REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1905.

THE sums received during 1905, in addition to interest from investments (£38,874 8s. 10d.), were as follows: Donations, £7,811. 16s. 7d.; Annual Subscriptions, £36,023. 14s. 11d.; from the League of Mercy, £15,000. The total income of the Fund from general sources amounted to £123,862. 5s. 4d. There was received £237,205. 14s. 7d. on Capital Account.

The year 1905 was marked by the accomplishment of what had been the immediate object of the Fund for some years—namely, a permanent income of £50,000 per annum. This gratifying result was due to a number of munificent gifts to capital received during the year, To Lord Mount Stephen, who gave £200,000 to the Fund in 1902, the grateful thanks of all connected with the Fund are due for the further munificent donation of £200,000. Mr. Henry Marshall presented the Fund with some freehold property in Shoreditch bringing in a rental of £420 a year. The residues of the late Mr. Lambert's and Mrs. Hames' Estates, bequeathed to the Fund, are expected to amount to considerable sums. The Executors of Miss Hasker, in their discretion under the Will, allocated £10,000 to the Fund. Sir F. L. Cook, Bt., and Sir H. A. White, the Executors of the late Mr. Wyndham Francis Cook, who left £25,000 to any Central Fund for London Hospitals, allocated £12,500 to the Fund. Sir Charles Tennant, Bt., gave a donation to capital of £10,000, and under Mr. Bawden's trust the Fund secures the income of £5,000 capital.

As will be seen, the actual income of the Fund included some unexpected legacies not allocated to capital, and the Council did not think it desirable to distribute more than £101,000. It must be remembered that in the year 1903 £18,751. 9s. was taken from capital to make up the amount distributed—namely, £100,000, including the £1,000 entrusted to the Fund for distribution among Convalescent Homes by the London Parochial Charities.

The amounts received in donations and subscriptions during the year show an increase of £2,032 over 1904; and in addition the League of Mercy has contributed £15,000, being £1,000 more than in the previous year. During the seven years of its existence the League has furnished in all £61,000 to the Fund. To all the voluntary workers who have

contributed towards this increasing success the Council desire to express their continued and grateful acknowledgments.

The Council have also to thank Mr. George Herring for voluntarily reserving to King Edward's Hospital Fund the repayment of a large sum of money which he proposes to advance to the Salvation Army in connection with a scheme of home colonisation.

His Majesty the King, our Patron, has been pleased to continue the deep interest in the Fund which he has taken from its inception; and His Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales, our President, has on all occasions exercised personal supervision over the work of the Fund. In Appendix I. to this Report will be found the letters of His Royal Highness sent to the meetings of the General Council on December 8, 1905, and April 6, 1906, as well as the proceedings of those meetings. His Royal Highness, having left for India on October 19 last, requested the Duke of Fife to perform the duties of President during his absence.

By the invitation of His Royal Highness the President, Sir William Church, to whom the Council are much indebted for his labours as Chairman of the Distribution Committee, was added to the General Council, he having ceased to be President of the Royal College of Physicians, in which capacity he formerly sat. Mr. J. Danvers Power has also been added to the Council.

Every eligible Hospital which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon.

The Council have continued to urge on some of the smaller special hospitals the desirability of amalgamation, and though they have no definite announcement to make this year in addition to what has been stated on previous occasions, they have hopes that their efforts will bear fruit in the near future.

The second Statistical Report was issued last summer and dealt with thirty-six hospitals as against sixteen in the previous year. The Council have received gratifying testimony from several of the hospitals as to the reduction in expenditure which has been found possible in consequence of the information contained in the Report.

