



REPORT OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL

For the Year ending 31st December, 1907.

THE total receipts for the year 1907 were £484,069 10s. 9d. This sum was made up as follows: Donations, £5,656 2s. 5d.; Contributions to Capital, £517 14s.; Special Donation, £100,000; Annual Subscriptions, £25,412 4s. 10d.; Contribution of the League of Mercy, £18,000; from the Lewis Estate, £212,500; Legacies, £69,472 12s. 3d.; Interest from Investments, £51,260 17s. 3d.; together with £1,000 from the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities and £250 from the Trustees of the Bawden Fund.

The amount distributed was £121,000, including the £1,000 entrusted to the Fund for distribution among Convalescent Homes by the London Parochial Charities. In addition to this, Amalgamation grants of £2,750 became due during the year and were paid.

Since the inauguration of the Fund the amount spent on administration has been £1 5s. 8d. per cent. of the total amount received.

During the year the sum of £212,500 was received from the Executors of the will of the late Mr. Samuel Lewis on account of the legacy of £250,000 left to the Fund. The legacies from the late Mr. Alfred Beit of £20,000, the late Mr. John Nicholas of £10,000, and the late Lord Grimthorpe of £5,000 (less duty) announced in 1906 were received, while a sum of £15,000 was received on account of the residue of the estate of the late Lieut. General G. E. Baynes, and a further sum of £10,932 on account of the residue of the estate of the late Mr. G. H. Heigham. The Fund have also to acknowledge the munificent donation of £100,000 from Mr. Andrew Carnegie.

The amounts received in donations and subscriptions, excluding Mr. Carnegie's gift show, as compared with 1906, an increase of £1,165 4s. 5d.

The Drapers' Company have generously increased their annual subscription from £1,500 to £3,000.

The League of Mercy has contributed £18,000, being the same amount as in the previous year. During the nine years of its existence the League has furnished in all £97,000 to the Fund. To all the voluntary workers who have contributed towards the collection of this large sum the Council wish to express their continued and grateful acknowledgments.

His Majesty the King, our Patron, has been pleased to continue the deep interest in the Fund which he has taken from its inception.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales has continued to exercise personal supervision over the work of the Fund, and in an Appendix to this Report will be found an account of the proceedings of the General Council meetings on December 16, 1907, and March 20, 1908.

Every eligible Hospital which applied for a grant was inspected and reported upon.

On July 26, 1907, the Bill for the Incorporation of the Fund became law, and on the same day a meeting of the President and General Council was held at which all the Committees were reappointed, and the same powers as they previously exercised, in so far as these powers were not inconsistent with the Act, were delegated to them. The Council is happy to say that the Act has appeared to work satisfactorily in every way.

In February, 1907, a Committee, consisting of Sir Eyre Massey Shaw and Captain Wells was appointed to enquire into the best means of assisting the various Hospitals to secure a greater degree of protection against fire, and in July they issued a report containing suggestions, which have been circulated to the Hospitals, and which it is hoped will be found of advantage. The Council feel much indebted to Sir E. M. Shaw and Captain Wells for their kindness in undertaking this useful work.

A Committee, consisting of the Presidents of the Royal Colleges of Physicians and Surgeons, together with Sir William Church and Sir Cooper Perry, was appointed to revise the form of report supplied to the Visitors to Hospitals, and the thanks of the Council are due to them for improving this form and bringing it up to date.

During the year the Royal National Orthopædic Hospital took over the patients and some of the Members of the Staff and Governing Body of the City Orthopædic Hospital, and the Council are glad to say that this amalgamation is now complete. The efforts to amalgamate the five Throat, Nose, and Ear Hospitals still continue, but the difficulties of negotiating with so many bodies are necessarily great, and it has not been found possible yet to arrive at any definite conclusion. In connection with the proposed amalgamation between the North-West

London Hospital and the Hampstead General Hospital the Fund made an offer with a view to the first named being converted into an out-patient department in connection with the Hampstead General Hospital. At the time the 1907 Council laid down its duties the matter was still under consideration.

