ernest Cassel enabled us to increase last year's awards. This is the first check in the steady rise in the amount distributed that has occurred since 1904. I need hardly say that the reason for the present pause is not to be found in any reduction of the needs of the Hospitals. It is due solely to a falling off during the year in the income of the Fund. The income, which last year amounted to £184,000, is estimated to amount this year to a little over £134,000. It is therefore only by drawing on the surpluses of past fat years that a distribution of £157,500 has been possible in this lean year. But this is a method of making both ends meet which cannot go on, and it would have been imprudent to continue to increase the amount distributed in the face of so disquieting a diminution in the amount received. The diminution itself is shown in three important items in the receipts:—Annual Subscriptions, Donations, and Legacies. In the case of legacies there has been a falling off from £48,500 to £11,000. This, of course, accounts for the greater part of the reduction and it shows how uncertain this source of income is. In the case of donations there is a drop of about £9,000. Last year, as in the year before, we were fortunate enough to receive an anonymous donation of £10,000. These generous gifts helped to justify us in increasing our previous distributions. But obviously, as a source of income, donations cannot be relied on, though our present position shows how extremely valuable a timely gift on this scale may be. Annual subscriptions are in a different category. Now it does seem to me that if the charitable public were to realise the demands upon the Fund and the great influence for good such a Fund can and, we believe, does exercise amongst the Hospitals, the list of annual subscriptions would cease to show the decline which unfortunately it exhibits. The total is raised now and again by the receipt of munificent subscriptions such as those of Mr. Walter Morrison and the late Mrs. Lewis Hill, but apart from these there has been during the past a steady though gradual decline. Of course we do not forget the amounts collected by the League of Mercy. But apart from the limited number of wealthy subscribers such as those I have mentioned, and the givers of small sums, whose valuable efforts the League of Mercy has organised with such devotion, there must be large classes who could give to Hospitals, either directly or through the Fund, but who, for some reason or other, do not. If any of those of whom I am speaking are under the impression that the King's Fund does not need their support—that it can go on growing automatically by means of legacies and income from investments—this year's record should surely dispel that illusion. The income from investments only provides about half of the annual distribution, and, even with all the skill of our Finance Committee, that income cannot be maintained if the falling off of other receipts compels the sale of securities. Donations and legacies are at best uncertain, and to insure, therefore, the maintenance of our distribution, a steady income from annual subscribers is of urgent importance. Let us turn now from our income to our output, using the word in its widest sense to cover not only the grants but the whole work of the year. The distribution, though the same as last year in total amount, shows nevertheless variations in the detail of the separate awards which testify to the minute care devoted by the two distributing committees to the study of the relative claims of the very numerous institutions applying for grants. With regard to the renewed application from St. George's Hospital, I will only say this. We are bound of course by the special trusts attaching to the Fund, including the undertaking given by its Founder, that the whole of it should go towards the relief of the sick poor, and no part towards the support of medical education or research. But while we maintain the second part of this trust to the best of our abilities, we do not forget the first, and we view with the greatest regret any circumstance which removes from our list of grants, even for a time, any institution which does good work amongst the sick poor and is in need of money for that work. We welcome, therefore, the fact that St. George's have been willing to re-open communications with the Fund, and have laid before us information as to their reasons for not accepting the conclusion of this Council upon the facts relating to their last application a year and

