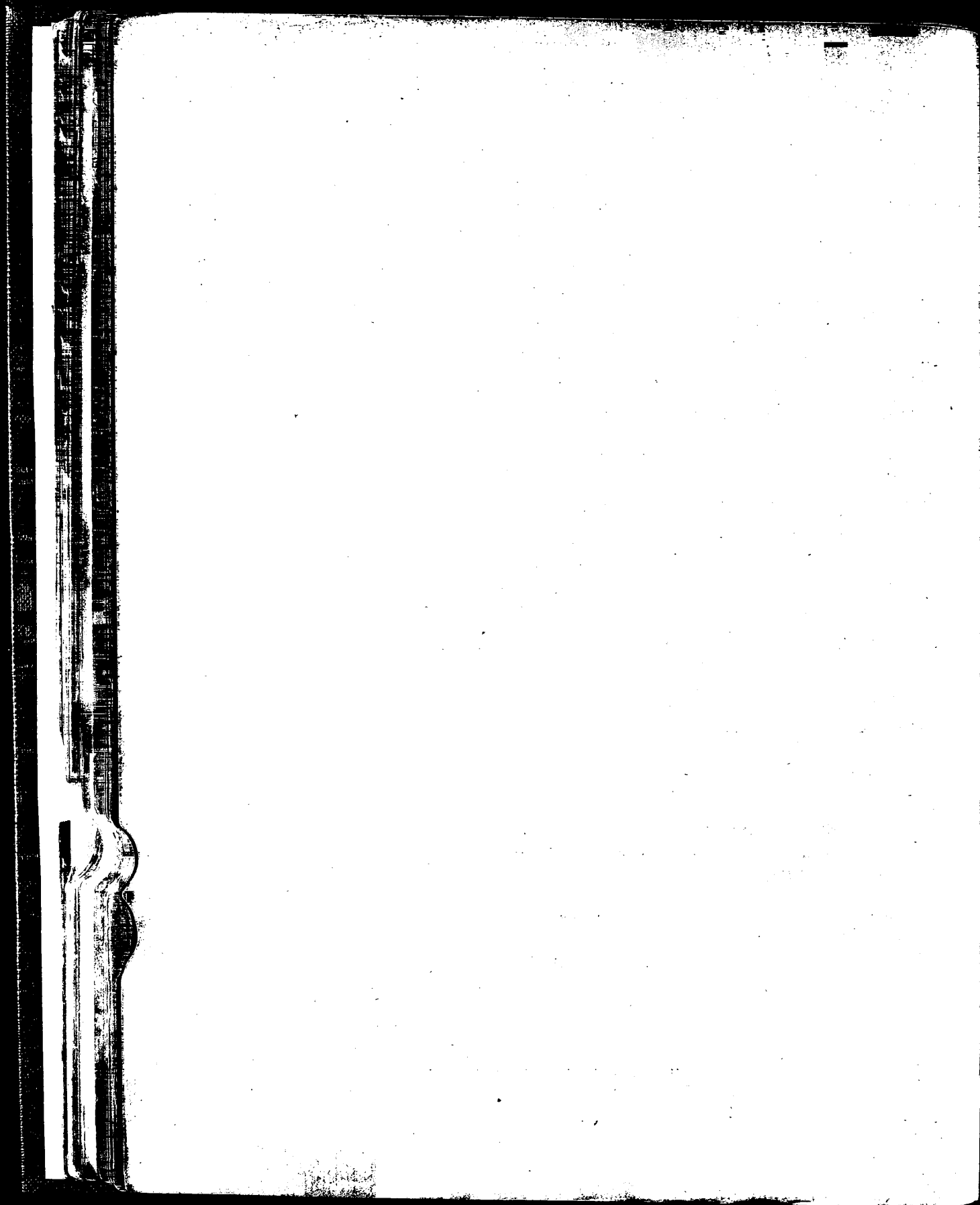

REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1913.

The total receipts for the year 1913 were £187,704 18s. 0d. This sum was made up as follows: Donations, £5,810 0s. 6d.; Contributions to Capital, £2,346 7s. 10d.; Annual Subscriptions, £26,187 17s. 9d.; Contribution of the League of Mercy, £14,000; from the Lewis Estate, £9,092 4s. 3d.; Legacies, £48,022 1s. 3d.; Interest from Investments, including property not yet transferred to the Fund, £82,046 6s. 5d.; together with £200 from the Trustees of the Bawden Fund.

The amount distributed was £157,500, being the same as in 1912. Of this sum the Hospitals received £151,000, while the remaining £6,500 was distributed amongst Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes taking London patients.

The £151,000 allotted to the London Hospitals was directed to be applied as follows:—£109,350 to General Purposes and Maintenance; £6,000 towards the liquidation of debts on maintenance account; £1,500 to an amalgamation scheme; and £34,150 for additions and improvements to hospitals and their equipment. Of the £6,500 given to Consumption Sanatoria and Convalescent Homes, £3,800 was allotted in consideration of the allocation of beds for patients to be sent from certain London Hospitals.

The total sum distributed amongst Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria during the last ten years (after deducting conditional grants to the extent of £7,409 16s. 7d. that have been allowed to lapse) is £1,357,840 3s. 5d.; since the foundation of the Fund a total amount of £1,790,916 8s. 5d. has been distributed.

During this year the amount spent on administration was £1 12s. 5d. per cent. of the total amount received, as compared with £1 17s. 1d. last year. The corresponding percentage for the whole period since the inauguration of the Fund has been £1 6s. 3d.