The Council desire to place on record their appreciation of the great services rendered to the Fund by Mr. J. Danvers Power during his tenure of the office of Honorary Secretary, the duties of which he discharged from June, 1904, to the end of the year under review. The Statistical Report which he initiated in 1904 is universally recognised as a contribution of the first importance to the cause of economical administration of Hospitals. The Council learn with satisfaction that Mr. Power's advice and experience will still be at the service of the Council and Executive Committee of the Fund. The office of Honorary Secretary rendered vacant by his retirement has been filled by the appointment of Mr. Frederick M. Fry, who was first connected with the Fund in 1898 and has served upon almost every Committee since that year.

The President of the Local Government Board, in pursuance of his powers under the Act, has appointed Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co. to audit the accounts of the Fund for the year.

The Fund removed in the course of 1907 to new offices, 7 Walbrook, E.C.

The Council continue to rely upon the kindly co-operation of the Press in obtaining for the Fund yet wider publicity and support.

Appendix to Report of the General Council.

A MEETING of the President and General Council of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London, for the purpose of awarding grants to the Hospitals and Convalescent Homes for the present year, was held

on December 16, 1907, at Marlborough House, H.R.H. the PRINCE OF WALES being in the chair.

Smith. There were also present—Lord Revelstoke, the Master of Elibank, M.P., the President of the Local Government Board (Mr. John Burns, M.P.), Sir Ernest Cassel, Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Arthur Bigge, Sir Horace Marshall, Dr. Freshfield, Mr. John G. The minutes of the last meeting having been read and confirmed, letters of regret were reported from the following: The Lord-Lieutenant of the County of London (the Duke of Fife), the Bishop of Southwark, Archbishop Bourne, the Earl of Bessborough, Lord Strathcona and Mount Royal, Mr. Thomas Burt, M.P., Sir John Aird, Sir Edgar Speyer, and Mr. J. Pierpont Morgan, Jun., also from the Chancellor of London University (the Earl of Rosebery), the Speaker of the House of Commons (Mr. James W.

Lowther, M.P.), and Professor W. Osler.

LORD ROTHSCHILD reported that the amount received by the Fund to December 12, after payment

of expenses, was £147,263 2s. 7d.

SIR HENRY BURDETT stated that, although this year had been a very bad year for the League of Mercy, owing to the general depression and the difficulty of raising small sums even from so many people, yet he was pleased to say the actual results were better than in any previous year. They would, therefore,

be able to give at least the same grant to the King's Fund this year as last year—namely, £18,000.

The Prince of Wales, in moving the adoption of the Reports and Awards, said:—In moving the adoption of the Reports, I ought first to mention that the receipts for 1907 have included some very large sums, such as the munificent gift of £100,000 from Mr. Carnegie, which will probably be placed to capital. We have also had exceptional sums from legacies; but even in this specially fortunate year it seems advisable not to distribute more than the average amount of the legacies received in past years, which has hitherto been our custom. The sum recommended for distribution to hospitals this year has, I am pleased to say reached forces. There are one or two items in the greats which require a word of am pleased to say, reached £120,000. There are one or two items in the grants which require a word of explanation. A very exceptional sum of £15,000 has been allocated to Guy's Hospital, and I cannot help thinking that the policy of occasionally making such grants is a sound one, and one which I trust will not be misunderstood. The most important work of rebuilding the out-patient department was being delayed, to the detriment of patients in a very poor part of London, for the want of £10,000. The King's Fund, in any case, would have ultimately contributed as much as £10,000 to this object, but the contributions would have probably been spread over several years. Instead of this, we propose to pay the whole sum now, and the work will be carried out at once. I hope that this will be of some benefit to those who are employed upon the building during the winter months, as well as to those for whom the building is We shall naturally remember for some little time to come that Guy's had this exceptional grant in 1907. As you will remember, we gave £5,000 last year to the Hampstead General Hospital in order to enable it to take advantage of a conditional offer of £20,000, and you will notice that no grant to that