Although on the occasion of the Annual Meeting last year, His Royal Highness, the President, was able to thank the Medical Schools Committee for the services they rendered to the Fund in enquiring into the financial relations between hospitals and their medical schools, their work was actually concluded during the last financial year. The Council take this opportunity of thanking Sir Edward Fry (the Chairman), Lord Welby, and the Bishop of Stepney for their Report, which was adopted, and which has been acted upon. The difficulty in regard to Medical Schools has, it is hoped, been now nearly overcome. While the Council regarded the original understanding between the Fund and its subscribers to be that no part of the money contributed to the Fund should go to medical laboratories and as being in the nature of a trust,

they fully adhere to the view that the public look to the voluntary hospitals for the means of medical education and the advancement of medical science. It has, however, been shown that among the subscribers to hospitals there are quite sufficient who are willing that their subscriptions should, if necessary, be employed for the purpose of medical education. On the other hand, there are others who, while wishing to help towards the immediate relief of the sick poor, are not willing to contribute for any other purpose. The Fund has also to bear in mind that its permanent income of £50,000 per annum is probably largely derived from capital gifts made in reliance on the original constitution of the Fund. The Council see no reason to object to the subscribers to hospitals direct ear-marking their contributions either for a hospital or a medical school, as this is a matter for their own consideration, and is entirely distinct from grants made by the King's Fund out of a sum which is the result of a great number of contributions invited for the direct relief of the sick poor. The Council are glad to know that it is probable that, though the work of placing this matter on a proper basis may have caused some inconvenience at the outset, in the long run the schools will be placed in a more suitable position than they have occupied in the past, and that benefit to medical education will be the result.

A wish having been expressed by many hospital authorities that the Uniform System of Hospital Accounts should be revised, for the purpose of enabling more accurate comparisons of the expenditure between different hospitals to be made, His Royal Highness, the President, appointed Mr. J. G. Griffiths, formerly the head of the firm of Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co., the Honorary Auditors of the Fund, to enquire into and report upon the matter. The Council desire to express their thanks to Mr. Griffiths for a most valuable Report which has been laid before the Metropolitan Hospital Sunday Fund and the Hospital Saturday Fund. Steps are now being taken which will enable the views of the hospital officials to be laid before the three Funds in order that whatever changes are eventually adopted may, as far as possible, meet the views of all concerned.

The attention of the Council has been called to the increasing number of proposals made to the Fund in connection with schemes to be carried on for profit, a part of which is offered to the Fund. In some cases these offers are made with the sole intention of benefiting the Fund, but in others they amount to little more than offering a commission for the use of the Fund's name. The Council have thought it better to make a rule to the effect that, while the Fund is of course grateful for all assistance given to it, it cannot officially allow the use of its name in connection with schemes for raising money in any form other than direct contributions to the Fund itself.

In conclusion, the Council again rely upon the kindly co-operation of the Press in obtaining for the work of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London yet wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

A MEETING of the General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals and Convalescent Homes for the present year, was held on December 8, 1905, at 15 Portman Square.
The DUKE OF FIFE presided.

Those present were: The Lord Mayor of London, the Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. A. F. Wallace), the President of the College of Surgeons (Mr. John Tweedy), the Chief Rabbi (the Rev. Dr. Adler), Sir Savile Crossley, M.P., Sir W. S. Church, Sir Joseph Dimsdale, M.P., Sir Henry Burdett, Sir John Aird, M.P., Sir William Collins, Sir John Craggs, Mr. Hugh Colin Smith, Sir Julius Wernher, Mr. F. M. Fry, and Mr. J. Danvers Power.

The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: The Lord Lieutenant of Middlesex (the Duke of Bedford), the Duke of Norfolk, the Postmaster-General (Lord Stanley), Viscount Iveagh, Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, Lord Rothschild, the Bishop of London, the Bishop of Southwark, Archbishop Bourne, Sir Trevor Lawrence, Bt., Mr. Thomas Burt, M.P., Mr. William Latham, K.C., the Rev. J. Guinness Rogers, D.D., the Rev. T. Bowman Stephenson, D.D., Mr. E. A. Hambro, Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, Jun., Mr. Albert G. Sandeman, and Mr. Edgar Speyer.