His Majesty the King, Patron of the Fund, has been graciously pleased to continue his Annual Subscription of £1,000. Her Majesty Queen Mary, Her Majesty Queen Alexandra, His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and many other Members of the Royal Family are also liberal supporters of the Fund.

The list of contributions includes annual subscriptions of £5,000 from Mr. Walter Morrison, £4,000 from the Drapers' Company, £1,000 from Mr. William Waldorf Astor, and £1,000 from the Merchant Taylors' Company; besides three anonymous donations each of £1,000.

The legacies received during the year included £25,000 from the late Sir Julius C. Wernher, Bt., £8,471 6s. 4d. on account of the bequest of the late Lord Lister, £6,000 from the late Mrs. Batchellor, £4,622 19s. 4d. from the late Sir William Dunn, Bt., and £1,000 from the late Mrs. Emma James.

In addition to the legacy of £25,000 from the late Sir Julius Wernher referred to above the Fund received in February of 1914 securities to the value of £269,644 7s. 2d., being a first instalment of his further legacy, left to the capital account of the Fund, of one-twelfth of the residue of his estate. This very important and generous gift is one of the largest ever received by the Fund, and is the more to be appreciated as it has been given by one who during his life assisted in the management of the Fund as a member of the Council.

Besides the legacies already mentioned, a bequest from the late Mr. A. H. Harman consisting of ground rents amounting to £1,382 3s. 0d. per annum was in course of transfer to the Fund at the end of the year.

The total amount received in donations and subscriptions as compared with 1912 showed, excluding contributions to capital, a decrease of £5,154. Legacies, however, showed an increase of £36,584 9s. 9d. as compared with 1912, or of £9,352 14s. 5d. as compared with the average of the five years 1908 to 1912.

The increase of legacies very nearly balanced the exceptional falling off in receipts from this source last year, and thus enabled the Council, in spite of the decrease in donations, not only to maintain its scale of distribution but also to replace the greater part of the amount drawn from reserves to make up the amount distributed in 1912. As only about one-half of the present annual distribution is provided for by the income from investments, the Fund is dependent for the maintenance of its awards upon the contributions received during the year.

The contribution from the League of Mercy this year was £14,000, being a decrease of £4,000 as compared with the sum contributed in 1912. The total amount received from the League of Mercy since its foundation in 1898 now amounts to £202,000, apart from the sums distributed by the League to institutions outside the area of the Fund's distribution. The Council desire to express their appreciation of this very substantial assistance derived from the efforts of a numerous band of voluntary workers.

The annual Statistical Report on the expenditure of London Hospitals during 1912, issued in August, 1913, showed that the cost of working at hospitals had increased since the previous year by about £22,000. The Report points out that in so far as this increase is due to the rise in prices and the continual introduction of more costly methods of diagnosis and treatment it does not nullify the efforts towards economy which produced the previous savings, estimated at £47,000 a year. In order to assist the separate hospitals to ascertain whether their own expenditure was affected by special or avoidable causes as well as by these general and unavoidable causes, additional tables were introduced into the Report comparing the increases and decreases at the various hospitals with the average increase or decrease of each group.

Various questions having arisen as to the application of the rules of the Revised Uniform System of Hospital Accounts dealing with Out-patient Statistics and Cost, a Joint Committee of the King's Fund, the Sunday Fund, and the Saturday Fund, was appointed at a Conference held on the suggestion of the Sunday Fund to consider the subject. The Joint Committee called

into consultation the Committee of Hospital Secretaries which assisted in the preparation of the Revised Uniform System itself, and the three Funds finally issued a memorandum containing additional regulations and suggestions, designed to promote uniformity in the statistics of the various hospitals.

Every eligible hospital and consumption sanatorium which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon by the Fund's Visitors, consisting as heretofore of one medical man and one layman in each case.

The scheme of the Convalescent Homes Committee for securing beds at consumption sanatoria and placing them at the disposal of London hospitals for the accommodation of patients urgently needing country treatment has again been extended, the number of beds secured for the coming year at five sanatoria being 44, as compared with 39 last year.

The Distribution Committee have carefully considered all schemes for the extension of reconstruction of hospitals which have been submitted in accordance with the request of the Council. The Fund has thus used its best endeavours to assist the hospital authorities in ensuring that when capital expenditure is undertaken adequate consideration is given to economy, efficiency, and the prospect of funds for future maintenance; and has particularly considered the relation of each scheme to the general question of hospital accommodation in London.

The General Council desire to express their sense of the loss the Fund has sustained by the death of Lord Strathcona, who was for many years a valued member of the Council, and who, by his munificent donation of £200,000 in 1902, contributed so greatly towards the establishment of the Fund on an assured financial basis. The Council also regret to record the deaths of Canon Barnett and Sir Trevor Lawrence, members of the Council, and of Mr. Alfred Willett, a former medical visitor and member of the Convalescent Homes Committee, and the Hon. Spencer Lyttelton, a visitor for many years. They also regret the retirement, which took effect at the end of the year, of Sir Ernest Cassel, Mr. J. Danvers Power and Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan. Mr. Power's services as Honorary Secretary from 1904 to 1907 give him a special claim to the gratitude of all connected with the Fund.

The Council are indebted to Mr. Fry for having kindly undertaken the duties of Honorary Secretary, as colleague to Mr. Griffiths, during Sir Savile Crossley's absence abroad for part of the summer.