hospital has been recommended this year. We propose to give a considerable sum to the removal fund of King's College Hospital, and the grant of £6,000 will make our total contributions up to £22,000 to this object. A matter which I am sure you will agree ought to engage our most serious attention in the future is that relating to the treatment of consumption, and I am glad to see that the Distribution Committee in the awards to consumption hospitals are giving special attention to the necessity for sanatoria. Whether this subject should be treated as distinct from the ordinary hospital work of London I need not at present discuss; but I feel sure that the want of consumption sanatoria in the country for London patients is very great, and I think that the King's Fund should do all in its power to encourage the establishment of these Another question for consideration is that which relates to the publishing in our useful institutions. reports of the names of hospitals which, having applied, yet do not receive any grant. I hope the Distribution Committee will carefully weigh the matter in all its bearings and advise us what ought to be done. The system which was adopted last year of not paying grants for special purposes until the occasion for expending the money actually arises has appeared to work very satisfactorily. In order to avoid money being left idle indefinitely, special grants are now always accompanied by the condition that the Fund shall have an opportunity of reconsidering the matter in two years if the money has not been spent on the object for which it was given. For some years we have had occasion to notice that certain hospitals do not issue their annual reports and accounts until rather late in the following year, and I think our committee have done wisely to propose that these should be issued not later than April 15 in future. It does not seem unreasonable to expect that three-and-a-half months is sufficient time for any hospital to prepare its annual statement to the subscribers. The whole of the useful information which is provided in our statistical report may be delayed by a single institution being behindhand in this respect. Turning to other work which has engaged our attention during the past year, I may pass over the important event in the history of the Fund, of our having obtained an Act of Parliament, which places the Fund on a legal basis, as I have already referred fully to that on a previous occasion. The amalgamation of the Orthopædic Hospitals is fortunately complete, and there is now only one Orthopædic Hospital, which, I trust, will worthily take its place among the special hospitals of London. The efforts to promote an amalgamation between the five Throat and Ear Hospitals are continuing, and I trust they may ultimately be successful. The Fund has made a liberal offer to the Hampstead General Hospital, provided it takes over the work of the North-West London Hospital on certain conditions, and we hope to be able to report favourably on this next year also. The only other subject to which I wish to call your attention is that of the Workmen's Compensation Act and insurance companies. I am aware of the difficulties which insurance companies have to deal with in the matter of subscriptions to charities and institutions which affect the risks they take. The premiums charged must naturally be based on all surrounding circumstances, among which the existence of hospitals is, I suppose, an important factor. In conclusion, I have to thank the League of Mercy for the great sum which Sir Henry Burdett has just announced, and which is the result of their continued persevering efforts. We are also indebted to the Trustees of the London Parochial Charities for their annual grant of £1,000 for convalescent homes. I desire to thank Sir Eyre Shaw and Captain Wells for their valuable Report on Fire Prevention, which we have circulated among the hospitals for their consideration, and, as doubtless will be found, for their assistance. To all the honorary officials of the Fund, and to those who have served on the Council and various Committees, I offer my warmest thanks, as well as to the honorary officers of the Fund, whose work this year has been unusually heavy, in consequence of the business connected with our Act. And here I must refer, with great regret, to the retirement of one of our honorary secretaries, Mr. Danvers Power, whose services cannot be spoken too highly of. He has compiled our statistical report—in itself an enormous asset to the Fund—and his qualities as a man of business, and of practical experience in the hospital world, are too well known to all of us to need comment. However, I am glad to think we shall retain him on our Council and Executive, and to know that his advice will always be available, and his interest undiminished. That Mr. Frederick Fry has consented to take up his work is a great mitigation of the loss; there is no one who could so well fill his place. I now move the adoption of the Reports.

Mr. John Burns, in seconding the adoption of the Reports, said he wished to associate himself heartily with His Royal Highness's remarks about Mr. Danvers Power, of whose work he had himself had experience in connection with the Queen's Unemployed Fund. As President of the Local Government Board it was his duty to nominate an auditor, and he suggested that the interests of the Fund would be best served if the present honorary auditors (Messrs. Deloitte, Plender, Griffiths & Co.) continued in their

position for next year, after which they would be better able to judge whether any alteration was necessary. He also wished to refer to the question of the relationship of general hospitals and Poor Law infirmaries, and outdoor relief generally. There was considerable overlapping, and he suggested that a committee of the Fund should look into the matter. In regard to consumption sanatoria there was a demand for the compulsory notification of consumption and tuberculosis. If this demand were hurriedly complied with, there would be an enormous, almost an overwhelming, claim made for new sanatoria. He had, as a result of the laborious industry of Dr. Bulstrode, obtained valuable information on this very important, almost tragic, question, and he proposed early next month to circulate it at home and abroad. In taking his seat as a member of the Council of the King's Fund, he had the greatest pleasure in seconding the adoption of

The adoption of the Reports was then put and carried unanimously.