a half ago. In July last the Special Committee on the Out-patient question issued their report. I am sure you will be with me when I tender to Lord Mersey and the Bishop of Stepney our best thanks for the very valuable services they have rendered in undertaking this laborious inquiry and in preparing their exhaustive report. Their findings and recommendations have been receiving the careful consideration of our Executive Committee, whose report on the subject will be laid before you this morning. One point that will, I feel sure, not be overlooked, is that the principal recommendations of the Committee are based upon reforms which are already in operation to a greater or less degree in many of the Out-patient departments to-day, and involve, therefore, the extension of tried remedies rather than the introduction of new and revolutionary methods. But even such an extension must be a matter of time and of the careful adjustment of general principles to particular circumstances, and this is especially the case at the present moment when great changes in connection with the treatment of a large proportion of the sick poor are imminent. It is now two years since the Fund's Annual Statistical Report on the expenditure of the London Hospitals reached its present form with the inclusion of all the Hospitals whose accounts are comparable. By the annual publication of these comparative figures the Fund continues to exercise its influence in the direction of economy and to furnish the Hospitals with information which may assist them in their own efforts. It is a remarkable fact that in spite of the continual introduction of more costly methods of medical treatment, and the steady rise in general prices, the Hospitals have achieved, since the first issue of these Reports, savings calculated at no less than £37,000 a year. We have this year to lament the loss by death of three Members of the Council. Dr. Bowman Stephenson and Sir Julius Wernher had both been members since the foundation of the Fund in 1897, while Sir Joseph Dimsdale joined in 1901. We have also lost, in Sir William Allchin, Mr. Clinton Dent, and Mr. Willie James, three Visitors who had all done valuable service for several years. It now remains for me to tender to the Members of the Council, and Members of Committees, and Visitors, and Honorary Officers, the best thanks of the Governors for all the self-sacrificing labours upon which the welfare of the Fund so largely depends. We are particularly indebted, I think, to the Honorary Secretaries, who have had a busy year, and to Mr. Fry, who very kindly continued, in connection with the Out-patient Inquiry, the work which he had begun when himself an Honorary Secretary. I now, therefore, formally beg to move the adoption of the Reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees.

LORD STAMFORDHAM having seconded the motion, the adoption of the Reports was put and carried unanimously.

LORD IVEACH then said: Mr. Speaker, my Lords and Gentlemen,—I beg to move that a vote of humble thanks be tendered to His Majesty for his gracious letter and for his continued interest in the work of the Fund.

The Speaker seconded the Resolution, which was carried by acclamation.

On the motion of the DUKE OF NORFOLK, seconded by Sir EDGAR SPEYER, it was resolved that the cheques for the grants should be posted on December 20th, except in the case of grants for the reservation of beds in Consumption Sanatoria during 1913, which should be posted on January 2nd.

In the absence of the EARL OF BESSBOROUGH (Chairman of the Executive Committee), Sir WILLIAM COLLINS presented the Report of that Committee on the subject of the Report of the Special Committee on the Out-patient System as follows:—

The Executive Committee have had under consideration during the Autumn the Report of the

Special Committee on the Out-patient System of London, which was published and circulated to the Hospitals in July last.

The principal recommendation of the Special Committee is the extension of the modern system of almoners already partially in operation at several hospitals. The Committee's Report describes the work of the almoner, who is an enquiry officer specially trained in the theory and practice both of hospital assistance and of other kinds of charitable or public relief, and whose operations are therefore directed, first, to preventing not only abuse of hospitals, by the method of mere exclusion, but also misuse, by the method of reference to more appropriate medical agencies; and, second, to supplementing the Hospital treatment where necessary by means of the co-operation of non-medical agencies.

The Special Committee recognise that the extension of this system to cover the whole ground would involve considerable additional expense, though they mention various factors which might favourably affect this result—notably the probable reduction of the large numbers now attending the Out-patient departments, especially should the extension of reform from within be accompanied by a development of provident agencies outside.

The Executive Committee have taken steps to obtain estimates from the various hospitals of the extra cost involved. It is difficult, however, to form an opinion upon the amount of additional work or expense until more is known as to the probable effect of the National Insurance Act generally, and in particular the effect upon the numbers, and character of the ailments, of the out-patients presenting themselves at the Hospitals. This factor may also have to be taken into account in connection with the other recommendations of the special Committee.

The Executive Committee would propose therefore to defer for the present making any definite recommendations and to report later. In the meantime they would suggest that the Council should commend the Report to the careful consideration of the Hospitals concerned and invite their observations and suggestions.

Sir William Collins, in moving the adoption of this Report, said that it did not ask the Council to adopt any principle or rule at the present time. The Report of Lord Mersey stated that the Out-patient Committee in making their recommendations had not considered the possible effect of the National Insurance Act upon the Out-patient Departments of the London Hospitals, and the Executive Committee were of opinion that it would be premature at the present moment to make any recommendation even in regard to the further extension of the Almoner system until some greater certainty appeared as to the possible future of the voluntary Hospitals as regarded their Out-patient Departments under the new scheme of National Insurance. Those acquainted with the administration of the Hospitals feared that, notwithstanding the elucidating circulars which had been issued by the Insurance Commissioners and the remarks which they had read in that morning's papers, the voluntary system of Hospitals as they had known it in the past would not remain entirely unaffected, at any rate in regard to Out-patients, if not also in regard to In-patients, under any National Insurance scheme; the Committee thought it premature to make any recommendation and merely asked that this Report be received.