The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co. to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year.

The Council are under great obligations to the Press for the valuable services they have rendered in the past, and continue to rely upon their kindly co-operation in obtaining for the Fund wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

The Meeting of the Governors and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals, Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria was held on Friday, December 12, 1913, at St. James's Palace, His Highness the Duke of Teck being in the chair.

Those present were: The Speaker of the House of Commons (The Rt. Hon. James W. Lowther, M. P.); The Rev. W. L. Watkinson, D.D.; The Chief Rabbi (The Rev. Dr. J. H. Hertz); Lord Rothschild; Lord Stamfordham; The President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (The Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor); The Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. Walter Cunliffe); The President of the Royal College of Physicians (Sir Thomas Barlow, Bt.); The President of the Royal College of Surgeons (Sir Rickman J. Godlee, Bt.); The Rt. Hon. Sir Savile Crossley, Bt. (Hon. Secretary); The Rt. Hon. Sir Vezey Strong; Sir William Church, Bt.; Sir Henry Burdett; Sir Horace Marshall; Sir Cooper Perry; Sir John Craggs; Sir John Tweedy; Mr. Frederick M. Fry; Dr. Edwin Freshfield; Mr. John G. Griffiths, (Hon. Secretary); and Mr. Algernon E. Sydney.

The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: The Viscount Iveagh; The Lord Lieutenant of the County of London (The Marquess of Crewe); The Duke of Norfolk; The Bishop of London; Cardinal Bourne; The Rev. Robert F. Horton, D.D.; The Earl of Bessborough; Lord Sandhurst; Lord Revelstoke; Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal; Lord Farquhar; The Postmaster-General (The Rt. Hon. Herbert Samuel, M.P.); The Rt. Hon. Sydney Buxton, M.P.; The Rt. Hon. Thomas Burt, M.P.; The Rt. Hon. Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt.; Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt.; Sir William Collins; Mr. Robert Fleming; Mr. William Latham, K.C.; Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan; and Mr. Albert G. Sandeman.

LORD ROTHSCHILD (the Honorary Treasurer), in reporting that the amount received by the Fund to the 6th inst. after payment of expenses was £150,692, said the Fund had the sum of £170,000 on deposit with Messrs. Baring Brothers, who had allowed a very generous rate of interest, for which the subscribers ought to be very grateful. He had a very pleasant piece of information to give to the Council which he had received from Mr. Eckstein, one of the executors of the late Sir Julius Wernher. Sir Julius Wernher had been a member of this Council, and had taken a great interest in its affairs; and besides making a specific legacy in his will he left this Fund one-twelfth of his residuary estate. A sum of £265,000 would shortly be received, to be followed later on by a further amount of probably £200,000, making £465,000 in all. In connection with this large windfall and also with the moneys received and to be received from the late Mr. Samuel Lewis's estate, he proposed that such sums as these be invested permanently, and not treated in the same way as ordinary legacies, because the Fund could not look forward to receiving such large amounts very often. He moved that a resolution of thanks be sent to Mr. Eckstein for the great trouble he had taken in winding up the estate.

The vote of thanks was seconded by His Highness the Duke of Teck, and carried unanimously.

Sir HENRY BURDETT, in making his annual statement on behalf of the League of Mercy, said it had been stated lately in the Press that the whole of the Hospitals were suffering very much this year; and there could be no doubt that, owing to recent legislation, the year 1913 had been and would be the trial year of the voluntary system of Hospitals in this country. He had given a great deal of attention to the effects and the probable result, and he was glad to say that on the figures, as far as they were now available, the voluntary principle had triumphed, that it was deep-seated in the hearts of the English people, and that the

voluntary Hospitals were certainly safe, in the financial sense, on their present basis. So far as the League of Mercy had yet received returns from the different districts, the amounts that would be received were practically identical with those of last year, and they would certainly bring the total contributions from the League of Mercy to the King's Fund, by the end of the present year, up to a sum considerably exceeding £200,000.

Sir WILLIAM CHURCH, the Chairman of the Distribution Committee, read the Report of that Committee, and Sir SAVILE CROSSLEY (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

In the absence of Mr. William Latham, K.C. (the Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee) Dr. EDWIN FRESHFIELD read the Report of that Committee, and Mr. JOHN G. GRIFFITHS (Hon. Secretary) presented the List of Awards.

His Highness the DUKE OF TECK, in moving the adoption of the Reports and Awards, said :—

My Lords and Gentlemen,—On behalf of the Governors I rise to move the adoption of the Reports which have just been read. Before doing so I have the honour to read the following letter addressed to the Governors by Lord Stamfordham, by direction of His Majesty the King, Patron and past President of the Fund :—

" Buckingham Palace,
" 7th December, 1913.

" Sir,—I am commanded to express to you and through you to the Council at their Meeting on the 12th instant the congratulations of the King upon the results achieved this year by the Fund.

" There has been an increase in the Income from Investments, and also to a slight degree in Annual Subscriptions. Consequently the amount available for distribution is rather larger than last year and the same sum can be distributed as in 1912, without again drawing on reserves. His Majesty realises that with the rise of prices and the increased cost of special treatments there must be a constant tendency for the needs of the Hospitals to become greater. At the same time grants have been given to two more Hospitals this year. For these reasons it is hoped that means may be forthcoming for an extended distribution in the future.