On the motion of Mr. Hugh C. Smith, it was resolved that the cheques for the grants should be

posted on December 19.

THE PRESIDENT then said: It may be convenient if I now state to the Council what the probable arrangements for the next year will be. Under the Act I must appoint a new Council every year, and the appointment must be made in, and in respect of, the year in which the Council is to act. I cannot, therefore, nominate the Council for next year until January. It is my intention, however, to invite all who have hitherto so kindly given me their help to continue their services, and I have also been fortunate enough to secure the services of some new members, many of whom we have the pleasure of seeing here to-day. It will, I trust, be understood that, as the convenience of transacting business round a table which has its limits must be considered, it is not possible for me to add the names of many others to whom we are greatly indebted for services on the Committees or as Visitors. As, no doubt, the first work of the new Council will be the delegation of some of its powers to Committees, and feeling that you will prefer that the matter should be discussed now, so that the meeting in the beginning of January need only be formal, I have directed the necessary resolutions to be prepared, and they lie on the table. You will, I think, agree with me that the work is satisfactorily divided by the existing Committees. They are, as you know, the Executive, Finance, Distribution, and Convalescent Homes Committees, and our Visitors. It will be my duty to nominate the members, and I should propose, in the first instance, to proceed on the principle of not nominating any one gentleman to more than one Committee. I think it will be necessary that the Honorary Secretaries should have the right to attend and speak at all Committees without, however, voting on more than the one to which they belong. Time will show whether this arrangement will always meet our necessities; but I feel that we should endeavour, within workable limits, to give the fullest possible opportunity to the greatest number of taking part in the work of the Fund. The Visitors have hitherto been spoken of by us as a Committee, but their duties, invaluable as they are to the Fund, are personal rather than corporate. I propose to appoint them as officials at a later date. The work of the Committees, if you decide to delegate some of your powers to them, would, under the draft resolutions, be divided in this work. The Figures Committee will deal with all questions of investment. The be divided in this way: The Finance Committee will deal with all questions of investment. The Distribution Committee will advise the General Council as to grants to Hospitals, deciding which Hospitals shall be placed on the list for consideration, and making rules for the observance of the Hospitals in connection with their applications. The Convalescent Homes Committee will advise as to the grants to convalescent homes and sanatoria beyond the metropolitan area. I have already referred to the importance of sanatoria for the treatment of consumption, and I do not think that the fact that many of these institutions are outside the area now visited by us should preclude us from considering their claims. It must not be forgotten that many of their inmates are patients from the London Hospitals. I hope next year we may devote some portion of our funds in this direction. This question seems to me well worthy of your consideration. With the exception of those duties assigned to the other Committees, and reserved to the Council, the general work of the Fund will be entrusted to the Executive Committees. I hope to attend the meetings of the Council regularly, as hitherto. In case I should be prevented from doing so, it will, of course, be necessary that some one presides for me. I am not sure that it is my duty to nominate a substitute, but, at the same time, I should like to think that my place would be taken by Mr. Hugh Smith who would be taken by Mr. Hugh Smith, who would bring his long experience as Chairman of the Executive to the service of the Council. In regard to rules and regulations, I doubt whether in a body of this kind, where we are all animated by one object, it will be necessary to frame any standing orders. The Act of Parliament gives us our constitution in its broad lines, and it will, of course, be the desire of all of us to carry it out in the

spirit as well as the letter. The draft resolutions appointing Committees provide for the current work and define the powers of those Committees. The Distribution Committee, as I said, will have power to make rules and regulations for the observance of institutions applying to us for grants. Under this Act we are subject to annual reconstruction. We know, therefore, that what is decided to be best now is not an immutable law for future generations, or even for the year after next. I now suggest that we should discuss these resolutions, and, if they are approved, record our approval for the guidance of the meeting in January, which will, doubtless, confirm our decision. Before doing so, however, I will read the names of the 1908 Council and Committees which I intend to appoint:—