Sir John Craggs reported that the amount received for general purposes by the Fund to December 2

amounted, after payment of expenses, to £93,865.

The DUKE OF FIFE, in moving the adoption of the Report of the Executive Committee, said: I shall not venture to occupy your time by making any lengthy remarks of my own, as I consider myself as merely the mouthpiece of our President, whose absence we naturally regret, although we rejoice to know that it is caused by his having again undertaken a great Imperial mission. On the work of this Fund, and the admirable results which have been achieved, I have nothing but the warmest congratulations to offer to you, and to all those who have so kindly and patriotically devoted themselves to the work. If this Fund had done nothing more than create a greater interest in the London Hospitals and improve their organisation it would have earned the profound gratitude of the whole community. But it has done far more. Thanks to the magnificent generosity of some of its supporters, it has rendered very material assistance to the great institutions which it was founded to benefit. The good work of the League of Mercy has enlisted the sympathies and support of a class which it would otherwise have been difficult to reach, and I am sure that you will agree with me when I say that all honour is due to the ladies and gentlemen who have worked so enthusiastically and successfully in its cause. Much as has been done of late years for the London Hospitals, I feel that I could not occupy my present position to-day without repeating what I have said publicly on other occasions, that their financial condition still leaves a great deal to be desired, and I fear that this will remain the case until the London public will take a more adequate view of its duty towards its hospitals.

In spite of the existence of this and other funds, we cannot disguise from ourselves the fact that the great majority of the London Hospitals are only kept alive by somewhat unsound methods of finance and continuous sensational appeals, and now, with your permission, I will read a letter which I have received

from the Prince of Wales.

"It is a matter of sincere regret to me that my absence in the East prevents me from being present at this year's Distribution Meeting of the Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London. This is the first occasion upon which I have been unable to preside since my appointment by the King to the Presidency.

"Please assure the Meeting of my ever keen interest in the work and welfare of the Fund.

"Although I only know the results of the past year up to November, enough is already shown

to prove, as I trust all will agree, that they are most satisfactory and encouraging.

"We have now secured a permanent income from investments amounting to £50,000 a year. I hope that, as the work of the Fund becomes better known, there will be an equally gratifying increase in the annual subscriptions.

"I am glad to see that there are indications of the Hospitals having already benefited to some extent from the Statistical Reports which have been issued to them by the Fund. I look forward with much interest to the results which will be shown in the next Report, as it covers the working of a

complete year since the first Statistical Report was available.

"I have learnt with satisfaction that the recommendations of the Medical Schools Committee have already been adopted by some of the London Hospitals. Our only object has been, while strictly adhering to the original aim and object of the Fund, to assist by the best advice procurable, in furthering the movement for the establishment of a more systematic and co-ordinated scheme of medical education in the Metropolis. Such a result would, we hope, be beneficial to the medical profession, of which we are so justly proud, and to whose co-operation in our work we owe so much.

"I have to thank Mr. J. G. Griffiths for a most valuable report, made at my request, on the existing system of hospital accounts. I trust that in his recommendations may be found a solution of the various difficulties which have hitherto confronted the hospital authorities in this important branch

"My best thanks are due to the Honorary Officers and Committees of the Fund for their

untiring and valuable services, and to each and all of those who serve on the General Council.

"Let me add, in conclusion, I am confident that the administration of the Fund is safe in the hands of those to whom it is entrusted, and I am greatly indebted to you for acting in my behalf during my absence."

The LORD MAYOR seconded the adoption of the Report.

It was proposed by Mr. H. C. SMITH, seconded by Sir Joseph Dimsdale, M.P., and resolved, that

cheques for the grants should be posted on December 14.

The Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. A. F. Wallace) proposed, and Sir John Aird seconded, a vote of thanks to the President, which was carried unanimously, and which the DUKE OF FIFE acknowledged.