The adoption of this Report was seconded by LORD FARQUHAR and carried unanimously.

On the motion of Sir William Collins, seconded by Sir Savile Crossley, a Report of the Executive Committee upon a letter from St. George's Hospital was received.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1913.

The Speaker of the House of Commons then said:—My Lords and Gentlemen,—We now come to the arrangements for 1913, and I have to announce that the Governors intend to appoint the Members of the General Council, Standing Committees, and Honorary Officers, in accordance with the list which I will now ask the Honorary Secretaries to read.

The list having been read by Sir Savile Crossley (Hon. Secretary), The Speaker continued: It now only remains to consider the Delegation Resolutions which, if approved at this meeting, will only need to be passed formally at the meeting held early in January for that purpose. No alterations are proposed in any of these resolutions, except that the various references to the Out-patient Enquiry Committee are no longer necessary, as that Committee is *functus officio*.

On the motion of the President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir Thomas Barlow), seconded by Mr. Sandeman, a resolution was approved delegating powers to the Finance Committee, Distribution Committee, and Convalescent Homes Committee.

On the motion of Sir Cooper Perry, seconded by Mr. Fry, a resolution was approved delegating powers to the Executive Committee.

The LORD MAYOR (Sir David Burnett) proposed a vote of thanks to the Speaker of the House of Commons for presiding. The resolution was seconded by The CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL (Lord Cheylesmore), and carried unanimously.

The Speaker having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings terminated.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London to receive the Accounts and the Report of the General Council for the year 1912, was held at St. James's Palace on Wednesday morning, 23rd April, 1913, at 11.30, the Speaker of the House of Commons being in the Chair.

The Minutes of the last Meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: H.H. Hon. Herbert Samuel, M.P.); The President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (The Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor); The Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. Walter Cunliffe); The President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir Thomas Barlow, Bt.); The Right Hon. C. Stuart-Wortley, K.C., M.P.; The Rt. Hon. Sir Ernest Cassel; The Rt. Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt. (Hon. Secretary); The Rt. Hon. Sydney

In the absence of Lord Rothschild (The Hon. Treasurer) Sir John Craggs presented the Account of Receipts and Expenditure and the Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December, 1912.

The SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS formally moved the adoption of the Accounts.

The resolution, having been seconded by LORD FARQUHAR, was put and carried unanimously.

Mr. John G. Griffiths (Hon. Secretary) presented the draft Report of the Council for the year 1912.

The Speaker of the House of Commons, in moving the adoption of the Report, said: My Lords and Gentlemen, I have to move the adoption of the Report. It is not usual at this meeting of the Council for the Chairman to make any lengthened observations, and I do not know that they are called for particularly. The Report presents some features of disquiet, and on the other hand it has some very satisfactory features about it. It is a little too early, perhaps, to say what the effect of the Insurance Act may be upon the dispositions of our subscribers, but we trust that, as the novelty of it passes off, they may feel that the demands made upon them are not such as to prevent their continuing to subscribe to our Fund as they did before the Act became an Act. I will not detain you any longer, but I will formally move that the Report be received and adopted.

Sir Horace Marshall seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

In the absence of Sir William Church (Chairman of the Distribution Committee) Sir John Tweedy moved the adoption of a Report of the Distribution Committee upon the application from St. George's Hospital for a grant as follows:

The Distribution Committee have now completed their consideration of the application received from St. George's Hospital in 1912, and beg to report as follows:

- 1. It will be remembered that St. George's last applied in 1910, and that in 1909 the Hospital had paid to its School, on account of specific work done in respect of the treatment of patients, a sum of £1,875,* made up as follows: Salaries £1,075*, Cash payment £550, Rent remitted £250. The departments in respect of which the payment was made included Bacteriological and Pathological Laboratories, Post-Mortems and Museum, and the payment was arrived at by an apportionment of expenses between Hospital and School. As compared with this payment of £1,875,* the charge to the General Account of the Hospital had before 1909 been £1,000, the £250 remission of rent not appearing in the accounts, and the cash payment of £550 having been paid out of a Discretionary Fund available for School purposes.
- 2. The King's Fund came to the conclusion that the payment of £1,875* from the General Fund of the Hospital to the School was excessive, and that, in order that the accounts of the Hospital should be clear from the indirect contribution to medical education involved in an overpayment, the total should be reduced to £1,000, the balance of £875* being repaid by the School. This could readily have been done by charging the £550 and the £250 mentioned above to the Discretionary Fund instead of to the General Fund.
- 3. The Committee of St. George's Hospital, however, did not accept this decision, and they disputed the conclusion of the Distribution Committee on the question of fact. That conclusion had been based on