" The King, in following the work of the Fund, fully recognises how much is due to the ungrudging services of the Members of the Council and the Standing Committees, and to the never-failing counsel and valuable assistance of the Honorary Secretaries.

" His Majesty has learnt with regret of the retirement through ill-health of Sir Trevor Lawrence, one of the oldest members of the Fund and of the Distribution Committee, and also that the Fund is losing Mr. Danvers Power, who was Honorary Secretary from 1904 to 1907, and who initiated the Statistical Report and devoted himself for many years to the work of the Fund.

" The King hears with the utmost satisfaction of the able and cordial manner in which the ever-increasing work of the office is conducted under the direction of Mr. Maynard and his Staff.

I am sure you will all desire the Governors, on behalf of themselves and of the whole Council, to tender to His Majesty our humble thanks for his gracious message and for the continued warm interest which he has ever manifested in the working of the Fund founded by his father, King Edward. It is with a great sense of relief and gratification that we find ourselves able this year to maintain our annual distribution at the high level of £157,500, first attained in 1911. Last year, as you will remember, we suffered from a very serious falling off in the amount received from legacies, and were compelled not only to check the steady rise in the amount distributed, but to draw a considerable sum from our reserves in order to avoid

an actual retrogression. We are, fortunately, in a better position to-day. It is true that our receipts from donations—always a fluctuating source of income—are at present rather less than last year. But annual subscriptions show a small increase on last year's estimates, and the estimated income from investments is up by nearly £2,000—the capital receipts from legacies last year having exceeded the amount taken from reserve. Legacies, moreover, are once more up to the average for the past five years—the average upon which the distribution has for some time been roughly based. We are thus able to distribute the same amount as last year, while keeping a small balance in hand—a balance which has been increased by further legacies received since the estimates were drawn up. I am sure you will agree that we are wise in keeping this balance and not at once increasing the distribution. For the effect of the small legacy receipts of last year on the five-years average will be felt for some time, and we shall have to be prudent in applying our funds as well as energetic in trying to increase them, if we are to maintain the distribution at £157,500. We must not forget, or let the public forget, the words of His Majesty, the Patron of the Fund, last year, when he said that he would look upon any reduction in the total grants as a calamity. I hope the increase in annual subscriptions, in which I am glad to say that Members of the Council and of the Committees of the Fund themselves took the lead, may be taken as a sign that the public do not mean to allow that calamity to occur. The Distribution Committee remind us in their Report that even when the total amount distributed remains the same, the individual grants vary from year to year; and they point out that this is because the distribution is carefully adjusted to the temporary variations in the comparative needs of the separate hospitals. For while the needs of the hospitals, taken as a whole, show a tendency to increase, owing largely to the increasing demands for more numerous and more costly special treatments, the finances of individual hospitals have from year to year their separate ups and downs. And it is one of the advantages of a Fund like this that it makes a detailed study of the accounts of each hospital, and can vary its awards so as to make up to some extent for these more or less accidental fluctuations. I am sure we all welcome St. George's Hospital back to our list of grants. I hope it has always been understood by the public that we have never suggested any want of good faith on the part of the Hospital authorities. The difficulty only arose because the Fund is bound by a special trust in the matter of the financial relations of Hospitals and Medical Schools. It is quite natural that those who have not the responsibility of carrying out that trust, and have not had the long experience that we have had in applying the trust impartially to the different circumstances of many different hospitals, should sometimes fail to realise the standpoint from which we are bound to approach any particular case. We are glad to see that the Convalescent Homes Committee have been able to secure more beds at Consumption Sanatoria and to include one more Hospital in the list of those to which beds are allotted. Whatever the future may bring forth in the way of public machinery for dealing with tuberculosis, there is no doubt that at present the demands on the voluntary Hospitals for the treatment of consumption in its early stages are most urgent and pressing. The Executive Committee have recently had before them a suggestion made by my brother, Prince Alexander of Teck, Chairman of the Middlesex Hospital, that the Fund should purchase a supply of radium, which should be available for the use of the London Hospitals through the agency of the laboratories attached to the Middlesex. While fully realising the need of the Hospitals for a larger supply of this very valuable and very costly curative agent, the Executive were compelled to reply that, as at present advised, the Fund had no legal power, under its Act of Incorporation, to use its general funds in the purchase of radium in the manner suggested. I should like to emphasise the remark of the Distribution Committee drawing the attention of the promoters of new Hospitals to the invitation of this Council to submit their proposals to the Fund. It is obvious that we cannot communicate with them individually as we can with existing Hospitals. We can only issue the invitation as publicly as possible, in the hope that it may become widely known, and that the advantage of seeking the opinion of the Fund at an early stage may become generally recognised. The Statistical Report this year again shows an increase in Hospital expenditure. The Report