Sandeman, and Mr. Edgar Speyer. LORD ROTHSCHILD (Hon. Treasurer) in submitting the Accounts, said :- My Lord Duke, my Lords,

and Gentlemen, I am happy to say that the Accounts of Receipts and Expenditure for the year ending December 31, 1905, are of a very simple and satisfactory nature. The Fund received in the year 1905 no less a sum than £361,068. Of this sum of £361,068, £237,206 represents money which will be added to our capital. But I think a satisfactory feature about the receipts and expenditure for the year is that you may take the Fund's normal receipts as £123,862, so that your normal receipts exceed your normal expenditure by some £20,000, and will probably enable you in the future to increase your grants. The other satisfactory feature in connection with the accounts is that the total expenditure for carrying on the work of the Fund does not amount to $\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. on the amount collected. As far as the balance sheet is concerned, we have at the present moment a capital sum of very nearly a million sterling. I do not think it is

necessary for me to make any further remark.

> The DUKE of FIFE, in moving the adoption of the Account of Receipts and Expenditure and the Balance Sheet, said :- My Lords and Gentlemen, I know that I am only expressing your feelings when I say that we greatly regret the absence of our President, but I have received a letter from him in which, amongst other things, he explains the necessity of holding our Annual Meeting before his return. I will not occupy your time by commenting upon the Annual Report, as the Prince of Wales, in his communication, which I will read, alludes to all that is of interest and importance in it. I am sure that all members of the Council, and all who are interested in the London Hospitals, must feel that the King's Fund has done a really great work. It has only been nine years in existence. During that time it has not only created a greater interest in the Hospitals, but it has improved their organisation and raised a very large sum of money. The gratitude of the whole community is most certainly due to the King, who so wisely and benevolently founded the Fund, and whose sustained interest in it has never ceased amongst his numerous and responsible duties. It is almost superfluous to allude to our President's hard and consistent work, as it is well known to the Council, and the letter which he has written to me from India is merely another proof that even when far away the work of this Fund is in his mind. But there is one thing which nothing seems able to overcome, and that is, the extraordinary apathy of Londoners with regard to their Hospitals. great majority of them do not subscribe at all, and the plain truth is that the London hospitals are maintained by a small number of charitable people. The needs and necessities of the Hospitals have grown enormously in the last twenty years, and if it was not for doubtful finance, sensational appeals, and every form of begging, many of them would be obliged to close their doors. I observed the other day that at the Annual Meeting of one of our oldest and best-known Hospitals the Chairman stated that unless further financial assistance was forthcoming, many of their wards would have to be closed, as their annual expenditure was £21,000, and their assured income only £6,000, leaving a deficit of £15,000, and I fear that this is the financial position of most of the London Hospitals so far as their assured income is concerned.

> In saying this, I do not in any way wish to ignore the excellent work done by the League of Mercy, of which I am glad to see a representative here to-day in Sir William Collins. But, though the League collects large sums from a great many different donors, there must still be an enormous number of people in this vast city who could afford to give their guineas, or even more, but who render no assistance to the Hospitals.

It may be within the recollection of some of those present that during the Coronation year a meeting in connection with this Fund was held at the Mansion House. I then ventured to point out very plainly the parlous financial condition of most of the London Hospitals, and the terrible difficulty of maintaining them. After the meeting I was told that I had drawn too gloomy a picture of the situation. What has since happened? A month ago a letter appeared in the *Times* from Mr. Sydney Holland, who is one of our greatest authorities on this subject, in which he unconsciously confirmed every single word that I said four years ago at the Mansion House. In his letter, Mr. Holland made a valuable and interesting suggestion with regard to Pay Hospitals. Of course this is not the time or occasion to discuss any particular remedy for what is really a serious state of things. Whether that remedy is to be found in Mr. Holland's proposal or in some form of Public Assistance I will, therefore, not stop to inquire, but sooner or later the whole question will have to be faced.

Personally I have a true Briton's leaning towards voluntary effort, and I should much regret to see that system set aside, although I believe that this is the only country in Europe in which the hospitals depend upon it. After all, these great institutions are not charities in the ordinary sense of the word.