comparative figures obtained from a number of important Hospitals, which showed that at St. George's the cost per bed to the Hospital of the departments in question exceeded the cost to the Hospital of similar departments at other Hospitals by an amount which, in the opinion of the Fund, could not be justified by the interests of the patients as distinct from those of the School.

- 4. St. George's subsequently themselves obtained figures from several Hospitals, and submitted a Statement to the late Lord Mayor (who was making a similar inquiry as President of the Hospital Sunday Fund), upon which he pronounced the opinion that the cost at St. George's was not excessive and did not represent a larger cost per bed than was the case at many other London Hospitals. When considering the present application for a grant from the King's Fund, the Distribution Committee obtained from St. George's a copy of this Statement. The Committee have made a careful examination of this fresh evidence, and have corresponded both with St. George's and with the other Hospitals upon the subject; and they regret to find that this examination does not enable them to modify their previous recommendation.
- 5. It is clear from their detailed inquiries that the conclusion of the late Lord Mayor was chiefly based on imperfect information as to what work was covered by the figures of the other Hospitals. The payment of £1,800 at St. George's covered Bacteriological and Pathological examinations, Post-Mortems and Museum. But the Statement laid before the Lord Mayor compared figures for St. George's which excluded the cost of Post-Mortems and Museum with figures for other Hospitals which included the cost of Post-Mortems in every case, and of the Museum in the rare instances in which the Museum is not wholly paid for by the School. In the case of St. George's the amount excluded (as given in another part of their Statement) was no less than £750 out of the total paid to the School, and the figure which was brought into comparison with the other Hospitals was thus £1,050 instead of £1,800.
- 6. When all the departments in question are taken into account, and when certain minor corrections are made, it appears that even in the case of the five Hospitals whose figures are used both by St. George's and by the Fund the cost per bed at St. George's still very largely exceeds the cost at the others, while if six other Hospitals whose figures have been used by the Fund are also taken into consideration the cost at St. George's works out at about $2\frac{1}{4}$ times the average. The Distribution Committee do not attach importance to the exact ratio except as evidence that the excess is very large.
- 7. In justification of their expenditure St. George's have argued: first, that the work done in the departments in question differs from that at other Hospitals in quantity and quality; and, second, that skilled investigators are necessary for the efficient treatment of the patients as well as for the purposes of the School, and as the School cannot afford to pay as much as at other Hospitals, the Hospital is compelled to pay a larger share of the cost.
- 8. On the first point the evidence brought forward by St. George's does not convince the Committee that the value of the work done in their Bacteriological and Pathological Laboratories in the sole interests of the patients exceeds that at other Hospitals; and, moreover, even if the argument were proved in regard to these departments it would not justify the heavy expenditure on the Museum which with the Post-Mortems accounts for the greater part of the excess cost.
- 9. The second argument assumes that the School has not sufficient resources from which to meet its due share of the cost, and ignores the existence of the Discretionary Fund which is, at the direct wish of the donors, available to meet the legitimate expenses of the School as distinct from the Hospital. The

amounts so available at St. George's during the past few years have exceeded $\pounds_2,000$ a year, while the amount chargeable to the Discretionary Fund would have been only \pounds_800 .