recognises that this is in many cases due to causes common to all Hospitals, such as the rise in prices and the increase in special or costly treatments. The Distribution Committee have, therefore, acted justly as well as wisely in making special inquiries before drawing attention to high cost at any particular Hospital. The comparisons of cost per bed depend for their accuracy very largely on the degree of uniformity with which the accounts and statistics of the various hospitals are made up. For this uniformity we are indebted to the Uniform System of Hospital Accounts introduced by Sir Henry Burdett, and to the revision of that system adopted by the three Funds—the Sunday Fund, the Saturday Fund, and ourselves—seven years ago. Since then certain minor differences in the method of applying the rules of the system have grown up, and during the year a joint committee of the three Funds has issued some supplementary regulations and suggestions. Mr. Griffiths, who was responsible for the original revision, again gave his expert aid as the representative of this Fund; and again, as on the previous occasion, a Committee of Hospital Secretaries assisted with their practical experience. In thus co-operating with the other two Funds we are not only doing what it is a real pleasure to do, but we are carrying out the intention expressed by our Founder, of revered memory, in his original letter inaugurating the Fund. Several changes in the *personnel* of the Fund have to be recorded. We welcome the appointment on the Council during the year of the new Chief Rabbi. On the other hand, we have to deplore three losses by death. Mr. Alfred Willett, though he had already retired from active service, had served for eleven years as a Medical Visitor and Member of the Convalescent Homes Committee; Canon Barnett, first on the Distribution Committee and then on the Council, gave us, so far as his health would permit, the benefit of his ripe experience and judgment in matters of charitable administration; and the Hon. Spencer Lyttelton had been a Visitor for thirteen years. It is with great regret also that we view the approaching loss, through resignations, of three members of the Council—Sir Trevor Lawrence, formerly Vice-Chairman of the Distribution Committee, and Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, both of whom have been connected with the Fund in various capacities since 1898; and Mr. J. Danvers Power, whose services as Honorary Secretary, Member of Executive and Distribution Committees and Member of the Council, can hardly be over-estimated. Before I conclude may I, on behalf of the Governors, express our thanks to all the Members of the Council, Members of Committees, Visitors and Honorary Officers for their assistance during another successful year? Amongst the Honorary Officers this year must be included Mr. Fry, who very kindly resumed his old work at the office for a time during Sir Savile Crossley's absence abroad. I now beg to move the adoption of the Reports of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees.

The SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS, in seconding the adoption of the Reports, said:—Your Highness, my Lords and Gentlemen,—I have much pleasure in seconding the motion which has been made from the chair. There are three points which I think we ought to bear in mind as specially standing out in this year's Reports. First of all, the fact that we are able to maintain the high figure of £157,500 as the amount which we distribute. Secondly, the very munificent gifts which are just coming to us from Sir Julius Wernher's executors. In connection with this I might perhaps refer to the fact that it is only two years ago since the Fund received a large and generous gift from Sir Ernest Cassel, which was then distributed. I do not know whether I may permit myself to express an opinion on this occasion, in support of what fell from Lord Rothschild, as to the advantage of not treating such gifts as Sir Julius Wernher's upon the same footing as other legacies, but investing them and treating them as permanent investments. It seems to me that that is a sound and what I may call a conservative policy to adopt. Last of all, may I say a word as to the satisfaction with which I have observed that the slightly strained relations which existed between ourselves and St. George's Hospital have, we may trust, come to an end? I should hope for myself that we may now "bury the hatchet," if ever any hatchet was employed at all, and that our relations may no longer be strained, but may be of the cordial character that they were before this unfortunate and unhappy dispute arose. I have very great pleasure in seconding the resolution.

After discussion the adoption of the Reports was put and carried.

On the motion of the CHIEF RABBI (the Rev. Dr. HERTZ), seconded by Sir VEZEY STRONG, it was resolved "That the cheques for the grants should be posted on December 18th, except in the case of grants for the reservation of beds in Consumption Sanatoria during 1914, which should be posted on January 1st."

On the motion of Mr. SYDNEY, seconded by Sir JOHN TWEEDY, a Report of the Executive Committee on a resolution received from the Society for the State Registration of Trained Nurses was adopted.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR 1914.

His Highness the DUKE OF TECK then said :—

My Lords and Gentlemen,—With regard to the arrangements for 1914, I have to announce that the Governors intend to appoint the Members of the General Council, Standing Committees, and Honorary Officers in accordance with the list which I will now ask the Honorary Secretaries to read. [The list having been read by Sir SAVILE CROSSLEY (Hon. Secretary), His Highness continued :] We have now to consider the Delegation Resolutions, so that the meeting held early in January for the purpose of passing them need only be formal. All the Resolutions are in the same form as last year.

On the motion of the PRESIDENT OF THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS (Sir THOMAS BARLOW, Bt.), seconded by Sir HORACE MARSHALL, a Resolution was approved delegating powers to the Finance Committee, Distribution Committee, and Convalescent Homes Committee.

On the motion of the GOVERNOR OF THE BANK OF ENGLAND (Mr. WALTER CUNLIFFE), seconded by the Rev. Dr. W. L. WATKINSON, a Resolution was approved delegating powers to the Executive Committee.

The LORD MAYOR (Sir T. VANSITTART BOWATER) proposed a vote of thanks to His Highness the Duke of Teck for presiding. The Resolution was seconded by the PRESIDENT OF THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF SURGEONS (Sir RICKMAN J. GODLEE, Bt.), and carried unanimously.

The DUKE OF TECK having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings terminated.

The Annual Meeting of the Governors and General Council to receive the Accounts and the Report of the General Council for the year 1913, was held at St. James's Palace on Thursday, 30th April, 1914, His Highness the Duke of Teck being in the Chair.

The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following : The Lord Lieutenant of the County of London (The Marquess of Crewe); The Bishop of London ; The Bishop of Southwark ; Cardinal Bourne ; The Rev. Hobhouse, M.P.); The President of the Hospital Sunday and Hospital Saturday Funds (The Rt. Hon. The Lord Mayor); The Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. Walter Cunliffe) ; The Rt. Hon. C. Stuart-Wortley, K.C., M.P. ; The Rt. Hon. Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt. ; Professor Sir William Osler, Bt. ; Sir Henry Burdett ; Sir Horace Marshall ; Mr. Robert Fleming ; Mr. William Latham, K.C.