They are necessities of our civilisation. I hope that I have not detained you too long, but it is really impossible at the present moment to say a word upon this subject without alluding to the very serious difficulties which surround it, and which seem to grow every year more and more urgent.

I will now, with your permission, read the letter which I have received from the Prince of Wales :-

"Prince of Wales's Camp, India, " 19th February, 1906.

"I regret that my absence from England makes it impossible for me to preside over the Annual Meeting of the General Council without causing an undue delay in the issue of the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts of the Fund. I should be sorry to thus prevent the subscribers receiving the earliest possible information as to the work of the past year and the general position of the Fund. That information will, I think, be considered as very satisfactory. We have, as I stated in my last letter, now secured a permanent income from investments of £50,000. The steady increase in the annual subscriptions and the large sums received in legacies strengthen me in the belief that the Fund is trusted by the public, and that its work meets with their approval.

"It is especially satisfactory to know that no less than £22,500 was given to the Fund by Executors who were left a discretion, while a further amount of £5,000 was sanctioned by a legal distribution of a sum bequeathed by the late Mr. T. J. Bell.

"In addition to the usual work of visiting every hospital which receives our grants, and the careful and prolonged labours of the Distribution Committee, based on the Visitors' reports, we have this year made exhaustive reports on the financial relations of London Hospitals and their Medical Schools, and on Hospital accounts. I have already expressed my thanks to those gentlemen responsible for them. It is to be hoped that the steps, which I am glad to see are being taken by most of the hospitals, will result in the difficulty regarding Medical Schools being shortly removed. I trust that with the co-operation of the hospital officials themselves, improvement in the system of keeping accounts will be beneficial to all concerned.

"The Fund continues to study with careful attention the question of economy in maintenance to which I referred at length in 1904. I am convined that co-operation in the circulation of the information obtained from the various hospitals cannot but be helpful to those responsible for their

administration.

The difference in the cost per bed for the same items for hospitals in the same class is still very striking. I hope that our Statistical Report, which has already produced valuable practical results, will be the means of still further saving. Several of the hospitals have shown their appreciation of this effort, and have recognised its great service to them in re-arranging their management on a more economical basis, and I am glad to know that our work has already borne good fruit.

"I must take this opportunity of acknowledging the great kindness of Mr. George Herring in reserving to the King's Fund the repayment of the munificent sum he is placing at the disposal of

the Salvation Army for a farm colonisation scheme.

"In conclusion, I wish to thank the Members of the Council and of the various Committees, as well as the Honorary Officials, for their services to the Fund during the past year. I have also to thank Mr. Danvers Power as well as all the hospital officials and others who have assisted in the production of our most valuable Statistical Report."

The Lord Mayor seconded the adoption of the Accounts, which was supported by the Earl of Bessborough, and carried unanimously.

SIR SAVILE CROSSLEY read the Draft Report of the General Council for the year 1905.

THE DUKE of FIFE formally moved the adoption of the Report, which was seconded by LORD

ROTHSCHILD, supported by SIR JOHN AIRD, and carried unanimously.

THE PRESIDENT of the ROYAL COLLEGE OF PHYSICIANS (SIR R. DOUGLAS POWELL, Bt.) proposed, and the Governor of the Bank of England (Mr. A. F. Wallace) seconded, a vote of thanks to the President, which was carried unanimously, and which the Duke of Fife acknowledged.

Report of the Hospitals Distribution Committee.