- To. Under these circumstances it still appears to the Distribution Committee that the existing apportionment between Hospital and School of the cost of the departments in question at St. George's involves a charge to the Hospital very largely in excess of the proportionate cost of similar work at other Hospitals; that the excess is greater than can be justified by the interests of the patients as distinct from those of the School; and that so long as this is the case the accounts of St. George's cannot be held to be clear from any payment in respect of medical education.
- 11. The Distribution Committee therefore regret that they see no reason why the Fund should depart from its previous conclusion, viz. that the apportionment should be revised, and that the charge to the Hospital, which in 1909 amounted (on the amended figures now supplied by St. George's) to £1,800, should be reduced by £800, this excess being repaid by the School.
 - 12. The Distribution Committee would emphasise the facts:
 - (a) That previous to 1909 the accounts of St. George's Hospital showed a total charge to the Hospital of only £1,000;
 - (b) That in the statement submitted by St. George's to the late Lord Mayor the total brought into comparison with the totals at other Hospitals was only $\mathcal{L}_{1,050}$;
 - (c) That the sum arrived at by the Fund as the proper proportion to be charged to the Hospital was and still is $\pm 1,000$; and
 - (d) That the greater part of the excess of £800 is due to expenditure on the Museum which at almost every other Hospital is wholly borne by the School.
 - 13. The Distribution Committee would also point out
 - (i) That the sum of £1,000 leaves a sufficiently wide margin above the average to allow for such differences between one Hospital and another as may be called for in the interests of the patients;
 - (ii) That the Authorities of St. George's have at their disposal a Discretionary Fund sufficient to enable the full amount of the School proportion of the annual expenditure (under the revised apportionment) to be paid for by the School out of moneys earmarked by the donors as available for School purposes;
 - (iii) That it is thus possible for St. George's, without hampering the work either of the Hospital or of the School, to make the required reapportionment, and clear the accounts of the Hospital from any contribution towards medical education; and
 - (iv) That there should be no insuperable obstacle against the acceptance by St. George's of this decision, since the Fund has at no time cast any doubt upon the bona-fides of those whose conclusions on this matter they have reluctantly found themselves unable to accept.

The motion having been seconded by Sir Cooper Perry was put and after discussion carried unanimously.

In the absence of Lord Bessborough (Chairman of the Executive Committee) Sir WILLIAM COLLINS moved the adoption of a Report of that Committee upon a request from St. George's Hospital for an independent inquiry.

Sir WILLIAM COLLINS said that this Report practically repeated the recommendation of the Committee at the last meeting, that they did not consider that the question was one which required the application of exceptional measures of a kind which did not appear to be contemplated by the Act incorporating the Fund.

It meant that the opinion of the Executive stood, viz. that it would be unwise to take this matter from the existing reference to the Distribution Committee, and also that it would be undesirable to set up an exceptional form of arbitration, as this would amount to an abdication of the functions of the Council, which under the statute was the final body to decide upon matters relating to the distribution of the Fund.

The adoption of the Report was seconded by Dr. Freshfield, and carried with one dissentient.

On the motion of Sir William Collins, seconded by Sir Vezey Strong, a resolution was passed on the question of rules and regulations.

On the motion of the Chairman of the County Council (Mr. Cyril Cobb), seconded by the President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir Rickman J. Godlee) a vote of thanks to the Speaker for presiding was carried unanimously.

The Speaker having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings terminated.

Report of the Distribution Committee.

The Governors and General Council having again placed the sum of £151,000 in the hands of the Committee with a view to distribution amongst the London Hospitals, the Committee beg to report as follows:—

- (1) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is 104, as against 105 last year.
- (2) St. George's Hospital, which withdrew its application last year as a result of the decision of the Fund in March 1911 on the question of the amounts paid and allowed by the Hospital to the Medical School in respect of work done for the Hospital, has applied again this year. From the accounts submitted on April 13, 1912, in support of this application it appeared that the payments in question were calculated on a method similar to that adopted on the occasion when the grant was withheld, and the attention of the Hospital was called to this fact a fortnight later. To this communication no reply was received, and down to the time when the annual distribution for 1912 was approaching, no evidence had been addressed to the Fund by the Hospital in support of its method of apportioning laboratory expenditure between Hospital and School, and no information had been offered as to the grounds on which the Hospital did not accept the previous decision of the Fund disapproving of that method. The Committee, however, learned from statements in the Press and in the Annual Report of the Hospital that evidence on these points had been furnished in February to the Lord Mayor on behalf of the Hospital Sunday Fund, and on October 14th, in view of their approaching meetings to consider grants to hospitals, they requested that this evidence might also be furnished to this Fund. It was not until November 20th, however, that this evidence was received. It was at once referred to a Sub-Committee, but the necessity of comparing and verifying a considerable number of items in the various returns of the Hospitals which have supplied information to the Fund and to St. George's Hospital has rendered it impossible for the Sub-Committee to complete their work; and, though an Interim Report indicating the chief points of difference has already been furnished, the Committee are not yet able to report whether or not the fresh evidence affords any ground for modifying their previous conclusion. As a result, therefore, of the lapse of time before this information was received, the Committee are not in a position to make any recommendation upon the application of St. George's for a grant this year.*
- (3) It was decided last year that the grants promised or set aside towards a general amalgamation of the five Throat, Nose and Ear Hospitals should remain at the figure of