LORD ROTHSCHILD (the Honorary Treasurer) said: It was his pleasant duty to present to the noblemen and gentlemen present the account of the receipts and expenditure for the past year. He did not propose to go into them, as members of the Council had them in their hands. But there were two matters that required some little explanation. As he had said at the meeting in December, the Fund had received a considerable sum of money from the executors of the late Sir Julius Wernher, representing the first instalment of the one-twelfth share of the residue left to capital account, to the value of £270,000. As the result of the receipt of this instalment of the legacy, the total investments of the Fund now exceeded £2,000,000. There was another legacy to which he ought to refer: that was the Harman Bequest of ground-rents, worth £1,382 3s. *od.* a year. The surveyor's report, recently received, estimated the value of this most acceptable legacy at about £25,000.

HIS HIGHNESS THE DUKE OF TECK formally moved the adoption of the Accounts, and the Resolution, having been seconded by LORD IVEAGH, was put and carried unanimously.

Sir SAVILE CROSSLEY (Honorary Secretary) presented the draft Report of the Council for the year 1913.

HIS HIGHNESS THE DUKE OF TECK, in moving the adoption of the Report, said: My Lords and Gentlemen,—It is not the custom of the Governors to make any lengthy speech at this meeting, but before moving the adoption of the Report I will take the opportunity of referring to one or two matters. I am sure we should all wish to express our very sincere thanks to the Finance Committee. Their task, now that the Fund's capital is so large, is one of great responsibility; and we are very deeply indebted to those who, in the interests of the Fund and the Hospitals of London, undertake that responsibility and discharge it so well. We regret very much that owing to his numerous other engagements Sir Ernest Cassel is unable to continue his valued services on the Council. We shall always remember with gratitude his special donation of £31,500 to supplement by one-fifth the grants made by the Fund in 1911. I should also like to add, on behalf of the Governors and the Council, a word of thanks to Messrs. Barings, whose advice and assistance are always at the disposal of the Fund, and also to Mr. Leslie Vigers, to Mr. Leonard Messel, and last but not least to our Honorary Solicitors, Messrs. Freshfields, who have all in various ways rendered good service to the Fund in connection with the administration of its property. Since we last met, in December, we have had to deplore the loss, in the death of Lord Strathcona, of a distinguished Member of the Council and a great benefactor to the Fund. It is hardly too much to say that his generous donation of £200,000, received in 1902, together with a similar amount from Lord Mountstephen, laid the foundations of the capital fund of the Corporation which now forms such a valuable element in its stability. It would be impossible to exaggerate the importance of these gifts in the history of the Fund. But they were not the only sign of Lord Strathcona's interest in its work, and it is with feelings of sincere sorrow that we miss from our meetings the presence and assistance of a friend to whom we owe so much. I have now the honour to read the following letter, addressed to the Hon. Secretaries by Lord Stamfordham:

“Buckingham Palace,

“29th April, 1914.

“Dear Sirs,—I am commanded by the King to ask that the following message may be delivered at the Council Meeting of the Fund to be held at St. James's Palace to-morrow.

“‘While deeply deploring the loss sustained by the death of one of our great benefactors, Lord Strathcona, and of other friends, we must all be proud of the continued growth of the Fund and of the proof of confidence in its management shown by the most munificent bequest of Sir Julius Wernher, which will be of the greatest service. His splendid example will long be remembered by all interested in Hospital Work.’

“Yours very faithfully,

“STAMFORDHAM.”

It was also with great regret that we learned before the end of the year of the death of Sir Trevor Lawrence, whose resignation was announced at the last Council meeting. He had done the Fund good

service for many years, both on the Council and on the Distribution Committee. I also wish at this time to pay a tribute of gratitude, on behalf of the Governors and the Council, to the memory of Sir Julius Wernher, to whose munificent bequest of one-twelfth share of the residue of his estate the capital account of the Fund is indebted for another large increase. Since the end of the financial year we have received, as a first instalment of this legacy, securities to the value of £270,000. The resulting very valuable increase in the permanent income of the Fund will do much to ensure our annual distribution against the danger of possible reduction which seemed a year ago to be threatening. Sir Julius Wernher had served the Fund as a Member of the Council ever since its foundation in 1897, and we receive this great gift with gratitude, not only as a welcome addition to the funds which we administer, but also as a token of the confidence which he felt in the management of the Fund, and as evidence of the strong appeal which the cause of the Hospitals made to the administrative ability and generous impulses of one who had made himself acquainted with their work and with their needs. I now beg to move the adoption of the Report.

The SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS seconded the motion, which was carried unanimously.

Sir WILLIAM CHURCH (Chairman of the Distribution Committee) moved the adoption of a Report of the Distribution Committee upon the Throat Hospitals Amalgamation, as follows :—

The Distribution Committee beg to report that the Hospital for Diseases of the Throat, Golden Square, and the London Throat Hospital, Great Portland Street, have entered into an agreement for the amalgamation of the two Hospitals upon the site of the Golden Square Hospital and an adjoining site recently acquired by that Hospital.