- (1) The Committee have the pleasure to report that the Executive Committee, with the approval of His Royal Highness the President, placed in their hands this year the sum of £100,000 for distribution among the London Hospitals, as against £79,000 in 1904.
- (2) The number of Hospitals applying for grants this year remains at 106, six having fallen out and six new applications having been received.
- (3) The Committee desire to reiterate their strong conviction of the undesirability of opening new Hospitals without the fullest consideration both as to their necessity and as to the means of maintaining them.
- (4) In reference to the City Orthopædic Hospital, the Committee, having been informed that there is now a prospect of the Hospital joining in the amalgamation of the National and Royal Orthopædic Hospitals, have recommended a grant subject to the arrangements made being approved by the Executive Committee.
- (5) The Committee learn with satisfaction that negotiations for the amalgamation of the various Throat, Nose and Ear Hospitals are in progress.
- (6) With regard to applications from newly established Hospitals for grants from the Fund, the Committee recommend the adoption of the practice followed by the Hospital Sunday Fund, which requires that under ordinary circumstances a Hospital should have been maintained in existence for three complete years before becoming eligible to participate.
- (7) The Committee are glad to note that St. George's Hospital and the Westminster Hospital have made arrangements to transfer the teaching of the preliminary and intermediate subjects of medical education to University Centres, as recommended in last year's Report.
- (8) A sum of £7,500 has already been contributed by the King's Fund to the special fund for the removal of King's College Hospital to South London; a further grant of £4,000, making in all £11,500, is now recommended in order to further this most desirable undertaking.
- (9) The question of Fire prevention to which a paragraph was devoted in last year's Report, has received the careful consideration of the Executive Committee, who, it is understood, are awaiting the decision of the London County Council with regard to the inspection of public buildings before reporting to the General Council.
- (10) The Committee have this year made two special grants in order to enable Hospitals to accomplish specific objects which might be prejudiced by delay. In the case of the Great Northern Central Hospital an adjoining piece of freehold land, now for sale, should be at once secured in the interests of the charity: and the Committee have recommended that the whole of the purchase price, £1,600, should be granted. In the case of the West Ham Hospital,

which is about to enter into possession of an adjoining building recently acquired and much needed, the Committee think that a sum of £2,500 to cover the cost of furniture and fittings might be granted at once in order that the benefits of the extension may be immediately available for this poor district. The fact that both these Hospitals are this year receiving more than would have been the case under ordinary circumstances, and that parts of the grants recommended must be regarded in the nature of advances, will of course be taken into consideration in the future.

- (11) The attention of the Committee has been called to the considerable grants made in past years towards building schemes, which in some instances have not yet been carried out. They would suggest that the Executive Committee should consider whether in future similar grants might not be retained by the Fund until the money is actually required and credited, together with the accrued interest, to the Hospitals to which they were made.
- (12) The Committee have, as heretofore, divided the grants into annual grants and donations. They recommend that in future grants made by the Fund should not be divided in this way. The Fund has now attained a permanent income of £50,000 per annum, which is more than sufficient to enable it to pay all the annual grants which it has hitherto made. There is, therefore, no longer any question as to its being able in future years to carry out its undertakings. Moreover, it must be remembered that many Hospitals which only receive donations are as much in need of yearly help as those receiving annual grants. The fact has also been brought to the notice of the Committee that in some cases where grants have been allocated for the re-opening of beds the beds re-opened have not been permanently added to the accommodation of the Hospitals inasmuch as other wards have been subsequently closed. In other instances the Hospitals to which grants have been made for the re-opening of beds no longer require the assistance of the Fund for that purpose. It seems, therefore, that the proper time has come for making the proposed change.
- (13) The Reports of the Visitors have as usual received the careful consideration of the Committee, and have been of material assistance in enabling them to apportion their awards. It is desirable to point out that circumspection with regard to suggestions should still be maintained, lest any let fall by the Visitors on the occasion of their visits should be interpreted, as has more than once been the case, as official recommendations, and afterwards quoted as the sanction for expenditure which it is sought to defray in whole or in part by grants from the Fund.
- (14) In addition to their published remarks the Committee have followed their usual practice in recommending that various suggestions should be made privately to many of the Hospitals. They would add that they have taken into special consideration several cases where the expenditure appears to be unreasonably high, and also others where efforts are being made to reduce excessive expenditure.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.