£20,500 pending an agreement on a satisfactory scheme or schemes. A scheme submitted by three of the Hospitals is at present under discussion. Except in this case, none of the grants made to special purposes in 1910 remain unapplied, and no question of renewal under the two years' rule arises.

- (4) As in past years several grants appear in the list of awards in aid of schemes of improvement or extension which have been submitted to the Fund in accordance with the Resolution of the General Council to that effect.
- (5) The sum of £5,000 voted towards the removal of King's College Hospital to South London increases the total amount contributed by the Fund to this object to £48,000. The Committee are informed that the new Hospital will probably be opened in the autumn of 1913.
- (6) Some time ago the Fund was approached by the authorities of the British Lying-in Hospital, Endell Street, who desired to discuss the question of the future of the Hospital in view of the changes in the character of its immediate neighbourhood. The Distribution Committee have now learned with satisfaction that the Charity Commissioners are prepared to consider favourably a scheme for an amalgamation between the British Lying-in Hospital and the Home for Mothers and Babies at Woolwich.
- (7) The Reports of the Visitors have again proved to be of the greatest value, and many of their observations have been brought to the notice of the Hospital authorities. The Committee have also communicated in certain cases private remarks arising out of their own examination of the circumstances of particular Hospitals, including in more than one instance a suggestion that greater efforts should be made to obtain support from the general public.
- (8) The Committee have also drawn the attention of the Hospitals concerned to cases where it appears from the Fund's Annual Statistical Report that the excess of cost above the average, in items more or less readily controllable from year to year, calls either for justification or for the exercise of greater economy.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.

Report of the Convalescent Homes Committee.

- (1) The Governors and General Council have this year again placed the sum of £6,500 in the hands of the Committee with a view to distribution amongst Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria.
- (2) The number of applications eligible for consideration amounted to 44 from Convalescent Homes and 10 from Consumption Sanatoria, as against 43 and 7 respectively last year.
- (3) In dealing with applications from Convalescent Homes the Committee have adhered to their original policy of giving special consideration to the Convalescent Homes closely connected with London Hospitals.
- (4) The Committee are glad to report that the scheme for placing beds in Country Consumption Sanatoria at the disposal of patients in London Hospitals continues to prove satisfactory. The amount of accommodation offered has increased considerably. But in view of the sum available for distribution and of the prevailing uncertainty as to the effect of the arrangements for Sanatorium benefit under the National Insurance Act, the Committee did not feel justified in adding materially this year to the number of beds taken by the Fund. For the present, therefore, they have secured 39 beds at five Sanatoria as against 37 beds at four Sanatoria last year. The accommodation is situated as follows:—
 - 2 beds for children at the Maitland Sanatorium, Peppard, Oxon.
 - 7 beds at the Sanatorium of the National Association for the Establishment and Maintenance of Sanatoria for Workers, Benenden, Kent.
 - 8 beds at the Kelling Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.
 - 10 beds at the Devon and Cornwall Sanatorium, South Brent, Devon.
 - 12 beds at the Northampton Sanatorium, Creaton, Northants.
- (5) With regard to the allocation of these beds to Hospitals in London the Committee have followed the same principle as that adopted last year, viz.: that preference should be given (in order of relative size) to the two Consumption Hospitals which have no country branches and that the rest of the beds should be divided between the two largest of the general hospitals which apply to the Fund.

They accordingly recommend the following allocation:

- 18 beds to the City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
- 9 beds to the Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
- 6 beds to the London Hospital.
- 6 beds to Guy's Hospital.
- (6) The Committee desire to express their thanks to the Visitors who inspected the Sanatoria applying for grants, and who thus furnished the Committee with invaluable evidence as to their eligibility.
 - (7) The grants recommended to the various Institutions are appended.