In 1907 the Fund offered, towards a general scheme for the amalgamation of the Throat Hospitals, a capital grant of £10,000 and an annual maintenance grant of £2,000 a year for five years. In addition to this, grants amounting in all to £10,500 were set aside between 1906 and 1911 out of the annual distribution for the purpose of a general amalgamation in lieu of maintenance grants to the separate institutions. In 1912 the Council decided that the £10,500 set aside should be added to the £10,000 promised and that the whole £20,500 should be considered as a grant to capital including building capital.

The Distribution Committee recommend that, out of the grants so promised and set aside for a general amalgamation, the following grants be made and promised towards the present partial scheme—viz., a capital grant of £10,000 and an annual maintenance grant (subject to the usual annual inspection) of £900 a year for five years.

The Distribution Committee further recommend that power be given to them to draw upon the balance of the capital and maintenance grants so promised or set aside, in such proportions as they may consider appropriate, in the event of any further amalgamation scheme being brought to a satisfactory conclusion before the next Distribution.

The motion having been seconded by Mr. FREDERICK M. FRY, was put and carried unanimously.

In the absence of Mr. LATHAM, K.C. (Chairman of the Convalescent Homes Committee), Dr. FRESHFIELD moved the adoption of a Report of the Committee upon the question of the reserved grant to the Maitland Sanatorium. This was seconded by Sir WILLIAM BENNETT, and carried unanimously.

LORD SANDHURST moved a vote of thanks to His Highness the Duke of Teck for presiding and for his conduct in the Chair.

The Hon. HARRY LAWSON, M.P., in seconding the Resolution, said His Highness had made himself a great name in the world of charity; and he was untiring in his zeal and in his good work on behalf of this Fund.

The Resolution was carried unanimously.

The DUKE OF TECK having briefly acknowledged the vote of thanks, the proceedings terminated.

Report of the Distribution Committee.

The Governors and General Council having again placed the sum of £151,000 in the hands of the Committee for distribution amongst the London Hospitals, the Committee beg to report as follows:—

(1) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is 106, as against 104 last year.

(2) Although the total amount to be distributed remains the same, the grants recommended continue to show, as compared with previous years, numerous and in some cases considerable variations. This is due to the fact that the grants are based on an examination of all the circumstances affecting the claims of each hospital each year, in relation to those of other hospitals, including the financial position of each institution as disclosed by its Income and Expenditure Account and Balance Sheet for the last completed year. It must not be assumed, therefore, that a reduction in the maintenance grant of any particular institution, any more than the absence of a grant, implies dissatisfaction.

(3) The Mount Vernon Hospital for Consumption does not now appear in the list, since the Hospital at Hampstead has not applied, and the Hospital at Northwood, being no longer a branch of a hospital applying for a grant, and being itself outside the area dealt with by the Distribution Committee, does not come within the scope of this Report.

(4) The Committee are glad to report that the Authorities of St. George's Hospital have rendered their Accounts for the year 1912 in an amended form which reduces the amount paid to the medical School out of the general fund of the Hospital, in respect of specific work done for the patients, to a sum not exceeding that which was charged prior to the changes which led to the suspension of the Fund's grants. The Committee, therefore, find themselves in a position to recommend a grant to St. George's Hospital, the amount of which is based on a consideration, on their merits, of the claims of the Hospital in respect of the work of the present year.*

(5) The Committee are glad to learn that further progress has been made with the proposal for the amalgamation of the British Lying-in Hospital and the Home for Mothers and Babies at Woolwich. The Committee recommend that a grant of £1,500 be set aside this year towards this amalgamation, subject to the scheme, when mature, being submitted and approved.

* The grant will be subject to a certificate from the Chairman of the Hospital that the Accounts for 1913 will be in conformity with those now presented for 1912. The position will then be that, although St. George's received a grant in 1909, for which year its accounts when made up and published in the spring of 1910 proved to be in an incorrect form, it forfeited grants not only in 1910 and 1911, when the accounts were in the same incorrect form, but also in 1912, for which year the accounts have now been submitted in the correct form in which they were rendered prior to 1909.

Under these circumstances the conditions set out in the Fund's rule and in the previous Reports of the Committee will be fully satisfied by the present recommendation.

(6) It was decided in 1911 that the grants promised or set aside towards a general amalgamation of the five Throat, Nose and Ear Hospitals should remain at the figure of £20,500, pending an agreement on a satisfactory scheme or schemes. The Committee are informed that a partial scheme is at present under consideration.

(7) The Committee view with great satisfaction the opening of the new King's College Hospital in South London. They recommend a further grant of £5,000 to the Removal Fund, thus raising the amount contributed by the King's Fund to this object to £53,000.

(8) The Reports of the Visitors bear witness as usual to the care and thoroughness with which the annual inspections are carried out by the medical men and laymen who undertake the work. The Committee have for many years made a practice of accompanying the Fund's grants, where desirable, by observations extracted from these reports, and they have found, as the result of enquiry by the Visitors of the following year, that the suggestions thus brought to the notice of the Hospital Authorities have often proved of practical value.

(9) The Committee have also accompanied the grants in some cases with remarks arising out of their own examination of the circumstances of particular Hospitals. In one or two instances they have recommended that these remarks should be made public.

(10) As in former years, many special grants are recommended in aid of schemes of capital expenditure, particulars of which had previously been submitted to the Fund and examined by the Committee.