I hope it is fully realised by all who have given their valuable time and services, but more especially by the honorary secretaries and the members of the Executive and other Committees, how heartily I recognise that it would have been absolutely impossible to secure these results without their zealous, unflagging work, and their self-sacrificing devotion to the interests of the Fund. With the same ready help, strengthened by that of our new members, I look confidently ahead. We have good friends who have given substantial proof of their belief in and appreciation of our work. The King watches over it with an interest no less keen than on the day

of its foundation. As to myself I never lose sight of the great responsibilities of our mission, and that it is our duty to direct our strenuous efforts towards the encouragement and support of efficient and economical administration of the London hospitals, and in this way to prove that we are worthy trustees of the funds

committed to us by the charitable public for the benefit of the sick poor of London.

On the motion of Sir William Collins, seconded by the Bishop of London, it was resolved that the following resolution be approved: "That, until the General Council shall otherwise direct: (a) The Finance Committee shall have the powers of the General Council with respect to the following matters—that is to say, the carrying into effect of sections 9, 10, 11, and 13 of King Edward's Hospital Fund for London Act—and such powers are hereby delegated to them. (b) The Distribution Committee shall have the powers of the General Council with respect to the following matters—that is to say, the rules and regulations to be observed with respect to applications from hospitals or other institutions for grants from the corporation, the determination as to which of such applications shall be considered, the making of inquiries into the circumstances and condition of any hospitals or other institutions applying for grants, and the making of recommendations to the President and General Council as to the distribution of the funds of the corporation to institutions not being convalescent homes, or such sanatoria for consumption as shall be situate outside the County of the City of London and the Metropolitan Police district, and as to all matters in respect thereof, and such powers are hereby delegated to them. (c) The Convalescent Homes Committee shall have the powers of the General Council with respect to the following matter—that is to say, the making of recommendations to the President and General Council as to the distribution of the funds of the corporation to convalescent homes, and such sanatoria for consumption as shall be situate outside the County of the City of London and the Metropolitan Police district, and as to all matters relating thereto, and such powers are hereby delegated to them."

On the motion of Sir Joseph Dimsdale, seconded by the Master of Elibank, it was resolved that the following resolution be approved: "That, until the General Council shall otherwise direct, the Executive Committee shall have the powers of the General Council with respect to all matters not comprised in the foregoing resolution, save and except the expenditure of the funds of the corporation beyond a sum for the expenses of the administration of the Fund's general business, not exceeding £3,500, and save and except the making of rules and regulations under section 8 of the Act, and such powers are hereby delegated to

On the motion of Sir William Collins, the Council directed that it should be an instruction to the Executive Committee to consider and report upon the question of rules and regulations.

SIR SAVILE CROSSLEY (Hon. Secretary) read the draft Report of the Council for the year 1907.

THE PRINCE OF WALES, in moving the adoption of the Report, said:—My Lords and Gentlemen, the draft Report which has just been read shows that the Fund has had a busy year. With reference to the accounts, you will be gratified to know that the expenses necessarily incidental to the passage of our Act of Parliament have, by the kindness and generosity of all who have acted for us in the matter, proved comparatively light. Since our Council meeting in December, acting on the advice of the Executive Committee, and in accordance with the powers given under the Act, I have decided to appoint a Committee to inquire into the system prevailing in the London voluntary hospitals regarding the admission of out-patients. It is to be hoped that the labour involved in the holding of such an inquiry may, perhaps, to some extent be lightened by the results of the work of the Royal Commission on the Poor Laws, the issue of whose report we look forward to with great interest. In so far as the Commission may deal with certain aspects of the question of medical relief, we cannot fail to profit by a perusal of the evidence given before them, and of the conclusions at which they arrive. We shall, therefore, defer our inquiry until the Commission has reported. Another matter to be brought to your notice is a development of the scope of the operations of the Fund which I have approved upon the recommendation of the Distribution Committee. Hitherto the hospitals with which we have dealt have been those lying in the County of London, or within seven miles of Charing Cross. This limitation was wisely imposed when the Fund was instituted in 1897. But in the eleven years which have since elapsed London has grown rapidly, and it is felt that the time has come when we should enlarge our area. The radius from Charing Cross has therefore here extended from seven to nine miles. We also proceed this radius from Charing Cross has, therefore, been extended from seven to nine miles. We also propose this year to consider the claims of the consumption sanatoria in the country which take a large proportion of their patients from London. It must be obvious that such institutions are better situated in the country than in London, or even in the suburbs. These extensions of our work will not, at any rate this year, involve very great additional demands upon the Fund's resources. But a larger area may necessitate a larger distribution, and we must not forget that, even for the smaller area, there has been an ever steadily increasing distribution. The total of last year's distribution exceeded the income from investments With the extended area an increased income from subscriptions and donations will be necessary, and I trust that the public will recognise this and continue to give us their substantial support. The rearrangement of the work of the Fund necessitated by the Act has undoubtedly added largely to the responsibilities of the honorary secretaries and increased their work, and I fear that circumstances have recently thrown much of this upon Mr. Fry. To him especially, and to all those who have given their services, I wish to tender my most sincere thanks. I now move the adoption of the Report. The Resolution was seconded by the Lord Mayor (SIR JOHN BELL), supported by the Chairman of the London County Council (MR. R. A. Report of the Distribution Committee.

