## P R E F A C E

### REGISTER OF RESEARCH PROJECTS RELATED TO HEALTH CARE NEEDS OF ETHNIC MINORITIES

For some years now the Fund has been involved with a number of projects designed to facilitate the provision of health care needs to those whose native language is not English and who may find the cultural features confusing which are built in to our own medical systems. So many of the features which the foreigner finds strange or indeed offensive, are characteristics which we take for granted, and in recent years a great deal of work has gone into the elucidation of the problems arising from these causes.

The publication in 1979 of "Asian Patients in Hospital at Home" by Alix Henley gave rise to considerable correspondence, and Ms. Henley and her colleague, Colette Taylor, have continued to work full-time in this area. In the course of this, the studies of others in this field have been brought to our attention and in many instances provided valuable help. As a result, we thought it would be a useful contribution to catalogue in an accessible form the titles of studies of which we have knowledge, in the hope that practitioners concerned with these problems could make use of the detailed work that has been done in so many places.

This small register has therefore been compiled and indexed at the King's Fund Centre in the hope that it may fulfil a need. We should be glad to know of any work to which reference has not been made so that the lists may be kept up to date here at the Centre, and we may therefore be in a better position to fulfil our function as a centre for the dissemination of good practices in health care.