(11) The Committee desire to draw the attention of the promoters of new hospitals to the fact that the invitation to submit their proposals to the Fund, originally issued by the General Council in 1903 and since repeated from time to time, was addressed to them as well as to hospitals reconstructing or extending. During the past two years the Committee have been consulted upon three new schemes. It is not the practice of the Fund to entertain applications for grants from any institution that has not been in existence for at least three years. But it is obviously preferable, in the interests of any proposed new institution as well as on general grounds, that the opinion of the Fund on the question of the necessity for a new hospital should be sought before, rather than after, any definite action is taken.

(12) In view of the general increase in hospital expenditure shown by the Fund's Statistical Report for 1912, the Committee made special enquiries into all cases where there had been any considerable rise in cost, so as to be in a position to distinguish between increases due to unavoidable causes, or to circumstances common to hospitals generally, and increases which it might be within the power of the managers of the individual hospitals to control. Where it seems desirable, attention is privately drawn to the excess of cost in a remark attached to the grant.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.

Report of the Convalescent Homes Committee.

(1) The Governors and General Council have this year again placed the sum of £6,500 in the hands of the Committee with a view to distribution amongst Convalescent Homes and Consumption Sanatoria.

(2) The number of applications eligible for consideration amounted to 46 from Convalescent Homes and 10 from Consumption Sanatoria, as against 44 and 10 respectively last year.

(3) In dealing with applications from Convalescent Homes the Committee have adhered to their original policy of giving special consideration to the Convalescent Homes closely connected with London Hospitals.

(4) The Committee have continued the practice of making grants to Consumption Sanatoria on the basis of the reservation of a certain number of beds for the use of patients from London Hospitals. The accommodation thus secured this year consists of 44 beds at five Sanatoria as against 39 beds at five Sanatoria last year, and is situated as follows:—

- 2 beds for children at the Maitland Sanatorium, Peppard, Oxon.
- 10 beds at the Devon and Cornwall Sanatorium, South Brent, Devon.
- 10 beds at the Kelling Sanatorium, Holt, Norfolk.
- 10 beds at the Sanatorium of the National Association for the Establishment and Maintenance of Sanatoria for Workers, Benenden, Kent.
- 12 beds at the Northampton Sanatorium, Creaton, Northants.

(5) In allocating these beds to Hospitals in London the Committee have followed the same principle as that adopted last year, viz.: that preference should be given (in order of relative size) to the two Consumption Hospitals which have no country branches, and that the rest of the beds should be divided among the largest of the general hospitals which apply to the Fund.

They accordingly recommend the following allocation:

- 18 beds to the City of London Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
- 9 beds to the Royal Hospital for Diseases of the Chest.
- 6 beds to the London Hospital.
- 6 beds to Guy's Hospital.
- 5 beds to the Middlesex Hospital.

(6) The Committee made enquiries both from the Sanatoria and from the London Hospitals to ascertain whether the supply of beds for consumptive patients was affected by the working of the National Insurance Act. The result of these enquiries indicates that, for the present at all events, the accommodation provided for tuberculosis patients in accordance with the Act has not been sufficient to reduce in any appreciable degree the need for the grants made to Sanatoria by the Fund.

(7) All the Sanatoria applying for grants have been inspected on behalf of the Fund, and the Committee desire to express their indebtedness to the visitors who undertook the necessary journeys.

(8) The grants recommended to the various Institutions are appended.

King Edward's Hospital Fund for London.

TITLE AND CONSTITUTION.

The Fund was founded in 1897, under the title of "The Prince of Wales's Hospital Fund for London," by His Majesty King Edward VII., then Prince of Wales, with the object of securing more efficient aid and support for the Hospitals of London, and of thus commemorating the Sixtieth Anniversary of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria.

It was re-named "King Edward's Hospital Fund for London" in January 1902, after the accession of His Majesty King Edward VII.

It was incorporated under that title, and its constitution settled, by King Edward's Hospital Fund for London Act, 1907 (7 Edw. 7, Ch. lxx.).

The Governing Body under the Act consists of the President and General Council.

His late Majesty King Edward VII. was President of the Fund, as Prince of Wales, from 1897 to 1901, and was subsequently its Patron.

His present Majesty King George V. was President, as Prince of Wales, from 1901 to 1910, and is now Patron.

The powers of the President have been exercised since 1910 by three Governors appointed by His Majesty pursuant to the provisions of the Act.

The work of the Fund is carried on by the four Standing Committees and Officers as set out on page 2 of the Annual Report. No individual serves on more than one Committee.

RULES AS TO APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS.

Under its present rules the Fund receives applications for grants from :

- (a) Hospitals situated in the County of London or within 9 miles from Charing Cross.
- (b) Convalescent Homes which are situated within these boundaries or which, being situated outside, take a large proportion of patients from London.
- (c) Consumption Sanatoria which take patients from London, or which are prepared to place beds at the disposal of the Fund for the use of patients from London Hospitals.

The Fund does not, however, assist at present in the foundation of new institutions, or entertain applications from institutions which have not been in existence in a properly constituted form for a period of at least three years, or from Dispensaries or Nursing Institutions, or from Institutions for the treatment of Incurables or of Mental Cases.

All institutions applying for grants are required to publish their accounts in accordance with the Revised Uniform System of Hospital Accounts.

Every eligible Hospital and Sanatorium applying for a grant is annually inspected on behalf of the Fund by two Visitors, a medical man and a layman in each case, specially appointed for the purpose.

Applications are invited in March, and the awards are made, on the recommendations of the Distribution and Convalescent Homes Committees, by the General Council in December.