- (1) The Committee have the pleasure to report that the sum of £120,000 is available for distribution this year amongst the London Hospitals, as against £110,000 in 1906.
- (2) The number of Hospitals applying for grants is 99, as against 105 last year. This year, however, for the first time, the Country Branches of the Hospital for Consumption and the Mount Vernon Hospital for Consumption at Frimley and Northwood respectively have been visited on behalf of the Fund.
- (3) Among the Hospitals which have fallen out is the City Orthopædic Hospital, which has ceased to exist as a separate institution, and has, we understand, amalgamated with the Royal National Orthopædic Hospital. The sum of £500, representing the two grants of £250 made in the years 1905 and 1906, will consequently be paid over to the Royal National Orthopædic Hospital when the amalgamation is complete.
- (4) In regard to the five Throat, Nose, and Ear Hospitals, the Committee are informed that the negotiations for amalgamation are still proceeding. Towards this object the Committee have, in addition to the considerable sums already promised by the Fund, set aside a further sum of £2,000 instead of making separate grants to each Hospital. The Committee, however, cannot recommend that this sum, together with the £1,000 set on one side for the same purpose last year, should be held over indefinitely, nor would they wish it to be understood that either of the amounts will be paid to the Throat and Ear Hospitals if the amalgamation is not carried out.
- (5) The sum of £6,000 voted towards the removal of King's College Hospital to South London increases the total amount contributed by the Fund to this object to £22,000.
- (6) The Committee last year referred to the two exceptional grants of £5,000 to the Hampstead General Hospital and £4,500 to the Mount Vernon Hospital for Consumption, and stated that, as those amounts were in the nature of advances, they would be taken into consideration in the future. In the case of the Hampstead General Hospital the Committee are informed that the Fund has made a liberal offer to this Hospital provided the amalgamation with the North-West London Hospital is carried out. This offer, which includes an annual grant of £1,500 for five years, will come into effect from the date of the completion of the amalgamation, and in view of this and the large sum paid to the Hospital last year the Committee have not felt justified in making any further grant.

- (7) The attention of the Committee was called to the urgent necessity for rebuilding the Out-patient Department at Guy's Hospital at a cost of about £20,000, of which £10,000 has already been received. In view of the needs of the neighbourhood and of the fact that the work if set in hand this winter might be carried out more advantageously, the Committee recommend a grant of £10,000 for this purpose. This, with £5,000 for the general purposes of the Hospital, makes a much larger grant than Guy's Hospital would be ordinarily entitled to, and should the Council sanction the proposal the Committee will take this exceptional grant into consideration in the future.
- (8) The attention of the Committee has been called to the inconvenience experienced in the preparation of the Statistical Reports owing to the late date at which the Annual Reports of several of the Hospitals are received. The Committee are of opinion that the Reports of all Hospitals applying for grants from the Fund should be sent in not later than April 15 in each year.
- (9) The Reports of the Visitors have, as heretofore, received the careful consideration of the Committee and have been of the utmost value.
- (10) In addition to their published remarks the Committee have followed and extended their usual practice in recommending that various suggestions, including many arising from the Visitors' Reports, should be made privately to the Hospitals.

The details of the awards to the various Hospitals are appended.




